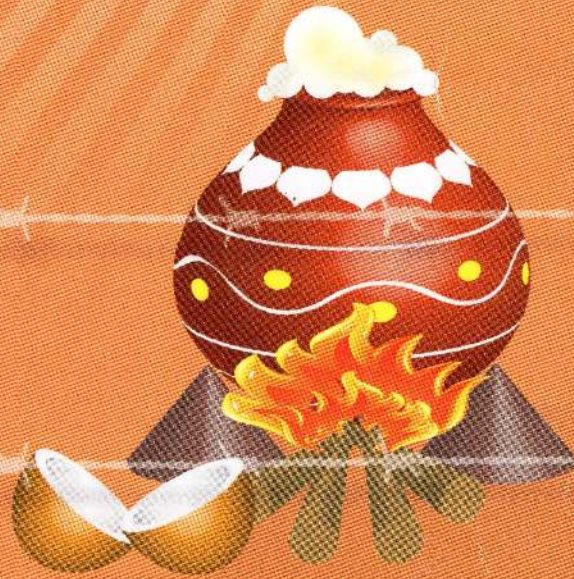

Furthermore, if we don't see any tangible changes to the human rights situation in Sri Lanka, we will ask governments to boycott the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting scheduled to be held in November 2013 in Colombo.

As CTC embarks upon a new year, we remain confident that we can count on YOUR support to help us move forward. On behalf of everyone at the Canadian Tamil Congress, I would like to wish you and your family a very happy Thai Pongal and a year filled with happiness, good health and prosperity.

Thai Pongal: A Celebration of Globalized Tamils



Thai Pongal is a harvest festival and is equivalent to Thanksgiving celebrations in North America. It is an inclusive festival celebrated by the Tamil population irrespective of religious faith. Prior to industrialization, in an agriculture-based civilization, farmers depended on their cattle, timely rain and the Sun for a bountiful harvest. Once a year, they celebrated Thai Pongal, to thank the nature, the sun and the farm animals for bringing prosperity to agriculture with plentiful harvests. Although the origin of Thai Pongal is not clearly known, it may well be more than 1000 years old.

Thai Pongal is celebrated on the first day of the month Thai (the first month of the Tamil Almanac). The day falls between January 12th and 15th in the Christian calendar. The date of Pongal often remains the same, as it is determined according to the solar calendar. The date is also viewed as an auspicious day as the Sun begins its journey northwards for a period of six months. That is where the Tamil saying, "Thai Piranthal Vali Pirakkum", stems from - the commencement of Thai paves the way for new opportunities and a way for love, peace, harmony, prosperity and joy in everyone's life.

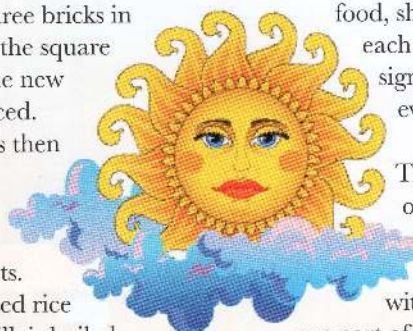
In the Tamil language, Pongal means "boiling over" or "spillover". At the front of the house, a flat square pitch

is made and decorated with kolam drawings made from rice flour. The square pitch is exposed to direct sunlight and defines the sacred area where the Pongal is prepared. A hearth made of natural firewood is set up using three bricks in the middle of the square pitch where the new clay pot is placed. The clay pot is then adorned with flowers, turmeric leaves and roots. Newly harvested rice with a little milk is boiled in the pot. Other ingredients of Pongal are chakkarai (brown sugar) or katkandu (sugar candy), milk (cow's milk or coconut milk), payaru (roasted green gram), raisins and cashew nuts.

While a senior member of the family cooks, the rest of the family members gather around the sacred area and dutifully assists him or her. The climax is when the rice and milk reach the boiling point and the Pongal spills over the edges of the clay pot. The spill over of milk is a propitious symbol of abundance and good omen and is often accompanied by wishing each other with the delightful cry - "Pongal O'Pongal!" - we are getting exactly what we expect. As soon as the boiling is over, the cooked rice, the Pongal, is first offered to the sun god on banana

leaves. The family prays and thanks the Sun, nature and farmers. The Pongal is then served with fruits among family and shared with relatives, friends and neighbours. Although every household makes the food, sharing the Pongal with each other is one of the most significant features of the event.

The Pongal festival was originally celebrated in India and Sri Lanka. It has now become global with Tamils residing in various part of the world and is celebrated by over 70 million people. The celebration has much in common with North American Thanksgiving and although the Pongal is in mid January, the celebration can last several days. ♦

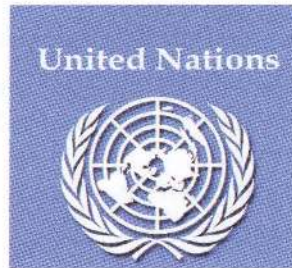

Sri Lanka Reviewed by Peers during UN Universal Periodic Review

November 1st, 2012 - United Nations, Geneva

The United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) reviewed Sri Lanka's human rights record as part of its Universal Periodic Review. After submitting written submissions on Sri Lanka's human rights record to the UPR panel, representatives of the Canadian Tamil Congress attended the three-hour review of Sri Lanka in Geneva. Much like its National Report, the content of Sri Lanka's oral statements illustrated a lack of progress towards implementing recommendations made by its peer states in 2008. Of 26 voluntary commitments made in 2008, Sri Lanka has fulfilled just 2 and of 45 accepted recommendations, only 5 have been implemented thus far.



Hundreds of supporters including youth groups, seniors groups, families and circles of friends, joined at Thomson Memorial Park, in Scarborough, for a 5 km walk. The proceeds from the event will benefit CAMH's highest priorities including the Office of Transformative Global Health, which will be supporting a capacity building training initiative in Sri Lanka.

CTC's Intervention Accepted by the Supreme Court of Canada

October 18th, 2012 – SCC, Ottawa



Tamil Canadians Walked to Raise over \$46,000 for CAMH

September 16th, 2012 – Thomson Memorial Park, Scarborough



Thousands of Tamil Canadians and friends joined the 2012 Tamil Canadian walk-a-thon in support of Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH). CAMH is Canada's largest mental health and addiction teaching hospital and is also known for its work globally on mental health initiatives, providing clinical training and education in several countries including Nigeria, Brazil, Mexico, China, India and Sri Lanka.



CTC intervened in *Agraira v. Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness*, an appeal at the SCC concerning the application of s. 34 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (IRPA). CTC's counsel, Ms. Barbara Jackman and Mr. Hadayt Nazami, argued that the Minister's discretion under s. 34(2) of IRPA should be broadened to ensure that people who do not present a security threat to Canada are permitted to regularize their status. CTC remains deeply concerned about the outcome of the appeal to the SCC as it will have a direct impact on Tamil refugee claimants in Canada.

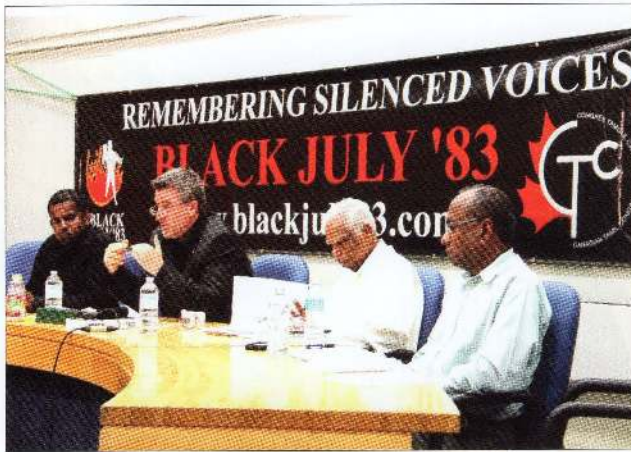

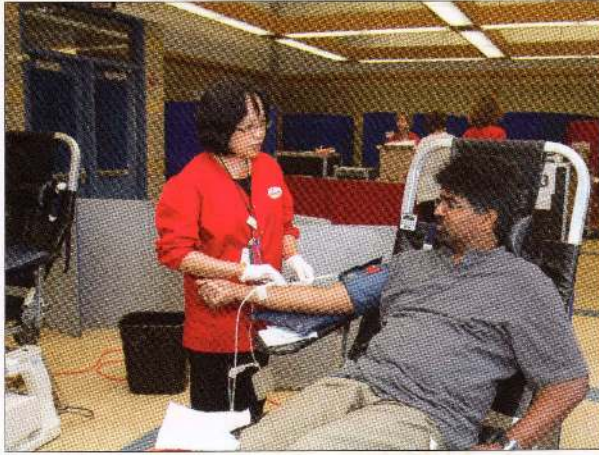

April 28th, 2012 – Canadian Tamil Congress



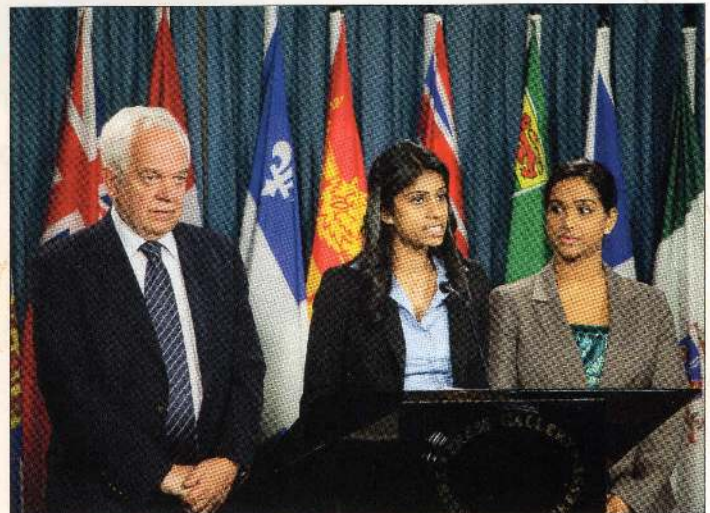

CTC Advocacy Team at the UN Human Rights Council

February 27th – March 23rd, 2012 – United Nations, Geneva

On behalf of Lawyers Rights Watch Canada (LRWC), Gary Anandasangaree and Vani Selvarajah addressed the UN Human Rights Council during its 19th session in Geneva. Statements delivered to the Council repeatedly urged the United Nations and its member states to call for independent, international investigation into allegations of human rights violations in Sri Lanka. The advocacy team lobbied various governments and groups at the UN to advocate for the passage of the Resolution on Accountability in Sri Lanka that passed on March 22nd, 2012. LRWC has been actively involved in UN lobbying and advocacy efforts on the international level. In 2012, the team participated in all sessions of the HRC in March, June and September.

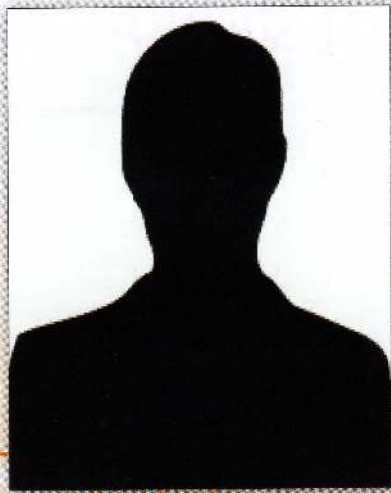

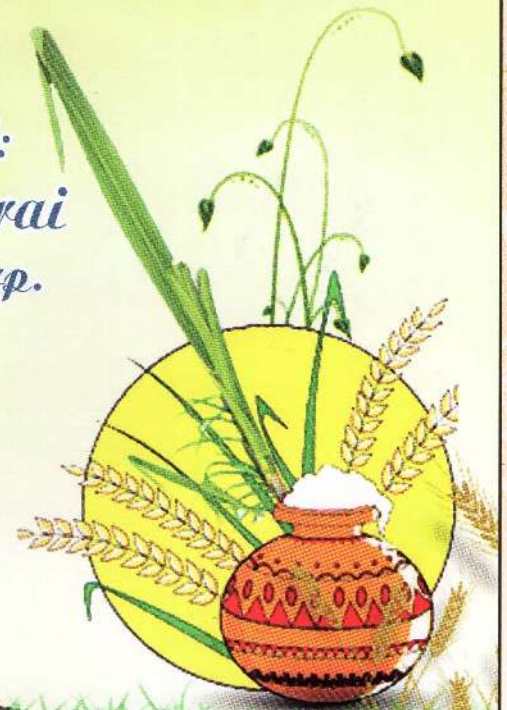
The Doctor was one of the last health care workers to come out alive from the war zone in May 2009. Fortunately, he was not captured nor identified as a doctor by the Sri Lankan authorities and managed to escape Sri Lanka. The Doctor, physically and mentally wounded, is currently living in exile with his wife and children and is trying to get past the trauma and horrific memories that have now become a part of him.

CTC honours the Doctor’s selfless work and salutes him for his courage, compassion and commitment to his fellow people in challenging and dangerous circumstances. Recognized for championing the quality of life for the people he served and the way he embraced his conviction to uphold his duties not only as a doctor, but also as a fellow human being, the Doctor has become a living hero in the eyes of many Tamil Canadians. ♦

இன்றைக்கு தொன்மையும் வளமும் வண்பும் இணைந்த ஒரு மொழியைப் பேசுபவர்களாக நாம் இருக்கிறோம். தோண்டத் தோண்டத் திகட்டாத தேன்சுவையைக் கொட்டித்தரும் தொன்மை தமிழுக்கு உண்டு. தமிழுடன் தோன்றிய பல மொழிகள் அழிந்துபோனாலும் நவீனத்தைக் குழைந்து இற்றைவரைக்கும் இளமையாய் வாழ்ந்துவருவது அதன் சிறப்பு. பல்லாயிரம் ஆண்டுகளாகத் தொடரும் தமிழ் மொழியின் சிறப்புக்கு வளம் சேர்த்த ஏராளமானோர் இருக்கிறார்கள். இவர்களின் ஒப்பற்ற உழைப்பாலும் அர்ப்பணிப்பாலுமே தமிழ் மொழி தொன்மையும் நவீனமும் ஒருங்கே அமைந்ததாய் வாழ்ந்துகொண்டிருக்கிறது. அந்தவகையில் தமிழ்மொழியின் பெருமையை உலகளாவிய வகையில் பறைசாற்றிய ஒருவர் அருட்திரு. சேவியர் தனிநாயகம் அடிகளார். தமிழை உலகமெலாம் பரவும்வகை செய்து ஈழத்தமிழினத்துக்கே பெருமை சேர்த்தவர் தனிநாயக அடிகள்.

சேவியர் தனிநாயகம் அடிகளார் 1913ம் ஆண்டு ஓகஸ்ட் 2ம் நாள் ஊர்காவற்றுறையிலே பிறந்தார். இவரின் இயற்பெயர் நாகநாதன். நாகநாதன் கிறிஸ்தவ சமயத்தைத் தழுவிப்போது ஏற்றுக்கொண்ட பெயர் சேவியர் ஸ்ரீனிஸலோஸ். இவர் தனது ஆரம்பக் கல்வியை காவலூர் புனித அந்தோனியார் கல்லூரியிலும் இடைநிலைக்கல்வியை சம்பத்திரிகியார் கல்லூரியிலும் (1920 - 1922) கற்றார். பின்னர் கத்தோலிக்க குருவாக விரும்பி கொழும்பு புனித பேர்னாட் குருமடத்தில் இணைந்து (1934) மெய்யியல் துறையில் தனது இளங்கலைப் பட்டத்தைப் பெற்றார். தொடர்ந்து உரோம் வத்திக்கான் பல்கலைக்கழகத்தில் மெய்யியல்



முனைவர் பட்டத்தைப் பெற்றார். ஐரோப்பாவில் இருந்தபோதே ஆங்கிலத்துடன் இலத்தீன், இத்தாலிய, பிரெஞ்சு, ஜேர்மனிய, ஸ்பானிய,

போர்த்துகேய மொழிகளில் புலமை பெற்றவராக விளங்கினார்.

அதன் பின்னர் தமிழ் நாட்டில் நெல்லை மாவட்டத்தில் உள்ள வடக்கன்குளம் புனித தெரேசா உயர்நிலைப்பள்ளியில் துணைத் தலைமையாசிரியராகப் பணியாற்றினார். இலங்கையில் கற்றபோதும் தமிழ் பமியல் வாய்ப்பு இலங்கையில் அவருக்கு வாய்க்கப்பெறவில்லை. வடக்கன்குளத்தில் இருந்தபோதே பண்டிதர் குருசாமி சுப்பிரமணிய ஐயர் என்பவரிடம் தமிழ் பமியல் ஆரம்பித்தார். 1945இல் தமிழ்நாட்டில் அண்ணாமலைப் பல்கலைக்கழகத்தில் சங்க இலக்கியத்தை ஆய்வு செய்து “தமிழ்ப்பாடல்களில் இயற்கை” என்ற ஆய்வுக் கட்டுரையை சமர்ப்பித்து முதுமாணிப் பட்டம் பெற்றார்.

தமிழ் மொழிக்கான ஆய்வுகள் அதிகமில்லாத அந்நாட்களில் தமிழ் மொழிக்கான ஆய்வு அமைப்பு ஒன்றை உருவாக்கும் ஆர்வம் கொண்டு தனிநாயக அடிகள் உழைத்து வந்தார். ஐப்பான், சிலி, பிரேசில், பெரு, மெக்ஸிக்கோ, அமெரிக்கா ஆகியநாடுகளுக்கு மொழியியல் ஆய்வு தொடர்பாகப் பயணித்தார். தமது பயணத்தின் போது ஐரோப்பிய நூலகங்களில் உள்ள பழந்தமிழ் நூல்களைக் கண்டறிந்தார். இவற்றில் “கார்த்தியா” (1556), “தம்பிரான் வணக்கம்” (1578), “கிறித்தியானி வணக்கம்” (1579), ஆன்டம் டி புரொசென்சா என்பவரால் தொகுக்கப்பட்ட முதலாவது “தமிழ்-போர்த்துகீச அகராதி” ஆகியவை குறிப்பிடத்தக்கவை ஆகும். அமெரிக்கப் பல்கலைக்கழகங்களில் ஏனைய மொழிகளுக்காக

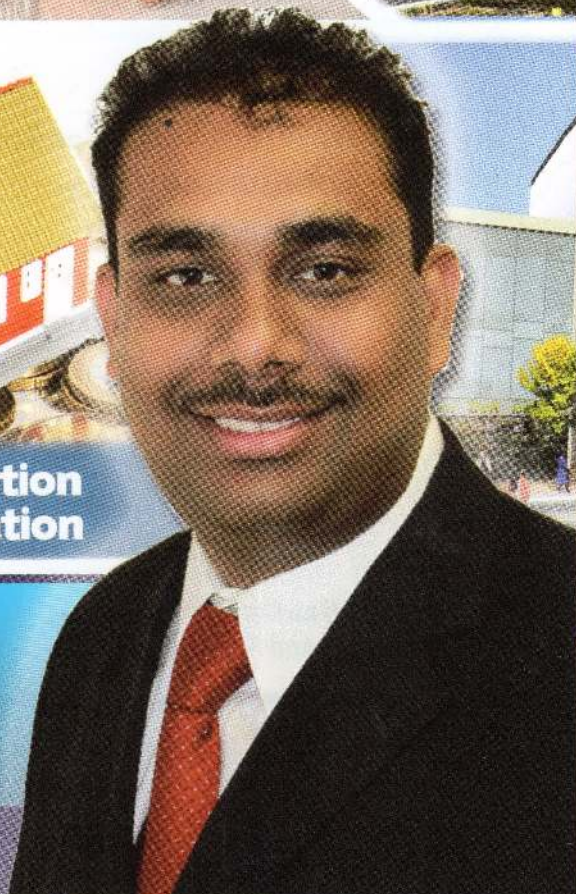



At the Campbell Family Mental Health Research Institute, made possible by donor support, CAMH scientists are pushing the boundaries of our understanding of the brain to reveal causes of mental illness and addictions; to improve prevention, treatment and management; and to understand societal and cultural factors to drive research, policy and social change.

New treatment options with fewer side-effects are already being

designed and perfected at the Temerty Centre for Therapeutic Brain Intervention. At the same time, scientists at the Tanenbaum Centre for Pharmacogenetics are working to identify new genetic markers and develop tests to predict a patient's response to medication. Their efforts will help eliminate trial-and-error prescribing – reducing dangerous side-effects and saving the health-care system millions of dollars in unnecessary costs.

Knowledge sharing and capacity building

A key component of CAMH's vision is to revolutionize education and knowledge exchange. We're developing into a true mental health learning organization; where teaching and learning permeate all aspects of our work. We know that with deeper awareness of mental

illness comes deeper understanding, acceptance and a willingness to help. That's why in addition to training tomorrow's mental health experts we're also educating patients, families and the general public.

Some Realistic Challenges to Inter-Ethnic Reconciliation in Sri Lanka



“Canada again calls on the government of Sri Lanka to live up to the standard of membership in the Commonwealth and show tangible progress on a process of national political reconciliation and to seriously address allegations of human rights violations by both sides during the civil war...” The Canadian Minister of Immigration and Citizenship, Hon. Jason Kenney during his recent visit to the island nation, stated this in Colombo, Sri Lanka.

Sri Lanka's Sinhala Minister for External Affairs, G.L. Peiris retorted that the Canadian Minister is “biased and unbalanced” and that “Sri Lanka must be given the time and space to address the post conflict issues, given the complexity of the domestic process including the need for wide consultations with political parties on the issue of devolution.”

It is important to understand the Sinhala Minister's mindset and the extremist Sinhala-Buddhist government think-tank he represents, before we try to understand what Peiris has said. Peiris was one of the members of the junta that shared the anti-Tamil war room together with the pack of hardline Sinhala academics/ diplomats as Palitha Kohona, Rohan Gunaratna, Dayan Jayatileke, Minister Mervin de Silva, and Prof. Nalin de Silva et al. Some of these men serve as policy makers

and interpreters of the Sinhala constitution to those who wield today power in the totalitarian regime in Sri Lanka.

From 1990-1993, I was elected President of the University of Jaffna Teachers Association and I travelled to Colombo several times to be present at the numerous meetings of the Federation of University Teachers' Associations (FUTA) that took place in the Board Room of the Ministry of Higher Education in Ward Place, Colombo. Prof. Nalin de Silva was the chairman of FUTA. What is commendable about Nalin is that he does not hide his ethno-religious and militant extremism and is very open and candid about it. He also openly advocates that he is in full support of the Sinhala government's unwritten policy of annihilation or assimilation of the Tamil nationality into the one indivisible Sinhala Buddhist state. His only accusation is that the Sinhala government is not completing this process fast enough.

During those visits to Colombo I had met with G. L. Peiris only once in his office at the University of Colombo when he was Vice-Chancellor. In that private meeting which lasted for less than 35 minutes, it did not take me much time to conclude that Peiris had no qualms in preaching the same philosophy of the land, race (Sinhalese) and faith (Buddhism), as advocated by his university colleague

Nalin de Silva. Herein lies the impossibility of any form of meaningful or over-arching reconciliation between the two communities, Tamils and Sinhalese who have shared this island for the past two millennia. It is therefore not surprising that G. L. Peiris chose to ridicule the statement by the Canadian Minister as biased and unbalanced. He is also sincere in saying that his Sinhala government needs “time and space.” Time in order to complete the process annihilation/ assimilation of the Tamil nationality which is happening at an accelerated speed with the help of over two hundred thousand Sinhala military personnel stationed in the “Tamil homelands,” i.e. the “space” in the political lexicon of Peiris.

The unwritten policy of annihilation or assimilation of the Tamil nationality was introduced already in 1948 when Britain ceded power to the Sinhala elite, in the name of political independence. The Sinhala constitutions of 1948, 1972 and 1978 were unilaterally imposed without the consent of the Tamil nationality. Tamils were not party to any of the constitution making and it can be inferred from the Sinhala constitution that it was imposed to legally deprive the Tamils of their right to land, culture, language, education, employment and political expression.

The forced settlement of Sinhala military personnel and ex-convicts currently in vogue in the heart of Batticaloa, Jaffna, Mannar and Trincomalee is reminiscent of what the Roman Conquerors did in the Hellenistic regions of Europe in the first century. Under the name of progress, the international community with the support of India is aiding and abetting this process of planned extinction of Ceylon Tamils who have always retained a distinct identity vis-à-vis Tamils of Indian origin. Batticaloa, Trincomalee, Mannar and Jaffna had a specific Tamil cultural and linguistic identity that is now being defaced and destroyed.

In 1675 the Dutch Governor Van Goens confirmed that only Tamils inhabited the Northern and Eastern districts of Ceylon. According to the British census of 1827 there were no Sinhalese living in the districts of Trincomalee and Batticaloa. The same census maintains that the Tamils comprised 81.8% and Muslims 16.9%. It is only the British data

of 1881, 1891 and 1901 that holds that the Sinhala population in the Eastern province fluctuated between 3.7% to 5.2% during these 20 years. (For more on this, see, A.J. Wilson, *The Break Up of Sri Lanka*, C. Hurst, London, 1988, p. 219). Today, with the government-aided and accelerated process of assimilation, the Sinhala population in the East is equal to the rest, if not more.

The Sinhala government has total monopoly over the island's economy, commerce, military, politics and media. In the past thirty years, they have managed to convince the world that they are dealing with terrorism and they received unconditional support from many European and North American states in decimating the Tamils or to chase away those who refused the process of assimilation as asylum seekers. Today, these countries see the refugee issue as an economic burden and want to reduce the push factor that catapults refugees to their shores. This effort is doomed to failure because these nations refuse to recognize the fact

that they are dealing not with a democratic polity but with a totalitarian regime that seeks to have an exclusive ethno-religious polity under the banner of democracy - a label that has no relevance to the political reality.

Even after sacrificing over a hundred thousand innocent Tamil children, women and men on the altar of exclusivist Sinhala-Buddhist hegemony, it is the euphonious spirit of subjugation and conquest that is evident in the statements of G. L. Peiris. If subjugation is another name for reconciliation, then the issue here is not politics but good Vs evil. The Tamil opinion is very firm that association with evil is always wrong. Aggressor and victim cannot reconcile while the victim is still trampled under the foot of the aggressor. ♦

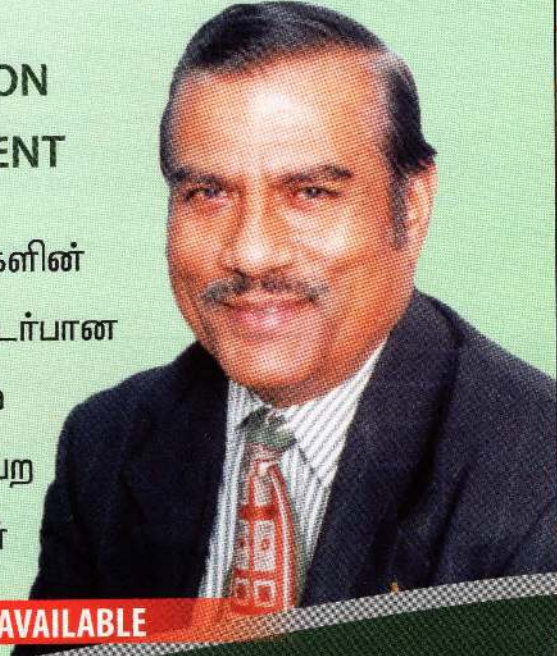

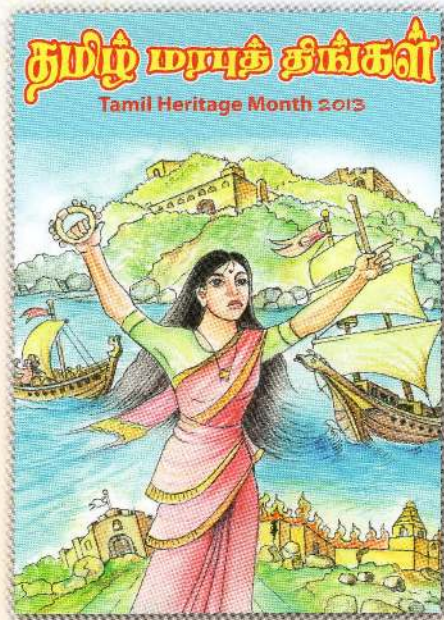

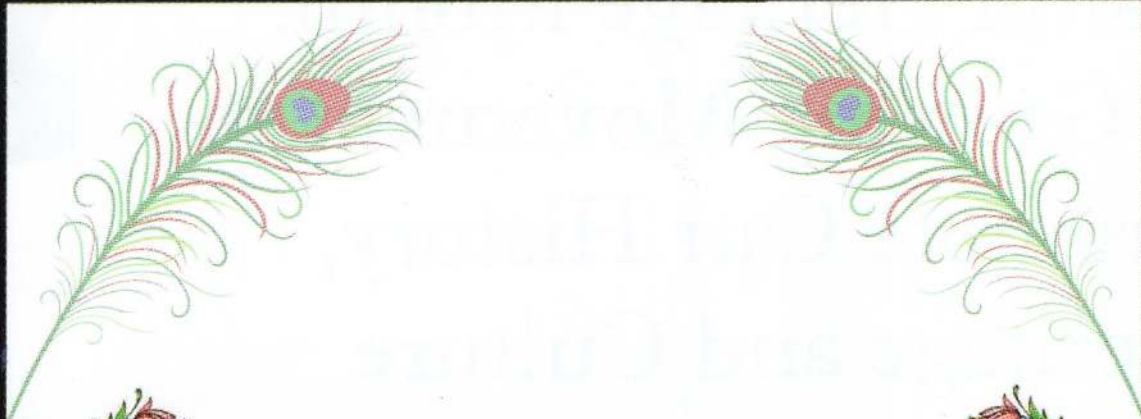

Commencement of “Thai” Paves the Way for New Opportunities

"**T**hai pi'ranthaal vazhi pi'rakkum" (தை பிறந்தால் வழி பிறக்கும்) means "the commencement of Thai paves the way for new opportunities". Sadly the reason the Sri Lanka Campaign exists is because for many people in Sri Lanka these opportunities are very limited: the military's vice-like grip on the north and east, the regime's clamping down on all forms of dissent, and the manner in which war crimes suspects continue to hold the whip hand over their surviving victims contribute to a culture of fear and oppression which prevents Sri Lankans of any ethnicity from getting on with their lives.

But this year will bring opportunities to change that. In March the UN's Human Rights Council will review Sri Lanka's progress over the last year, and whilst the Commonwealth's decision to host its Annual Summit in Sri Lanka in November is disgraceful, it does bring opportunities to shine a bright light on the wrongs of the regime – particularly if Commonwealth Nations follow the Canadian Prime Minister's lead and refuse to send their Head of Government.

These will be our priorities for the year to come. I believe they will also

be the priorities for many people here, and I hope we can count on your support.

Traditionally there has also been another priority to much Canadian activism: that on the Tamil right to



self-determination. I am not a lawyer, but am aware that self-determination is understood in international law as having two meanings. First self-determination is a fundamental right of peoples guaranteed in Chapter 1, Article 1, part 2 of the UN Charter, and elaborated in a 1960 declaration of the UN General Assembly. This right, which was a significant part of decolonisation movement, is often referred to as 'external' self-determination. Second, it is defined for a different purpose in the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights as the right for peoples to "freely determine their political status and freely pursue

their economic, social and cultural development." This is often referred to as 'internal' self-determination.

Clearly many Tamils in Sri Lanka don't enjoy these rights – the direct intervention of the military, paramilitary groups, and Basil Rajapakse's Presidential Task Force for the North preclude it. But what is not always understood is that independence is neither always necessary, nor ever sufficient, for self-determination. It is never sufficient because peoples never fit neatly into geographic areas, and it is not always necessary because a regime more inclusive than the Rajapaksas might potentially be able to satisfy demands for self-determination within a loose federal state.

Whether that is possible is not a question for the Sri Lanka Campaign to answer. We remain uncommitted on the question, although we have individual members on both sides. But what is clear from talking to Tamils in the north of Sri Lanka is that what is at threat is not so much the idea of a Tamil Nation (which is no stronger or weaker than it has been for some time) but the Tamil identity (which is under siege from forced Sinhalisation, the military's intervention in northern commercial

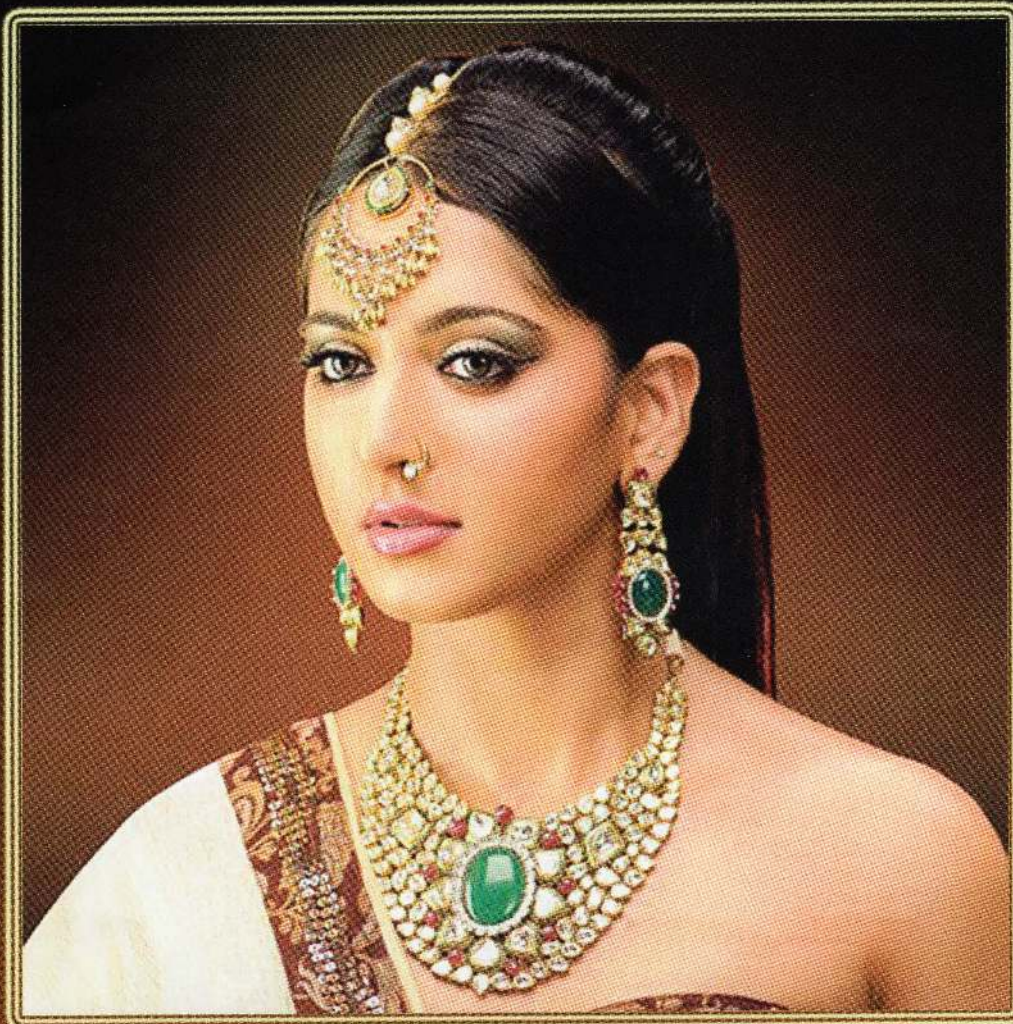

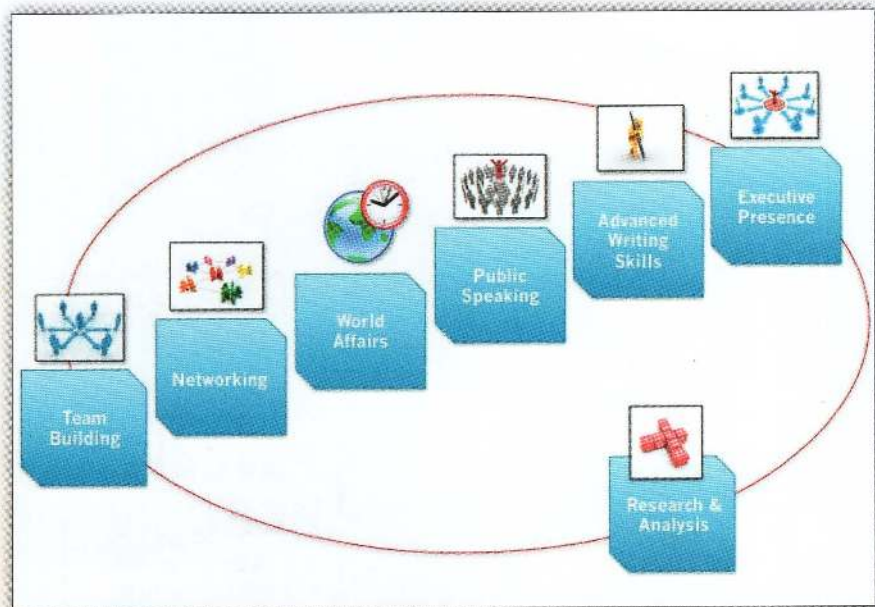

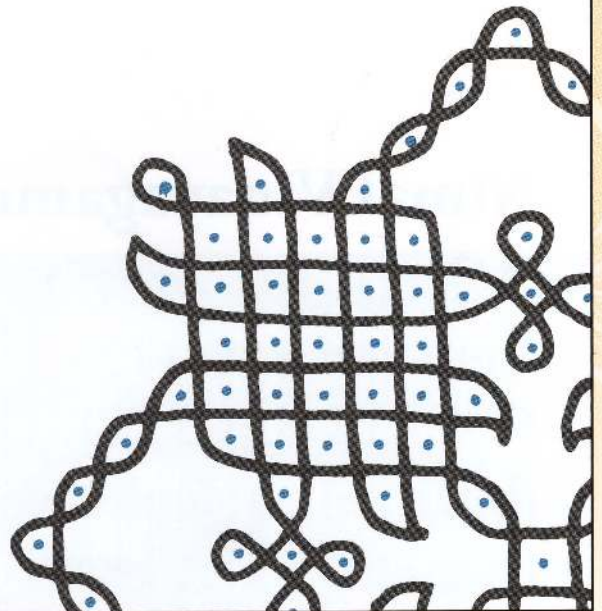

A Defining Moment in the Wake of Tragedy:

Understanding what Women's Rights mean in the Tamil Community

India continues to grapple with the public outcry and unrest following the violent gang rape and subsequent death of a young student in New Delhi in December of 2012. As details of the tragedy continue to unfold, violence against women and women's rights have been pushed to the forefront of our collective consciousness. Certainly there are different perspectives on the issue and everyone from politicians to journalists to lay people has voiced their opinions through the public stage that is the Internet. Some are calling for the castration and execution of the culprits; others are victim-blaming suggesting that young Jyoti, whose name was released publicly by her family weeks after her death, should have been more careful, should have known better. Typically, many people fall somewhere in between on this spectrum when such violent sexual crimes take place. Given the exoticism that the Western world typically imparts onto India, the New Delhi incident has drawn a wholly distinct response from our Western news sources. This neocolonial line of thought suggests that this penchant for violent rape is inherent to Indian culture and is embedded in the social psyche. These commentators cite such practices as dowries for brides,



female infanticide, and low literacy and education levels for girls and women as proof that India is a decidedly patriarchal society with misguided beliefs that the "West" has moved beyond. Narratives that identify gender-based violence as an Indian-specific problem perpetuate dangerous stereotypes, painting South Asian women as passive and submissive, and Indian culture as being unique in its mistreatment of women.

Of course violence against women is by no means a cultural phenomenon specific to India. It is an epidemic that crosses borders. It is a widespread social problem that is the product of a dominant culture that normalizes and excuses violence

against women and girls. It flourishes within any society that systemically degrades and devalues women and their experiences. While these neocolonial notions of Indian culture are entirely misguided, the New Delhi incident has served to rouse an entire nation that has traditionally treated women and girls as second-class citizens.

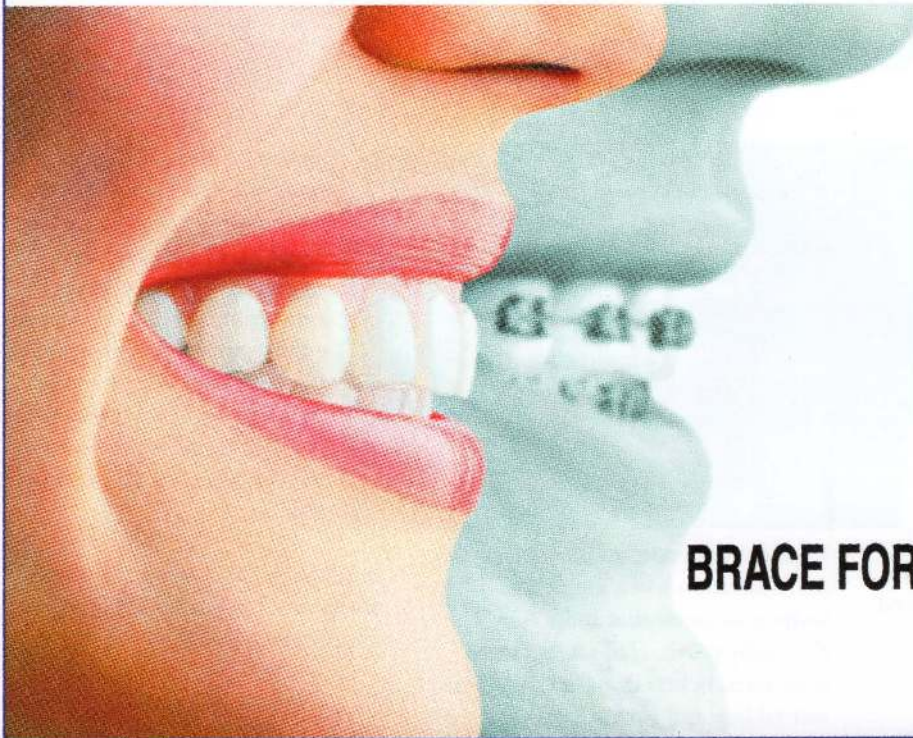
But how deeply rooted are these misogynistic attitudes within our own Tamil community?

This is a difficult question to answer. Particularly given our dual identities as Tamil-Canadians; we are influenced not only by ancient

cultural practices and traditions that we fiercely protect and preserve, but are also affected by the ever-encroaching spectre of attitudes and values. So as we sit precariously at this intersection between "Western" and "Eastern" ideologies, and pause to reflect on the tragic fate of Jyoti, we must review, with a critical eye, our own attitudes towards our mothers, daughters, sisters, and partners.

For second generation Tamil-Canadians, much of our understanding of “Tamil culture” is filtered through the lens of Tamil cinema, which often simultaneously places a woman at a position of utmost respect and regard and at a place of utmost ridicule depending exclusively on how modestly or modernly the woman is dressed. A modest woman dressed in a traditional sari will elicit a prayer from the hero, while a woman dressed revealingly in modern clothes won't even get a second glance from our righteous protagonist. Asserting that dress, in and of itself, can dictate the social standing of a woman irrespective of her character, personality, and deeds, effectively objectifies a woman, stripping her of her personhood and identity.

We cannot deny that such prejudicial attitudes and behaviours toward women exist in our daily lives and we certainly cannot disregard the scope and extent of violence against women within our own community. But what cultural norms contribute to this pervasive climate of gender injustice? For one, the extreme stigmatization of rape and sexual violence makes disclosing incidences of abuse or assault incredibly difficult. The ways we police our daughters, sisters and partners' bodies via what's considered acceptable boundaries of female sexuality is an incredibly problematic practice as well. From seemingly innocuous passing comments regarding skin colour and weight to outright dictation of dress code and behaviour, our community asserts



collective ownership of a woman's body through patriarchal control, reinforcing slut-shaming and victim-blaming and placing the heavy burden of protecting chastity and family honour squarely on the shoulders of girls and women.

In order to uncover the underlying cultural factors and work towards an intervention we must have open dialogue and an informed response, including actively working towards naming, identifying, and demystifying gender-based violence. The continued absence of any such genuine discussion about violence against women only serves to further stigmatize an already deeply taboo issue. But to kick-start such a movement towards gender equality and justice also requires a collective response. Men and women of all ages must stand in solidarity against all forms of violence against women because protecting the rights of the most systemically vulnerable members of our communities strengthens and protects the rights of everyone. We must get involved with and support the continued efforts and advances made by local initiatives and women's groups in South Asian communities, learning from their experiences and reinforcing our collective voice to



stand up against gendered violence together.

Tens of thousands of men and women across India have taken to the streets throughout the end of 2012 and early 2013 over an issue that has been historically and deeply stigmatized within the community. Their unprecedented

response and refusal to accept the country's climate of impunity for crimes against women suggests a shift in public attitudes concerning the treatment of women that cannot be understated. This is a defining moment for India, and it can be one for us as well. As we grapple with the pressures to both strengthen and shed our cultural identities as Tamil and Canadian individuals, we must choose to leave behind traditions that devalue our women and girls and limit their opportunities for success, happiness, and fulfillment. ♦

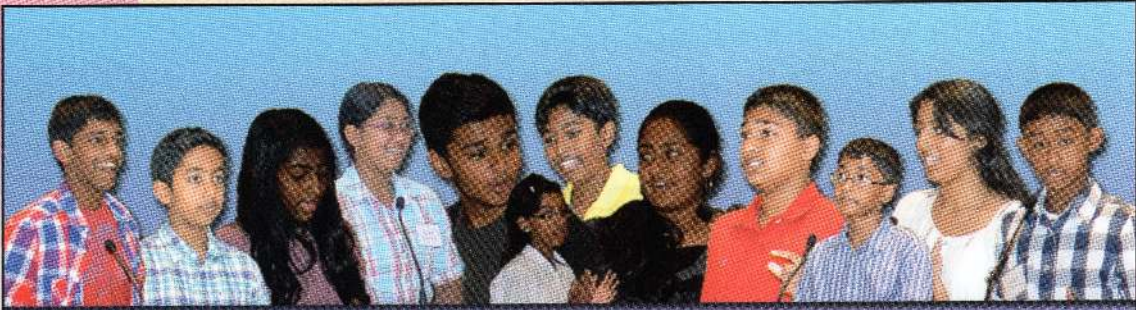

Assertiveness allows leaders to be strong and powerful towards what they believe. A leader knows when they need to take control of the

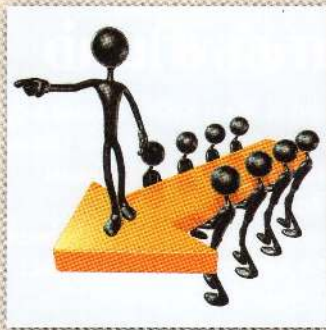
operation and be confident throughout the end.

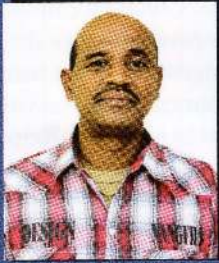

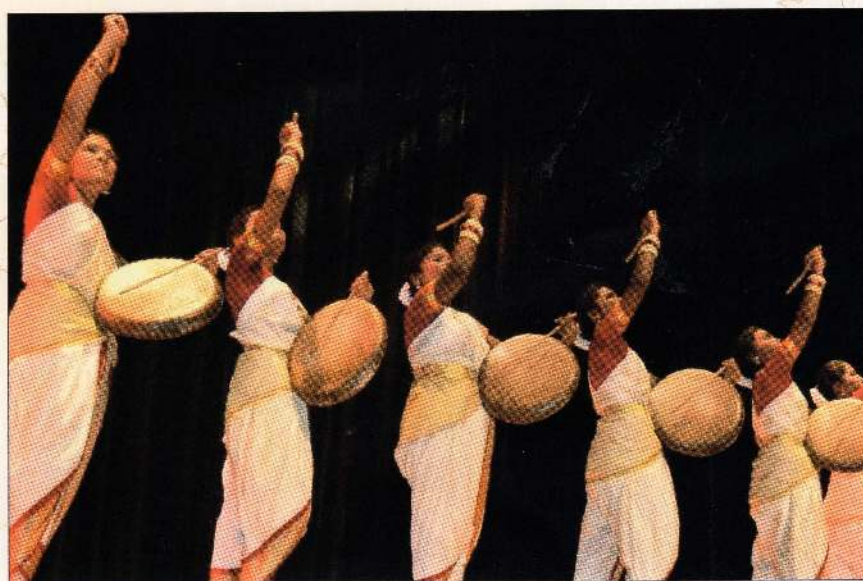

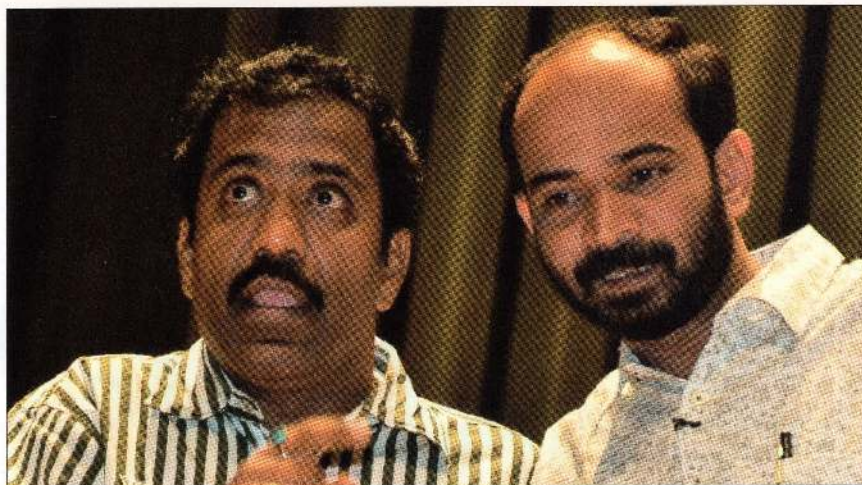

Finding Life Partners: Challenges and New Opportunities

Young Tamils are facing the same challenge that many of their mainstream counterparts face these days: finding a life partner!

Caught up in today's fast paced workforce, young people find little time to meet that special someone. And as the university and college years grow dim, it becomes even more difficult to find and create genuine connections with other singles. Those of us in the Tamil community tend to believe that finding a life partner should be a cinch – after all, there are numerous marriage brokers, online matrimonial sites, and searches conducted by our parents, aunts and uncles.

But what happens when our family searches are not fruitful?

Accessible options are: bars, social mixers, online dating, and speed dating. While all options provide risks and benefits, the advantage of online dating or speed dating is that it removes the ambiguity – the individuals who meet in these spaces are clearly searching for a partner; you need not wonder whether that individual you just met is single or attached.

While online dating is a good option for those who are able to figure out the genuine characters from those

not-so-genuine, most young professionals need a better solution to help them with their search!

We can look to other communities for meaningful solutions. The Jewish and Ismaili communities are adept at hosting community-focused mixers



and/or speed dating events that allow their young professionals to meet marriageable partners in a safe and comfortable way.

Speed dating allows men and women to rotate through mini-dates; each one-on-one mini-date lasts anywhere from 3 to 10 minutes, depending on the time allotted by the organizer. All participants are given a response card, where they can discreetly note down their yes/no response to each participant. At the end of the evening, the event organizer will collect all participant cards. A day or two after the event, the organizer will notify participants with the contact information of their matches. A match is determined only if both

parties have responded 'yes' to each other on their response cards.

Speed dating provides some significant advantages over other options:

- It allows multiple meetings (or dates) in a short period of time.
- It becomes much easier to determine whether a particular individual may be a suitable match when meeting in person.
- The awkwardness of those first dates is greatly reduced due to the structured nature of speed dating.
- The post-event match notifications mean that participants can avoid the pressure of either selecting or rejecting other participants in person.
- Filtered events improve matching outcomes when using common criteria such as age or religious background.

The Jewish, Ismaili and other communities have been successful at providing dynamic and modern solutions for their young professionals to find life partners. It's time for the Tamil community to invest in future generations by supporting new ways to find marriageable partners for our singles! ♦

Annapoorani - 75 Years of Nautical Pride



Decades before Eelam Tamils migrated throughout the globe, a small group of pioneers sailed the big seas. They were one of the first Tamil ambassadors to the United States and many other nations on the way.

It all started in the town of Valvettithurai on the Jaffna peninsula.

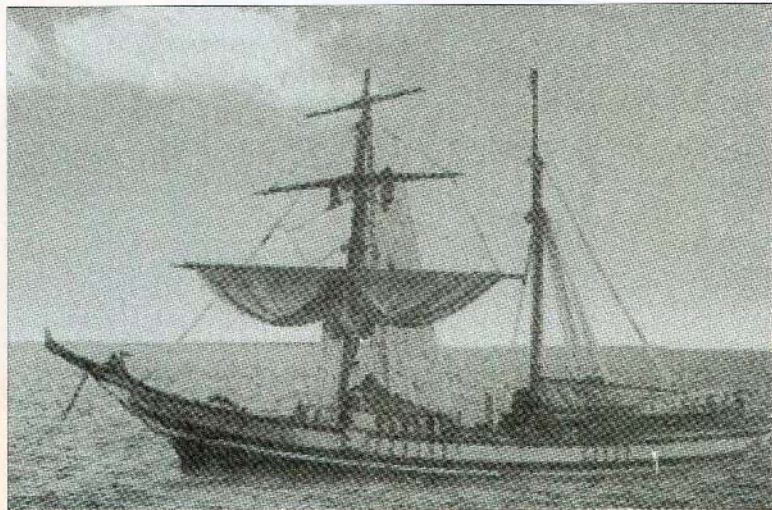
Valvettithurai has importance in the history of Eelam Tamils, not only for being the birthplace of many prominent Tamil leaders, but also for its might over the seas, international trade and social development. It is not only in the recent years that Eelam Tamils have shown nautical strength and power.

In 1938 a convoy of our pride, social and economical development & international cooperation, left the shores of Valvettithurai and sailed strong and bold across oceans, seas and international borders and arrived at the Gloucester harbour, in Boston, USA.

The "Annapoorani", one of the many world-class sail ships the Tamils built, was owned and operated by Eelam Tamils for trade and travel across international borders. History books show that during the time of the Annapoorani, the Eelam Tamils had a 200-year history for being masters of ships and sails. The Valvettithurai port was one of the busiest in the region.

In the year 1936, an American tourist and a sail ship enthusiast while visiting Sri Lanka (Ceylon), came across the Annapoorani. It was love at first sight. William A. Robinson, a wealthy American businessman, bought the 89-foot British-style Sailor ship immediately. He was determined to buy this sail

the elements of nature and weather, the ability to withstand ocean waves and meeting navigational standards are only some of the concerns when building an 89-foot long sail ship. However, in its time, the Annapoorani was recognized as a sail ship capable of travelling international waters; a product of

ship as a gift to his wife. Although having experienced the sails of many such ships, Robinson found uniqueness and a special interest in this one, built by Sundara Mestriar, an Eelam Tamil, in the year 1930.

The sail ship was built in Valvettithurai, utilizing the craftsmanship, expertise and engineering capabilities of the Tamils. Building a sail ship is not a simple matter. Salt-water corrosion,

excellent engineering and social development of the Eelam Tamils.

The Annapoorani is a "hermaphrodite brig", meaning two-masted vessel square-rigged forward and schooner-rigged aft. In the United Kingdom, this type of vessel is called a "brigantine". The same English dictionary also speaks of the Tamils and Hindus, saying, "the Tamils are members of the most

enterprising branch of the Dravidian race, mostly Hindus. They are numerous throughout South India and northern Ceylon. The language is the oldest, most cultivated and best known of the Dravidian languages."

Despite Robinson's experience at sea, he was wise to employ the services of the Tamils to arrange for delivery of the Annapoorani to Boston.

On February 27th 1937 and under the command on Thandayal (captain) Kanagaratnam



Thampipillai, 4 Eelam Tamil crew members, William Robinson and insured by Lloyds of London, the Annapoorani set sail towards the open ocean. This was to be Annapoorani's last voyage under the command of a Tamil captain.

Although Robinson had fitted the ship with an engine, she still largely depended on her sails. Their voyage was to take them through the Arabian Sea, the Red Sea, then the Mediterranean sea and finally into the vast openness of the Atlantic



Ocean, totalling over 520 days and nights in total.

Leaving Valvetūthurai, the Annapoorani sailed around the southern belly of Sri Lanka (Ceylon) for 3 days and made a 4-day stop in Colombo. From Colombo, she crossed the Indian Ocean and the Arabian Sea before reaching Aden, a port in Yemen. This portion of the trip lasted 23 days. There she remained at port for a period of 8 months. A slight setback had come in the way. Robinson was to meet his wife at Aden, where she would join him on board. However he received a cablegram notifying him that his wife was too ill to travel.

The ship sat at port while Robinson flew to America and some months after returned to Aden. After 8 months at port, the Annapoorani resumed her voyage with Mr. and Mrs. Robinson on board. From Aden to port Sudan and then Suez, she sailed through a narrow channel into the Mediterranean Sea.

Then came another setback. A heavy storm drove them off course by almost 250 miles towards the coast of Lebanon. Finally they reached Candia, a large island in the middle of the Mediterranean Sea. Thanks to the unexpected storm, the voyage from Suez to Candia would last 32 days. Mr. and Mrs. Robinson flew

back to America and arranged captain Donald A McCuish to fly to Candia and meet up with the ship. After being at port in Candia for 30 days, the Annapoorani set sail once again, with captain Donald McCuish providing guidance assistance to Thandayal (captain) Kanagaratnam Thampipillai. Robinson felt that a captain with knowledge of the western seas would

prove to be of great value to Thandayal (captain) Kanagaratnam Thampipillai.

Now with a crew of 6, the Annapoorani sailed another 36 days and reached Gibraltar, where she stayed at port for 8 days.

On the final stretch leaving Gibraltar June 8th 1938, it took 41 days to reach Hamilton, Bermuda. It was a slow passage with not enough wind stirring most of the time to ruffle a sail. The engine fitted by Robinson

had failed by the time they had reached Gibraltar. They were left with only the Eelam Tamil built sails; their only hope of crossing the Atlantic Ocean. This 5,000 mile journey would not come easy. For

many days, they sat idle on the ocean, as not a single whisper of wind would move them along. The captain had estimated the crossing of the Atlantic to last 30 days. Supplies and food were short on board. Yet the determined Tamil sailors, weakened not the slightest, pressed through the final stretch of the ocean.

The crew encountered many difficulties during their journey. From the notes and diaries of the crew, it is also known that the Annapoorani came close to a catastrophic collision. After about nine days of leaving Gibraltar, a thick layer of fog blanketed the Atlantic Ocean. The Annapoorani had a narrow escape from being cut in half by a transatlantic liner.

Finally the Annapoorani reached Hamilton, Bermuda. This must have

seemed a great relief to the crew. At port, they replenished their food and water supplies and spent some nights and days discovering the local cuisine. On July 28th 1938, the voyage resumed.

The first to sight the vessel in Boston was Carl D. Hill, light keeper at the Eastern Point, who informed the arrival of the Annapoorani to the waterfront, recorded at 12:45 PM on August 2nd 1938. Shortly after a tug escorted the vessel to the wharf. The Tamils were greeted with warm welcome and celebrations. Their cultural distinctness sat very well with the Americans. The Boston Globe called these men "...a fine lot of men, if you treated them right and respected their religious beliefs".

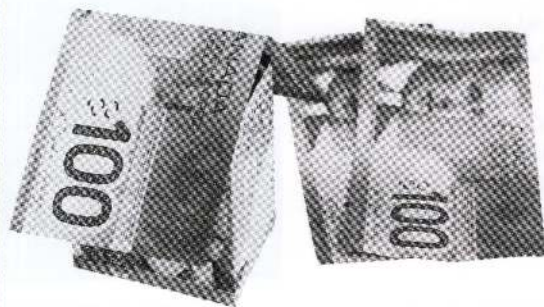
The Americans were awestruck by the Eelam Tamils' strength, aspiration and motivation. They

found that when the Tamils religion, cultural identity and birthright were respected, one wouldn't find more loyal companions even while death stared them straight in their faces. It is an accurate description of Eelam Tamils, who are known for their immaculate hospitality of visitors and hosts.

The crew and the captain of the Annapoorani spent many more days and nights in their new world, entertaining their new friends with art, music and culture from their birthplace. They left a lasting impression on the American soil before their voyage back to the Jaffna peninsula by a steam ship through Singapore. ♦

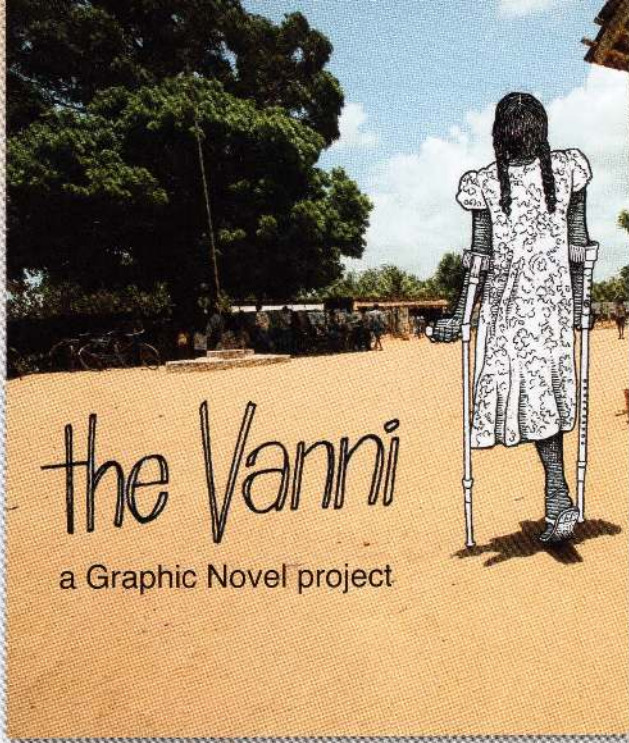

a Graphic Novel project

For years in Japan and parts of Europe comics about serious topics have commanded a huge readership. Now the rest of the world is catching up and graphic novels are the biggest growth area in publishing. Examples of political or reportage comics include 'Palestine';



'Persepolis' - about life in Iran; and 'Maus', which is about the Holocaust.

Working with artist Lindsay Pollock, former UN staff Benjamin Dix is now writing a book on the Sri Lankan war. 'The Vanni' is about a fictional but representative Tamil family between 2006 and 2013. The book is told from the perspective of

Antoni, the father. He is in London, in the present day, seeking asylum and reflecting on his experiences in the preceding years.

The story will be written directly

from amalgamated survivor testimony, so that the events depicted are accurate - helping the reader understand the situation and encouraging further research and political engagement with the topic. Chapters will cover the significant events that affected Tamil families like displacement, the assault on the beach and internment in Manik Farms.

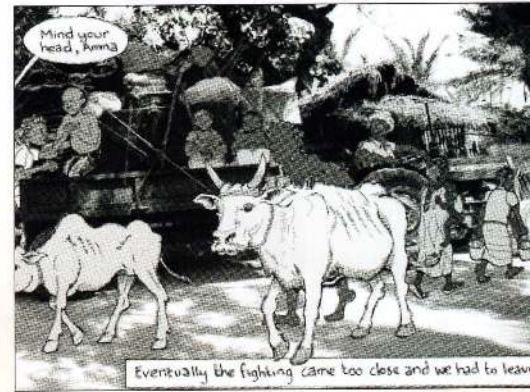
This novel approach should bring a new audience to the global campaign for justice in Sri Lanka. The combination of words and pictures renders the story in a tangible and affecting way, and makes complicated subject matter accessible to the common reader.

'The Vanni' will be available for free on the Internet, presented with multimedia resources for interested readers to learn more, including audio and video, short essays giving a précis of important topics and links to related organizations.

Produced independently, the book is paid for in part through a 'crowd-



sourcing' model. This refers to a project that is enabled by multiple small donations from a number of sources, often individuals. Around the world, art works and humanitarian projects alike have been completed through crowd-



sourcing and as the saying goes, 'every little helps'.

For 'The Vanni' the authors will spend two years interviewing survivors, writing and drawing their story, as well as building and hosting the website.

'The Vanni' is supported by The Sri Lanka Campaign, award winning author Arundhati Roy, former BBC reporter and author Frances Harrison and endorsed by Canadian Tamil Congress. Beyond being an education tool, Benjamin hopes that 'The Vanni' stand as a lasting record of the war and a tribute to all those who suffered through it. ♦

From Reconciliation to Impeachment: From Citizen to Subject

As we moved into 2012, the buzzword was reconciliation and with it the acronym - understood by too few of our fellow citizens- was LLRC. The Lessons Learnt and Reconciliation Commission Report had been presented to the president who in turn had sent it to parliament. There was some hope that since the commission had been set up by the president, that he would accept its recommendations in full and get on with the task of implementation. This was the commission he and his had told the world would answer and lay to rest all doubts, queries and allegations about the last stages of the war, in particular.

The report in English was eventually sent to the Central Bank- yes the Central Bank- for translation into the two official languages so that the majority of Sri Lankans would be able to read it. This, I understand is now possible, a good nine to ten months later. Months went by and the international community led by the US at the UN Human Rights Council in Geneva passed an anodyne resolution on Sri Lanka in March 2012, essentially calling on the regime to expedite implementation of the LLRC recommendations, report to the Council on what it intended to do on accountability- which the resolution noted the LLRC fell short on- and avail itself of the assistance of UN

bodies in the implementation process. The High Commissioner for Human Rights was charged with the responsibility of reporting to the Council in a year on progress made with assistance availed of. India, frustrated, even angered and humiliated by the broken promises of the regime regarding a political settlement, was amongst the 24 countries that voted for the resolution.

The regime first tried to defeat the resolution by sending packs of ministers, officials and apparatchiks to Geneva in a vulgar display of overkill and loutish behavior. Having failed, it

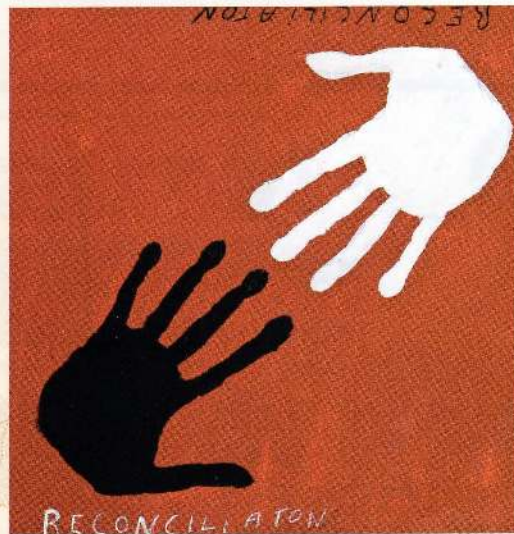
failed in turn in its scoundrel's resort to arouse the patriotism of the masses back at home in the full measure it desperately yearned for. By the time of Sri Lanka's Universal Periodic Review (UPR) in the Council in November, the regime had completed a Human Rights Action Plan and produced an Action Plan for the Implementation of the

LLRC recommendations the status of which still remains that of a 'work in progress'.

Geneva, March 2012, in this respect was a Rubicon of sorts. It was the first real defeat of the regime and seen by the regime as such, its conduct of the war was on the agenda of a multilateral organization for the first time, India could no longer be taken for granted and

there was general agreement even expressed in and by the media that the whole episode was a foreign policy cock - up, pure and simple. The Permanent Representative to Geneva was axed and eventually went to Havana

having said her picce. The media had a field day - all its tabloid Christmases having come together, so to speak. One positive result was that in the aftermath of the hysteria about violated sovereignty and other impertinences, the regime showed signs of beginning to learn the art of international relations. The jury is

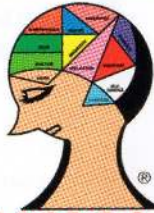

out though on as to how much and for how long or indeed as to whether the signs were no more than flashes in the pan of defeat and disappointment.

Now at the end of 2012, there are articles on how the LLRC has been forgotten. A key reason for this – though by no means the sole one – is that the crisis of governance the LLRC report elaborates has been dragged to a new nadir with the shoddy sham of the impeachment of the Chief Justice. The buzzword for 2013 is surely “impeachment”; “constitutional crisis” perhaps coming a close second when we are into the second half of this month. No doubt this will have a bearing on Geneva, March 2013 and the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) in November; no doubt it should.

The point about all of this is how we have regressed. Take any yardstick of reconciliation and/or governance and you can see how thuggery – literally and metaphorically speaking – in the service of the consolidation of power by the ostensibly strong yet deeply insecure has taken hold and in a way that arguably would make even J.R. Jayawardene and R. Premadasa blush! What may yet save us now, as it did then, are the efforts of too few daring to dissent and resist the flagrant destruction of the institutions, processes and the political culture of a functioning liberal democracy. What we had was flawed, but not “floored” to the extent that it is now.

Take reconciliation for instance – where do the violent arrests of students and young people in Jaffna and elsewhere in the north, the continuing land grab in the north



and east, the presidential opening of the Lagoon’s Edge Hotel in Nandikadal to service war tourism fit in with it? What of the fate of the Tamil women inducted into the forces – did they know what they were getting into or was it a case of being “taken into”? What about the last IDPs from Kepapalivu? Where was Kepapalivu and where is it now? How do things happen in post war Sri Lanka 2012 like in Marble Bay in the east, where as in apartheid South Africa, the land and the sea is roped off for VIPs, forces, and the general public including the inhabitants of the area, respectively? How does what happened at the Navinna Rajamahaviharaya at the end of November to address the “Muslim threat” to Sinhala Buddhists, reminiscent, according to some accounts, of a meeting of white supremacists in the Deep South of the 1950s USA, happen in post-war Sri Lanka with its extensive, costly and efficient security, law and order machinery, not to mention its kiri pani rhetoric of Chintanaya and reconciliation? How many IDPs could have been housed with the duty that was not levied on racing cars? Why do people from the north and east risk life and limb to end up in camps on Christmas Island? If they are economic refugees why are they leaving when economic development is supposed to be the priority? This is only part of it.

Likewise, with governance. Who interprets the constitution? Is natural justice a luxury post-war Sri Lanka cannot afford especially if it stands in the way of the regime getting its own way? As this

columnist wrote some time ago and as the president is reported to have said in an inimitably candid statement of his idea of governance – it boils down to “ape minihava beraganna oney” and therefore it is “shape kerala ganna” all the way. Impunity rules as long as apparatchiks remain so. Contort, corrupt institutions and processes as a consequence; nurture and sustain a popular culture of subjects not citizens.

As long as she stands her ground, the Chief Justice will be impeached. The regime have in their ham-fisted, revengeful way made a heroine and a martyr out of her and aroused the legal fraternity in a defence of the judiciary in a way unimaginable in the desolate days of the Eighteenth Amendment and all the assaults on governance and the rule of law by this regime, before and since. The regime cannot back down now without looking weak and immature at the least.

And so it comes back to us. There is every sign of it getting worse before it begins to get better. This is what comes from destroying the prospects for reconciliation and from the certainty of impeachment, which is illustrative of the crisis of governance.

A disempowered man from Jaffna told me that things there look better but feel worse. He was an IDP, metaphorically speaking.

Is this the fate that awaits us who cling to a notion of citizenship?

The play is the thing; to be a part of and not merely watch. ♦

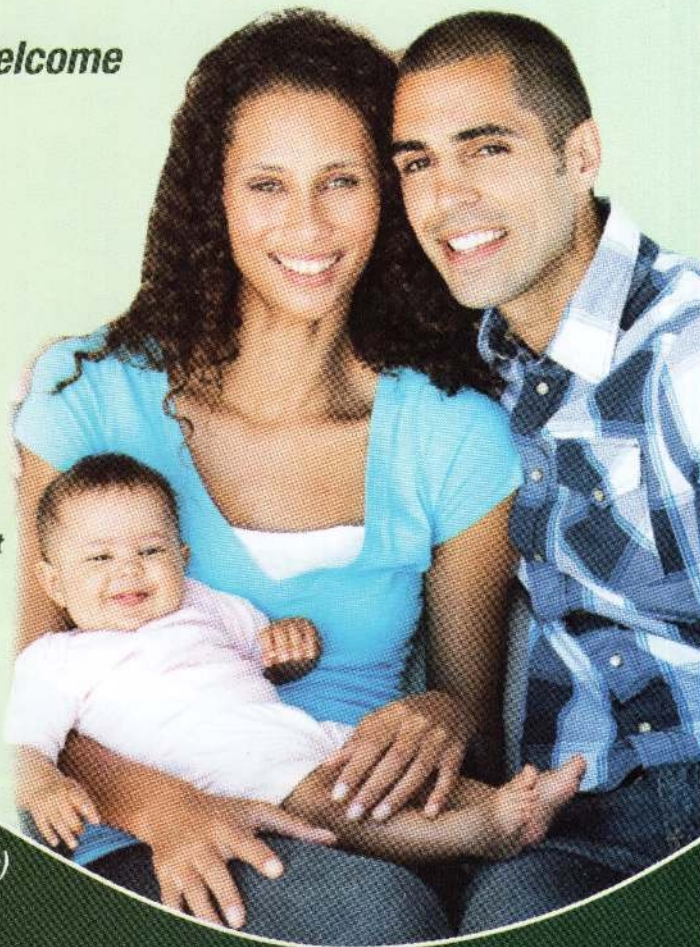

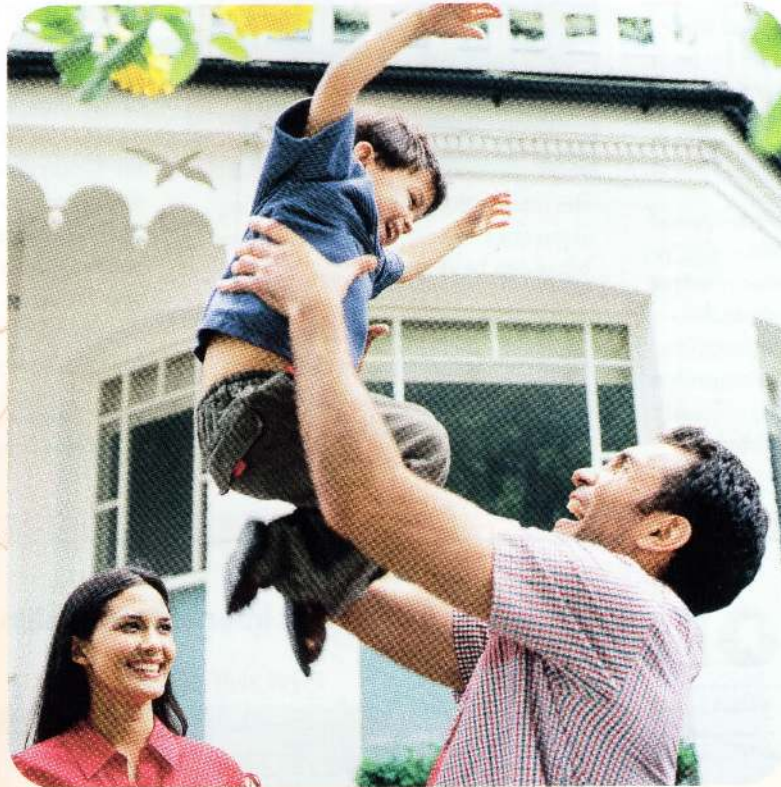

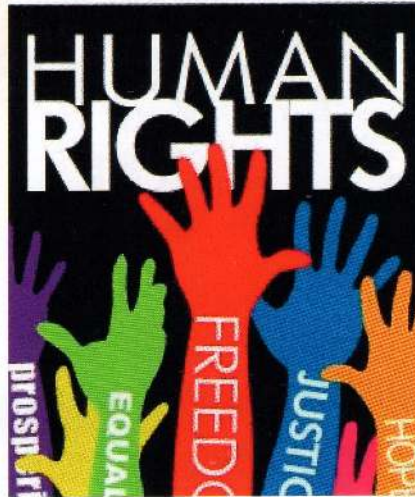

enterprises, and the continued democratic deficit in the Northern Province).

Defending the Tamil identity against these threats requires a global mobilisation of all those who care about the inhabitants of the island. It also requires a clear focus on the ongoing human rights violations that plague the island, and also on their root cause – the total failure by both the Government of Sri Lanka, and the wider world, to hold the mass murderers of 2009 to account.

Many, indeed most, activism around Tamil issues recognises this – and yet the perception remains that much of the human rights advocacy in Sri Lanka is based in Tamil separatism. This perception continues regardless of facts, and is seen as a significant barrier to international lobbying –



the international community being separatism averse. Why is this? And what can be done?

Part of the answer is that the Government of Sri Lanka's PR machine is very good at defining its opponents. In addition the international community is often

actively looking for an excuse not to intervene. When these things are taken together they mean that the actions of a small minority are easily used to define the whole. No community in the world is without its extremists, but the extent to which the position of the extremists can be twisted to define the whole is dependent upon how many alternative voices are heard.

One of the most positive experiences of last year was the increase in the number of different voices criticising the Government of Sri Lanka – and the diversity of views they represent. The Government of Sri Lanka will continue to call human rights activists as terrorists and traitors, but the broader our movement is the less impact these words will have. ♦

Refugee Reforms: Changes in Canadian Refugee Law

The year 2012 saw various changes made to refugee law and the asylum system in Canada. These reforms will almost certainly have a profound impact on incoming refugees to Canada, and on the underlying values of our asylum system as a whole.

The right and procedures to claim status as a refugee to Canada are laid out in a number of Canadian laws, guided by our history and culture as well as international treaties and norms in refugee protection. An asylum claim can be made at any port of entry (land, air or sea), or at a Citizenship and Immigration Canada office, and all claims for citizenship are processed and decided upon by the Immigration and Refugee Board (IRB). Recently however, two pieces of legislation have made vital changes to Canada's refugee policies: The Balanced Refugee Reform Act of June 2010, and the Protecting Canada's Immigration System Act of June 2012. On December 15, 2012, both these acts entered into full force, bringing with them many changes to our refugee and asylum system.



Waiting times have changed to expedite processing, as well as reduce backlog. For claimants from designated countries of origin (countries that do not generally produce refugees, a list of which can be found on the CIC website), the

waiting time will decrease from an average of 18 months to 30 to 45 days after referral of the claim to the IRB. For claimants from other countries, the new waiting time is approximately 60 days.

Changes have also been made affecting pre-removal risk assessment (PRRA) applications. The PRRA is a mechanism to ensure that persons being removed from Canada are not being returned to a country where they would be at risk or in danger of persecution. When a rejected claimant receives a removal order notice, they then have the

opportunity to apply for a PRRA. Under the new laws, limits have been imposed on the availability of PRRA. Rejected claimants now have the right to one PRRA application one year after a negative refugee claim decision or a final

PRRA decision.

Furthermore, rejected claimants from a designated country of origin are barred from accessing a PRRA for 3 years (although, in the case of sudden change in a country's condition, the Minister of Citizenship, Immigration and Multiculturalism can exempt certain individuals from this bar).

Modifications affecting humanitarian and compassionate considerations (H&C) have likewise been implemented. H&C grounds apply to persons with exceptional cases, who would not normally be eligible to become permanent residents of Canada. H&C does not assess risk factors such as persecution, risk to life, cruel and unusual treatment or punishment, but rather looks at ties in Canada with respect to children and family, as well as other factors. New H&C regulations stipulate that an H&C submission cannot be made while a refugee claim is pending, and that

failed refugee claimants are barred from requesting H&C for one year after a negative decision (except in cases where a claimant's life is a risk if removed). These changes also include the elimination of the automatic stay of removal of certain failed refugee claimants after filing leave for judicial review at the Federal Court of Canada. This means that failed refugee claimants are now removed to their country of origin pending Federal Court review, and must request a stay on a case-by-case basis. This includes claimants who arrive as part of a designated "irregular arrival" and who thereby become "designated foreign nationals". These claimants must wait five years to apply for H&C considerations if rejected by the IRB, and must return to the country of origin upon receiving a removal order (if a stay is not granted).

The Refugee Appeal Division has also been introduced. As of December 15, 2012, appeals will be taken by paper submission, with oral hearings only in exceptional cases. Appeal decisions will now be expected within 90 days of the appeal, and claimants from designated countries of origin as well as designated irregular arrivals do not have access to RAD (all failed refugee claimants still have the option to appeal to the Federal Court).

Finally, other procedural and administrative reforms have also been instituted. These include: i) a loss of permanent resident status when the IRB finds that a person ceased to be a Convention refugee or a person in need of protection (for example, if they return to their country of origin); ii) the Refugee Protection Division (RPD) and Refugee Appeal Division (RAD) can

no longer re-open previously decided refugee claims and appeals once a final decision is made at a higher level (i.e. RPD cannot re-open a case after RAD makes a decision); iii) the commencement on June 29, 2012 of the Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration pilot program, designed to support the removal of low-risk failed refugee claimants more quickly, expediting removal and reducing backlog.

There is much debate and heated discussion about why our government has implemented such changes, and the potential effects of these new laws. Are these measures necessary to tackle labour shortage or keep foreigners from abusing our

system? Or are they designed to have an influence on which parts of the world immigrants can come from? Are these reforms the products of a right-leaning agenda, or necessary measures geared towards preparing Canada to be competitive in the more globalized world? No matter the reason however, it is certain that these new reforms will change the everyday realities of refugees and would-be refugees to Canada, and perhaps the very values our asylum structure is built upon. ♦

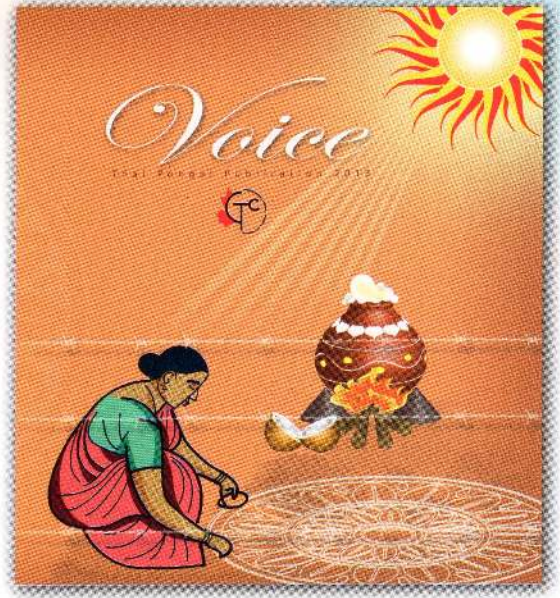
