

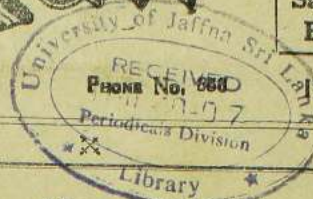

## N. P. T. A. IN RESPONSIBLE ROLE

### Emphasis on Literary and Cultural Efforts

"Our Association which has been in existence for over half a century is greatly interested in education. Just as much as we fight to safeguard the rights and interests of the teachers we work for the educational upliftment of our students in this part of the country. At a time when other trade unions are trying to build up educational and cultural contacts we are really proud of our achievement of these years in having... this elocution and singing contests where we achieve wonderful success and where more than 65 schools participated," said Mr. V. Sivasubramanian President of the N. P. T. A. when he distributed the awards at Jaffna Hindu College for those who obtained places in the oratorical and singing contests organised by the N. P. T. A.

He said that the students should feel proud to have had the opportunity to participate in these contests. He thanked the large body of teachers who gave a helping hand particularly the Principals for having cooperated to run these contests.

## ROLE OF RELIGION

Significantly he said "There are some well marked roads and it is safe to walk along the beaten tracks trod by the ancient teachers."

Man has to survive the onslaught on religion by irreligion in a world that is witnessing a cold war between theism and atheism. Mahatmaji had often referred to the experiences of an unbroken line of prophets and sages. He certainly lived in a realm of religion. Hence his spectacular success as the greatest worker for the welfare of the people.

Lives of the *Nayanmars* remind us of the sublimity of life. Their prayer to God in the form of Thirumurais indicate in the clearest manner the quintessence of Saiva Siddhantha on which philosophy is based the Saiva Religion. The tradition of life in Lanka has been one based on religion and that of the Saivaites has been according to the Saiva Siddhantha philosophy. No Saivaite can ever agree to allow any attack on religion to be encouraged in any sphere of life. ## Reviewed News

### Eighty One And Yet Ever Green!

The 'Hindu Organ' and the 'Inthusathanam' are on their eighty first year of publication, a rare achievement for weekly journals of a religious organisation. These newspapers maintain their steady progress in strict conformity with the ideals that inspired the founders. Like a perennial stream that takes its source in some mountain always rich with flowing water, the 'Hindu Organ' and the 'Inthusathanam' continue their uninterrupted course ever since they took their source from the Himalayan inspiration of the Great Navalur. The perenniality of these publications is really a matter of pride for all Hindus.

### Contemporaneous With The H. O.

March saw this year, two others who have long and abiding connections with the 'Hindu Organ' enter their eighty first year of existence. Mudir C. Muttu tamby and Mr. R. N. Sivasambu of Madras (Lanka of the Hindu Organ) seem to be growing with the Hindu Organ most unostentatiously. The Mudalar keeps on writing about the Great Navalur in the Inthusathanam. Mr. Sivasambu was the correspondent of the Hindu Organ in Malaya and Singapore from 1910 to 1921 and in Madras thereafter. His writings under the pen name 'Lanka' compel careful attention of our readers. 1889 - born Mudalar and Sivasambu, both have the interest of the Hindu Organ, another 1889 creation, in their hearts.

### Skanda - Seventy Fifth Year

Mark of maturity of a school or college does not necessarily depend on the passage of years. But where years roll by in decades and the growth of the institution in content and construction is spectacular, then of course the event becomes worthy of note.

What was known in the early part of this century as Kanderodai Hindu English Institute was established in 1894 by learned men of vision: Seenipathiyayar and Kandiah Uppathiyayar must have had intuitive knowledge of what their attempts in the field of educational needs would eventually become. Against odds they toiled hard and struggled with

# HINDUISM FOR HIGHER STUDIES

Hindus of Lanka and South India are all Saivaites. The Saiva Religion is best explained by the system of Siddhantha philosophy which is the accomplished conclusion of conclusions. The study of Hinduism, a word used by educational authorities in Lanka, must necessarily be the study of Saivism and therefore of Saiva Siddhantha.

Rev. Dr. G. U. Pope, a Christian Missionary who studied the Saiva Siddhantha philosophy and gathered such knowledge as could enable him translate the Sacred Verses of Saint Manickavasagar described Saiva Siddhantha as 'the most elaborate influential and undoubted the most intrinsically valuable of all religions of India. It is peculiarly South Indian and Tamil religion. Saivism is the old prehistoric religion of South India, essentially existing from Pre Aryan

times and holds sway over the hearts of the Tamil people. Saiva Siddhantha philosophy is the choicest product of the Dravidian intellect."

Now what do the educational pundits who constitute the Board of Examiners in the subject of Hinduism mean when prescribing books for the study of Hinduism (Saivism) they omit the cream of Saiva Literature'. Along with the Meihanda Shastras, the Thirumurais a treasure of hymns bring out the essence of Saiva Siddhantha. No study of Saivism at the University level can be complete without research knowledge of Thirumurais and Thiruthondar Puranam.

Is this indifferent attitude of the educational authorities a challenge to the Saiva Public and Saiva Societies?

"The Hindu Students' Union seeks to lodge its protest against the subtle manner in which the Education Department seeks to prescribe a field of study which it imagines could be described as Hindu Civilisation.

We refer to the new syllabus in 'Hindu Civilisation' for the G. C. E. (A) Level which will come into effect as from January 1971.

The New Syllabus seeks to withdraw from the old the essential elements of Hindu Philosophy and Culture as practised by the Hindus of Ceylon.

We therefore request you to withdraw the New Syllabus and frame an alternate one more suited to our culture

Sir,  
Recently I happened to see in the course of my preregir nations a young female taking a still younger female on the bar of her bicycle and more recently another female in saree on a motor bike pillion and it looks as though if modern females take up to horse riding they would not be ridingside-saddle as did the women of England of old. Rapid urbanisation has overtaken the pace of rational social thought and where finances are short living to show off at others expense has become a virtue and not a vice. The population of Ceylon constantly on the increase is dividing itself not so much into male and female (which is really an accident of birth) but into the white elite and clean savages of the Western type. Food is available in plenty and political crop growing notwithstanding the country at large cares very little whether food is imported or locally produced as is the case in England. At any moment the total resources of a country in terms of human resources, space, and labour by government is limited and if in the name of modernisation we are to create asphalt jungles of even bye-lanes of areas where traditional rural culture and dedicated tilling of the soil went a long way to supplement what nature beautifully supplied, Ceylon cannot progress far. There should be scope in the country for satisfactory expression of natural aptitudes and exploitation man and animal by other men and women must be prevented. The late Nehru regretted that he would not be here to see men land on the moon and though we have forgotten him we cannot forget his words told us and the incident of handing over his clothes to Tensing Nerkey when the latter visited him before leaving for England to meet the Queen at Buckingham Palace. The Nehrus were westernised oriental elites but they never grudging the coming up in life of the humble Nepalese mountain climber. We in Ceylon should learn to see our happiness in the happiness of life of around and at least in the case of children of all castes and all faiths let us not grudge sharing resources for common purpose. No man is beneath social recognition. The brahmin as much as the scavenger

The Seventy fifth Anniversary Number has reviewed the story of the rural school that has shot up to 'Space' and is now a base for broad education. One of the articles in this memorial number is from a distinguished old boy who distinguished himself as student, teacher, inspector and finally as Deputy Director of Education. Mr. K. S.
