However, the Parishad, within its about forty branches all over the Archipelago, represents ten million Hindus in Indonesia. It runs an Indonesian monthly magazine, 'Varta Hindu Dharma'. Owing to their poor financial conditions, the members of the Parishad find it difficult to participate in the International Conferences outside Indonesia. The organizations that invite them may take notice of this fact. However they liked the of holding some All Indonesia or International Hindu Conference in Bali. The idea may be encouraged by others also. Here one thing is noticeable. Though the Parishad is not a government institution the Government of Indonesia gives full recognition to it. Regarding Hindus nothing is without the consultation of the Parishad. I avail myself of this opportunity to make a clarion call in the name of all Hindus, especially in India and South-East Asia, to come forward and extend their invaluable help to the Parishad, so that Hinduism should regain its glory in Indonesia.

Sri Sastriji is a Sanskrit scholar with good knowledge of English and Indonesian. He has translated a number of Sanskrit works into Indonesian. Many of the young Sanskrit scholars in Bali and other parts of Indonesia have got instruction and inspiration from him. He is a storehouse of information. About twenty-five years ago Sastriji came to Indonesia from India to promote the cause of Hindu Dharma. One cannot simply imagine now how difficult it was at that time to start some Hindu work. Even the Hindus were not ready to call themselves Hindus. In their view, the country of their origin, Bharatavarsha, had been submerged in the waters and the present inhabitants of India, Hindus were none but Muslims! This confusion was the sheer result of the wrong impres-

sion given by the Khojas (Muslims) from Gujarat. Even when they agreed to call themselves Hindus, they did not like to be in the line of 'Indian Hindus'. Thus they claimed to be 'Bali Hindus'. But now the position is quite different. Now they have come to be convinced that there is no difference between them and the Hindus in India. Now they do not like to add any epithet to 'Hindu'. Recently they passed a resolution, demanding that instead of being called 'Bali Hindu' they should be called simply 'Hindu', as there was no difference between one Hindu and another.

Anyhow, Sastriji is a wonderful personality. He can convince you of the immediate necessity of Hindu work in Indonesia. He can give you good lessons, also, in comparative studies.

Offerings to household gods and small shrines in the home is quite common among Hindus in Bali. Most temples are dedicated to Bhagavan Siva, though Brahma, Vishnu and Krishna are also popular. Though the Hindus in Bali believe in one god, they do not refuse to accept His manifestations. Here the temples usually do not have any idols. Even if there

are the idols, they are more or less for decorative purposes. At the time of ceremonies, the priests bring their own idols and after the ceremonies are often held, accompanied by dance performances, and whenever dance performances take place, the wonderful music resounds the air. Temples, shrines, sacrificial altars are ubiquitous in Bali, in the mountains, valleys, plains and beaches. The numerous Tjandis (shrines) still attract the devotees in thousands. The anniversary of the temples is an important event and subject to the making of feast and banquets throughout the year. The Balinese New Year is celebrated once in 210 days.

Alike the Hindus anywhere else, the Hindus in Bali have faith in Karma (the result of one's own action), Tunitisan (reincarnation), and Moksha (state of Perfection and Emancipation). The ten basic principles of Balinese life are: Ahimsa (non-violence), Brahmakari (continence), Satia (truthful), Aviawahara (to avoid quarrelling), Antenia (non-stealing), Akroda (freedom from anger), Guru Susrusa (respect for teacher, parents and government), Sotja (righteousness) Ahara Lagawa (less eating) and Apramada (alertness).

Letter to the Editor

'Adult Education'

Sir,

We are a poor nation in which a salaried individual who has two square meals a day is looked upon as a hero by his fellow-villagers. In addition to the lakhs of children of school going age who do not attend any school we have also talks of adults who hold even an elementary school text book in reverential awe. However we are supposed to have a literacy rate of 85% which is very high and one of the highest in South East Asia but can one overlook that fact that ballot papers with symbols against the names of candidates are the order of the day and further this sort of international parochialism which prompts comparison of our country with poorer neighbours helps no one. It must also be noted that on the whole Asia is looked upon as an economically and educationally backward region. The object of this letter is to invite attention to the problem of adult education which is being tackled in their respective areas by western nations and on a world-wide level by the U. N. E. S. C. O.

In a Democracy the quality of the individual voter counts a lot in deciding the quality of the administration. The press and the platform are two fine mediums of adult education. Unfortunately the platform in the Ceylon of today is dominated by politicians to whom 'all is fair in politics'. With a general election due early in 1970 the latest potential voters must band together and pay more attention to the truth and quality of contents of politicians' speeches. Those who read newspapers must take it upon themselves to educate their less fortunate brethren in how to think and vote better. Newspapers should pay honest attention to the truth and it would be better if they foster a spirit of

universalism in the individual reader. It is really ironical that Tamils who take great pride in the words 'மா தும ன் ன் ன் மாவ கும் கேள்வி' should be regarded as highly selfish, conservative and narrow-minded at individual level. What is wanted is a mass movement at all Island level where those organising adult education programmes and those benefitting by them would join hands in a worthwhile venture which should not end with the elections but go on for ever and be free to the maximum extent possible from interference by government and politicians.

Men like Navalur, Gandhi and Nehru were adult educators par excellence, for they placed their deep knowledge and wisdom at the disposal of those who flocked to hear them and thus shared a high and decent educational companionship with the masses. Writer-commentators like Rajaji are doing noble work in this connection along with many newspaper and magazine editors and staff writers. Poet-writers like our own beloved குளவையார் should not be forgotten. All educated men should bear in mind that when on the move they have an obligation to improve the mental capacity of their less fortunate brethren who come into contact with them and there-

VACUUM VACANCIES

The stereotyped statement of Ministers including the Premier about unfilled vacancies is 'that immediate action is being taken to absorb the unemployed'. The Education Department, for instance, has the largest number of unemployed. Graduates and non-graduates alike have waited for weeks, months, years and even decades for the mercy of the powers that be. Even the examination that was held several months ago to choose assistant teachers for teaching English has not been concluded in the sense that the selection has not been made despite the fact that the matter is of paramount importance. What is the Department doing in this matter? Is the machinery impotent?

The fast unto death that was undertaken by the leader of the Unemployed Graduates' Union has been called off by the persuasion of two Tamil speaking Members of Parliament on their assurance that the grievances would soon be redressed. We are surprised to learn that these M.P.s. have taken upon themselves a gigantic responsibility considering the fact that the Minister of Education has for long failed to remedy the situation.

Strikes and stoppage of work have systematically suffocated the progress of the people with the result that in the present trend of the political philosophy of the leaders of the Leftists, the country is being held to ransom till complete revolution is achieved. Can this be tolerated? And yet there are unfilled vacancies!

fore should be very careful about their speech and action. The chairman of the N. C. H. E. (Dr. G. P. M.) once said that the people in ancient times were well educated through religious discourses by monks. S. Mani Bagavathar but we need many more like him. One has also to note and feel grateful for what the 'Hindu Organ' and 'இந்திராஜா' and their editors are doing to spiritually enlighten and improve the life and thoughts of both the literate and the semiliterate. The people of Kopay North would do well to erect a statue and also open an adult education centre to honour Sabapathy Navalar. Other areas in Jaffna and elsewhere can follow suit. Books in the vernacular in simple prose on Navalar, Gandhi, Nehru and others like them are welcome. There should be cheaply priced. In other words a popular movement in the name of adult education and the mental upliftment of the masses is an urgent need. This besides anything else would help to wean ordinary folk away from indulgence in bad habits during after work hours.

The Radio is also a good medium of adult education. However in Ceylon it is looked upon as a super luxury item. Further the good work done through an adult education programme of the C. B. C. would be offset by the top variety romantic melodies of the commercial service. As for the cinema it has its uses and the D. M. K. in India used it successfully for mass political propaganda. This is also a form of education. However it so happens that film goes retain more of the images of the chief actors rather than those of the characters portrayed or their sayings. Thus as an adult education medium the cinema is a double-edged weapon. The stage is better for the purpose if it is connected with a well established adult education centre.

In India parents study from their children but Ceylon parents are reluctant to follow suit. Husbands can educate their wives. Gandhi tried to teach Kasturba the Hindi alphabet but the
