The aim and style of the Catalogue.

THE object of the Catalogue is—

I.—To enable any one to find a book of which either—

- (a) The author,
- (b) The title, or
- (c) The subject

is known.

II.—To show what the Library contains—

- (d) By a given author.
- (e) On a given subject.
- (f) In a given kind of literature.

Entries are made—

- (1) Under name of author, with necessary cross-references.
- (2) Under subject of the book, with necessary cross-references.

The above note gives a general idea of the arrangement intended. It is difficult to say how far the ideal has been carried out,—there are doubtless errors and omissions.

The want of a Catalogue of the Society's Library has been long felt, and it has been continually called for by Members. The last Catalogue (properly speaking a List of Books) was issued in 1882, and has been out of print for some years, and since then the Society's Library has been enriched by considerable additions.

I have to thank Mr. J. HARWARD for assistance rendered, and Mr. H. C. COTTLE for the personal care bestowed on the printing of the work.
