### Educational

We understand a Sinhalese Tutory is to be opened in Jaffna by the middle of this month, in order to coach up students who wish to take up Sinhalese, Parli or Sanskrit. Higher education in any of these three languages are afforded to anyone who desires to do so. All who wish to enrol are kindly requested to get in touch with Mr. Chas. Pathirana 3rd Cross St. Jaffna, who will be pleased to give all necessary information relating to same.

The Tamil Text-Book Committee consists of nine members, five from the educational circles of the Tamil provinces and four from various denominations. The Director of Education is supposed to be the President of the Committee and one of his assistants or an officer with a good knowledge of Tamil officiates as the Secretary to the Committee.

Applications are invited from those who wish to join a class for the training of Agricultural Instructors for employment in the Department of Agriculture. Applicants should be not less than 17 years and under 21 years of age on January 1, 1940 and should have passed the London Matriculation or equivalent examination. Only Ceylouse are eligible for enrolment in this class. Selected candidates will receive free tuition, board and an allowance during the two year period of training.

It is understood that the Executive Committee of Education has accepted the suggestion of the Cambridge University Syndicate to lower the standard of the Cambridge Senior School Certificate Examination held in Ceylon to the same level of the requirements for a pass adopted for candidates sitting for the Senior Examination in England.

### NEWS IN BRIEF

—A pulpit in memory of the late Rev. V. Ramalingam Samuel Methodist Minister presented by his widow will be dedicated at Puttur Church on Thursday 7th inst at 5 p. m. by the Rev. E. Middleton Weaver, Chairman, North Ceylon District, assisted by the Rev. James S. Mather. It is the first anniversary of the death of the late Rev. V. R. Samuel.

—A special service was held in St. John's Chapel on the 25th ultimo in memory of the late Mr. C. C. Jell, The Principal was the preacher. He chose as his text Eph. 5, 1-2. The text aptly described the quality of Mr. Jell's life. He was one of self-giving and self forgetting service.

After the service the congregation wended to the College library where was unveiled a tablet, on which the following words were inscribed "Sacred to the memory of Christopher C. Jell, (an Old Boy of the College), Teacher 1909-33, Boarding House Master 1909-19, Patient and painstaking, strict but kind. He ever lives in the hearts of those who knew him as teacher and friend. "Blessed are the Pure in heart"

—The InterCollegiate Cricket Match was played on St. Henry's grounds on Saturday the 24th ultimo. St. Henry's College beat Hartley College by 3 runs. St. Henry's winning the toss sent Hartley to bat. Hartley scored 122 runs in the first innings. St. Henry's replied with 76 runs before lunch. Hartley collapsed for 73 in the second innings. St. Henry's sent in and scored 122 runs. The match ended in an exciting victory to St. Henry's by three runs.

—In a very keenly contested match St. Patrick's beat Jaffna College last Saturday by 3 wickets and three runs. When St. Patrick's began their second innings they had 92 runs to make to ensure victory with only 45 minutes in hand. By fast scoring they made 94 in 42 minutes for the loss of 7 wickets.

—The match played on St. John's College grounds between St. John's and Jaffna Hindu College ended in a draw.

### Obituary

There passed away on Saturday last Mr. K. P. Aseervatham, retired Inspector of Post Offices in his seventy-third year. The funeral took place the next day at his residence "Aralvass", Hospital Road Jaffna, and was largely attended. The service at the house was conducted by Rev. E. Middleton Weaver assisted by Rev. James S. Mather and Rev. V. B. Muthulaloe, Rev. Canon Somasunderam and Rev. Weaver gave addresses dwelling on the good life and work of the deceased. The interment took place in the New Burial Ground, Jaffna, where the service was conducted by Rev. James S. Mather assisted by Rev. J. T. Arulannandham (son-in-law of the deceased) and Rev. M. S. Chinniah. The late Mr. K. P. Aseervatham was Circuit Steward of St. Peter's Church Jaffna, and was a staunch supporter of the work of this Church.

PADDY CULTIVATION

The Acting Director of Agriculture reviews in his latest Administration Report the difficulties in obtaining increase in the total production of paddy. The smaller holdings are uneconomic in size and are held in undivided shares which discourage any attempt at permanent improvement.

The Acting Director recommends a radical solution of these difficulties. The State, he suggests must provide assured irrigation for fairly extensive units of land, clear the area of forest and reduce it to well drained arable land, provide housing, medical and educational facilities and a prescribed minimum of the other amenities of life for the tenants, and maintain a technical service which would carry out all the major agricultural operations with power driven implements and allow the tenant families, holding about 25 acres each, to carry out all the minor operations.

The present Director is noted for his efficiency, but we sometimes fear that the human element is missed in talking only in terms of ruthless efficiency. The Report however reveals true insight into the human factors in the work of the Department in relation to village agriculture. On the one hand, the Report deplors the absence of a cohesive village social order influenced and guided by disinterested men whose leadership is recognised, and the absence of enthusiasm on the part of the individual cultivator to grow a crop, which he has not grown, through a desire to improve his own economic condition.

'FRIENDS OF REUNION'

Twenty-five years ago the Christian Faith received scant attention in the daily newspapers. There were then, as now, weekly papers devoted to various aspects of Churchmanship. If a man read the 'Church Times', he probably never opened the 'Record' and hardly knew of the existence of the 'British Weekly' or the 'Christ-

ian World'. Those who did were equally ignorant of the contents of other religious journals.

But for years now the most responsible newspapers have regularly included essays on the Christian Faith in their columns and it is safe to say that amongst their readers there have been many who were not members of the particular communion to which the various contributors belonged. The days of Arthur Clutton Brook's Saturday homilies in the 'Times' are gone. In another journal his place as a lay theologian has been taken by Miss Dorothy Sayers whom most people know as a writer of distinguished detective fiction. Readers of that notable provincial journal, the Manchester Guardian have for years been familiar with the articles from the Anglican and Methodist pens of Canon Peter Green and Dr. George Jackson respectively.

It was in many cases from just these ordinary newspapers that people began to learn something of the underlying unity of the faith professed by others whose ways of worship and church organisation were different from their own.

Then followed conferences attended by delegates from many different churches, conferences which probably owed their impetus to the World Missionary Council at Edinburgh in 1910, of which the Lausanne Conference on Faith and Order, the Conference on Christian Politics, Economic and Citizenship, and the Oxford Conference on Church, Community and State are the best known.

In such ways as these the corporate consciousness of Christian men, women and churches finds expression and problems that beset and divide all, are studied and discussed. The war is likely to cause a set back to these united efforts to arrive at a common mind. The provisional World Council of Churches must obviously work, if at all, under severe disabilities. Its Quarterly magazine 'Koinonia' ('Fellowship') has not yet materialized and a less comprehensive effort by the Student Christian Movement 'Unity' has had to be postponed indefinitely.

But at a time when the Christian message is the most vital of all, it would be disastrous if Christian fellowship between various communions was not enhanced and mutual understanding fostered. To some people conferences, committees and such like have an air of unreality. They do not touch the average Church member. As often as not he is prepared to let somebody else do his thinking for him, partly from laziness and partly from ignorance. Either cause produces people who think on the one hand that our differences are insoluble, or on the other hand do not matter. In neither case has the vision of the Church as a Divine Society presented itself to them.

There is a way in which every church member can strengthen the bonds of fellowship that already bind us one to another. Let every sincere Christian who feels that disunion is fundamentally sinful make a point of seeking the friendship of someone who belongs to a denomination other than his own. Let them jointly explore the faith that is in them frankly, courteously and in a spirit of love. In such an adventure, difficulties may loom on the horizon that were little thought of, and some which bulked large may fade away. But there is little doubt that the result will be to establish both these seekers as 'friends of reunion'.

INSTRUCTION AND GUIDANCE

THE 'QU-IP' METHOD

A meeting of the Vadamaradhy Teachers' Association was held on Wednesday 14th ultimo, at the Girls' Bilingual School, Point Pedro, beginning at 5 p.m. After tea provided by the Principal and staff of the Girls' School, Mr. H. S. Perera, M. A., F. C. P., Principal of the Government Training College, delivered a lecture on 'Instruction and Guidance'. The distinction between Instruction

and Guidance, the lecturer said, was as old as Socrates and by using guidance, Socrates had been able to make his servant construct a square on a given straight line, another square on a line twice as long as the given line, find the relation between the two squares thus drawn; and also to construct a third square twice the area of the one drawn first. Many teachers often forgot that their work lay rather in guiding their pupil to knowledge than in mere instructions.

In the course of his lecture Mr. Perera referred to what he called the 'Quip' method, used by a certain class of teachers. 'Quip' in this sense was a word coined by him and had no relation to the word in common use. Qu-IP stood for question-Imperfect answer-Premature explanation. Some teachers aware that lecturing was unsound teaching, used to open a fusillade of questions, and before the pupils could either complete answering or even think out answers, give out the answer themselves. This method the speaker said, was no better than the plain and simple lecture method, for the pupil had no chance to think out his answers.

Another fault common among teachers was to constitute themselves testers. They assigned portions of work to be learnt by the pupil and only questioned the pupils the following day. This method stood condemned as the pupils were not developed enough to assimilate straight from the book. Presentation by the teacher was necessary.

Continuing, the lecturer pointed out how every good teacher would combine in his teaching the essential features of the Montessori, Dalton, Morrison plans.

Mr. S. V. Gunanayagam proposed a vote of thank, which was carried with acclamation.

Later Mr. Perera was entertained to dinner at the Point Pedro Rest House by the Teachers of Vadamaradhy, among those who took part were Miss M. Maragotroyed, Principal, Girls' Bilingual School Pt. Pedro, Mr. C. P. Thamothersan, Principal, Hardley College Pt. Pedro.

THE LATE MR. R. P. ASEERWATHAM

(An Appreciation)

The death of Mr. R. P. Aseerwatham which took place on 24th Feb. in his seventy-third year is a serious loss to the Churches in Jaffna. He was a sincere and devoted follower of Jesus Christ, and possessed a living and fresh experience of his Master and Lord. He had been Investigating Inspector of Post Offices and knew all kinds of people and problems. He had an alert mind and business habits which he used to the best advantage of the work of the Church with which he was connected. He was Circuit Steward of St. Peter's Methodist Church Jaffna where he was a trusted leader held in high esteem and deeply beloved. He was not only peaceful, but also a peace maker and mediator who faithfully endeavoured always that all sections of the Circuit co-operated and there was true harmony. He was a loyal colleague of the Ministers, and missionaries with whom he had to work as an official of the Church, and was ever ready to stand by them in their difficulties and give them his whole hearted support. He was Treasurer of the Jaffna-Point Pedro United Home Mission and took the deepest interest in the work at Marukan and Puthukkam. He visited Allhipiddy and Manakumban and did all he could to encourage the work on the other side of the Jaffna lagoon. As Circuit Steward of St. Peter's Church he occupied a position of great responsibility and trust which he discharged most faithfully and with much acceptance. He gave liberally to the work of the Church, and every good cause found in him a warm supporter.

But more than in finance, he was a great abettor of the

pastoral and evangelistic work. He and his late wife visited the houses of the members as well as the sick in the hospitals, and everywhere his prayers and words of cheer were much appreciated. When the writer had to go out of the Island for about two months in 1938 he volunteered to do himself all the pastoral and evangelistic work of the Minister so that he might be able to accept the invitation from abroad. The writer found on his return that every piece of work had been done faithfully and well, and not a single appointment dropped.

He was a model Christian layman, by whose death a gap difficult to fill has been created, and it presents a call to the laity of our Churches to throw themselves wholeheartedly into the life and work of their Church, and to serve God and His Kingdom with the same sincerity, fidelity and devotion which characterized the life and work of Mr. R. P. Aseerwatham our brother greatly beloved and highly esteemed.
