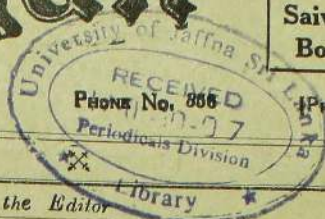

## Ceylon - Foundation for Stability and Progress

PROF. K. KULARATNAM

Rubber, Coconut, Tea, from crisis to crisis; food drive, foreign aid; population outstrips production; and Ceylon drifts along; in short this is the current situation!

Two fundamentals remain ignored: (1) Survey and inventory of domestic resources: material and human; physical and biological, tangible and invisible; (2) Political climate of communal harmony, as indispensable foundation for healthy nationhood and progress. The country lies in the grip today of the power-hunger of self-seeking politicians, communal chauvinistic and parochial factions geared to "power at any cost and to hell with the country and the people." In the name of the race myth, mis-interpreted history, linguistic superiority fanatic anti thesis of religion, in the name of enlightenment and religion itself, the spectre of destruction haunts the land. Western-type harmony based on the party system has gone away and leaders have descended to genocide as way of escape and short-cut to power.

Even at this belated hour, but before it is not too late yet, the call is getting louder for a return to sanity and experiment in prosperous living. With due acknowledgments to the authors, may we heed the words of J. P. Narayan, P. A. Wadia and M. R. Masani, uttered in a parallel Indian context.

In a developing country tasting the fruits of Independence, perhaps a little prematurely, politics inevitably plays a disproportionately dominant role. Yet while so much is made to appear dependent on politics, it is precisely the working of politics that is causing the most anxiety. The anxiety is caused by the juxtaposition of two

sharply contrasted situations.

"On the one side the problems of the country are found to be so vast, so numerous, so difficult and many of them so urgent and pressing (the food front and unemployment) that it is becoming clearer day by day that nothing short of a united national effort, like an M. R. A. miracle, founded on national unity and communal harmony can be expected to cope with them adequately and expeditiously enough.

"On the other side, experience shows that existing political institutions, parties and processes are tending increasingly to promote disunity rather than unity; disruption rather than consolidation, partisanship and parochialism, nepotism, corruption and chauvinism rather than patriotism and accelerated production.

Competition for power at any cost between political parties, rather fortuitous and opportunist groups ganging together for sharing the spoils, has become the essence of our practice of democracy. There seems little stability or discipline in many parties, standards of political conduct leave room for comment and public opinion which is the best safeguard is neither powerful nor effective. Political morality has descended to low depths, personal interest supercedes public interest. The picture in all respects is most depressing.

Today's politics of composition among parties has not only proved wanting, but is aggravating and complicating many of our problems and even obstructing or slowing down their solution.

The language question has been made more diffi-

cult by competition between the parties for cheap popularity by exploiting ignorance among the masses. Religion, which is a personal matter of the individual has been dragged into the ugly arena of party politics. In the legislature, partisan debates eclipse urgent national issues

There is hope for the future, though. The people are getting rapidly disillusioned with this kind of politics; their rising expectations remain shattered and scattered in the dump heap! The leaders will be forced to come together for the common good of the people as a whole, for a divided house cannot stand. That would be the policies of consensus. Time is running out. This has to be adopted even as a temporary expedient and palliative. People will not tolerate the other alternative of dictatorship. The parties will not easily substitute the politics of consensus for the present politics of competition. If not willing to substitute, at least the people can make them to supplement competition with consensus.

The different major parties are engrossed in the struggle for power. Still, could they not be persuaded to agree even to the limited idea of supplementing their competitive politics with a measure of cooperative politics? In war time or other emergency they have shown proof of such ability. All that is needed is for all parties to agree to eschew language, religion, so-called race, caste and other chauvinisms, and learn to act as enlightened statesmen, whatever their ideologies, methods and techniques of good government may be. Unity, of action must be forged in at least a few urgent spheres of economic life such as agriculture, industry, trade and employment.

Despondency instead of hope has come over the intelligent people of our country over the way in which the parties and the political system have fail-

The late Pundit Nehru of India regretted years back that he would not be alive when man lands on the moon. The regret turned out to be prophetic but one has to note that Nehru had full faith in man's capacity to perform the great feat. The late president Kennedy set out the lines on which American space exploration should proceed and clearly explained it was all to be in the name of peace and promises, Nehru and Kennedy are not alive to congratulate Armstrong, Eldrin and Collins and after saluting the memory of these two great departed humans I proceed.

When Columbus successfully sailed West he made it worthwhile for his Spanish Royal Sponsors Ferdinand and Isabella. Gold, forced converts and overseas empires resulted from his mission. Columbus was not watched and heard by millions on T. V. and Radio sets. His achievement will and cannot be erased from History books Armstrong and Co brought back 50 lbs. of moon rock (not candy) and we rejoice that our own Ponnampereuma will be a key figure in the analysis of same. They say that the moon mission will increase our knowledge of moon's origin etc and also to help improve weather forecasts. Improved weather forecasts are good but in countries like America abundant harvests and price fluctuations at times force the state to pay farmers for not growing wheat. In the context of American economic conditions more wheat without satisfying price ambitions of farmers would be a calamity. The moon missions of course lead to new trends in science and technology but there is the danger that there may be new and dangerous developments in war science.

When the English led Everest expedition of 1954 successfully climbed the mountain and made the feat a rare coronation gift to Queen Elizabeth, the Nepalese admirers of Tensing Norkay created a furore as to whether Tensing or Edmund Hillary set foot first on the top. They acted on the assumption that their local hero Tensing did so while actually Hillary was there first and bent to give Tensing a helping hand to get up. In the case of Armstrong & Co the matter is clear. It had been decided weeks ahead on earth itself that Neil should step down first and that he should be followed by "Buzz" Eldrin and that Collins should hover above them. They did just that and now (for the time being at least) national and racial differences and jealousies have been forgotten and the whole of human society is being looked upon as one and Russia and America seem to be exchanging ideas on further space exploratory adventures. The success of the latest mission has whetted the appetite for more missions of this type and though it is well known that in the sphere of manned flights Russia is behind America, in the interests of world peace one wishes that a Russian lunarnaut would also step on the moon soon.

ed to develop. Many feel that the old Executive Committee system would have fared better in our political environment. A new constitution with fundamental rights inscribed in it has become urgent even for the exclusive progress of the majority community, which otherwise will not be allowed to march forward, being pulled down by the aggravating load of minority misery. In every party, power hungry extremists within are trying to pull down the good men. The nationwide deterioration in public conduct started from above with the politicians. The bureaucrats naturally cannot but do the least they have to do, holding the fort between one government and the other. Politics has now become one of ganging up; of tactics and expediency; of vested interest and unscrupulous adventurism. These can be dropped when party competition yields place to at least limited cooperation.

The elections are round the corner. Eventually one party will come to power and the others will be driven into the wilderness for five years. In their effort to pull down the party in power, they will accentuate the country's miseries. Instead, if they agree to some form of limited cooperation, putting questions of language, community, religion and caste above party politics, all can receive the thanks of the people and march together forward, though differently, and take their turn to power, on the basis of their efficiency.

We have too much of politics and too little of citizenship in Ceylon today. The politician becomes bad if the citizen remains passive, whether the politician is priest, physician or peasant. We sorely need grass-roots democracy. National integration cannot wait for the politician to bring it about, for it is not to his advantage. Only the people can give the lead to national integration. The National Integration Society of Ceylon, the Congress of Religions, the Nationalists Association and other organs run by the people themselves

have a vital role to play in establishing stability and progress for this country as a whole. The citizens must educate the politicians, for they are the masters and the politicians are merely the representatives. Whether this is true or not, some have been heard to say that they will rob more efficiently than others when they come to power. Where is public opinion to tolerate this kind of democracy?

The advent of freedom from foreign rule has, if anything accentuated communal differences. Who is responsible for this? The politicians who want short cuts to power by playing on the religious susceptibilities of the ignorant masses. Aggressive groups are formed, under their pressure the country is threatened with disruption and consequent destruction. It is no more economic rivalry or linguistic fanaticism which has already had its field day, but now the feeling is that the majority group whatever it be compounded of, has the right to ride round-shod over the minorities. This has been made the underlying assumption of democracy in Ceylon. For centuries, the main communities have lived peacefully and have fought together to win freedom. Now power hungry politicians have ingrained mutual ill will and suspicion. These can be wiped out by a mere show of voluntary self-denial on the part of the majority community in their own interests and in the name of their own religion. We have allowed free scope for the canker of divisive forces and is it not a matter of shame that we should be shown linguistic fanaticism as our crowning achievement in the field of education.

Establish national integration and communal harmony first, and follow it up with the discovery and utilisation of local resources. Then automatically will follow all prosperity economic, social and political, for there is no difference among the people except what scheming politicians have created and accentuated for temporal personal gain.
