ANNUAL REPORT - 1979

Your Excellency,*

This is your first official visit to St. Joseph's as President of Sri Lanka. This is the first time you preside at our Prize-Giving, thus adding lustre to a long line of eminent men who have done so before. Recently you came to St. Joseph's to pay your last respects to a distinguished priest of St. Joseph's and a long-standing friend. We like to consider you a friend of St. Joseph's, and it is as such we welcome you.

We take pride in the fact that a Josephian is your Prime Minister, and a Josephian your Minister of Justice to usher in your Dharmista Society, not to mention a number of other Josephians who render loyal service to your Government.

In the midst of onerous duties of State you have taken time off to be the Chief Guest at our Prize-Giving today. We ourselves would have suffered a certain sense of guilt in drawing you away from more urgent obligations, if not for the reason that we owe a debt of gratitude to you and your Government to which we would like to give public expression. Your Government's decision to end twenty years of the disabilities suffered by our schools as a result of the infamous Act of 1960, we consider a truly historic decision-historic in the annals of denominational education. We are aware that you were determined to put to right the injustices suffered by our schools, and though with the passage of years we may have tended to grow somewhat timid and less insistent in asking for redress, it was a most courageous and generous decision you took in cabinet to grant us our rights.

It is when such decisions are made that politics ends and statesmanship begins, and you have demonstrated during your tenure of office as President, that you have long since graduated from politics to statesmenship. As the first democratically elected President of Sri Lanka, you are to the people, to us, the sign and symbol of the nation's aspiration to national unity and social justice. You symbolise the people's yearning for "iustitia", for the "compassio" of Bucchism, and the "caritas" of Christianity. We are fortunate that at this critical period in the island's history you are at the helm of affairs. In the contemporary political scene there is none who can match your record of experience and knowledge of politics and statecraft. Your sterling qualities of integrity, incorruptibility, dedication to work, sense of justice and fairplay, transparent sincerity, and freedom from doctrinaire politics, give you a masterly self-possession which enables you to be totally at the service of the nation. It is our fervent wish that, under your charismatic leadership, the entire nation will rally round you to usher in an era of prosperity for the masses of this country.

Finally, Sir, I would like to pay tribute to your dedication to the universal values and ideals of Buddhism. They are not alien to our Christian faith. The highest authority in the Church has urged us to join hands with our non-catholic brethren to foster those ideals. This may be one reason why you have an appeal to the Christian conscience. You are also wedded to the secular ideals of socialism and democracy, and when you declared Sri Lanka a democratic and socialist Republic, you symbolically freed these two words from the monopoly of a totalitarian creed.

The presence in our midst of the first lady of the land, Mrs. J. R. Jayewardene, adds grace and colour to this occasion. Her quiet and unassuming manner and her homely qualities are a credit to the women of Sri Lanka. We are glad she is associated with us this morning as a silent witness and sharer of our joy and gratitude. Please accept, gracious lady, our sincere thanks.

Last year, when the Honourable Prime Minister presided at our Prize-Giving, my predecessor in office prophetically declared that the moment of truth hed come for the Government to demonstrate the courage of its convictions by undoing the injustices perpetrated on schools like St. Joseph's. Within a year of these words being spoken, your Government has decided to correct these injustices.

When I look back on these twenty years of struggle and sacrifice by parents, staff, students, and my predecessors, I feel a sense of unworthiness to be privileged to reap the fruits of their labour. Our gratitude goes out to our Cardinal who took the courageous step, by a sheer act of faith, to keep these schools independent within the crippling conditions of the Act of 1960 - a senseless piece of legislation - intended to let our schools die a slow death. Many of the smaller schools no doubt succumbed, not for want of conviction, but for lack of cash. At the initial stages, the universal Church came to our aid, but as time went on the Welfare Societies composed of the parents, and old-boys, supported the school enthusiastically, and thus we were able to weather the storm. Our thanks are, therefore, due to our parents who bore the burden of double taxation in education; our loyal old-boys; our teachers who, though deprived of their pensionrights and of training facilities, still stood steadfastly by us.

The schools themselves were starved of educational resource-material for some time. The students were deprived of cadeting facilities. In short, we were the outcasts of the educational system. All this happened becaue this microscopic minority had the courage of its convictions. Successive governments, which recognised the injustice, gave promise but not fulfilment. It is, therefore, very courageous and magnanimous of the present government to end the injustice that had been perpetrated on our schools. No one should grudge this recognition of the right of the parents to choose the type of education they desire for their children, and to a just have of the expenditure on education to which they contribute by way of taxation. By giving aid to our schools you have affirmed and translated into action one of the fundamental freedoms guaranteed by the Universal Declartion of Human

Rights, as proclaimed by the United Nations and to which Sri Lanka is a signatory, namely, that "parents have a prior right to choose the kind of education that shall be given to their children." giving these schools a grant you affirm another fundamental right enshrined in democratic constitutions, that "the State shall not, in granting aid to educational institutions, discriminate against any educational institution on the ground that it is under the management of a minority, whether based on religion or language". By your decision to correct the anomaly of the non-fee levying private schools, and to give financial support to these schools, you have, as a democrat, affirmed two basic principles of democracy and of human rights. The blood, sweat, toil and tears of a generation of parents, teachers and educationists have finally borne fruit. Their enceavours have been rewarded. As the Lord said, "In your patience you shall possess your souls."

Now that this courageous step has been taken, it is our fervent hope that the machinery of government will be swifit to execute your will. Let not the Shakesperean lament about the "law's delay" be exemplified in this case. The drive at the centre must be matched by the enthusiasm at the circumference. May the year 1980, then, herald the dawn of a new era for non-fee levying private schools.

The decision to help our schools is but a part of the new thinking that is taking place on the role of the State in education in Sri Lanka. In fact, I would even go further and say that this is but a part of the broad compass of your political philosophy of liberation, the liberation of the individual from servile dependence on the State, and your firm belief that the individual should parteilipate in the entire political, social and economic process. You have taken steps to free the economy from the stranglehold of State socialism, and politics from centralisation, The vital energies of the people are tapped for social progress. It is in this linethat the Educational Reforms Committee has set about its ask; to free the educational process from bureauractic constraints; to depoliticise, de-centralise and re-structure the educational system.

It is with a view to this that the Education Service Commission and the National Education Council are to be established and community participation sought. The Educational Reforms Committee has analysed the evils of our educational system. What is now required is enthusiasm at all levels of society to put our educational house into order once and for all, on the correct lines. It is in this context that we would like to view your Government's decision to come to the aid of the non-fee levying private school and to bring them into the mainstream of the educational process. The State now assumes a new role in the life of the community. It seeks not to dominate but to serve, not to subjugate but to liberate, not to take-over but to control and co-ordinate, not to impose but to seek participation.

The most significant event during the past year was the change of Rectorship. Dr. Quintus G. Fernando, the former Rector. left for the United States on a scholarship to the University of Notre Dame, Indiana. His five years of Rectorship were full of achievement. The College was established on a sound financial basis. The Ground Development Project was brought to a auccessful conclusion. A modern turf wicket became a reality; a terraced concrete pathway along the edge of the College grounds was added to bring new beauty to the grounds, and there was a notable improvement in the aesthetic surroundings of the College. Two dental clinics were secured through the good offices of the Ministry of Health; the Premadasa Pavilion was initiated and half the funds for the project collected. These were some of the many achievements. Studies and discipline in the College made steady progress and the Nursery Department was given a modern orienation. Fr. Quintus Fernando was a versatile and dynamic personality who achieved much within a short time.

When called upon by His Grace, the Archbishop to assume the Rectorship, I had no illusions about the tremendous task I was called upon to undertake. It was the call of my Alma Mater where I had my entire education, from the Kindergarten to University Entrance Class, during two Rectorships, those of Rev. Fr. M. J. Le Goc and Rev. Fr. Peter Pillai, and the six years of experience gained as a member of the staff, as Principal of the Middle and Upper School from 1958 to 1964, that persuaded me to accept the responsibility. With a profound sense of my own unworthiness I seek the support of all parents, old-boys, staff, students and well-wishers to do my best for the greater glory of St. Joseph's.

I have to record with deep regret the passing away, at the ripe old age of eighty years, of Very Rev. Fr. D.J. Anthony, O.M.I. Thousands of Josephians, from the Prime M nister to the humblest old-boy paid homage to a great priest, educationist, writer and nationalist. Your Excellency paid the nation's tribute to him accompanied by the Prime Minister, the Minister of Education, the Hon, Ministerof Parliamentary Affairs and Sports, and the Minister of Cultural Affairs. I had the privilege of coming under the guidance of Fr. Anthonyas aboarder and a student of the C. llege and in the priesthood of as a personal friend and counsellor. It was a great honour, as Rector, to receive his mortal remains in the College Chapel. It is not possible within the compass of this report to pay full tribute to his life and career. He was Prefect of Studies, Prefect of Discipline, Prefect of Boarders, Vice-Rector and Acting Rector. He was General Manager, R. C. Schools, and the Principal of the Bolawalana Teacher Training College. A proliffic Sinhala writer and translator of the Bible into Sinhala, he was a stupendous and tireless worker. May God welcome him as His good and faithful servant to his Kingdom.

Another great Josephian passed away last year, none other than the indefatigable Mr. Anthony Abeysinghe, the former Josephian Football and Athletics Coach, and, up to the time of his death, National Athletic Coach. No Josephian of the last fifty years or so can forget this figure on the C llege grounds who brought fame to St. Joseph's in the field of Athletics. A teacher, coach and student counsellor, St. Joseph's owes him an unredeemable debt. A fervent Catholic, there is no doubt that his reward will will be great in heaven. These two Anthonys should inspire both

staff and students to greater effort and dedication in the cause of St. Joseph's.

On the 19th October, 1979, the College celebrated the 75th Anniversary of the birth of Rev. Fr. Peter Pillai, O. M. I. who was Rector of St. Joseph's for nearly twenty-one years. Rev. Fr. T. Kuriacose celebrated Mass and gave an inspiring sermon on the life of Fr. Peter Pillai, O.M.I. Later there was an exhibition of the life of Fr. Peter Pillai and talks were given in the three media by Messrs. Victor Gunawardena, D. M. Jayawardena and B. G. Emmanuel on the life and work of Fr. Peter Pillai. The intention was to give the students an understanding of the past history of the College, and to pay a tribute to a great Rector.

1979 marks the International Year of the Child. We have celebrated this year by an educational programme. A committee was set-up comprising both staffand students to bring into focus the rights of the child, for the benefit parents, staff and students and to society at large. The primary school celebrated the year with a dance and a play entitled, "A Child has Many Faces". A plan to organise classes for non-school-going children of the area was initiated, and although the response from parents was poor, we intend going ahead with classes for a small group as part of the on going tprogrammofor the Inter maional Year of the Child. With the passage of time, we hope that more children will join the classes. Thereby we hope to make use of the facilities at St. Joseph's, after school hours, for the less privileged children in the neighbourhood. The Nur ery Department celebrated the International Year of the Child by an Art & Craft Exhibition, and the upper school srtudents intend to comme morate it on the 16th of November this year. I thank the staff, and, the students who worked so enthusiastically to bring all this to fruition.

During the year we had a very distinguished visitor in the person of His Excellency Msgr. Lourduswamy. Sceretary of the Congregation for the Evangelisation of Peoples. He came in the distinguished company of His Excellency Msgr. N. Rotunno, the Apostolic Nuncio, and His Grace the Archbishop. He was conducted round the College and finally presided at an assembly of the students in the chapel where he addressed them and imparted his blessing to them.

During the year we lost the services of Rev, Fr. S. Fernandopulle O. M. I. who was the Burear, Prefect of Boarders, Prefect of Games and Spiritual Director. His transfer in the middle of the year caused anxiety, but Providence intervened. Rev. Fr. F. Renjith Perera was appointed Prefect of Boarders and Student Counsellor. Mr. Aloy Perera, an old-boy and a man of experience, was appointed Bursar, the first lay Bursar in the history of the College. This is a significant step taken to relive the priests of mundane tasks, so that they may be made available in a more meaningful way to the students and staff.

The following teachers left the staff during the period; Messrs. George Fennando, who after twelve years of dedicated service was a tireless worker, S.C.B. Seneviratne; C.O.A. Wickramaracheh and Rev. Sr. Lambert.

We welcome the following teachers: Messrs. A. S. R. Patrick; S. F. Kandiah; D. E. S. Weerakkody; A. Tillakaratne; Miss S. Sinnadurai; Mrs. C. Fernando; Mrs. S. B. Wijesinghe and Rev. Sr. Maria Goretti.

We hope they will emulate the Example of the great teachers of the past. I have a dedicated staff to collaborate with me, and my Vice-Rector to lighten the burdens of office.

Through the good offices of the Welfare Society, we intend to give incetives to our teachers by establishing benefits based on attendance and punctuality and, awards for long service of 25

years, and awards on retiremnt. These are incentives given to dedicated teachers who give of their best,

This year the Preparatory School joins with the College Section to have a common Prize-Giving. The Primary School is under the able guidance and supervision of Mr. W. D. J. Ratnasekera.

The Inter-House Athletics Meet at which Rev. Fr. Joe de Mel was the Chief Guest, was well organised and was a great success. The primary school's swimming meet was held with Mrs. C. Stephen, a veteran teacher of the school, as the Chief Guest.

Our primary school children, accompanied by the teachers, have gone on study tours to public institutions such as the Railway. Post Office, Market and the Police Station, and to the Botanical Gardens, Peradeniya, as a part of their environmental studies.

The teaching of religion is being updated through the valuable services of Rev. Fr. Don Sylvester, Director of Cthechetical Centre.

The parents of the primary school are very generous in their financial contributions for worthy causes. We are very grateful to them.

The following teachers left the staff during the period: Messrs. Merril de Fonseka; Harold de Silva; Rev. Srs. Nidosini; Agnesia; Misses Serena de Silva and A. Thomas. We thank these teachers for their services. We make special mention of Mr. Harold de Silva, a versatile teacher and one who had a real flair for organising sports meets.

We welcome the following teachers to the staff: Rev. Srs. Gerard and Benildus; Mrs. M. Kariyawasam; Mrs. A. Francis and Misses Sirima de Silva, Chitra Perera, Rachel Douglas and M. I. Sebastian.

My sincere thanks to the Principal and Staff of the Primary School for their dedicated service to the little children.

The Pre-school, under the able guidance of the Directress, Miss, Margie Silva had a year full of activities. The Kindergarden Sports Meet with Rev. Fr. Don Peter as the Chief Guest, was a great success and an exhibition of Arts and Crafts of the kiddies from Pre-school, Lower K. G. and Grade I, was held to commemorate the International Year of the Child talk on "The Education and Growth of the Child" by Mrs. Sharmini de Silva, Directress, Woodkinds Training Centre, Mehategama. was organis for the parents and the staff. We thank Miss Margie Silva and the teachers for their love and care for the kiddies.

Special mention must be made of the Board of Administration composed of Vice-Rector, Rev. Fr. Joseph Benedict Fernando; Deputy Principal, Mr. D. C. Jayasinghe; Middle School Principal, Mr. M. J. B. Perera; Middle School Deputy Principal, Mt. M. G. I. Ferdinanesz; the Principal of the Primary School, Mr. W. D. R. Ratnasekera and the Directress of the Pro-school, Miss Margie Silva and Sectional Heeds, namely Mr. H. Epasinghe, Mr. P. Milton Wickremaratne, Mr. A. T. Christis Perera, Mr. W. M. Griffith Fernando, Mr. Roger Fernado and Mr. S. A. Kandiah. who meet regularly with me once a month to discuss matters of administration. I am really impressed by their unstinted cooperation, dedication and loyalty to the institution. I am thankful to them for all the help and support they give me in my work. The Subject-heads whom we appointed this year have still to make any impact and to co-ordinate studies in the College. But already a beginning has been made and much good is expected in the coming year when their work will bear fruit. The Principal of the Middle School, Mr. M.J.B. Perera, is a real asset with his long and wide experience.

Regular Parent/Teacher Meetings of the various grades are held every term and very useful discussions take place. A committee of parents has been formed, together with the staff, to organise special classes and special activities. This is a healthy development which we hope to continue in the future.

The spiritual activities of the College give motivation for studies, play and human relationships. Opportunities are given to the students to freely participate at daily Mass, monthly confessions, group retreats and apostolic movements viz. Christian Students' Movement and the St. Vincent de Paul Society. It is our intention to make the chapel with the Sacrifice of the Mass the centre and source of the spiritual life of the student. With this intention the Corpus Christi procession was revived, and besides the Mass during the short interval, we have introduced a Mass at 7.20 A. M. to enable the parents and students to join in common wership. Rev. Fr. M. J. Le Goc wanted the chapel to be the centre of the College both physically and spiritually. Humbly we seek to fullfil his intention. My grateful thanks to Rev. Fr. Justin Perera, the doyen of the community, Fr. Chrispin Leo, Fr. Stanley Fernandopulle, Fr. Joseph Benedict Fernando, Fr. Fr. S. Rupasinghe and Fr. Felician Ranjith Perera, the visiting Fathers and the lay teachers, especially Mr. M.S. Fernando, for their help in the spiritual formation of our students. I am glad that Fr. Justin Perera is still in our midst to dispense his inexhaustible store of spiritual largesse, as in our own school days, to the present generation. Old-boys also have access to his ministrations.

The Altar Servers' Association under its Director, Mr. Peter Liyanage, renders useful service at Divine Services. The enthusiasm of the young members to serve at God's table is very edifying and I am proud to be an old boy of the Association, having joined it way back in 1939. It should become the ciadle for future vocations to the priesthood. We thank the past members of the Committee and hope that it will, under its new leader Master Sampath W. Welgampola become one of the most active Associactions of the College.

The Sinhala, Tamil and English Literary Unions form the core of our extra-curriccular work. They engage in various cultural

activities such as debates, dramas, essay contests and participation in inter-school debates. The Sinhala Literary Union also took part in an art festival and in the Sahithya Day Calebrations organised by other schools. The English Literary Union held Inter-House competitions where selected extracts from Shakespeare were performed. Coudert House was placed first. The Tamil Literary Union had its normal spate of activities with inter-school debates, essay contests and the annual elocution contest.

At the suggestion of the Ministry of Education we undertook to foster a school in the cyclone ravaged area of Batticalca. Fatima Carmel College of Kalmunai was assigned to us. Due to the enthusiasm of the Vice-Rector, Rev. Fr. Joseph Benedict and Mr. A. Kandiah and the generosity of our parents we were able to collect Rs. 10,000/- and the Welfare Society contributed Rs. 5000/- We also helped by supplying model question papers for the Advanced Level Classes and helped in the raffle organised by the school. In this way we wish to show our solidarity with the less fortunate schools.

Cultural Day was celebrated in all three media. This is now an annual feature.

The Environment Protection Society of the College joined in a seminar organisd by the parent body. A competition is at present in progress to give a prize to the cleanest class. Shramadana and work experience projects were also organised by this society

The United Nations Students' Movement, formed a year ago, is still in its swaddling clothes but is stirring itself to action. The society conducted a sports meet for a school in Marawila and donated prizes. They are now busy with the College Canteenand trying to put the lid on the recent price hikes at the tuck, shop, which is subject to inflationary pressures from outside.

The movement, as I have already mentioned, conducted a house to house survey of non-school-going poor children living down Devanampiyatissa Mawatha, Colombo 10. The response from the parents was, however, not very forthcoming, due to a certain timidity which we hope to overcome with the passage of time. The Students also actively participated in a Sharamadana project, along with other voluntary organisations, at Samanthrana pura in Mattakkuliya where slum dwellers have been settled.

We thank in a special way, Mesdames A. C. Saverimuttu, Nimala Perera, C. D. Jacobs, Messrs, M. G. L. Ferdinendez and M. S. Fernando, the Teachers in Charge, for the great interest they have taken in the activities of the Societies.

The College Western Band, the Hewisi Band and the Oriental Band are often called upon to perform at public functions, and they add colour to all our celebrations

Cricket dominates the sports activities of the College. We have Under 11, Under 13, Under 17 and 1st XI Teams. There is great enthusiasm among our students to join the cricket teams of all ages. We have had a fairly successful season this year, and although we did not win any matches outright, of the fourteen matches played, we lost only, one and that to Royal which setback we intend adequately to overcome next year with apologies to Your Excellency. Our thanks are due to the Masters-in-Charge of Cricket, Messrs. Angelo Rayer and P. J. L. Katuwawala, and the Coach, Mr. Tony P Opatha. Mr. Fairlie Delpathadu is now our coach and great things are expected of him this year, Wealso wish to express our thanks to Messrs. James Perera and Alirajah for coaching our junior teams. We wish to thank them all for their dedication to College cricket. Former Josephian captains and coaches and masters met together to review Josephian cricket. An advisory committee under the leadership of Rev. Fr. Joe de Mel, has been established.

Rugby at St. Joseph's seems to have come of age and our students have displayed their growing talent by their

performance in Inter-School Rugby. We offered stiff resistance to tred tionally strong rugby teams such as Royal, Trinity and St. Thomes. However, our boys had the better of Dharmaraja, Ananda, Thurstan and St. Anthony's Callege, Kandy. Credit for the plucky performance of our boys is due to our coaches Messrs. Chulika de Silva and Y. C. Chang. St. Joseph's rugby team has become one to be reckoned with once again we thank our coaches for their services to Josephian rugger.

Our Inter-House Athletics Meet was held on 14th July, and the Chief Guest was one of our distinguished old-boy sportsmen, The Honourable K. W. Devanayagam. Bonjean House emerged champions. The Old-Boys, Union financed the sports meet and many old-boys sent in their contributions. We thank them all. Athletics at St. Joseph's needs to be brought back to its former glory, and we place our hopes on our junior athletes to regain our lost fame in inter-school athletics. M:A.C. Dep, himself one of our most brilliant past athletes, has volunteered to coach our boys and Mr.D.E.S, Weerakkody has been appointed master in in charge Mr. B. Ockersz continues to encourage our boys. We thank them all.

Soccer at St. Joseph's has suffered a setback due to the want of an experienced coach. As a result, the talent among the boys has not emerged. We lost to Royal and to St. Anthony's, Wattala. Here to, our junior teams have done better than the seniors, and were runners-up in the Colombo District School Tournament.

Lawn Tennis at St. Joseph's has been given a boost, thanks to the services of our coach, Mr. Neville Wijewickrema, who, has offered us his help voluntarily. A former gentleman usher at the now defunct Senate, and a veteran navy man, he has spent the rest of his waking hours on the tennis court. Many boys have enlisted for College tennis, and two of our students, Arjan Perera and Vijaya Francis participated at the Sri Lanka Junior International Tournament.

A team of six players was entered for the Schools' Tennis Tournament. We beat St. Thomas' College, Gurutalawa 27/0, Ananda College, Colombo 14/13 and Royal College 'B' Team 14/13.

We could not come into the Final because of the smallness of this Team and the system of scoring.

Whatever progress Table Tennis has made is due to the interest shown in the lady tennis coach, Miss Sirina J Lucas who coached our boys for All: Island Schools Table Tennis Tournament.

Basketball which had almost been abandoned St. Joseph's is once again being revived with the services of our new coach and the Priest in charge, Fr. Felician Perera, a champion basketball player. We envisage a bright future for our basketball. We thank Mr. Anton Nadarajah for the interest he takes in Basketball.

In swimming the Juniors have done better than the seniors-They came second in the Junior Schools Championship. At the Novices Swiming and Diving Meet our boys retaines the Championship for the second year in succession. Our thanks are due to in a special way to M: Abeysena, the coach, and Mr. Kahatapitiya.

The Scout Group under the able guidance of Rev. Fr. Stanley Fernandopulle and an enthusiastic bind of scouters has made steady progress. One of our junoir scouters, Chaminda Perera, was selected to represent sri Lanka at the world jambore to be held in Australia this year. We thank Mis. G. G. M. Shanmugam for training our little cubs.
