I am delighted to have been part of the committee this year to support the school. In one year only, I have been fortunate enough to see the growth of the school in such detail, and been proud to say that I have been part of this process. Being the Secretary, I have been able to hear the opinions of every member, but I am unable to unite and bring all to the same platform which is an undesired outcome.

As per normal, we organised the fantastic and much anticipated Nathavinotham show, but with one small difference: this year we chose to invite Kumaran (a famous Nathaswaram Vithwan) and his group from Sri Lanka, enabling us to support our local talents in Jaffna. The show was a success and we earned a profit of over £10,000, which will all be used to improve life at Hartley for all future generations.

We have also supported E-Kalvi: an online education system developed by the University of Jaffna's Engineering Faculty and retired and well-known teachers, consisting of pre-recorded lessons and questions, with the aim of giving students another way to learn and improve their education. We donated 3 sets of computers with accessories and installed all of them at the hostel as a way of improving the integration of technology with the ever-present rigour in our education.

We also contributed to the purchase of land adjacent to our existing sports ground and the building of the boundary wall. This is very important to us as education is not only found in the classroom; it can also be found on the field as we believe that sport is equally necessary to students' mental wellbeing in their education. This is mirrored with the Sports Club donating a cricket bowling machine to support the rising talent at Hartley.

This year's Global Hartleyites Day in July was successfully held at Hartley College, where the President of our HCPPA(UK) represented us. This was another great example of the global united response amongst all PPAs and highlights the success of the international community in inspiring the next generation.

Money that we have earned through fundraising activities, as shown above, has been donated with the focus of improving the education of our students. Education is not only what you learn, it is the experience of learning, the environment in which you learn, and how you learn. We have used the money to improve the standard of living for disadvantaged students at the hostels, providing a better learning environment. We also aim to improve their English language skills by supporting the teachers, making our students more accessible to the international world in the future.
