MINUTES BY THE GOVERNOR.

WITH reference to the portions of the Minutes of 11th, 12th, and 13th May, 1887, and 20th October, 1888, and of the Circular of April 9, 1888, No. 54, which concern Regulations regarding Travelling Allowances to Public Officers when changing stations, His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to order that the maximum baggage allowances granted on changing station should be enlarged as follows:—

Officers in the Survey Department drawing salary in excess of Rs. 6·25 a day, and in all other Departments Officers drawing salaries of Rs. 3,000 a year and above	}	Railway and steamer fare on four tons of baggage, or the hire of four carts (large or small) for the same.
Officers in the Survey Department drawing salary of Rs. 6·25 a day or less, and in all other Departments Officers drawing under Rs. 3,000 a year, including clerks	}	Railway and steamer fare on two tons of baggage, or the hire of two carts (large or small) for the same.

From these allowances no deduction will in future be made on account of increase of salary.

1. Examinations when required for gentlemen born and bred in Ceylon who are desirous of entering the Lower Division of the Civil Service, in terms of the Minute of November 24, 1891, will be held as a rule in the month of January. Candidates will be selected by a competitive examination, open exclusively to candidates nominated by His Excellency the Governor.

2. Candidates must be between the ages of 21 and 25 on the first day of January in the year in which the examination is held, and must satisfy the Civil Service Examiners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. They must be of sound constitution, possessed of good sight, and be otherwise physically qualified for service, and they will be called upon to undergo a medical examination to test these points.

3. No candidate will be admitted to the competition who has not previously satisfied the Examiners in a preliminary examination in Handwriting, Orthography, and Arithmetic, including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.

4. The fees required from candidates are Rs. 25 inclusive for both the preliminary and competitive examinations, and Rs. 10.50 for the medical examination.

5. The heads of the competitive examination are as follows :—

A.—Obligatory.

(a) *English Language and Literature.*

Papers will be set in English composition and Précis Writing.

The examination in English Literature will be confined to the period between 1702 and the present date.

(b) Any two of the following languages :—(1) *Latin*, (2) *French*, (3) *German*, (4) *Sinhalese or Tamil*.

For the Examination in Latin certain portions will be selected from Virgil, Horace, Cícero and Livy, or such other books as may from time to time be approved by the Examiners.

B.—Optional.

(a) *Pure Mathematics*, i.e., Euclid I.—IV. and VI.; Algebra, including the binomial theorem; Trigonometry, including solution of triangles; Analytical Geometry (elementary).

Mixed Mathematics, including statics and dynamics treated without the differential calculus.

(b) Modern Geography and Modern History. The periods in History to be prescribed for each examination.

(c) The Elements of International and Constitutional Law and Political Economy.

(d) Civil Engineering and Surveying.

(e) Physical Science, i.e., chemistry, heat, and electricity.

Every candidate must show a competent knowledge of the obligatory subjects.

No candidate may offer more than three of the optional subjects.

The following is the scale of marks :—

(1) English Language and Literature, &c.	1,500
(2) Languages, each	750
(3) Mathematics	1,500
(4) History and Geography	750
(5) Law and Political Economy...	750
(6) Civil Engineering, &c.	750
(7) Physical Science	750

NOTE A.—The first examination under the above regulations will be held on July 13, 1892, and following days, in the Council Chamber, Colombo.

Africa, East Coast—Zanzibar Island.—Zanzibar Harbour Approaches—Buoyage.

Information has been received from Commander F. H. Henderson, H.M.S. Raccoon, dated October 4, 1891, that the following system of buoyage has been established in the approaches to Zanzibar harbour:—

Approaching Zanzibar harbour, red buoys should be left on the starboard hand, black buoys on the port hand (consequently the colours of the two southern pass buoys are reversed, but, in order to prevent confusion, the old buoys are for the present kept in position). The buoys recently placed are *can* buoys:—

- (1) A *can* buoy, black and red chequered, is moored in $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water on the southern edge of Seagull shoal with white block-house bearing E. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., distant $1\frac{1}{10}$ mile, and large house on Bet-el-Ras S.S.E.
- (2) A black *can* buoy is moored in 5 fathoms water on the bank northward of Bet-el-Ras, with Bububu house bearing E. by N. $\frac{3}{8}$ N., distant $6\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and large house on Bet-el-Ras S. by E.
- (3) A black *can* buoy is moored in 5 fathoms water, about half a cable seaward of the edge of the bank off Bet-el-Ras with Bububu house bearing N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., and large house on Bet-el-Ras S.E., distant 3 cables.

- (4) A red *can* buoy is moored in $6\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water near the eastern edge of Chapani reef, with white stone pillar bearing N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., distant $5\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and square white house S. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.
- (5) A red *can* buoy is moored in 7 fathoms water near the eastern edge of Chapani reef, with white stone tower bearing N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., distant $6\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and square white house south.
- (6) A black *can* buoy is moored in 5 fathoms water near the eastern edge of Kisiki reef, with Mbweni house bearing E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., distant $1\frac{1}{10}$ mile, and conspicuous house on Ras Buyu S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. The old buoy (red) near the above-mentioned buoy remains in position for the present.
- (7) A red *can* buoy is moored in 6 fathoms water near the western edge of Mtwana reef, with Mbweni house bearing E.N.E., distant $1\frac{1}{10}$ mile, and conspicuous house on Ras Buyu S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. The old buoy (black) near the above-mentioned buoy remains in position for the present.

The depths given are at low-water ordinary spring tides.

Perera moved "that the report regarding the lake required to be furnished by the resolution of Council of November 14, 1890, upon the complaint of His Excellency the Major-General, to wit, that the Sanitary Officer, Superintendent of Works, and Consulting Engineer be requested to submit a report on the present condition of the whole lake, its depth, condition of its margins, state of channels leading from or into the lake, its islands, or accumulation of silt in it, comparing it with its condition during the last four or five years, and reporting what is necessary to be done for its improvement, and stating the depth of water which should always be retained in it, be laid upon the table."

Mr. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.

The report of the Consulting Engineer received with letter No. 67 of November 7, 1891, and the report of the Superintendent of Works received with letter No. 601 of November 13, 1891, were laid on the table.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that the above report be considered."

Mr. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.

Resolved,—That the reports of the Consulting Engineer and the Superintendent of Works be circulated after their perusal by the Sanitary Officer, and that the Sanitary Officer be requested to furnish his report before the next Meeting of Council.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera asked "whether the letter from Mr. Vincent Loos, of Dematagoda, dated June 5, 1891, has been circulated in accordance with the resolution of Council of July 24, 1891. The Chairman replied in the affirmative.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that all the papers connected therewith be laid on the table and be considered."

Mr. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.

The papers were laid on the table, including a letter No. 581 of November 2, 1891, from the Superintendent of Works.

Resolved,—That the papers, including the further papers now submitted, be again circulated among Members.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved “for a statement of receipts and expenditure on the gas account from 1872 up to December 31, 1890, showing also the balance to the credit of that account on that date.”

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended by the substitution of the words “police and gas and consolidated rates” for the words “gas account.”

The motion so amended was seconded by the Chairman and carried.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved “for a statement showing how the sum of Rs. 195,496.69 outstanding on December 31, 1887 (being the aggregate of the arrears of assessment tax and cash balance in the Banks at that date), has been disbursed.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne seconded.—Carried.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved “for a statement of the interest which accrued on moneys deposited in the Bank in the years 1888, 1889, and 1890.”

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended by the insertion of the word “assessment” between “on” and “moneys.”

The motion so amended was seconded by Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne and carried.

The Chairman said that a statement in terms of the motion originally submitted had already been prepared.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved “for a statement in detail of the arrears of assessment tax to the end of third quarter, 1887, of the several Wards outstanding on October 31 last, showing the amounts due for each year and for each quarter, also a statement of receipts on account of assessment tax in the month of November, 1891, up to the latest possible date.”

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended by the insertion of the words “to be furnished to the Standing Committee” between the words “detail” and “of;” and the addition of the words “and that the return be treated as a confidential document by the Committee” after the word “date.”

The motion so amended was seconded by Mr. Coomaraswamy and carried.

9. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved “that the remarks of the Auditor-General on the accounts of the Council be laid on the table.”

The Chairman seconded.—Carried.

The remarks of the Auditor-General on the accounts for May and June were laid on the table.

10. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved “that the said remarks be printed and circulated, and that in future all remarks made by the Auditor-General on the Council’s accounts be printed and circulated.

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended by the omission of the words “printed and,” and the addition of the words “among Members of the Standing Committee, with the Chairman’s first replies, before their transmission to the Auditor-General” after the word “circulated.”

The motion so amended was seconded by Mr. Dias and carried.

11. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved “that the remarks on the Budget for 1892 made by him be printed and circulated.”

Mr. Coomaraswamy seconded.

This motion was, by leave of Council, withdrawn.

12. Pursuant to notice Hon. J. J. Grinlinton moved “that the question of improving the lighting of the town be considered”

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne seconded.—Carried.

Resolved,—That the Council do go into Committee on the question.

The Council having resumed, Hon. J. J. Grinlinton moved “that during dark evenings, more particularly at the changes of the monsoons, the street gas lamps be lighted, notwithstanding that the evenings may not be those which have been included within the programme of lighting for each month; also that the large lamp opposite the Municipal Council, and the large lamp at the cross roads in the Fort where York street crosses Prince street, and the four lamps on the bridge over the Customs road leading to the passenger jetty, and the four lamps at the Clock Tower, be lighted every night for the same period that the lamps at the cabstands are lighted.”

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

13. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy moved “that the rules regarding leave for officers of the Municipal Council be the same as in Government service.”

The discussion of this motion was postponed, Mr. Hay having undertaken to draft a code of rules for submission to the Municipal Council in accordance with the rules in use in the Government service.”

14. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy moved “that further expenditure on Galle Face be stopped.”

Mr. Walter Pereira seconded.

Hon. J. J. Grinlinton moved as an amendment “that the Military authorities be requested to hand over the Galle Face to the Municipal Council on the same terms as the Racquet court.

Captain Bayley seconded.

The original motion having been withdrawn in favour of the amendment, the amendment was carried.

15. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy moved “that training horses and playing golf be stopped at Victoria park.”

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended by the substitution of the word “breaking” for “training,” and the addition thereto of the words “between 6 and 8 A.M. and after 4 P.M.”

Mr. Walter Pereira seconded.

16. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy moved “that a return be furnished showing for the years 1889 and 1890—

- (a) the names and numbers of persons sent to jail for non-payment of commutation tax ;
- (b) names and numbers of persons who were fined for non-payment of tax, and amount of fine in each case ;
- (c) the date of receipt of such fine.”

The Chairman seconded.—Carried.

The return in question was laid on the table.

17. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Coomaraswamy moved "that a return of persons licensed by the Chairman to seize stray cattle be laid on the table."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

The return in question was laid on the table.

18. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy asked "whether such persons were so licensed by authority of the Municipal Council under section 10, Chapter XX. of Ordinance 16 of 1881, and moved for papers."

In reply, the Chairman read a resolution of Council of February 14, 1882, authorising the Chairman to issue such licenses on behalf of the Council.

19. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy moved "that a return be furnished to the Council of defalcations by officers of the Council in 1888, 1889, 1890, and up to September 30, 1891, showing the names of such officers, the nature of their offices, the amount misappropriated, the cost of prosecution in each case, and the result of each prosecution."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

The return was laid on the table.

Resolved,—That the return be circulated.

20. Pursuant to notice Mr. Coomaraswamy moved "that a return be furnished to the Council of the law suits in connection with over-assessment for 1888, 1889, 1890, and up to the end of September, 1891, showing names of parties, No. of suit, and the name of the court of institution of suit, amount of assessment complained of in each case, amount to which the assessment was reduced by the court, the costs incurred by the Council and paid to the plaintiffs in each case."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

The return was laid on the table.

Resolved,—That the return be circulated.

21. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Dias moved "that as the present insanitary condition of Kehelwatta is a source of extreme danger to the health of the neighbourhood, and as the promises made by the Council to favourably consider the petitions presented from time to time on the subject have not been fulfilled, the Council do cause the removal of such insanitary condition by adopting measures, even on a small scale, which will ultimately secure the object in view, instead of awaiting an opportunity for carrying into execution some grand scheme for effecting a radical change in these quarters.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Resolved,—That the matter be referred to the Sanitary Officer to suggest such measures as he may deem necessary for carrying out the object referred to in the motion.

22. Pursuant to notice Captain Bayley moved "that the Superintendent of Works be requested to devise a scheme for the deepening, cleansing, and improvement of the lake, and that it be submitted to Council for its consideration."

Resolved,—That the consideration of the motion do stand over until the next Meeting.

23. A report dated October 19, 1891, from the Gas Inspector, on the subject of "extra lighting," was considered in connection with Motion No. 12.

24. The report of the Special Committee on the Chairman's Administration Report for 1890 was not ready. Hon. J. J. Grinlinton undertook to submit it at the next Meeting.

Resolved,—That the report be circulated when received.

25. The following recommendation of the Standing Committee of October 30, 1891, was submitted.

"Resolved that the Town Hall be placed on the Telephone Exchange without delay, in anticipation of sanction of Council—(Rs. 175 per annum)."

Resolved,—That the matter do stand over for consideration with the Budget for 1892.

26. The Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January to October, 1891, was not ready. A Progress Report of Work done during the same period was laid on the table.

27. A report No. 438, dated August 7, 1891, from the Superintendent of Works, on the memorial from certain householders of Kotahena street, presented at the General Meeting of July 10, 1891, was read; and also a memorandum by the Chairman, intimating that the proprietor of 14 and 15, Kotahena street, as well as others, having consented to have steps constructed inside their verandahs, the Superintendent of Works would be instructed accordingly.

Resolved,—That steps be constructed by the Superintendent of Works as agreed between the Chairman and the proprietor of Nos. 14 and 15.

28. A letter No. 118/11487 dated October 10, 1891, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, was submitted, forwarding a copy of one from the Acting Chief Engineer, Colombo Waterworks, with reference to the necessity of laying down a second main supply pipe or constructing a second service reservoir; and inquiring whether the Municipal Council would be disposed to join in defraying the cost of either scheme.

[These letters had been previously printed and circulated.]

Captain Bayley moved "that the Council is not in a position to join in defraying the cost of either of the alternative schemes suggested by the Acting Chief Engineer, Colombo Waterworks.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne seconded.—Carried.

29. A letter No. 3081-F 1537, dated October 29, 1891, from the Hon. the Government Agent, intimating the result of the sale of certain toll rents for 1892, was submitted.

Resolved,—That the offers be accepted.

30. A letter dated November 6, 1891, from the Hon. L. B. Clarence, inviting attention to the condition of the lake, was submitted.

Resolved,—That the letter be circulated, and its consideration deferred till next meeting.

31. A memorandum from the Additional Municipal Magistrate was submitted, suggesting that one person be appointed clerk and interpreter of the court, with a salary of Rs. 45 or Rs. 50, and a that process clerk be appointed on Rs. 15 per mensem.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the suggestion, the salary of the clerk and interpreter being fixed at Rs. 45 rising to Rs. 50, and that a process clerk be appointed at Rs. 20 per mensem.

Mr. C. S. Hay seconded.—Carried.

32. A letter No. 435 dated October 8, 1891, from Surgeon-Captain Vanderstraaten, Volunteer Medical Staff, was read, requesting permission to retain the ambulance litter belonging to the Council at the Volunteer Head Quarters for use in any emergency.

The Chairman moved that the application be allowed.

Captain Bayley seconded.—Carried.

33. A letter dated October 5, 1891, from Mr. C. H. de Silva, Proctor, giving notice of action for the recovery of Rs. 200 for injuries caused to a horse and carriage belonging to Mr. Carimjee Jafferjee by the fall of the branch of a tree at Keyzer street, through the negligence of certain servants of the Municipal Council, was submitted.

Resolved,—That the letter be circulated.

34. A letter dated November 4, 1891, from the Secretary, Colombo Hotels Company, was read, requesting permission to convert the piece of ground extending from the east end of the cab-stand to the road leading to the passenger jetty into an ornamental garden, on payment of a nominal rent.

The Chairman moved "that the application be allowed, on payment of a nominal rent of Rs. 5 per annum."

Mr. C. S. Hay seconded.—Carried.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE HAVELOCK RACE COURSE COMPANY, LIMITED.

THE regulations contained in Table C of "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861" shall apply to this Company, with the following additions:—

SHARES.

No person shall be allowed to hold more than three shares in the Company.
