



Treasurer's Report

I have great pleasure in writing this brief report for this souvenir which is being published to mark the 29th anniversary Over the last 28 years BUDS have donated approximately £550,000 for various charitable organisation in Batticaloa Region. During the financial year ended 30 September 2015 BUDS has donated £10,000 to our Batticaloa branch this is in addition to the money held already in our BUDS Batticaloa bank accounts to continue the charitable activities.

The foster care programme is also a great success and currently 35 children are benefitting. In the last financial year We have spent Rs 1,275,450 for this programme.

The Thiraimadu self-study centre was a great success and over 100 children from that area were benefitted. The project ended and had been handed over to local women association.

In the financial year ended 30 September BUDS Batticaloa branch successfully initiated and implemented a major educational classes in 5 various centres. This programme was initiated by our Batticaloa branch president Mr Sathiyanathan, who is the zonal director of Education Department. The total cost of the project is 1.2 million rupees and BUDS contributed 764,953 rupees and the balance by Worldvision.

In the current financial year we have donated the following.

Swami Vipulananda Children Development centre - Rs 300,000

YMCA - Rs 200,000 Ozgnam - Rs 200,000

Small charities such as ours are finding increasingly difficult to raise funds due to many factors. To enable us to continue serving the needy society and achieve our goal we need more financial assistance from the diaspora in the UK. It would be greatly appreciated if you would donate generously to make this a reality

Considering the charity work undertaken and the commitment of the members and the long standing of the Organization, we wish the BUDS-UK generate more funds and contribution and thereby the event become success.



THE HISTORY OF BATTICALOA UNDERPRIVILEGED DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY (BUDS)

Batticaloa University Development Society (BUDS) was founded in 1986 in the UK, with the main objective of providing support and assistance to the Eastern University, which itself was in its infancy.

Initially BUDS was able to provide support in the form of

- Books for the Library
- Equipments for the laboratory (Nuclear Magnetic Resonance Spectroscope and Infra-Red Spectroscope)

After the Eastern University became fully operational; with the funding for building, staff & equipment, it was felt that the BUDS support for Eastern University would be minimal. Hence, the objectives were diversified to support and to assist the educational needs and other social and cultural needs of the underprivileged of East Sri Lanka.

In summer 1998, the constitution of the organization was redesigned in preparation to apply for charity status and its name was changed to Batticaloa Underprivileged Development Society, but the acronym BUDS was retained. In June 2000 it was accepted as a registered charity with the England and Wales charity commission.

The diversified objectives of BUDS are

- Providing Financial Assistance to Orphanages
- Providing Educational support to Underprivileged children
- Providing Medical Equipment to Hospitals
- Providing Financial Assistance to Local NGOs to conduct Health Clinics & special Medical

Screening programs in remote rural areas and in the UK.

In the year 2005 it was recognized that a branch association for BUDS at the grass root level in the location of its activities would help to provide its service more effectively and efficiently. Hence, in September 2005, Batticaloa branch of BUDS was inaugurated and in November 2006 it was awarded the Registered Charity status (Voluntary Organization) in Sri Lanka. One of the main objectives was to assist orphanages.


From 2012, the organisations have been requested to submit an income generating project for running their homes on their own. Accordingly, the following homes started their project. The initial payment was paid in the year 2013

NATURAL DISASTERS & ETHNIC CONFLICT

The year 2004 was marked by the TSUNAMI which devastated Sri Lanka, the Eastern Province the worst. Thousands of people lost their lives and hundreds of thousands were rendered homeless. BUDS swung to action on 27th of December and played the pivotal role in getting all the different organisations of the EP under one umbrella, to effectively serve the people at home. Tsunami Disaster Relief Coordinating Committee (TDRCC) was formed to spearhead the relief work. The following organisations joined the BUDS in this massive project.

Amparai District Vipulananda Rehabilitation Organisation (ADVRO)

Kaluwanchkudi Welfare Society

Shivananda Vidyalaya Past Pupils Association

St Michaels College Alumni Association - UK

Vincent Old Girls Association

The members worked tirelessly and collected over GBP 130,000. Some of the projects implemented were: Immediate relief in the form of cooked food, Dry rations, Kitchen utensils & Clothing. We sent one container load of used cloths and medicines.





Construction of Temporary Shelters and Educational Assistance to children in the camps.

Construction of 5 Permanent Houses (£15,000) through Ramakrishna Mission. Installing Tube Wells through Ramakrishna Mission in the affected areas (£1,650).

Provision of a new Tractor & Trailer to an orphanage to partly sustain their income & training purposes (Through ADVRO -£17,675) Various other relief work were completed through other NGOs, namely; Eastern Human Economics Development (EHED) £28,000, Lions club £2,000, St Michaels college £7,650, Vincent PPA £5,000, Shivananda OBA £5,500, Prisoners Welfare Association £500, ADVRO £17,675 & Batticaloa Medical association £6,000.

Following the Natural disaster, the man-made ethnic conflict saw an escalation in the number of displaced from Muthur & Vaharai, making Batticaloa a sea of refugees. This was in addition to recurrent floods in the area. Each time, BUDS with the help of the dedicated Batticaloa BUDS committee members, was able to support the community with dry rations, clothing, books, uniforms & shoes.

In 2007, dry rations and other essential items including infant milk powder items worth Rs 200,000 was distributed to refugees from Vaharai, who were displaced to refugee camps in the Mankadu area.

In 2008, BUDS Batticaloa has worked jointly with IRO (Inter Religious Organization) to support the refugees displaced from Muthur (Trincomalle district). Cost Rs.200,000

In 2009, Rs. 198,700.00 was spent for few university students of Vanni, studying at Eastern University, who were unable to get back home when their life was in danger. Rs .180,000 was spent for Vanni IDP Children through Bishop of Mannar.

In 2011 floods, 579 families from following locations were provided Dry rations worth of Rs 930/= per family

FLOOD RELIEF 2011









21,750 exercise books (80 pages @20.75) 15,000excercise books (160 pages @37.50) were distributed to 27 Schools in the Batticaloa District. Shoes & Slippers were issued to some of the needy schools.

In 2012, Livelihood Assistance was paid to a war victim (Rs 100,000).

Post Tsunami assessment of the 'BUNDS' (Batticaloa project) was undertaken by University of Surrey. BUDS contributed £ 950.

EDUCATION

Foster care Project

After the Tsunami disaster in 2004 and the ethnic conflict, most of the affected children's education & life was disturbed. It is better for the parentless children to be free of the stigma 'Orphans' and would be better to grow up with their uncles, aunties & cousins to enjoy the warmth of their family. BUDS-UK identified Association for Educational development of Underprivileged (AEDU) as a suitable partner for running Educational projects of BUDS. Accordingly, we joined AEDU in the 'FOSTERCARE PROJECT'.

In the beginning, the number of children catered by this project was 105. Subsequently the number has reduced, because the other donors came forward to assist these children and also the financial position of some children has improved. At present 36 children are being benefited through BUDS Foster care project, consisting students from Grade 5 to University level. Best way –UK is supporting 10

children in Batti and Trinco each, under this project since December 2011. A sum of Rs. 2830 is being paid to each child monthly. Periodical monitoring & individual assessment is made by the dedicated AEDU members, visiting the child's home & school. We would appreciate more donors so that we could increase the number of recipients. Monthly £15 contribution will help a child. The amount donated By BUDS through AEDU from 2005 is Rs 7,344,800.00

Self Study Centre - AEDU @ Thiraimadu-Panichayadi

This project was implemented from August 2011 up to July 2014 (3 years) with the co-participation of the Women Rural Development Society (WRDS) Panichayadi. The place is also called 'Swiss Village' as it was redeveloped by Switzerland after the Tsunami. BUDS-UK and MIOT jointly funded this project. This project was meant for the children who were affected by Tsunami and had hindrance to their education at homes after school, due to various environmental disturbances. Either they didn't have enough room at home or were disturbed by other inmates. The classes are from 6-8pm. The students complete their homework and teachers are in attendance to help with their queries. The beneficiaries numbered around 100 at the start. We made use of the WRDS community hall and furnished it with tables, chairs & kitchen utensils.

During the period of this project the children were provided with the following facilities.

- Comfortable class room furniture
- 2 Daily Nutritional drink
- 3 Guidance and Supervision of senior Teachers
- 4 Electricity payment to the Centre
- 5 Equipment for preparation of Nutritional drink
- 6 Study materials
- 7 Prize giving as appreciation of educational progress.
- 8 Nominal pay for the teachers

A sum of Rs. 1,045,572/= has been spent on this project.

This project has been taken over by the WRDS and being continued by them. Around 50 students are still utilising this Study Centre.

In 2012, we assisted Kaluwanchkudi Welfare Society in the project 'Progress Towards Target'. Students who did well in the A/L but failed to get a place in the Universities were trained in spoken & written English to progress in their future options (£800).

In 2014, a sum of Rs. 205,000 was donated to Civil Society, Batticaloa for distribution of exercise books among students from Batticaloa West Education Zone.





'Enhancement of Educational Performance in Batticaloa West Education Zone'

The Bishop of Batticaloa Rt Rev Ponniah in his recent visit to the UK, requested the BUDS to help the education of the children in Paduwankarai. The Zonal Director of Education of West Zone Mr. Sathianathan, his staff and his associates from BUDS Batti made this a reality for the O/L students this year.

The project was implemented in 3 Divisions of Batticaloa West Education Zone. The Project intended to improve the performance in G.C.E. (O/L) examination – 2014. For this, 15 classes were organized in 9 centres in 3 Divisions of the Zone.

Extra classes and model examinations were conducted in 5 core subjects viz; Tamil Language, English, Mathematics, History and Science. Classes were conducted for 15 days (Saturdays and Public Holidays) commencing from 6 September 2014, each day for 6 hours. Rs. 500.00 was paid per hour to the Resource Persons. More than 50 Resource Personal conducted classes and examinations. Model question papers were provided to the students and instructions given for answering the papers. The total payments to the Resource Persons amounted to Rs. 577,125. The 'World Vision' came forward as a valuable partner in this worthy venture, having granted the payments amounting to Rs 244,500.

An interim evaluation and the opinion expressed by the students revealed the greatest satisfaction of them and the hope for the best performance in the examination.

BUDS-Batticaloa is grateful to the Zonal Director of Education-Batticaloa West Zone and his Staff for the immense help extended in implementing this Project. They were monitoring and supervising the project activities.

HEALTH

Medical Clinic

We have conducted Medical Clinics in Harrow & Edmonton area for the Sri Lankan expatriates in the past. Checking for high blood pressure, Diabetes & Cholesterol has helped many old people who couldn't communicate in English.

SICU

Friends of Batticaloa Hospitals (FOBH) initiated and planned in collaboration with BUDS, a building for the SURGICAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT (SICU) at Batticaloa Hospital. BUDS donated £5000 for this needy project. An Australian organization provided the equipments. The SICU was opened in 2012 and has vastly improved the management of the seriously ill patients.

BUDS provided Rs 400,000 to Batticaloa Hospital towards replacement of the camera for an Endoscope, used to look into the intestines.

We supported the Cancer Society of Batticaloa with funds to help the patients' travelling & accommodation, when they visit Maharagama.

In 2012, a child with Heart disease received Rs 24,000 for assistance to go to Colombo for treatment.



EYE CAMP

In 2013, BUDS UK joined the Medical Institute Of Tamils (MIOT-UK) and conducted an Eye camp in Batticaloa hospital, where 125 cataract & plastic surgery were performed for poor patients from Vaharai to Maha Oya. Three volunteer surgeons travelled from the UK paying their own costs. BUDS Batticaloa provided transport, food and lodging for many of these patients and arranged clinics in remote area such as Vellaveli. We hope to repeat this worthy project.

FAMILY UNION

BUDS organized two cricket & sports festivals during summer successfully, to get the families together in the UK. Children had sack race & buns race; ladies Netball and the boys Football & cricket. Everyone enjoyed freshly made Vadai, Hoppers, Koththu, Buriani & Ice cream.


