

Editorial Notes

Ourselves

Readers will remember that our last issue which appeared almost two years ago, covered a period of four years 1972 — 1976. The last two years of this period spanned a phase in our history which we could now look back upon, as the Babylonian captivity.

This issue covers a period of two years. These two years witnessed the meteoric rise of the United National Party to power, the unprecedented physical and psychological damage caused by the racial riots and the breakdown of not merely law and order in the country but all norms of human conduct and behaviour that sustain a civilised society. The traumatic experience of those dark days in Sri Lanka remind us of those lines of Walter S. Senior before been which have never more relevent in our country than today.

"Give peace between their boarders
Twxt man and man goodwill
The love all unsuspicious
The love that works no ill;
In loyal lowly service
Let each from other learn
The guardian and the guarded
till Christ Himself return"

But here within our walls at Jaffna College we were able to see some distant gleam among the dark clouds that were hovering over us. Indeed we were able to witness some definite signs of our buildings which were taken away from us in 1974 being restored to us. As we go to press the process of handing back has been completed. But we reserve for our next issue, it being also, the hundredth year of the publication of the Miscellany more information about this historic event.

Last year, in response to requests from students and parents in Jaffna, we introduced the G. C. E. Advanced Level (London) classes and at present we have the Arts and Science streams. These students will be appearing for their examination this year.

In September 1977 the Principal and Mrs. Kadirgamar left for the United States as the first representatives of the Jaffna Diocese of the Church of South India in a "Partnership in Mission" programme with the Churches in Rhode Island. They returned to us in January 1978. We are glad that they were given this opportunity for the experience gained

by them, will undoubtedly prove beneficial both to the College, the Church and to the community at large. They had also the opportunity of attending a meeting of the "Board of Trustees" of the College in Bostan and met several alumni in U.S.A. & Canada.

The period under review also saw the beginning of the Second Phase of the Jaffna College Technical Institute. More modern equipment has arrived, and new buildings are in the process of coming up. Already the Institute has served a very useful purpose in training young men to learn various skills to help develop our country.

We offer our felicitations and congratulations to four members of our staff who completed their twenty five years of service in this institution. Messrs. A. Kadirgamar (Principal), A. Rajasingam (Vice Principal), Miss M. S. Elias (Supervisor, Jr. School) and Mrs. R. S. Thambiah. To mark the event, a service of Thanksgiving was held in the Cathedral Church last October. The Round Table too feted them at a complimentary Dinner.

Two members of the minor staff, S. D. Rasiah and V. Kandiah too joined the select band of Jubilarians.

Last year we bade farewell to Mr. T. Ponnambalam who retired after completing thirty-four years of service. His share in shaping the young minds and his contribution to the aesthetic life of the school cannot be easily forgotten. By his departure the school has lost a trusted and loyal friend. We are glad, however, that be continues to serve the Institution through the Alumni Association, by being a member of its executive committee.

In 1977 we had to wish goodbye to Mr. S. N. Venayaga-moorthy, who left us to accept a teaching position in Nigeria. As a student he had almost his entire education here obtaining his London B. In Memorium

Mr. Handy Perinpanayagam

In the death of Mr. Handy Perinpanayagam we have lost one of the most senior members of the alumni and a member of the staff who shaped a generation of students at Jaffna College, whose outlook and horizons were different from those who were the products of a colonial era. He was a pioneer in making education relevant to the environment of the student and independent of the shackles of a colonial economy.

He has a special place in the annals of Jaffna College, as a teacher of Science and Mathematics for a brief period and as one of the Directors of the College for many years. Mr. Nalliah was one of our most loyal and devoted alumnus. At the time of his death he was the staff representative on the Board of Directors. He began his life in the clerical service and rose to the position of Deputy Director of Supply and Cadre. We would like to place on record the sense of deep loss sustained by the college by his sad and sudden death.

Mr. W. T. I. Alagaratnam

Mr. Alagaratnam retired director of Irrigation was a student teacher and member of the Board of Directors of Jaffna College. His technical expertise and his remarkable qualities of mind and spirit enabled him to a position of great eminence in the life of the country. His demise in July 1977 took away a familiar landmark from our midst.

Principal's Report

Bishop Abeynaike, Mrs. Abeynaike, Our Bishops, Chairman and Members of the Board of Directors, parents, Alumni and Friends:

Jaffna College extends to all of you once again a very cordial welcome to its Annual Prize-Giving, and we thank you for your presence here this evening.

Bishop and Mrs. Abeynaike, you are no strangers to us, and we welcome you with much affection and regard into the Jaffna College community today.

Bishop Abeynaike, you have impressed us by your dedication and commitment to the life and mission of the Church of Ceylon in this country. We admire your sensitive and learned grasp of history and culture. It has always been a refreshing and invigorating treat to listen to your speeches studded with relevant, colourful and incisive illustrations. Your sermons have raised our spirits to great heights. Your evangelistic fervour, simplicity of life and great sense of pastoral care have enabled you as pastor and shepherd of your flock to deal very kindly and gently with your clergy and laity and all others who have come under your care.

As a former teacher and Principal of the Divinity School in Colombo you have educated and guided into the life of the Church several dedicated ministers. We owe much to your consecrated life and work in our midst and we look forward to your message to us this evening with great expectation.

Mrs. Abeynaike, we welcome you into our midst and we know that you are a great source of strength and comfort to the Bishop in his life and sacred work. You have very devotedly participated in that life of unstinted service. Our children will welcome and cherish the opportunity of having their well earned prizes from your hands.

We thank you both very sincerely for giving us so much of your time and concern this evening.

This ladies and gentlemen, is one of those very rare and unusual occasions when we have three Bishops on our platform. Under normal circumstances we are blessed with the presence of two which itself is a luxury for any school.

In Memoriam:

We regret to record the deaths of the following who were very closely associated with Jaffna College. Appropriate references have been made to them in the school assemblies and in the Staff Meetings and their contributions to the College have been remembered.

In the death of the Most Reverend Lakdasa de Mel, Jaffna College has lost one of its very best and affectionate friends. He was a member of the Board of Directors of the College from 1947 to 1952, and was Chairman of the Board during the last five years of his membership. It was during his tenure of Office that we embarked on the momentous project of making our institution a full-fledged College, by undertaking to conduct an Undergraduate Department. We recall with gratitude how he enlivened our proceedings with his unfailing wit and humour and sustained us by his bouyancy and optimism. He guided us during an important stage in our history with tact and We realise, however. that his chief activities were in a much wider sphere and, therefore, would like to place on record the sense of the deep loss sustained by this country and the whole Christian Church by his passing.

I need not recall here the sorrow, the sense of loss and the great void caused by the death of our leader, Mr. S. J. V. Chelvanayakam. We at Jaffna College

have a special place for him in our history because he was a teacher of Science and Mathematics here for three years in the years 1916 to 1918. Those years of his intimate association with us as a teacher brought him very close to the life of the College and he served later for several years as a member of the Board of Directors. His calm wisdom, his penetrative insight, and above all his deep and abiding loyalty to the College and its ideals made his presence in our Board Meetings most invaluable.

The Board also felt highly honoured by the willingness of a person of his status and prestige to associate himself with our deliberations, and, therefore, we salute his memory with great reverence.

Mr. V. Nalliah met with his death most unexpectedly and we have lost a great friend and a loyal and devoted alumnus. the time of his death he was the staff representative on the Board of Directors of the College. He was an active member of the Colombo Branch of the Alumni Association during his period of service in Colombo. And ever since his retirement he lived very closely with his Church and College in Jaffna. He was well known for his efficiency and for his deep and abiding Christian faith.

was a welcome and stabilising influence in our midst always and we miss him much.

Mr. V. Koshy who lived in retirement in Kerala died during the course of the year. He served the School and the College very faithfully as a teacher of Economics for more than eighteen years. He came to us with a wealth of experience as a teacher in other institutions in Malaya, India and Ceylon and contributed much to the teaching profession and to the student community in and out side the class room. The hostels, the staff and student Tennis Clubs. and the Round Table owe much to him. He was a very pleasant, cultured and genial person. I met him in Kerala in his home town a few months before his death. He was then in the best of health. We remember him with much gratitude.

We convey to all the members of the families of our dearly departed our deepest sympathies.

Ourselves:

Providing a meaningful and wholesome education is our sole purpose. All our efforts in our varied activities and in the specialised training of our teachers is directed towards that purpose. It remains a tremendous challenge and a never-ending task. "The

physical, intellectual, emotional and ethical integration of the individual into a complete man is a broad definition of the fundamental aim for education", says the UNESCO document. "Learning to be".

But, is such a noble aim possible in our own class rooms, in our schools today? Is it possible in our society so enamoured by the material aspects of life only? Highly pressurised reinforcement in efforts, in limited and narrow pursuits, for extremely high achievements in examinations, seems to be the only aim in our so-called education or 'schooling' to be more exact, and this at the expense of all other worthwhile experiences of a wholesome education. Even in the sphere of music, the child is made conscious only of an examination qualification, so much so, that even aesthetics is not integrated into the joy of living.

Students, teachers and parents have found effective short-cuts to achieve the desired results. It looks foolish in such a world of short-cuts to talk of deepening insights and understandings, of broadening visions through the appreciation and experience of Music, Art, Sports, Literature and the Sciences. There seems to be no place for imagination, the specific element in human life in

which visionary freedom is united with discipline and critical thought. To read, to reflect, to exercise the daring of the mind and the audacity of the imagination seems to be a far off cry in our schools today.

Hard and trying as it may be we have struggled through another year to integrate our religious, literary, sports, social, co-educational, residential and academic pursuits into a wholesome process of education worth its name. We hope and pray that we can continue in this spirit of education for much longer.

Staff:

There are 43 members on the staff, 16 in the Junior School and 27 in the Senior School. 26 are graduates with 13 holding Diplomas in Education or postgraduate qualifications, and three undergoing postgraduate training. 14 are trained or specialist teachers. Three have Advanced Level qualifications. 8 of our teachers are Jubilarians.

Mr. S. N. Venayagamoorthy, B. Sc. (London), who was a teacher of Physics, Science and Mathematics left us during the course of this term to accept an appointment in one of the schools in Nigeria. He was associated with the College for a period of 33 years as a student and teacher

and taught here for about ten years. He had his entire education from Grade I to the B. Sc. (London) at Jaffna College and was one of the very conscientious and loyal teachers. The grand farewell given to him by the staff and students was an indication of the love and affection he had won in the College community. We thank him and wish him and his family well in their new place of work.

Mr. V. Selvaratnam granted six months leave to proceed to the Madras Institute of Technology to follow a course in Automobile Technology. Besides being a teacher of Physics and Mathematics he was chiefly instrumental in introducing Automobile Mechanism as one of the subjects in the College for Pre-Vocational studies in the N. C. G. E. classes. We are happy he has this opportunity of widening his experience in this subject in some of the well established Institutions and Factories in South India. We wish him a very useful period of studies.

Mr. S. Sebanesan was granted two years of study leave to work for his Master's Degree in Tamil at the University of Madurai. He will also take this opportunity to complete his Bachelor of Divinity Study at the Tamil Nadu Theological Seminary, Arasaraddi, Madurai. We wish him a very

profitable period of study in both these fields of his academic pursuits.

Mr. P. Santhirasegaram, who was appointed as a Commerce Teacher this year left us to accept an appointment in the Valuation Department. We thank him for his very brief but effective period of service.

Mr. R. Balasubramaniam completed 25 years of faithful and loval service to the College. He was a specialist teacher of Tamil G. C. E. and Sanskrit in the (Advanced Level) classes and also helped out in the Undergraduate Department in the past. He was Head of the Tamil and Hinduism Department of the College. He was a very efficient and scholarly teacher and was a great asset to the teaching profession at Jaffna College in particular and to the country in general. He helped out very effectively in guiding and training students in the Tamil Oratorical contests and in supervising the editing of the Tamil section of the student paper, the 'Young Idea'. His noble presence in the College Campus is a great encouragement to his fellow teachers and officers of the College. We congratulate and thank him for his several years of service.

Miss. Mary S. Elias completed 25 years of service in the College. She is the daughter of late Mr. C. O. Elias, who himself served the College for more than 30 years. Miss Elias had her entire education from Grade 1 to B. A. (London) at Jaffna College and was a teacher of Tamil and Sanskrit in the Upper forms. She was warden of the Womens' Hostel of the Undergraduate department for some years. She is in charge of the Girl Guides Company in the College and is Guide Commissioner in the Northern Province after a period of special training at Sangam' in India which is the World Centre in Asia. She was a House Mistress and conducts the Tamil Choir. She was appointed Supervisor of the Junior School in 1972 and has administered this part of the School very efficiently these few years. She was the first lady appointed as an officer of the College and this gives strength to co-education in the College. We congratulate and thank her for the several years of faithful and loyal service to the College.

Mr. S. Selvendra B. Sc. (Ceylon) was appointed as a Physics and Mathematics teacher and Mr. K. Thangarajah B. Sc. (Ceylon) in Public Finance and Taxation as a Commerce teacher. We welcome them and wish them a fruitful period of service in our midst.

On Roll:

The number on roll is 209 in the Junior School and 464 in the Senior School making a total of 673 of whom 57 are boarders. We admitted 135 new students, 67 in the Junior School and 68 in the Senior School 950 to 700 is the optimum number for our present limited accommodation as a result of the take-over of our Campus. The Junior School is still somewhat over-crowded.

Examination Results:

At the G. C. E. Advanced Level examination April, 1976, 107 sat, 46 passed in three or four subjects and 18 were admitted to the University: 3 for Engineering, 5 for Physical Sciences, 2 for Medicine, 2 for Biological Science, 1 for Vet. Science, 4 for Arts and 1 for Law.

At the G. C. E. (Ordinary Level) examination December, 1976, 86 sat, 40 passed in five or more subjects and 20 qualified for the G. C. E. (Advanced Level) classes. At the N. C. G. E. examinations 1976, 85 sat and 57 qualified for the H. N. C. E.

Curriculum:

We have introduced Commerce in the H. N. C. E. classes. The Project Work in the H.N.C.E. class involves the development of the neighbouring village of Kanawakai. The students have taken this work to heart and have collected sufficient funds with the help of the College community and others, and have built a Community Centre for the village. They are involved in the health. nutrition, sanitation, leisure and sports activities, pre-school adult education of this community. It is a small but intensive project which has helped our students to acquire several new interests and skills. It has enabled our students in the words of Ivan Illich "to celebrate awareness". This is certainly a very relevant innovation in education though there are problems of a uniform evaluation for the purposes of admission to the University on a competitive basis.

We had a fairly successful season in Athletics and the team was captained by L Satchithananthan. Members of the team secured a number of places in the Athletic Meet conducted by the West Zone of the Jaffna Schools Athletic Association. L. Satchithananthan and C A. Arnold also participated in the Sri Lanka Schools Athletic Meet. Hastings House emerged champions at the Inter-House Athletic Meet.

Hockey:

a successful season and we were runners-up in the tournament conducted by the Jaffna Schools Hockey Association. Of the four matches played we won three and lost one.

The Under 17 Team under the captaincy of S. Mohanrajah did not reach the normal high standards.

The Under 15 Team under the captaincy of T. Mathiraj emerged Joint Champions in the tournament conducted by the Jaffna Schools Hockey Association.

Football:

The First Eleven Football Team under the captaincy of V. Sutharshan had a fair season. Of the five matches played we won two, drew one and lost two-V. Sutharshan and S Jeyendran were invited for trials for the selection of the Sri Lanka Schools Under 18 Football Team. Sutharshan was included in final pool of 30 players.

The Second Team under the captaincy of N. Asokan played five matches and won two, drew one and lost two.

The Third Eleven under the Our First Team under the captaincy of K. Muraleetharan participated in the tournaments.

Tennis:

The Student Tennis Club continues to function and a tournament was conducted.

Swimming:

We introduced Swimming for 25 students, 10 of whom were girls. Several coaches from the Kinross Club in Colombo have been helping us out. We are grateful to them for the time spent with our students Mr. V. Selvaratnam is our coach and he and his friends in Colombo were responsible for organising and founding the North Sri Lanka Swimming and Life Saving Association. We are particularly grateful to our former students Messers. K. Tharmalingam and N. Ariaratnam who are also members of Executive Committee of Colombo Branch of Alumni Association for all the generous help and guidance given to popularize swimming classes in the College and in Jaffna.

Junior School:

All the various colourful activities and functions of the Junior School such as dramatics, literary and Sports activities were carried out as usual. Master Muraleetharan was elected President of the Junior School Council. An English Day was organised in March as an experiment to encourage as many students as possible to express what they have learnt in class through dramatics. singing and poetry. The experiment proved successful and several students participated with much

enthusiasm. Several of these students participated in the Festival of English Poetry conducted by the Lions Club, and won certificates of merit. Mr. S Arunasalam, the A. G A. for Valigamam West, and Mrs. Arunasalam were the Chief Guests at the Annual Inter-House Athletic Meet, Brown emerged and House champions for the sixth year in succession. Four students were selected from the Junior School to play for the Under 14 Cricket Team of the College. Some of our students also won certificates of merit, in the Cross Country Race and Festival. Students in Grades 6 & 7 were able to tour certain parts of Sri Lanka particularly Anuradhapura, Sigiriya and Mihintale, and the smaller children toured the Jaffna Penninsula. The Parents Day ended with a rich and varied programme of poetry, prose, music and drama which was well received

In keeping with the new trends in the integrated primary education scheme introduced by the Education Department, we are making progress. The members of our staff have undergone in-service training to handle these changes. We still have the problem of insufficient accommodation to give a fuller life in and out of the class rooms for the educational programmes of the Junior School.

Religious Activities:

All the religious activities of the College were carried out as usual. There was a lively participation of staff and students in all worship programmes, Sunday Vespers and Hostel Prayers. The S. C. M. conducted Some of Inter-School debates. our students and teachers participated actively in the Student Christian Federation Conference at the Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall this year. The Choir rendered useful service at Christmas time and at the Vesper Services. The College Y. M. C. A has been reorganised to meet the changing needs.

Hostels:

Prize Day Address

(The following is a summary of the address delivered by the Rt. Rev. C. L. Abeynaike at the Jaffna College Prize - Giving on the 4th inst.)

The Rt. Rev. Cyril Abeynaike, the special speaker of the evening in an address punctuated by many humourous remarks and illustrated by apt quotations from many sources, began by saying that he was not the type of speaker usually in demand on such occasions, as he was not a judge or a Vice-Chancellor or a Professor. He would, he said, that day function not as a Prophet or a Politician but as a postman, that is, carry certain ideas of others. He wanted to concentrate on the child, its nature, needs, significance and possibilities. Every child is unique and must not be moulded into uniformity. Havellock Ellis has said that everyone who wants to be a man must be a non-conformist. Tennyson has said, "Selfreverence. self-knowledge, control: these three lead to sovereign power"; and Shakespeare has said, "To thine own self be true and it follows as the night the day that to others you would be true." Democracy means that a person should be willing to be in a minority of one.

The Home, therefore, is important. The Jesuits, who are great educationalists, say, "Give

as a person when he is young and then you can take him and do what you like." Scientists say that man's superiority over the beast is that he requires a much longer period to be educated. Arnold Toynbee, after analysing nineteen nations that had fallen, observes that two of them went because their home-life had gone earlier. The declaration of Joshua, "as for me and my house, we shall serve the Lord" is a great guide in the matter.

When training the child, we should realise that the child's world is different from ours. It lives in wonder-land. We should educate the child accordingly. Einstien has said that imagination is more important than knowledge. The fragmentation of knowledge and the tendency to early specialisation, now-a-days are, therefore, misguided. The Bishop quoted the joke about specialists being persons who tend to know more and more about less and less, till they know everything about nothing.

A child must learn to do more than it is his duty to do. Lord Acton has said that civilisation depends on precisely this every man has his price. Motor cars are built up to a standard. Our children must rise above this kind of thing, each a personality in his own right.

There is always a tendency to idealise the past. This has prevailed from ancient times. There was no golden age in the past. We must look to the future. Streams do not flow backwards but forwards.

Though politics was not in his line, he would like to make one comment on our Society. We

quality. Walpole has said that live in a mixed society. We are seeking to be a nation; therefore, we should work together. A mixed society is like a man with two hands. A man cannot clap with one hand. There must be autonomy for each social, religious and cultural association to enable it to contribute its share to the common good.

Principal's Report — 1978

Dr. & Mrs. Benjamin, our Bishops Chairman and members of the Board of Directors, Parents, Alumni and Friends:

We extend to all of you a very hearty welcome to our Annual Prize-Giving, and we thank you for your kind presence here with us this evening. It is certainly an encouragement to have you all present here.

Dr. & Mrs. Benjamin, we welcome you into our midst not only as our honoured Chief Guests, but also as genuine and good friends of ours.

Dr. Benjamin, we have been impressed by your splendid allround achievements as a student at St. John's College, Jaffna. You were a brilliant prize-winner in the higher forms of the school. You were an excellent Sportsman winning your colours in Athletics and captaining the Athletic Team. You were a member of the Ceylon Cadet Company, a senior Prefect of the College, and an active and devoted member of the Student Christian Movement of the College and later of the University. You gained admission to the Medical Faculty obtaining a first division and distinctions in Botany and Chemistry at the H. S. C. examinations, and an Exhibition at the

University preliminary examinations, and later secured the Jeejeebhoy Scholarship at the First M. B. B. S. examinations at the University.

After a very successful and brilliant career at the Medical College you served briefly as a Medical Officer, and for the past 19 years or more you have served the country as a very skilled surgeon, particularly in the important hospitals of Jaffna, Kandy and Colombo. You have also been in the University Surgeon Teaching Hospitals and have served as an examiner in the Final M. B. B. S. Examinations. Besides the art and practice and teaching of surgery you have taken time to serve very effectively in several professional, religious and social organisations. served as President of the Jaffna Medical Association, and Government Medical Association, and was a member of the Medical Board of the J. D. C. S. I., a member of the Ashram and Navajeevanam Boards, a Warden of the St. John the Baptist Church, Chundikuli and you serve now as a member of the Board of Directors of Jaffna College.

Besides the skill of your healing knife, the healing influence of your total personality warmed the hearts and minds of those who came under your benign influence. We have been guided by the incisive insights you brought to bear in all the committees and boards you served. Your devotion and commitment to the Church, to the Student Christian Movement and to other Christian causes have been a notable witness. You will always stand out as a worthy example to be followed in your professional, social and religious life.

Mrs. Saraswathy Benjamin is an old girl of Ladies College, Colombo and an Arts graduate of the University of Ceylon. She is no stranger to us, being the daughter of a distinguished alumnus of the College, the late Dr. A. W. Rasiah, Dr. A. W. Rasiah and his brothers particularly Mr. A. W. Nadarajah were most intimately connected with the College in the Alumni Associations and the Board of Directors of Jaffna College. Dr. Rasiah was an outstanding sportman and captained one of our best Soccer teams in 1915. Mrs. Benjamin, I am sure would have inherited something of the qualities of Jaffna College through her good father. We are happy to note that as a University woman you have given priority to the building up of a good home for your husband and children instead of being lured to some

other lesser worth-while job or profession. It is a privilege to have you here with us to distribute the prizes.

We thank you both for your presence with us and for the encouragement you have given us today. May God Bless and prosper you.

Ourselves:

Jaffna College, its physical set up has now been restored to its rightful and proper status and this event was inevitable in the context of sanity and of justice with freedom. A Government committed to a Dharmista Society could not do less, and we remain grateful to all those who implemented the policy of the Government on the side of what was right, resonable and just, and for whatever action taken already. We now await the return of our valuable books, the expensive equipment and the solid furniture. We also expect the authorities concerned to compensate us adequately for all the loss and damage to property, moveable and immovable. Of course it will not be possible for anyone to compensate in a tangible way the losses incurred to the prestige and morale of a great school with a history, tradition and unique service of more than 150 years. It is common knowledge now that

the whole traumatic episode was unnecessary, unjust and resonable. This tragic event will remain a sad blemish on the history of education in this country for a long time to come.

In a larger context, Jaffna College could never be taken away. "You could take over the buildings but not its spirit", said Mr. Dahanayake referring to the take-over of denominational schools some years ago. The sense and effect of being a part of 150 years of history with the collective wisdom involved — could not be erased from the minds of all those connected with the College, Jaffna College remains a way of life — a link between generations of contributors and benefactors.

The whole experience, however, is not without its valuable spiritual significance to us. we struggled through these four years of darkness we yearned for light. Unworthy as we are, God in his mercy looked kindly on us. We have seen the glorious dawn of new day. "Jaffna College is a supreme example of the struggle for light by all enlightened community", wrote the American Mission historian, Dr. Fred Field Goodsell almost four decades ago. We have inherited something of that quality to struggle through strange odds with patience, faith and hope. We are reminded by

Professor Jurgen Moltmann that "Patience is the art of hope."

The German martyr and theologian, Dietrich Bonhoeffer expresses our predicament best at this point:

"For most people not to plan for the future means to live irresponsibly and frivolously, to live just for the moment. while some few continue to dream of better times to come. But we cannot take either of those courses. We are still left with only the narrow way, a way often hardly to be found, of living every day as if it were our last, yet in faith and responsibility living as though a great future still lay before us. "Houses and fields vineyards shall yet again be bought in this land", cries Jeremiah just as the City is about to be destroyed, a striking contrast to his previous prophecies of woe. is a divine sign and pledge of better things to come, just when all seems blackest. Thinking and acting for the sake of the coming generation, but taking each day as it comes without fear anxiety - that is the spirit in which we are being forced to live in practice. It is not

easy to be brave and hold out, but it is imperative!

And so we move forward again with faith, hope and courage and pray for God's guidance as we face the future. We are conscious of the sacred trust placed on us and may we be found faithful. We reaffirm our purpose as we sing the last stanza of the College Song — "The Light of Life is on her seal and may this College be, a place where all her sons shall feel that they the true Light see".

In Memoriam:

In the death of Mr. S. Handy Perinpanayagam we have lost one of the finest products of Jaffna College. He was a student, teacher and later a member of the Board Directors representing the Alumni of the College. He joined the College as a student in 1914, and established a record in 1922 being one of the first two students passing the Intermediate Examination of the London University. As a teacher of Latin he had few equals. He was President of the Y. M. C. A., Warden of the Inter-Hostel and first President the autonomous Teachers' Round Table. He started the Jaffna Youth Congress in 1924 and had the gift of firing many others with his ideals. He always acknowledged the great influence

Jaffna College had on his life and to quote his own words, he said, "I reached man's estate in the Bicknell home", which summerises adequately his intimate connections with his alma mater. We convey to the members of his family our deepest sympathies.

Staff:

There are 46 members on the staff, 31 in the Senior School and 15 in the Junior School. 28 are graduates with 18 holding Diplomas in Education or postgraduate qualifications; 15 are trained or specialist teachers; one each with G.S.Q., Advanced Level and ordinary level qualifications. Ten of our teachers are Jubilarians.

Mr. T. Ponnambalam retired from service at the end of 1977 after serving us for a period of almost 35 years. He joined the staff of Jaffna College in 1944 and taught most of the time in the Junior School teaching Music and Tamil, and Hinduism in the Senior School. He was a vernacular trained teacher with special qualifications in Music. He toured Malaysia rendering Music racitals and was in great demand in Jaffna for his Kathapirasangams and Music recitals. His Tamil plays and variety entertainments were greatly appreciated. He was held in high esteem by his students, colleagues and administrators for his exemplary professional qualities. He was to the very end a loyal and dedicated teacher, and he is now contributing his share to the Alumni Association as a member of its committee. We wish him well in his retirement, and convey our good wishes to him and his family. The Senior and Junior School Councils conducted the well-organised farewell functions for him.

Miss S. P. Gulasingam will complete her study leave at Chelsea College, University of London and will be returning to us at the end of this year qualified in the teaching of Integrated Sciences.

Mr. S. Sebanesan is also on study leave preparing for his Masters Degree in Tamil of the University of Madurai, and the Bachelor's Degree in Divinity of the University of Serampore, while being a resident student of the Tamil Nadu Theological Seminary, Madurai.

We congratulate the following staff members on their examination successes: Mrs. L. B. Thambirajah obtained the English Special Trained Teachers' Certificate: Mrs. M. D. Mithirathasan obtained the English Special Teachers' Trained Certificate and the L. T. C. L. in Music; Mr. Noel A. Vimalendran obtained the G. S. Q. Certificate of the University of

Sri Lanka. These qualifications were secured while the teachers were in service. Mr. N. Thatparananthan, obtained the Diploma in Education (Merit pass) and Mr. G. Rajanayagam, Diploma in Education, both of the University of Sri Lanka.

We want to welcome into our midst the following new teachers: Mr. T. Nithiaratnam, Physical Trained Instructor's Certificate of Lucknow; Mr. M. Vettivel, B. Sc. (Ceylon), Diploma in Education (Ceylon); and Miss M. Kularajasingham, G. C. E. (Ordinary Level). Mr. V. Ganesharatnam G. C. E. (O. L.) was appointed to the non-academic staff.

Mr. A. Rajasingham, our Vice-Principal completed 25 years of service in the College. He is an alumnus of the College and taught Mathematics in the Undergraduate Department and has been Head of the Department of Mathematics in the School. He was appointed Vice-Principal ten years Being a wizard at figures his expert advice was always available wherever numbers were involved. He could state a problem precisely and concisely with deliberate cool calmness and if challenged would restate the problem with all the physical energy and volume of voice he could command and at the end of the stormy session we will all have a neat formula and

a satisfactory solution to all our thorny problems. I am fortunate in having a Vice-Principal with such brimstone and fire to solve most of my problems. Though best known as an efficient and very successful teacher of Mathematics in the Advanced Level classes he has given his services to several religious and professional particularly organisations, Manager of the 'Morning Star', Treasurer of the J. D. C. S. I., Secretary of the Medical Board, the Northern Province Teachers' Association and to the Thrift and Benefit Societies of the College. We owe much to him and wish him many more years of useful service in our midst.

Mrs. R. S. Thambiah has completed 25 years of service at Jaffna College. She was the first teacher of Home Science in the College. It was a pioneering task and she has educated generations of girls who now conduct their homes efficiently. Organising social functions and catering for colourful socials and dinners has become such an easy and pleasant task for the College community here because of the impact of a good Home Science Department we have had here through these years. Mrs. Thambiah takes full credit this happy state of affairs. She qualified further and obtained the M. Sc. in Euthenics of the

Kansas University, U. S. A. She also served as a very efficient Choir Mistress, and is presently a House Mistress, Head of a department and guidance counsellor for girls. While thanking her for the excellent work accomplished we wish her many more years of service in the College.

It is my pleasure and privilege today to record my own 25 years of service in the College which includes one and half years as Vice-Principal and ten years as Principal. I joined the College as a student in 1946 arriving from Malaya immediately after the second World War and have ever since been involved intimately with the life of this insti-Someone remarking on Jubilarians who are teachers said that some of them have only one years experience repeated twenty five times over! But I can assure you that it was not so in my case for I had a variety of tasks to perform in these 25 years and each new day was an adventure in itself for better for worse. It certainly has been a thrilling experience to be so closely associated with growing and developing children and youth throbbing with precious life and to observe generations of them blossoming forth into manhood and womanhood with spectacular achievements in life. There certainly can be

no better reward in life than to watch this splendid human scene unfold itself before one's eyes as one relaxes in the afternoon or evening of one's life. This is a school teacher's unique privilege. It has been a wonderful opportunity and a deeply satisfying experience to serve one's alma mater for so long, and I take this opportunity to thank all my students, colleagues, alumni, parents, friends and members of the Board of Directors of the College for the encouragement and friendship given to me at all times. At this time I also crave the generosity of your forgiveness for all my failings and short comings.

On Roll:

The number on roll is 277 in the Junior School and 505 in the Senior School making a total of 782 of whom 75 are boarders, as against 673 enrolled at this time last year. We admitted 163 new students this year of which 104 were admitted to the Junior School and 59 to the Senior School. We may be able to increase our enrolment with more space available soon.

Examination Results:

At the G. C. E. Advanced Level Examination April, 1977, 82 sat and 44 were successful in three or four subjects and 14 were admitted to the University distributed as follows: 3 for Medicine, 2 for Engineering, 3 for Agriculture, 1 for Architecture, and 5 for Physical Sciences.

One student in the Junior School was awarded a scholarship at the Fifth Standard Scholarship Examination held by the Department of Education.

Curriculum:

We have had to readjust again to changes with the reintroduction of the G. C. E. Ordinary Level and Advanced Level classes, giving up the N. C. G. E. and the H. N. C. E. classes. There is still no real substitute to formal education and this seems to be the general opinion in most countries in the world today and all innovations in Education have to take second place in the scheme of things. The students who appeared for the N. C. G. E. Examinations in 1975 and 1976 are still groping in the dark, losing much valuable time still preparing for the University entrance examinations that does not seem to take place. Some justice must be done to these group of students-

The present G. C. E. (Ordinary Level) curriculum does not really encourage the study of Arts and the humanities as Social

Studies is given up by most students in the Grade 9 level. There must be some way of including Social Studies in the core of the curriculum so that it is not treated merely as an optional subject.

We welcome the emphasis given to English by the Ministry of Education as an important and compulsory second language.

A matter that causes much concern to educationalists, parents and students is the very long period of wasted time that lapses between the University entrance examination and the actual admission of students to the University on the results of these examinations. It now takes almost one and half years for students to be admitted after they appear for the admission examination, and a very valuable period in their developing academic life is lost to themselves and to the University itself. We hope the authorities concerned will view this matter seriously and stop this wastage of academic and human potential.

We have formed the G. C. E. (Advanced Level) classes preparing for the London University Examinations in June, 1979 as a trial. Students appearing for these examinations will need a sound knowledge of English. We will be able to comment on the success

of the scheme a year or two later. There is great keeness shown by students and parents here and abroad in these classes and there are pressures to have the Ordinary Level classes preparing for the London examination too to be organised here. We are seriously studying the feasibility of conducting the classes.

School Activities:

SPORTS:

Cricket:

The First Team in Cricket was captained by V. Sutharshan. We played 7 matches of which we won 2, drew 3 and lost 2. The under 16 Cricket Team was captained by S. Kathiraj. Of the 8 matches played, we won 1, drew 2 and lost the rest. The Under 14 Cricket Team was captained by T. Nithiraj; six matches were played, of which we won 2, drew 2 and lost 2. We are doing our best to improve our standards in Cricket.

Athletics:

We had a fairly successful season in Athletics and the team was captained by S. Jeyendran. Mr. & Mrs. S. Rajanayagam were the Chief Guests at the Annual Inter House Athletic Meet at which Hastings House annexed the championship. A. J. Bavani broke the Putt Shot record for

girls in the Senior group and V. Kumudini, the High Jump record in the Intermediate group. M. Uthayakumar created new records in the Javelin Throw, 400 Metres and 800 Metres in the Boys Under 17 group. We also want to congratulate him in obtaining a second place in the Javelin Throw at the Sri Lanka Schools Athletic Meet. The Athletic Team won five First places, three second places, and two third places in the West Zone Athletic Meet for seniors.

Soccer:

Our First XI Soccer Team captained by S. Jeyendran, played 7 matches of which we won 2, drew 2 and lost 3. Our Second XI team was first captained by S. Mohanrajah and later by S. Sooriyakumar; of the 9 matches played we won 3, drew 1 and lost 5. The Third XI Team was captained by M. Premakumar and they participated in all the friendly matches.

Hockey:

The Inter School Tournaments did not take place this year.

Swimming & Tennis:

The Swimming and the Student Tennis Clubs have been functioning well.

Cross Country Sports Festival:

The Festival as usual enjoyable and colourful with large number of participants both boys and girls. Mr. & Mrs. C. F. J. Richards were the Chief Guests. The performances of the following students are noteworthy:

Junior School:

All the usual activities and functions of the Junior School were carried out. Mas. Paul Thevarajah was elected President of the Junior School Council Mr. & Mrs. A. C. Canagarajah were the Chief Guests at the Annual Inter House Athletic Meet A Tamil Kalakam was formed and bi-weekly meetings were held, and the Gandhi Day

celebrated. A Science Club was formed and bi-weekly meetings were held. An English and Tamil Debating Club too was formed. A variety entertainment was held at the end of term.

Girl Guides, Little Friends & Scouts:

These groups have been meeting regularly. The Scouts have been holding outdoor camps. Mr. & Mrs. T. S. Oppenheim have presented the troup with a set of tents. More students have enrolled themselves into the Cubpack and Scout troup.

Religious Activities:

All our religious programmes have been carried out fully and we have made special efforts to make our worship programmes, vesper services, staff prayers and Hostel prayers more meaningful and with wider participation. The S. C. M. has been as active as ever, and the Y. M. C. A. has been re-organised and strengthened. The Choir have rendered useful service at Christmas time and at the Vesper Services. We are grateful to our student leaders, members of the staff, special speakers and preachers for their services renderered. My thanks are due to Mr. G. Rajanayagam for helping me to organise this work.

Hostels:

We have a few more students in the Hostels now and we are able to provide a comfortable Hostel for girls because the University authorities have returned the Hostel to us. Mrs. M. D. Mithirathasan has been appointed as the Warden of the Girls' Hostel. We want to thank Mrs. T. Rajadurai for all the help rendered in housing the girls during the last four years. The Boarders' Day was celebrated as usual.

Literary Associations:

The Lyceum, Forum, Brother-hood and the Academy celebrated their annual functions with the usual colour and gaiety. Prof. S. Vithiananthan, President of the Jaffna Campus and Mrs. Vithiananthan were the Chief Guests at the Annual Academy dinner.

'Young Idea':

The student paper 'Young Idea' is published regularly for internal circulation only. This helps to encourage student journalism and management.

Miscellany:

The Miscellany was published covering the period 1972 to 1976. Next year, 1979 will be the centenary year of the publication of the Miscellany.

School Council:

The School Council headed by K. Sritharan carried out all their routine duties very faithfully.

The Welfare Work:

The Welfare Work has been carried out very well. My thanks are due to the Welfare Officer, Mr. K. A. Selliah.

Bunker Memorial Lectures:

The Bunker Memorial Lectures were held after a lapse of four years. Professor S. Mr. Kadirgamar (the Principal), the teachers and other members of the staff of Jaffna College, the present and past students of Jaffna College, our Bishops, the Chairman and fellow members of the Board of Directors of Jaffna College, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am deeply conscious of the great honour bestowed upon my wife and myself, being the Chief Guests today, and no words can adequately express our sentiments of thankfulness and gratitude to the Principal and members of the staff for having made it inescapable for us to be with you in any other capacity at this great event I am one of you, despite my inability, to claim to have studied at Jaffna College. In all humility, I prefer to interpret this gesture on your part, at a time when you are coincidentally rejoicing and celebrating the release and return to you of your treasured possessions, which in 1974 were traumatically excised from you, with armed guards at the arbitrary boundary line beyond which alone you were permitted to exist, as your desire to honour the two educational institutions in Jaffna, wherein I had my entire school

career, for you, along with those two Christian Institutions, Chundikuli Girls' College, and St. John's College share the common distinction of establishing beyond all doubts, proving to the poor, the people, the powers that be, and to the whole world that what all considered impossible, has been abundantly possible; when both the ordinary, and the intellectual thinking was that Jaffna College, and the two Colleges where I was privileged to study were voluntarily and obtusely choosing the suicidal path to early extinction, electing to be PRIVATE NON-FEE LEVYING SCHOOLS, you survived the storms in the face of repressions and restraints. functioned with full vitality on the path of challenge, asserting your WILL to be true to the noble causes and calling of those who founded and toiled in such institutions; you have flourished and flowered and enlightened the world that there is a place for private schools, which while conforming to all the policies of the state, have the right to impart a Christian atmosphere and influence, although Christians form only a small minority in this land.

I am inclined to disagree with you, Mr. Principal, when you say "it will not be possible for anyone to compensate in a tangible way the losses incurred to the prestige and morale of a great school....", when you refer to the critical period in your history you have passed through. You lost neither prestige, nor your morale. I will prefer to look upon the last 4 years as the most glorious years in your history. Your morale was at its highest, as you travelled those difficult years with confidence and conviction that no force on earth can conscript, constrict, or contrain you, and you have come through without blemish, stain or flaw. During those 4 years, God in His ways wrapt in mystery, permitted Jaffna College to suffer agitation, anxiety, affliction and agony in a unique and unmatched way, when He used the secular state to utilise the best parts of your valued possessions as component or condensed nucleus in the inauguration of the Jaffna Campus of the University of Sri Lanka, a historical fact now. Why were you chosen to make the sacrifice? It was because. right from the time of foundation of your College and it's predecessor, the Batticotta Seminary in 1823, your institution was ahead of time, and in your

delegated into the responsibility of implementing the previous Government's policy of giving Iaffna a University, got dazzled by your excellence, or envious of your expertise, or perhaps both, and recognised in you, everything needed for inception of an 'instantaneous University'. How then can you feel that you lost 'prestige' when your prestige was being reckoned very high, particularly at places most unkind sympathetic to you.

In God's plan, the University of Sri Lank planted in, or on Jaffna soil, in two fragments 4 years ago. has developed and expanded on more appropriate locations, and as the Vaddukoddoi component of that University Campus withdraws out of Vaddukoddai, you regain what was extracted from you by force; during the last 4 years, you would have realised more fully than ever before, the value of your potentialities and possessions. I haven't the slightest doubt that as you reclaim your territory, you will see the sad spectacle of it being delivered to you soiled, damaged, disintegrated, dismembered and perhaps even desecrated to the extent that you can never receive adequate compensation, but at no time did you suffer possessions, the experts and advisers loss of prestige. On the contrary,

you have contributed at high cost to yourself, very richly to the prestige that the Jaffna Campus of the University of Sri Lanka has, and this too is now an unalterable historical fact.

I find in the narrative Glimpses into your past, presented by your students at your Ter-Jubilee Year Prize-Giving, a year before your traumatic experience of 1974, there is reference to 'the Beginnings'. followed in sequence by 'the Hastings Era', 'the Bicknell Era', 'the Bunker Era', and finally by what is described as 'the Modern Era'. I boldly predict that in years, to come, the so-called Modern Era' will be recorded as 'the Kadirgamar Era'. Your 10 years as Principal of Jaffna College is but the beginnings of the 'Kadirgamar Era', and it is not without significance that twice in your life-time, you have gone through 4 year periods of testing, the earlier occasion being during the World War II, when Japan entered the scene of fighting. You have been 'baked' or 'matured' by these episodes, and you emerge now better equipped to assess, foresee, and prepare yourselves for the needs, challenges, direction and destiny of the future, which calls for re-thinking, reorganisation, reflection, re-moulding, reformation, reintegration and reconciliation, with new visions, wider and more distant horizons, deeper insight, and with a firm grip of realities on the local, national and international everchanging scenes. The words inscribed on the Jaffna Colleges Crest. 'IESUS CHRIST THE LIGHT OF LIGHT OF LIFE' and the words inscribed on the crest of of the College I studied at which translated into English 'LIGHT SHINETH IN DARK-NESS' are gems of truth. As long as you retain awareness that God is your source of supply, for all your needs, you may without any tinge of malices thank God for the persons, individuals and the Government that 4 years ago caused trauma to you, and for the persons, individuals and the present Government that restores to you (as best as situation permits), what belonged to you.

I am delighted, Mr. Principal, that you welcome the emphasis now given to English by the Ministry of Education, and the making of English a compulsory second language in the schools. The older members in this distinguished gathering will recall how, and in what circumstances, the iniquitous act was passed in the House of Representatives, and in the Senate, making Sinhala the ONLY OFFICIAL LANGUAGE in our country. This happened in 1956. All our children born after

1956, those born a little earlier, but who commenced their schooling in or around 1956, and those who were already in the primary schools of our land in 1956, thus had their school education, and at a later stage at the University too, instruction, thinking and learning, either in the Sinhala Language, or in the Tamil Language. The few exceptions who were allowed to study in English were fortunate. It is well known that many educated elders who proclaimed and pushed education for the masses in Sinhala Tamil, give their own offspring the benefits of sound education in English often competence in other foreign languages as well. Closer home, some of our eloquent who advocated that our children should study in Tamil, and refrain from gaining knowledge or competence in Sinhala, have their own children who also came to be affected by the events of 1956 holding high positions in state sector, competent, skilled, able and actually performing their tasks, discharging their responsibilities with equal efficiency in English Sinhala and Tamil. 1956 was 22 years ago. To my reckoning, all who in 1956 were of the ages of 10 years and under, i. e., those who now are under the age group of 32 years and less, have been adversely affected by the policy of neglect of the

English Language The thin edge of the destructive wedge which has been hamered with divisive force since then, not only by the extremists, but also by sections of the best of the cultured, English educated elite on both produced on the national scene. social dehiscence, to which as sequence, got added in very generous amounts, bitterness, the animosity, frustrations, pseudonationalism and preudo-patriotism, the inevitable result of which was the exodus of some of the best talent of our country from age group of around 35 years and above, on the one hand, and the violent unwanted social convulsions on the other. Language became a delicate and sensitive subject for discussion at the beginning of that unfortunate era, and then language if referred to in 'good circles' emerged as an expression of 'bad-taste' later followed fairly soon as a matter of controversy charged with emotion and utter un-reasonableness quickly, and currently has become a dangerously explosive subject now. In this the keenness of the context. Government to recognise the importance and need for English as part of Education is a bold step. More than half the population of our country will be under the age group of 32 years, who have had their full education either in Sinhala or in Tamil. Their access

to information in the various disciplines of science and technology has been limited, and as a result, the country has suffered damage. As a doctor, I boldly assert that while our skills and competences are passed on to younger members of my profession, who learn a lot by apprenticeship as students and as junior colleagues, we still use far too many techniques and methods discarded in other parts of the world. This is partly due to poor English, and partly due to economic factors. For example, we still have all our laboratory reports in hospitals in our country expressed in absolete units, while other countries have adopted the Standard International Units for routine work. The prize we have paid for neglect of English has been loosing sight that we belong to a global or international community.

During the past 5 years, I have had the privilege of teaching medical students at our Medical Schools, and I have been able to observe the impact and the damage the neglect of English has done to medical education in our country, because I have been able to compare this experience of the last 6 years with knowledge I had as a member of the academic staff of the Medical Faculty in Colombo for 2 years from the middle of 1953.

I do believe that an identical situation exists in other spheres of studies.

I am confident that 'Kadirgamar Era' of Jaffna College will also be one, where Jaffna College will continue to be several steps ahead of the rest of the country, in education in its widest sense, and a return to good English, and better English will draw into Jaffna College, students from all parts of Sri Lanka, as it happened earlier in its illustrious history. I am 100% sure that our children, and most parents will opt for a sound education in English, if facilities are made available for instruction, imparting of knowledge and dialogue in English. But you will face resitance to giving proper emphasis to English, not only from political forces, but also from generations of teachers in this country, who are at present able to effectively conceal that they are several years behind time, by eloquence in the national languages. Eloquence is often mistaken for knowledge, and it is unfortunate that this disaster a reality not only in schools, but in the higher temples of learning, the Universities too. The greater tragedy is when eloquence gets equated to possession of foresight and attributes needed for leadership, or when bluff with showmanship gets misinterpreted as expressions of loyalty and efficiency.

'Rivers never flow backwards' quoted one of the greatest intellects of this land, when with great eloquence, he defended the revolutionary changes ushered in, which coincided with the era of commencement of neglect education in English in this country. The truism that the natural phenomenon of rivers never flowing backwards was projected with imagination to include and cover all changes invoked, invented and introduced uncompromisingly, as irreversible processess which could not be retrieved. But we in contemporary Sri Lanka have witnessed what man can do mighty rivers. Barriers or dams have been carefully constructed across the path of rivers, to halt the flow along unwanted or wasteful and unproductive paths; waters flowing down the rivers have been given new directions and destinations, altering the course of nature and environment. landscape and scenery, generating better utilisation of our resources with purpose and profit, for the betterment of our people. Why cannot we do the same thing to the streams of Education? Giving recognition to the importance of English, and returning to emphasise the need for a good foundation and a place for English in the

educational curriculum in schools amounts to diverting the direction along which the streams of education have flown in our country. I do hope that the different language streams do not take the youth of our land in different directions, but that each language stream will be but a tributary, and that the English, the Tamil and the Sinhala tributaries will converge, meet and merge into a single mighty river surging with life towards the goals of peace, prosperity, dignity and mutual recognition of the worth and value of every stream or rivulet which served as a tributary, regardless of the source or origin, path and identity of every single tributary.

This is the vision I will like to leave as a thought, worthy and meriting reflection upon, and I do hope that whon your College celebrates its 200th anniversary, and its history be reviewed then, the chapter that will emerge as the 'Kadigamar Era' will reveal that Jaffna College carried the torch of light many steps shead of the rest in Sri Lanka, illuminating the path along which principalities and powers, people and the proletariat, gressed towards peace and prosperity, freedom and justice, proving your conception of the 'LIGHT OF LIFE'.

My privilege today carries responsibilities as well, and my charge will be incomplete without a special word to the 782 students on the roll of Jaffna College today. Your presence in Jaffna College today is not due to any You have accident or chance. been chosen to redeem, re-create, renew afresh, retain and reverberate the life and activity with greater energy than has been ever before, as participants in the process of re-structuring the part of Jaffna College that returns to you. In this respect, everyone of you are prize-winners, winners of a prize each, which imposes on you a sacred trust. In this context, I wish to remind the students that the way of life in this College had differed from student-life in other educational institutions in this country, in that you are not subject to the visible disciplinary controls and restraints that teachers are normally expected to exercise over you; you have the heritage and high tradition where you as students have been enjoying a very large measure of independence, and have been collectively responsible for the exemplary conduct within and outside your College The Principal and the Campus. staff are there to give you guidance, counselling, and help, but it is you, the students, who constitute the pulsating life and light of the

College. Removal of territory, grounds, building, library, halls class-rooms, and several members of the staff as well did not erase the College. But if the students alone had been removed from the scene, there would have been no College, even if the staff and buildings remained. The undergraduate department which Jaffna College was proud of, ceased to exist 4 years ago. It is up to you, the present students of Jaffna College, and those who follow you in the years to come, to take by surprise and startle the world, by re-structuring with strategy, the salvaged remains of the undergraduate department that was erased 4 years ago, into a new area of activity that will embrace not only an undergraduate department, but also a postgraduate institute, and that your efforts will bear fruits that will not be a mere substitute for what ceased to exist 4 years ago, but will have substance to supersede everything of it's like, in this land and elsewhere. Do not dig for fossils in the defaced debris that will become available to you. It is up to you to furnish the fabric and texture, the genius, grit and sublime spirit, as sentinels, of the future, as you enter a new exacting exalted exceedingly excititing era in the life of Jaffna College. You have only to look at the words on your College crest, to show you the path ahead.

We take pride in recording here the timely daring act of our Junior School office peon, Mr. S. Thurairatnam who jumped into a well to save a 5 year old child from drowning. The staff, students and the College contributed their share to reward him with a gold medal presented by the Principal at the Annual Inter House

Athletic Meet in recognition of his courageous act.

We were grately relieved when a part of our buildings was returned to us in June. This section housed the students of Grades 6 & 7 and accommodated the Science Laboratories. 





We have thirty in our Company. Meetings continue to take place on Tuesday evenings.


Two of our Guides, Gnanalatha P. and Sathaselvi T. attended a week-end All Jaffna Under Canvass Camp held at Pandateruppu.


