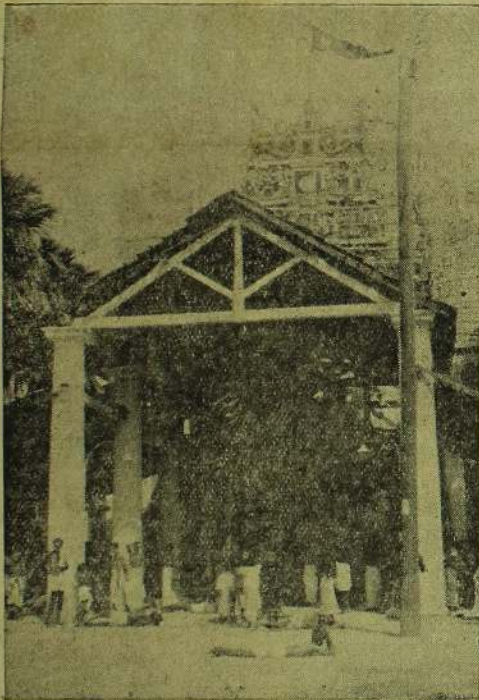

Motor Transport in Malaysia

Mr. P. Mailvaganam, who saw the small mosquito 6-seater one-man driven and conducted omnibuses grow into the present huge 64-seater buses, retires as Office Manager of the largest pioneer Bus Company in Malaysia, The Sri Jaya Transport Company (PTN) Limited, after 41 years in the transport business.

Mr. Mailvaganam came to Malaya in the year 1926, and after a brief spell of services with the Times of Malaya Press, Ipoh and The Malayan Daily Express, Kuala Lumpur, entered Government Service, then Chief Architect's Office Malaya, houses in the present Bank Negara Building. Finding the advancement slow as a snail, he chose to enter into commercial enterprises and joined Messrs. Wearne Brothers Limited, Kuala Lumpur, in May, 1928. Wearnes were then operating the Yellow Top Taxi Services, renowned throughout the world for catering for tourists. Later in 1935, Wearnes were the pioneers who systematically brought into existence the operation of the mosquito buses by forming the General Transport Company (FMS) Limited at a time when mosquito buses were operated by individual bus owners. It was at this time that one Mr. Nelson from the London Transport, was sent by the British Government to organise the road transport industry in the then British Malaya.

Mr. Mailvaganam could remember that he heard Mr. Nelson telling the individual bus operators at statutory meetings, that he was sent to Malaya by the British Government to organize the omnibus transport which had a lot of waste-

ful competition then, and run in the lines that buses had to wait for intending passengers and that he was here in Malaya to reverse that procedure, by getting the intending passengers to wait for the buses in recognised bus stops.

Mr. Nelson formed about 55 groups of limited or private bus companies throughout the length and breadth of Malaya and proceeded to Ceylon, the premier Crown Colony of the far flung British Empire then, to put transport in the lines as he did in Malaya. It was at this time of Mr. Nelson's arrival in Malaya that Mr. Mailva-ganam was transferred from Wearne Brothers Limited, Kuala Lumpur, to the aforesaid new transport company called The General Transport Company (FMS) Limited which under the able captainship of Mr. G. H. Hunt, who was the General Manager of this Company for over a period of 21 years from 1946 to 1967, grew up to become the largest and premier omnibus company in Malaysia.

Indian Congress in Confusion

Political developments in the Union of India have assumed a very intriguing turn keeping every one guessing as to what would follow next in the affairs of this great sub-continent of Asia. The success of the former Vice-President, Shri V. V. Giri, at the Presidential Stakes has to be analysed from several data for a true assessment of the situation to be made.
