THE SPIRIT OF INDIA

The spirit of India has faced formidable challenges during the last 25 years of her history. The cultural, religious and social values of humanity have been swept away by the rising tide of nuclear science and technology. What has been India's reaction to the traumatic wind of change blowing so vehemently all over the globe? Does India show any desire to safeguard her cultural moorings in a world of shifting values? Has India any significant message for the modern world? These are a few questions which stimulate a good deal of thinking in contemporary India.

Mahatma Gandhi performed a singular feat of history by liberating India from the shackles of British Raj in 1947. It was undoubtedly a grand achievement in as much as the subject nations of the world, particularly those of Africa realised for the first time that they had an inborn right to govern their motherlands and that colonial subjugation was an abject crime against humanity. I fervently believe that Gandhi was the first leader ever to reverse the significance of Rousseau's dictum: "Man is born free but he is everywhere in chains". Viewed from a non-political standpoint Indian Independence was a realisation of the Vedantic concept of Swaraj enunciated in the following lines: "Oh the far sighted, and oh friends, you and we the learned shall strive to achieve the comprehensive Swaraj which is protected by many".

The ancient Indians did not create an image of a warring and divided world. India has always endeavoured to solve international problems in accordance with her cultural tradition. Jawaharlal Nehru's doctrine of Panch Shila was a valuable contribution to the cause of

peaceful coexistence. The ancient Indian scriptures attach a great importance to international amity, neighbourliness and national solidarity. The theory of peaceful coexistence is no longer a new addition to Indian thought: it already forms the backbone of the Vedantic philosophy. The Atharva Veda stressed centuries ago the importance of the comity of nations in the following words: "One and the same be your resolve and be your minds of one accord. United be the thoughts of all that all may agree and live together happily". India displayed an exemplary cool-headedness during the recent aggressions of China and Pakistan on her territorial sovereignty. This fact is further corroborated by her adherence to the policy of non-alignment which has considerably added to the promotion of world peace. Lal Bahadur Shastri gave a practical proof of India's desire for peaceful coexistence by signing the Tashkent Declaration on January 10, 1965.

India's choice of a secular democracy can be regarded as the final flowering of her ancient history which held the King responsible for the well-being of his subjects. The sublime words of the Atharva Veda still sound perfectly democratic: "Let all be of one purpose and mind under a common leadership in a spirit of fellowship. It was quite feasible for India to declare herself as a Hindu State after the formation of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan. But Pandit Nehru displayed a genuine farsightedness by choosing a secular character for free India in order to preserve the glorious tradition of her composite culture. It is not a unique example of religious tolerance? The freedom of worship and equality of rights and opportunities guaranteed by the Indian

Constitution earnestly aim at safeguarding the interests of the minorities and promoting emotional integration.

The sacred literature of India has exercised a profound influence on the Western savants amongst whom Schopenhauer, Max Muller, Emerson, Edwin Arnold and E. M. Forster deserve special mention. Sir William Jones, a notable Englishman who devoted his whole lifetime to the study of Sanskrit literature, rendered a supreme service to Indology by translating into English Kalidasa's Shakuntala, in 1789. Europe first learned of the classical Indian drama from Sir William's translation which highly influenced Johann Wolfgang von Goethe. It may well be surmised that the prologue in Goethe's Faust was inspired by Kalidasa's prologue which was in accordance with the usual tradition of the Sanskrit drama. The English Translation of Rabindranath Tagore's Gitanjali was hailed as a bombshell by the Westerners on the score of its ethereal poetry which worked like a balm on their diseased psychosis. W. B. Yeats was virtually ravished by the imaginative profundity and timeless message of the Bengali poet. The influence of Indian scriptures on modern English poetry becomes conspicuous when T. S. Eliot draws on the pantheism in the closing lines of The Waste Land. While visiting India in February, 1965, Monsieur G. Pompidou, the French Prime Minister, frankly acknowledged the strong influence of Indian culture on French letters in the following words: "While de Guignes, Asquetil-Duperon, Burnouf, Garcin de Tassy, Barth, Senart and more recently Sylvain Levi, Alfred Foucher, Jules Bloch, Rene Grousset and Renou to mention only the most prominent names, played a part and some times a major one, in giving recognition to your culture, the latter was beginning to pervade our letters and to open new vistas to our thought".

'REGRETS'

What we call கலகம் in Tamil is really a form of last minute regret tinged with wisdom born out of experiences of a life time and the dying man is in a sense a happy bird bidding adieu to those who come to listen to him, before he takes full leave of his senses. There is another saying called உயிரோடு கடவுள் கூப்பிடுவல் but this has nothing to do with regret but must be connected with the practice of discharging the gravely sick near crematoriums in the days of old. Coming back to the subject proper it is a matter of great regret that we in Ceylon today have discarded much of what was good in traditional way of life in favour of modern trends and at the pace urbanisation proceeds in the Jaffna peninsula there is the danger of Tamil language and literature being destroyed not so much by Saivite action but by the attitude of the Tamils themselves. In trying to rescue Tamil and Tamil literature from Politicians and Pundits one should not fall into the mistake of oversimplification of poetry etc in the name of mass comprehension or attempt impossible blends of Zola, Shaw and others in the name of revolutionary literature. One can understand an ayurvedic physician attempting to modernise his methods to compete favourably with westernised medicine and practice unscrupulous politics with the increased income and only a patient who

suffered under such physicians need regret this and not others. Going back to Tamil and Tamil literature it is worthwhile recalling that the late Prof. K. K. of the University of Ceylon (sadly missing from the local literary and dramatic scene as is the case with Dr. V. Ponniah who with a keen sense of humour told us in the varsity entrance class of 1948 how training college Pundits set about preparing thesis for higher degree and also tried to teach us Tamil poetry composition based on the lines of கிராமப் பெருமான் வர் grammar) used to brand Bharati's Panchali Sabatham as Prosy verse, unless present-day Tamils learn to appreciate the beauty in Tamil poetry and literature and at the same time learn to drink deep into the literature of other nations through sensible and selective reading, they should drop all pretensions to claim themselves as educated persons. It is really a matter of deep regret that at book depots books are dumped on the counter in the same way as textiles and very often glossy finish and what we call பணத்திழிர் decides purchases of both. As a lover of good books this pains me a lot.

A senior politician from Jaffna is supposed to have said on the eve of the 47 election 'after election we mean business. Another Jaffna politician is supposed to have said 'You can be a leader of the masses but you need not be one of the masses.' Are we to be happy about these utterances or regret them in the light of recent political development. They say murder will out but it is a matter of deep regret that the voters can never learn the truth about natives behind political thought and action. Imagine the plight of a youngster pushy and
