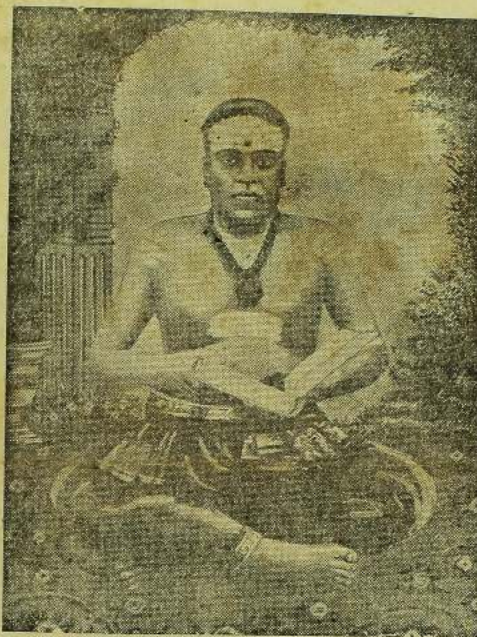
## ASSESSING SRILASRI ARUMUGA NAVALAR'S ACTIVITIES

#### 'Smoke & Drink'

Sir,—Smoke and drink are two products, consumption of which is soaring in the country to the delight of finance ministers who rake in revenue from taxes etc and are we to feel happy that free rice, free education and free medicine are financed partly from such revenue and justify smoking and drinking on this ground and on the ground that consumption of these provides employment to thousands. Thousands gain monetarily through the sufferings of thousands of fellow countrymen. Again tobacco farms in Jaffna can be easily converted into potatoe fields. If with prohibition there is a big loss in revenue this can be partly made up by pruning Govt expenditure all round and additional borrowing from diverse sources. Toddy tappers can be found employment as semi-skilled workers after a crash technical training programme as semi-skilled factory workers and in agricultural schemes. As far as Excise Inspectors are concerned Prohibition will turn them into prohibition enforcement officers. Arrack for export is as bad as opening new distilleries in any part of the Island for arrack is bad for other people as much as it is for the Ceylonese. This point has been well emphasised in a letter written to the 'இந்திரன்' by one Ragunathan month back.

## Remembering Nehru

Recently the Ceylon Daily News carried an assessment of Gandhi by Nehru and still more recently the Ceylon Daily Mirror carried an assessment of Nehru by C. P. Ramaswamy Iyer, in connection with Nehru's 80th Birthday Anniversary. When one recalls the name Nehru one cannot help thinking also about several other stalwarts of Indian Freedom struggle—C. P. Ramaswamy Iyer was himself one of those. He was Diwan of Mysore and a personal friend of the then Viceroy of India Lord Linlithgow, just as Rajaji was and is a personal friend of the Mountbattens. Other great figures are Vallabai Patel, Moulana Kalam Azad, Rajendra Prasad and many others. I read in 'இளம்பிறை' a Tamil magazine published by Muslims an article on Nehru as a writer by the late Humayun Kabir in

which the author says that when Nehru died India lost not only a great statesman but also a great writer as well. Nehru's mastery over English was acknowledged even by the West and his Glimpses of World History (available also in Tamil as (சரித்திரக் காட்சிகள்) can be read for both pleasure and profit by all of us. How far this influenced Mrs. Indira Gandhi the recipient of the letters contained therein is for her to say. Mrs. Pandit during her recent visit to Ceylon admitted that while in some prison or other she read books under the guidance of her brother (Mr. Nehru himself). If only she had supplied us with a list of these books, F. E. E. C's notwithstanding we would have gone all out to get at them. Nehru was a great lover of children and India of his time sent baby elephants as gifts to the zoos of other countries. Naming a section of the Dehiwala Zoo, Nehru enclosure would be as good a way as any for remembering Jawaharlal. In whatever he did Nehru, was the showman par excellence. Whether it was addressing a specially convened session of the U. N. General assembly, or a typical ticker tape welcome in New York, or opening an exhibition at home, or addressing a University convocation, or staying at Claridges as guest of John Bull for Commonwealth conferences, Nehru took all of these in his strides. During visits to Ceylon he gave security personnel an anxious time by setting out on his own at times. For the major part he was a man in sherwani but he used to wear western dress occasionally when in England. He was fond of roses and used to wear one in his button hole now and then. His love for the well-being of the human race transcended all barriers and both in life and after death remembrance he is a fine advertisement for India. It is said that as P. M. he took off only 4 hours for sleep. He gave religion a wide berth but gave practical shape to the policy of a secular state guaranteeing full freedom of worship for all. He also accepted the principle of administrative units based on language and as long as he lived the Indian masses were doubly happy that someone great and above them yet so near to them, was doing well in their midst and also because they felt that something will always be done by the Central govt. for their well being. Mr. Earnest Corea (I think he is the editor of the Ceylon Daily News) in a recent three instalment article on Indian affairs says that Nehru, the intellectual was feared even by the Indian Left. In private and public life the sporting instinct was always strong in him though it is said that he lost his temper very often. I have seen a

## PROPER RELIGIOUS PRACTICE

What the world seriously needs is proper religious practice. This aspect has not been given sufficient attention even by those who lead religious societies, let alone the common people. However an awakening has been aroused throughout the country by the observance of days of religious significance in the form of conferences and festivals. How much advantage such a method of religious revival could bring about is a question that has to be examined against the background of the teachings of the Saiva Saints and the exposition of these precepts by Saiva Savants like Sri la Sri Arumuga Navalar.

We do not support the view that the Great Navalar was a National Hero in the sense in which political and social workers have been described. It is common knowledge that what is common to the whole nation is termed 'national'. By no stretch of the imagination can the Saiva Saints be called National Heroes of India. Their sphere of work, their method of approach to the lofty aspect of life, their example to the people, all had the background of practice of Saiva Religion. In this practice they were supremely solemn. Interpreting their exemplary lives, we find the stamp of true Saiva culture that has been reflected in their Thirumurais and their devotion as exquisitely described by Sekilar Swamikal. What should be prohibited in the course of one's life is the basis of correct religious practice. Killing, stealing, drinking, breaking the code of conduct of sex, scandalizing religious gurus and religious practice, uttering falsehood, partaking of non-vegetarian food, among others, being the more serious

lapses called 'Sinning' must not be allowed to make one's life a miserable and irreligious one. Towards this end the Saiva Savants lived and worked. The Great Navalar remained a bachelor and lived the life of a sincere Saivait. Let us therefore be grateful to the Saints and Savants who had set the significantly supreme example of service to religion. In the Name of the Great Navalar let us call for a true practice of Saiva religion. For this the campaign should first centre on vegetarianism and non-drinking.

ther he had done anything silly in the course of the previous night. Alcohol induces a temporary state of well-being and irresponsibility and in course of time drinking finishes all that is valuable in a man. As for tobacco they say there is a connection between formation of the habit and the time at which the smoker as an infant was weaned. We are made to understand that those weaned later in childhood have better immunity to taking up to the habit. The connection between smoking and lung cancer has been well-established.

Smoking and drinking are recurrent actions caused by memory promptings of pleasure caused during earlier use. Thus if social workers with the co-operation of parents and teachers do what they can to prevent a boy or young man (or girl for that matter) having his or her first cigarette or drink plenty of good can be done. Cigarette and the cocktail have become symbols of stylised modern living and many young people take to these because they don't want to be looked upon as timid spoil sports by fellow members of this age group. Today people don't like to be preached to and there are ever-widening gaps between the various age groups. The young and middle aged

are finding it difficult to communicate with one another and both are drifting away from the older generation. All age groups must come together if the country is to be free from alcohol and tobacco. Again there is the silly idea in the minds of common-folk that government servants on account of their status etc can smoke and drink to their heart's content but that teachers etc those in similar position should be free from these twin habits. All must follow a sensible code of right thought and conduct. Far from aiding intelligent thought and concentration tobacco dulls the brain and spoils appetite. A free spender on drink and smoke will be looked upon as an undesirable idiot by fathers with grown-up daughters in Jaffna but there are commercial circles which would warmly welcome such an individual as long as his money lasts. To put in economic jargon—one man's expenditure is another man's income. We must note in America where the national dream at individual level is 'Peace' Freedom and ever-growing affluence. Chronic alcoholics about 5 million in number) present a grave social problem.

Critics of prohibition argue that no prohibition scheme would succeed if those who drink go all out to obtain supplies illicitly. If all who drink give themselves a healthy dose of enlightened drink tobacco will disappear for want of custom. Smokers and drinkers suffer under the delusion that the rest of society admires them. Some non smokers and non drinkers look down upon addicts of the twin habits. All smokers and drinkers are not sinners and all non smokers and non drinkers are not saints.

After reading all this a reader may turn round and ask—"Mr. S. K., you preach so much, what are your credentials? I am a man with some education and have been an interested spectator of life around for years and am one who has suffered plenty under the two habits. Above all I am anxious to see and be a part of a society in which individuals face with confidence and happiness emotional strains and stresses of modern life without resorting to dangerous props like cigarette and arrack.
