

Bound into this copy is Paul Johan Sandifort, *Deglutitionis mechanismus*, verticali sectione narium, oris, faucium, illustratus, Leiden, 1805. This has 2 folding plates, engraved by R. Muys after drawings by G. Sandifort. This work is dedicated to the author's famous father, Eduard Sandifort and has plates after his brother(it is a dissertation; the praeses was Sebald Rau)...It seems to be a very scarce work. Nuc records only one copy, and it is not mentioned in the extensive discussion of the family in Choulant.

GM 311 – "Cuvier ranks with von Baer as one of the founders of modern morphology"; Horblit 20a has the first issue of the first title, dated An VIII and with Baudouin only in the imprint. Our copy has the second issue, dated 1805(as the final vol.) and with the imprint quoted above. Our copy conforms to the Horblit collation, with all the half titles and errata leaves, except that we lack the blank leaf, while bound into Vol. 3 we have an additional pp. ix- xxviii of prelims. This comprises a Lettre de M. Cuvier a M. de la Cepede; it is dated at the end "30 messidor an 13" i.e. 1804 and attempts to answer complaints about delay in publication of the book. It might well be lacking from early copies Inspection of the BM(NH) and BL copies of the first edition discloses what is probably also true of Horblit (he gives the imprint for the first vol. only), viz. Vol. 1-2 have Baudoin An VIII but Vol. 3-5 are all dated An XIV and have the imprint "Chez Genets jeune".

"he numbered among his friends Darwin, Wallace, Agassiz and Owen. He came into the Eyton Hall estate in 1855 and built a spacious museum in which he amassed a large collection of birds and bird skeletons, most of the latter being prepared by himself" – Mullens & Swann.

The record of a substantial and important library. It contained (i.a.) 93 original watercolours by Cuvier "Legende manuscrite de son main"; 3 major Travies; most of Gould; a coloured Diggles; a complete Donovan's Nest and Eggs; and most surprising of all, an original subscriber's copy of the folio Audubon. This latter is not identified in Fries, and brings us to a point on which we are entirely ignorant; what happened to the library?

Gadeau de Kerville was born in 1858 and Ronsil lists a string of his publications, the last in 1938 when he wrote the introduction to the proceedings of the 9th. Ornithological congress, which was held in Paris. Bradley Martin bought the catalogue from Quaritch (it has a note in Howard

Radclyffe's hand) but the date is not recorded.

A rare catalogue. Thayer (1862-1933) was an amateur ornithologist who published a number of papers. As Richmond commented "It is very interesting to look over the list and see haw many rare books you have, but rather surprising how many of the commoner ones are missing." Among the rare books was a folio Audubon. When Thayer died in 1933 his library was bought by the Kennedy Galleries and Frank Walters in partnership. Kennedy took only the Audubons and busted them, while Walters sold the rest. Inserted are two letters to Walters from W. W. Brown (who was Thayer's bird collector) and an attractive photograph of Brown on St. Lasaria Island, Alaska, 1915 which has a note by Thayer on the verso.

Comprises a reprint of Burke's 24pp. title quoted above, together with Richard Freeman's indexes, corrections and additions to date, which more than double the volume. Essential for any student of the complex Darwin family.

Dr. Freeman printed about 700 copies of which we now hold the entire stock. Single copies are as above, but with a sliding scale for bulk as follows; 2-14 copies £5 ea; 15-99 copies £4 ea.; above 100 copies £2 ea.

Niceville was an important entomolgist who published no substantial books; his offprints are thus more important than is sometimes the case. This is a virtually complete set; six papers listed in the *Index Litt. Ent.* are not present, but we have 10 papers not listed therein. The collection must have been put together by someone close to the author and is possibly his own set. Several papers have proof corrections; and in a note on the butterflies of the Nicobar islands there is an interesting ms. note, as one entomologist to another, on visiting them — "The people are harmless and hospitable". Some titles have more general interest than might be supposed. For example in *Reply to Mr. Butler's paper*, 1885 Niceville comments "Mr. Butler has formed his (opinions) thousands of miles away, with a scanty supply of specimens, and misled by a label."

If finished this would have been a colossal publication; the arachnids with 18 parts and the reptiles with 10 parts are the most substantial portions; mammals and birds with 3 and 4 pts each were barely started.

The volume was bound for the celebrated ornithological collection of J.H. Gurney of Norwich, and has his (rather worn) leather label on front cover.

The Brunnich is interleaved and with extensive notes by him (upwards of 700 words in his hand) particularly at the beginning where he is extracting a list of Birds of Kamtschatka & the north of Asia in preparation for his Arctic zoology. Bound at the end are four very interesting additional pieces, viz.

I.A catalogue of British birds, 8pp., drophead title, a few notes by Pennant, one suggesting that Solander has (erroneously) recorded all the birds found N. of lat 60; the pamphlet seems to be unrecorded except by Dryander (II, 119; he gives neither date nor author; who could the latter be?). It is not in Mullens & Swann, Freeman or the ESTC Blaise file.

II. Catalogue of the animals described in this volume with their British names, pp.345-51, perhaps

from the first 8vo edition of the British Zoology, 1768-69

III.J. R. Forster, A catalogue of British insects, Warrington, W. Eyres, 1770. This is the first attempt at a comprehensive list of British insects; it is very rare. Forster notes in his preface that Pennant has described the quadrupeds, birds reptiles and fish, but has left the insects to him.

IV.A catalogue of the European quadrupeds, birds, reptiles, extra- Britannic. pp. 87-96, from the supplement of 1770 to the British Zoology, annotated by Pennant, and at the end 3 leaves of his ms.

notes on the birds of Gibralter, drawn from John White, Gilbert's brother.

Pennant obviously intended the four latter items as an amalgamated comprehensive checklist of European zoology. The volume must have been in the 1913 Downing sale but cannot be identified in the catalogue. Casey Wood on Brunnich; "this very rare title"

The bulk of the work is geology; Hitchcock solicited lists of plants and animals from different authorities; the birds are by Ebenezer Emmons. When he received the list Hitchcock sent it to Audubon, asking for additions; but there is nothing to show that Audubon added any notes to it (see Ruthven Deane's article in *The Auk*, 1901, which is inserted). *Hazen 5106*

Comparason of copies in the British library and the Wellcome shows that our copy seems to be either 7646 [1544?] or 7646.5 which latter has a colophon dated 1547(the BI copy of the latter, which might settle the question, has been lost or stolen). Of the first STC records 3 copies in the UK(2 imperfect) and 5 plus in he USA; of the second 4 in the UK(2 imperfect) and 4 in the USA (one imperfect). Since the imperfections stated can only be a minimum it is clear that complete copies are very uncommon. "A popular, sensible treatise on healthful living, with sound and practical advice on the recognition of the commoner symptoms of disease, as well as what to do about them. Sir Thomas was criticized for having undertaken this work, since it was considered beneath the dignity of a knight and a diplomat; the *Proheme*(which first appeared in the 1541 edition) is written in self-defense against this criticism"- Hunt 155 (1587 edition).

Very uncommon. The Wellcome and the BL sets are uncoloured (the former lacks pl. 6 and all the 5 uterus plates; the latter has all the plates but is in poor state): the BM(NH) set is coloured but lacks all the anatomy plates. The last five plates, separately numbered and titled, illustrate Anatomy of the gravid uterus and are after the celebrated drawings prepared by William Hunter and published in his Anatomy of the human gravid uterus. These were mostly by van Rymsdyk, and three of the present plates are credited to him. The text claims "Dr. Hunter has favoured us with an elegant dissection, which we have represented in plate V...the arteries and veins, and most of the different vessels, were injected with wax, and are now in Dr. Hunter's collection...". Hunter died in 1783 leaving much work uncompleted. The text to his great atlas was not published untill 1794, edited by his nephew, Mathew Baillie. Several of his pupils published material which was certainly inspired by his example and teaching (e.g. William Cruikshank, John Sheldon). Perhaps one of these three was responsible for the anatomy in the Ency. Lond. (there is no statement of responsibilities in the work itself). Russell 455a cites one set and one partial set of the plates ("The publishing history of these plates is not known"). He describes imprint dates of 1796, 1803 & 1807(his set must be a re-issue; all our plates are dated 1796). This being the case the Wilkes plates could be renumbered as Russell 452a, following immediately after the first edition of Hunter's Gravid Uterus. No coloured copies of this are known; the present plates are certainly an important supplement to it.

A preliminary version of the Vademecum, though still running to over 350pp.

542 Editor of the "Indian Tea Gazette" The tea planter's vade mecum...tea blight, tea cultivation and maufacture, tea machinery, timbers for boxes...steam engines in tea facto ries. Minor marginal worming, half roan, somewhat worn and stained but not too bad, date erased from title, Calcutta, published at the office of the Tea Gazette, [1885]

Includes allsorts of recondite information, including the manufacture of Thibetan Brick Tea, and brief accounts of tea in Fiji, New Zealnd, Javan, and the United States. The *Indian Tea Gazette* was founded in 1877 but there is no run listed in Bucop nor a copy in the BL; we have not succeeded in identifying the editor.

The book does not have a consolidated bibliography; it is, however, clear that these local pamphlets are very uncommon. None are in Rothamsted; Perkins has only the Letters.

The execution of Dr. Blackwell left his wife destitute; she recovered her fortunes by undertaking Blackwell's Herbal. On the Fry collection see D.J. These include an exultant purchase note on title "Bought in Londin 1800, price £7 value 20 & more", and an inserted 12 pp. ms. "in the course of this study of some 1050 genera, about fifty of them new, Gaertner called attention to an enormous range of hitherto neglected or unknown characters of fruits and seeds..." Two or three copies are known of a preliminary issue of Vol. 1 dated 1782 and without a vol. number on title. Many people were consulted about the translation including Samual Johnson who advised on the formation of English botanical terms, and Linnaeus the younger who sent proof sheets of the *Supplementum*. *Soulsby* 580a

Botanically the book is apparently "a rather unsatisfactory performance" but is particularly interesting for its use of indigenous resources. Stafleu 6264

Dell'historia de i semplici aromati...dall'Indie Orientali. ..Indie Occidentali. 26 woodcuts, mostly of spices (mace, cardomon, pepper, etc.) but including also an armadillo, some browning, a decent but probably made- up copy in a vellum binding from a 16th. Cent. ms., Venice, Z. Zenaro, 1605

Annibale Briganti's translation of Orta's *Coloquios dos simples...da India* and Monardes' treatise on the medical plants of America, the first complete edition of which was published in 1574.

612 Pabst (G.) & Mueller (O.) Cryptogamen-flora...Cryptogamen Deutschlands. 3 pt. in one vol., 34 plates, stamp on title, folio, cloth, bit worn and loose, Gera, 1875-77

Comprises Pt. I Flechten with 12 uncoloured lithographs; Pt. II Pilze with 25 coloured, or partly coloured lithographs; Pt. III Die Lebermoose, with a plain plate of detail and 8 partly coloured lithographs. Staffeu 7175 & 7176 lists the 3rd part separately and remarks "Asher(Cat. 14 no 135, 1974) offered a complete copy at D. fl. 950 US \$ 400"; this latter would appear to have been one of the less successful 15 year speculations, or perhaps this copy is cheap.

613 Palisot de Beauvois (A.M.) Flore d'Oware et de Benin en Afrique. Vol. 1 pt. 1-5 only 30 plates, printed in colours and finished by hand, after J.G. Pretre and B. Mirbel, some foxing, near contemporary quarter green leather, gilt, little worn and scraped, booklabels of Chas. Puls, pharmacist at Ghent and the Powis library, 1804 (-05)

About a quarter of the work only, which ran to two vol. with 120 plates. Staffeu 7212 gives a full acount and collation; apparently only 200 copies were issued.

The pinnacle of nineteenth-century selenography

Very rare in this complete state (we were able to bring this set together from two different sources). D. Wattenberg has produced a recent article on the map (Zur geschichte der Mondkarte von J.F. Jul. Schmidt, *Mitteilungen der Archenhold-Sternwarte Berlin-Treptow*, No. 65, 1962) which uses some archival sources. Schmidt sold his 2100 moon drawings to the German government which then published the work. 400 copies were printed at the considerable cost of over 8,000 marks.

The Linda Hall exhibition catalogue The face of the moon, 1989 gives a laudatory accound of Schmidt, though it does not take Watternberg into account. "The Schmidt map was the pinnacle of nineteenth-century selenography. Published in 25 sheets, if assembled it would make a map 6 and a half feet across. There are over 33,000 craters depicted...".

Schmidt (1825-1884) was the first director of the Athens observatory founded by Baron von Sina; it still exists on its attractive site near the Acropolis.

The pressmark on the flyleaf and the bookplate once on title verso are both consistent with other books we have seen from the family library.

Even the press cuttings, almost all on ornithological or natural history topics, make good reading; a few headlines; Brasher quits woods, Jefferson Butler killed by auto, Roosevelt like a powder mill? This last comes from an extensive collection *Aricles on nature faking* a substantial row over the

president's hunting and nature lore.

Ruthven Deane, 1851-1934, was a distinguished amateur ornitholgist and one of the founders of the Nuttall Ornithological Club. Batchelder's history of the club remarks "After his school days an office desk claimed most of his time, but spare hours still found him in the field; he kept posted on the current literature, and nothing could interrupt his constant contact with his ornithological friends"

The most sustantial titles are Review of the Ibidinae, On the fruit pigeons, A study of the Ptercolidae, or family of the sand-grouse, and The genus Porphyrio, Milne Edwards receives printed acknowledgement in several and a number are inscribed to him by Elliot. The collection (unbound) was lot 548 in the Milne Edwards sale in Paris in 1901.

In the second Bradly Martin sale (lot 1468) a copy of the book with the coloured plates (only) made 1,430 dollars (though it has to be admitted that there was another copy in a mixed lot later which made less). The Bradley Martin and Ronsil sets, sold at auction in 1989 & 1990 made \$16,000 & DM 22,000 respectively (with premium roughly equivalent to take home prices of £10,800 & £9,000). Both sets were mostly bound and were, perhaps, slightly nicer than the present run.

We are unable to say if our set is complete, though it certainly runs to the same date as that in Trinity College. The coloured bird plates are an extraordinary mixture, including fine chomolithographs, attractive and not so attractive hand-coloured lithographs(one of these as late as 1935) and dim colour printing or colour tinted photographs.

Nevertheless, as Howard Radelyffe once observed (in another context), this could well form the icing on the cake of any substantial ornithological library.

The woodcuts are of a most endearing simplicity and have much more character than many a more sophisticated representation. " interesting, exceedingly rare and curious" — Casey Wood. See illustration on front cover Casey Wood 450; Palau 151290; Not in Ayer, Trinity or Yale.

A fine set of a very rare work. Martinet is best known for his illustrations to one of the great ornithological classics, the Martinet Buffon. This, the Planches enluminees as it was called, was designed by Buffon as the most lavish reworking of the bird section of his Histoire naturelle with coloured plates; Martinet was selected as the artist. However he was not satisfied with the result, and to give himself artistic freedom he started to publish his own colour plate bird books. He was a lovely artist but seems to have been a bad organiser. His own projected folio edition seems to have petered out with nothing to show but a couple of sets of proofs (one was Bradley Martin sale, pt. 1, lot 155 bought by Maggs; it seems to be unique; it is now in a private collection in England). He was a little more successful with this 8vo edition but not much. It is very rare and all the copies I have seen are different. A total of 483 plates is sometimes cited, but I have yet to find a copy with the so-called full complement. A number of copies consist of the first six volumes only. The Bradley Martin octavo set (lot 156; bought by Maggs; now in an English private collection) had one less plate than present here; the ex-Rothschild copy at Tring does have three more bird plates but lacks all but one of the charming allegorical frontispieces. Dr. Bertrand Sauzier is presently writing a paper on Martinet and his bird books which may clarify some of this confusion; in the meantime the present set is the finest I have ever seen of this rare and desirable work. A book with some attractive plates, but organised in a muddle. The plates are mostly lithographs, and these fall roughly into two groups. There are 11 plates printed in India at the Byculla Education Society's press and lithographed by Ignatius Siqueira; these all have hand colouring though it is very sketchy. There are 18 plates by Mintern brothers , London of which 8 are fully coloured by hand. Two of the "Mintern" plates have a BES imprint and were probably prepared in England and printed in India.

The number of plates which should be present is confused but we believe this copy to be complete, although Nissen calls for 37 plates. The plates in Vol. 1 conform to the list except there is an additional plate of the skeleton of Balearica pavonina which is not called for; also there is a slip @ p. 107 promising two plates (Corvus corax, Pyrrhocorvax alpinus) which never appared. In Vol. 2 two woodcuts – those at 363 & 372 – appear on separate leaves while there is a coloured plate of Cinnyris minimus @ p. 228 which is not called for. All three species of Aethopyga seem to appear on one plate at p. 222, not separate plates as listed.

Janinet, 1752-1814 was a celebrated engraver, particularly of mezzotints. Portalis & Beraldi, II, 476-87 attempt a catalogue of his engravings; our *Cahier* is not included.

One seems to represent a general revision (which was never published) the other concentrates more on Jardine's own collection at Jardine Hall, Lockerby, Dumfries.

John Henry Gurney (1848-1922) was one of the great figures on the Victorian ornithological scene. He published some 130 books and papers, while his comfortable financial position as one of the banking Gurneys, enabled him to build a very fine ornithological library. He was particualarly interested in Raptorial birds. In 1894 his catalogue of Raptorial birds in the Norwich Museum, a collection put together by his father and himself, showed that they had obtained 403 of 470 species of Accipitres and 195 of 268 Stirges. These are exactly the birds covered by Strickland; this copy thus provides an unrivaled documentation of these birds in the late 19th, century.

Gurney's library was sold on the premises at Keswick hall in 1940. This book was the reader in lot

624; with 17 other omithological books it made 9 shillings to Edwards.

Loosely inserted in a card with a pencil note in Bradley Martin's hand detailing this point.

This is a particularly attractive set, bound for E.V. Utterson, 1778-1856 the collector and bibliophile. He was a friend of Dibdin (who called him "Palmerin") and a founder member of the Roxburghe club. For further details see de Ricci and R. Turley's article on him in *The book collector*, 1976.

A scarce book. The list of bird books with comments is absolutely rivetting; its refreshingly individual taste is best given by a few quotations. On Donovan "This is a work of little merit, and wholly useless to the Ornithologist. The descriptions are short and inaccurate, and the plates stiff and

gaudy." On Gerardin "...can easily be dispensed with at the present day"
He also notices Mrs. Perrot ("coloured £1 1s;uncoloured, 14s.") and Mr. Lane's Figures of the Parrots, 1831 ("This splendid work...the most beautiful, and masterly work, delineating birds, ever published in Britain..."). Mr. Lane seems to have eluded everyone else; it is quite appropriate that he should be in Wood.
