CENTENARY THAT COUNTS HIGH

Gandhiji's Inspiration Must Goad Us To Serve Others

The Information Service of India, functioning in the High Commission of India, Colombo, has favoured us with the choicest writings of Mahatma Gandhi for republication in the interest of our readers.

Ideal Society

(Gandhiji found the picture of his free India in its essentials embodied in a song that was sung at one of his evening prayers in Bhangi Colony, New Delhi. It gripped him. He translated it into English and had it sent to Lord Pethick-Lawrence. It was as follows.)

We are inhabitants of a country
Where there is no sorrow and no suffering,
Where there is no illusion nor anguish,
no delusion nor desire,
Where flows the Ganges of love
and the whole creation is full of joy,
Where all minds flow in one direction,
and where there is no occasion for sense of time,
All have their wants satisfied;
Here all better is just,
Here all are cast in any shape or form,
No high no low, no master no slave;
All is light, yet no burning heat.
That country is within you—
It is Swaraj Swadeshi,
The home within you—
VICTORY! VICTORY! VICTORY!
He realizes it who longs for it,
(What emerged was a picture of the India of his dreams)

A picture of a casteless and classless society, in which there are no vertical divisions but only horizontal; no high, no low; all service has equal status and carries equal wages; those who have more, use their advantage not for themselves but as a trust to serve others who have less; the motivating factor in the choice of vocations is not personal advancement but self expression and self-realisation through the service of society.

Essence of Democracy

Democracy must in essence mean the art and

science of mobilizing the entire physical, economic and spiritual resources of all the various sections of the people in the services of the common good of all.

The very essence of democracy is that every person represents all the varied interests which compose the nation. It is true that it does not exclude and should not exclude special representation of special interests, but such representation is not its test. It is a sign of its imperfection.

In the true democracy of India the unit is the village.... True democracy cannot be worked by twenty men sitting at the centre. It has to be worked from below by the people of every village.

Surely, timidity has no place in democracy, where people in general believe in and want a particular thing. Their representatives have but to give shape to their demand and make it feasible.

The truest test of democracy is in the ability of anyone to act as he likes so long as he does not injure the life or property of any one else. It is impossible to control public morals by hooliganism.

Democracy comes naturally to him who is habituated to yield willing obedience to all laws. Let those who are ambitious to serve democracy qualify themselves by satisfying first this acid test of democracy. Moreover, a democrat must be utterly selfless. He must think and dream not in terms of self or party but only of democracy.

should be satisfied with drawing the Government's attention to mistakes. They could remove the Government if they wished to. But they should not obstruct them by agitating against them.

Let us not push the mandate theory to ridiculous extremes and become slaves to resolutions of majorities. That would be a revival of brute force in a more virulent form. If rights of minorities are to be respected, the majority must tolerate and respect their opinion and action... It will be the duty of the majority to see to it that the minorities receive a proper hearing and are not otherwise exposed to insults.

I have repeatedly observed that no school of thought can claim a monopoly of right judgment. We are all liable to err and are often obliged to revise our judgments. In a vast country like this, there must be room for all schools of honest thought. And the least, therefore,

"GRATITUDE"

Sir, — It is a tragedy of the times we live in that when writing about gratitude one has to write more about ingratitude than about the nobleness of gratitude. In Kural Thiruvalluvar might have said

“காலத்தினுற் செய்த நன்றி சிறிதெனினு, ஞாலத்தின் மானப்பெறு”

but in the context of times getting things done or getting oash and kind from some one has come to mean nothing from the angle of satisfactory human relations and feeling. The demon may give with a good heart but the recipient in more cases than one looks upon the whole transaction as the outcome of his own cleverness. In the sphere of knowledge and obtaining of it another Kural is apt viz.

“எப்பொருள் யார் யார் வாய்க் கேட்பினும் அப்பொருள் மெய்ப்பொருள் காண்பதறிவு”

One must be a discerning listener to get at the true substance of what another says and if one who benefits by it must be grateful to the speaker concerned. In course of one's daily peregrinations one may be beset with several difficulties and a wayrider of nondescript appearance may help. The help must be remembered without the recipient of the favour imagining himself entitled to it on account of status etc. If a retired teacher recognises a student the student should be gratefully happy that he has been both recognized and remembered. Teachers have the pleasure of being gratefully remembered by thousands but this is a handicap for students become somebody in the course of time and may join the rest of society in looking down upon the teacher. Further remembering details about students is a burden on one's memory, time etc. for today the teacher is in the unfortunate plight of having to crave the recognition of a student

who is somebody. A teacher should be gratefully remembered not only by individual students but by the school in which he served and society at large including parents of his children. This need not be over done and it is ridiculous to over emphasise this but there has to be a touch of honest gratitude and respectful remembrance about the whole affair. Again how far should a patient be grateful to the doctor who attends to him in a Government hospital or for that matter how far should patients remember a doctor in private practice. The doctor gains both money and experience through attending to his patients and can't the patient call the whole matter quits on account of this reason. However one must remember that Doctors not merely heal but also help in the matter of rehabilitation of the handicapped patient and all receiving treatment are handicapped to some degree or other. The Doctor has a skill which is unique and valuable and thus he deserves special remembrance. Dr. Miller of America treated the late Mr. C. N. A. of India and became well-known to millions of Indians. The patient died but the Doctor's skill was never in doubt. Should Dr. Miller and his wife gratefully remember Mr. C. N. A. for having helped to raise their prestige abroad. I don't think so.

MOVING WITH THE MAHATMA

The occasion of the celebration of the Centenary of the greatest devotee of self-less service must certainly inspire the participants with a rare sense of patriotic feeling. The world, as it is today, has been rent asunder by the most menacing features of evil tendencies leading to instant destruction of all that is dear to human civilization. Hence the very repetition of the most magnetic name of Mahatma Gandhi must be able to make mankind think of better human conduct that can save the world from colossal wreckage.

The organizers of the Gandhiji Centenary have out of great devotion to the cause and the hero planned a very extensive program of celebration of the epoch-making event—the Centenary of the Century. In fact this is a cosmopolitical centenary that provides for a program of moral re-armament in order to equip humanity against the treacherous trend of barbarism that is threatening to uproot the structure of sober thought and action. It is therefore essential that the celebrations should be symbolic of the cause. Hence the need for those who identify themselves with the Celebrations to embark on a service of spade-work depicting the different aspects of Gandhian patriotism. We would expect leaders of the Centenary Celebrations to conduct

- (a) Spinning and weaving activities
(b) house to house preaching for total prohibition
(c) inter racial, and inter communal seminars.

Above all the organizers must set a supreme example of sincere remembrance of the world leader by translating into true action all ideas that they have themselves repeated as preached by the Mahatma. Let us merely repeat here the weighty words of Gandhiji on

'Duties and Rights'. Said he significantly: In Swaraj based on Ahimsa, people need not know their rights but it is necessary for them to know their duties.

that we owe to ourselves as to others is to try to understand the opponent's view-point and, if we cannot accept it, respect is as fully as we expect him to respect ours. It is one of the indispensable tests of a healthy public life.

Intolerance, discourtesy and harshness...are taboo in all good society and are surely contrary to the spirit of democracy.

Evolution of democracy is not possible if we are not prepared to hear the other side. We shut the doors of reason when we refuse to listen to our opponents or having listened, make fun of them. If intolerance becomes a habit, we run the risk of missing the truth.

The openness of mind strengthens the truth in us and removes the dross from it, if there is any

I ask you not to be cowed down by the thought of a small minority. It is sometimes a privilege I have so often said that I would love to be in the minority of one, because this artificial majority, which is the result of the masses' reverence for me, is a clog in my progress. But for the clog I would hurl defiance...

Role of Education

The ancient aphorism, 'Education is that which liberates', is as true today as it was before. Education here does not mean mere spiritual knowledge, nor does liberation after death. Knowledge includes all training that is useful for the service of mankind and liberation means freedom from all manner of servitude even in the present life

Servitude is of two kinds: slavery to domination from outside and to one's own artificial needs. The knowledge acquired in the pursuit of this ideal alone constitutes true study.

Persistent questioning and healthy inquisitiveness are the first requisite for acquiring learning of any kind. Inquisitiveness should be tempered by humility and respectful regard for the teacher. It must not degenerate into impudence. The latter is the enemy of the receptivity

of mind. There can be no knowledge without humility and the will to learn.

Education must be of a new type for the sake of the world. It is not literacy or learning which makes a man, but education for real life

National Education to be truly national must reflect the national condition for the time being.

Literary education should follow the education of the hand—the one gift that visibly distinguishes man from beast. It is a superstition to think that the fullest development of man is impossible without a knowledge of the art of reading and writing. That knowledge undoubtedly adds grace to life, but it is in no way indispensable for man's moral, physical, or material growth.

I hold that true education of the intellect can only come through a proper exercise and training of the bodily organs, e. g., hands, feet, eyes, ears, nose etc. In other words, an intelligent use of the bodily organs in a child provides the best and quickest way of developing his intellect.

at least for political survival.

The language line adopted by a political leader in 1956 paid ample dividends and even parties and mature political leaders who had advocated parity earlier took the line though belatedly of course, so as not to be left behind in the unholy scramble for power, at any cost.

The District Council question, which had the support of Wilmot Perera, and two Sinhalese Permanent Secretaries, Political Leaders, including 100% support of one of the leaders, and mentioned in Throne Speeches for several years, by succeeding Governments raised a storm of protest from these very political leaders and parties, when it was presented in the House.

Another disturbing factor is the dishonesty in high places. There was the case of a Vice-Chancellor who gave false impressions of marks at

Scholarship Board Meetings so as to keep out deserving students and ensure the chances of those in whom he was interested. He was caught in the act. However he got away with it.

It would appear that not only Communalism has come to stay but also that 'Federalism' is the only solution. The observation made by no less an authority than an architect of the present Constitution, namely Rees, in an article headed 'The Evolution of the Common Wealth', has much significance in this context. 'In a plural Society the different communities will demand representation as communities; but communalism is not a good basis for Government. It perpetuates Sectionalism. In Ceylon the Soulbury Commission did what it could to eliminate communalism from political life. Unfortunately the issue has been inflamed by the proposal to make Sinhalese the official language. This has alienated the Tamils and raised an emotional issue difficult to deal with rationally.'

Leghorn in his minute of 1-6-1799 had pointed out 'Two different nations from a very ancient period have divided the land'.

Those whom God has put asunder no man can join together.
