## MARAI GNANA SAMBANDHAR

(Third in succession from Meikanda Sivachariar)

Marai Gnana Sambandhar was an orthodox brahman who sojourned at Tiruk-kalam-Seri (திருக்களம்சேரி); but his native place was Pentakadam (பென்கடம்) where there is the Sivan Temple called Thoonganai Maadam (தூங்கைமாடம்). Soon after his birth his parents performed all the customary astrological ceremonies. He was invested with the sacred thread in his seventh year according to the Vedas, and he got his initiation from his Guru, Arulnandi Sivachariar who had instructed him in theological

knowledge, thus removing all his Karmas. He became an adept in the Vedas and other Sanskrit lore and he was called Marai Gnana Sambandhar. He stayed with his Guru for some time, then paid his respects to him and left for the sacred town of Chithamparam where he was engaged in teaching some disciples under him. One day while he was thus teaching, sitting in the verandah of a street house, one of his disciples, seeing St. Umapathi Sivachariar, the high priest of the Nadarajar Temple passing in procession sitting in his palanquin and attended by paraphernalia of musical instruments, flags, umbrellas, torch-lights etc, got up and turning to his Guru Marai Gnana Sambandhar said, "Sir, one of the temple-priests is coming along the street in his palanquin in the broad daylight (in this month of May which is intensely hot) attended with torch-light etc. Even we who are sitting here in the shade feel the heat very much." On hearing this, Marai Gnana Samban-

har said, "This person is day-blind." Umapathi Sivachariar coming to know this remark of Marai Gnana Sambandhar by the Grace of God, jumped down from the palanquin and approached the seat of Marai Gnana Sambandhar. No sooner had Umapathi Sivachariar begun to honour him than Marai Gnanar ran away from the place. Umapathi Sivachariar seeing this ran after him. They both continued their running until they reached the Weavers' Street. As these two priests had never before such a run with perplexed minds, the weather being very hot, they were completely tired and their bodies covered with perspiration. Marai Gnana Sambandhar turning to the weavers who were at that time starching their cloths said, "Oh weavers, I am very much tired". Then one of them asked him to come to his house so that he might feed him quite satisfactorily. But Marai Gnanar asked him to pour into his hands some starch-porridge which they had with them. One of the weavers did so.

When Marai Gnana Sambandhar was consuming the liquid food, Umapathi Sivachariar who was with him drank the porridge that flowed down his elbows, thus preventing the drops falling on the ground. As soon as he drank the tricklings of the liquid as Guruprasatham (குருப்பிரசாதம்), he imagined Marai Gnana Sambandhar as his Guru who bestowed on him spiritual knowledge and then they both parted.

While sojourning at Tirukalanseri, Marai Gnanar wrote the following books for the benefit of mankind: - Sivatratri Kalpam சிவரத்திரி கற்பம், சோமவாரகற்பம், உருத்திராக்க விசிட்டம், சைவசமயநெறி சிவதருமோத்தரம் etc. He lived for some more years and then passed away at his residence on Utthara day (உத்தர நட்சத்திரம்) in the month of August.

### 'POPULATION EXPLOSION'

Sir,  
It is said that man breeds by inclination and not by calculation but this was with reference to population policies aimed at increasing births, though NAZI, Germany tried out a policy of selective breeding to produce a Super-Aryan race. In the context of modern times our need is for reduction in number of births though one does not take delight in hoping for Malthusian gloomy doctrines to come true. Pressure of population on resources has become a universal problem. In Ceylon a country which conquered malaria long ago, the problem is not as acute as in India but big increase in bus and cinema queues and scramble for seats, for tables at eating houses in Colombo and elsewhere are unmistakable symptoms of harsh times ahead. When on the move one is forced to function as a unit of large human groups and to the self-conscious this is a grave handicap which cramps one's style and personality. In years to come there will not only be a mad rush to get at the bare essentials of life but there will be also a tragic dog-like quarrel even among members of the same family to get at what is needed at any cost from others if necessary. In the name of modernisation living standards beyond one's capacity to absorb and maintain are being chased at even in the rural areas and it is ironical that one buys something imagined to be exclusive only to find thousands of others possessing it. Economists may plan for plenty, engineers may dream of building for many, politicians may with false bravado exclaim— "The merrier" but to a calm observer of the human scene it is evident that something has to give way soon. It is true that birth control methods have produced unexpected results in countries like Japan and effective family planning is making some

### MOCKERY OF EXAMINATION MARKS

The conducting of the G. C. E. (O. L.) Examination in the limited premises of the set-up that is the Department of Examinations, is like holding a mammoth rally in a market square. The obvious result cannot be anything but pandemonium.

The December 1968 Examination for the G. C. E. (O. L.) Certificate was held three months later in March 1969, for more than three lakhs of students. This gigantic rally dispersed in the middle of April 1969 to keep vigil for the result for four full months. And last week the G. C. E. population was awakened to a confusion that has not yet cleared. Several hundreds of candidates have yet to know their achievement in certain subjects that are considered very vital to the assessing of the final verdict. Thrown hither and thither the continued march to the G. C. E. O. L. goal has again to be resumed for a similar performance in December 1969.

To those several thousands of stupefied students who have fallen by the wayside and have been forced to abandon the unequal fight for success in educational attainments, we extend our sincere sympathies; for the discarded thousands have one consolation of having beaten a hasty retreat be-

fore more humiliating developments could inconvenience them later on.

The rest who have been thrown into the quandary of a colossal confusion of incomplete or inexplicable or intriguing results of their efforts in March 1969 deserve to be rescued from the labyrinth in which they have been left by the Examiners.

In a country that can well boast of complete success in holding parliamentary elections in the context of adult franchise and disclosing the results within hours of the closing of the ballot boxes, the inability to hold the G. C. E. (O. L.) Examination of full educational franchise seems inexplicable. All that we can say is that the Department of Examinations has not developed itself in proportion to the growth of the magnitude of the G. C. E. (O. L.) Examination. The Machinery of Examinations must now receive space craft service to cope with the rocketing G. C. E. (O. L.) Examination.

headway in India but frankly I am of opinion that with more sober dress habits etc. in Ceylon in the near future there will be no acute misery caused by a population explosion. Our birth rate (around 2.5-1) was one of the highest in the world but as now fallen. More and more food is being produced. Hand spun clothes can partly fill our wardrobes. We can build vertically with economy of space instead of horizontally. It is true that the social services section of our national budget has reached its breaking point but individuals have more money than before and should be made to pay partly for education, health etc. Many more things like this can be done and in this connection I wish to emphasise that Saivaites Hindus can never condone the killing of a life which has already come into existence in the name of population policy. My view is that Ceylon can comfortably maintain a population of 15-18 millions provided people mend their ways.
