PROCLAMATIONS BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight, Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

E. NOEL WALKER.

WHEREAS by the 19th section of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1885 it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, viz.:—

- (a) the period fixed under section 7 for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and
- (b) if such claims have been made, the period fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and
- (c) all lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 have become vested in the Crown—

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation :

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest :

Now know all Men that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest as from and after the 1st September, 1893.

And We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule, reserving, nevertheless—

- (i.) to the public the right of way, 6 ft. wide, along the existing pathway from Munnesseram to Manuwangama and thence to the Nariyagama fields ;
 - (ii.) to (1) Patabendi Korallalage Andirala ; (2) Patabendi Korallalage Yahapathami ; (3) Patabendi Korallalage Guruhami, Menikrala, Sinno Appu, Punchihami ; (4) Patabendi Korallalage Punchappu ; (5) Patabendi Korallalage Ranamalli, Buriya, Menuhami ; (6) Patabendi Korallalage Sittappu, and their heirs and successors, the right to practise chena cultivation in the lots 7,265½ (20 acres 20 perches) and 7,266 (96 acres) in preliminary plan 1,382, on obtaining permits from the Assistant Government Agent, Chilaw, as heretofore, and subject to the payment of the customary share to Government. Lot 7,265½ is bounded on the north, east, and west by lot 7,256, and on the south by lot 7,266 ; lot 7,266 is bounded on the north by lot 7,265½, on the east and west by lot 7,265, and on the south by lot 7,266½ and lot A 636 ;
 - (iii.) to the aforesaid persons and their heirs the right to collect forest produce within the limits of lots 7,265½ and 7,266, subject to such rules as may from time to time be prescribed on that behalf by the Government Agent as provided by section 15 (b) of Ordinance No. 10 of 1885 ;
 - (iv.) to the aforesaid Patabendi Korallalage Punchappu and his heirs the right to pasture cattle, not exceeding twenty in number, within the limits of lots 7,265½ and 7,266.
- And excluding lot A 636 (2 acres 3 roods 11 perches) called Migahawatta, where certain of the aforesaid persons reside.

of January, 1888, shall be continued to the said Fretsz Peter Scharenguivel and to his said wife Joselyn Aurelia Scharenguivel, to whom only the right of interment therein is hereby expressly declared to be granted and continued, and with whom such right shall cease and determine.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance relating to Rabies.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the suppression of Hydrophobia in this Island: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.
Date of operation.

1 This Ordinance may for all purposes be cited as "The Rabies Ordinance, 189 "; and it shall come into operation on such date as the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, appoint.

Repealing clause.

2 There shall be repealed as from and after the date of this Ordinance coming into operation the Ordinance No. 9 of 1842, intituled "An Ordinance for the prevention of mischief by Dogs," and all regulations heretofore made thereunder. Provided that such repeal shall not affect any liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment incurred under the last-mentioned Ordinance or any regulations made thereunder, or any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment; and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be carried on as if this Ordinance had not passed.

Definitions.

3 In this Ordinance, unless the subject or context otherwise requires—

"Disease" means rabies, and "diseased" means affected with rabies.

"Suspected" means suspected of rabies, and "suspected animal" includes any animal which has been bitten by any diseased or suspected dog, or which has been in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has been otherwise exposed to the infection of rabies.

The words "local authority" denote a person falling under any of the descriptions hereafter following, viz. :—

- (a) The chairman of a municipal council within the limits of a municipality.
- (b) The chairman of a local board within the limits of a local board.
- (c) The government agent or assistant government agent outside the limits of a municipality or local board and within the limits of his province or district respectively.
- (d) Every person duly authorised in writing by the chairman of a municipal council or the local board or the government agent or assistant government agent to act in his behalf for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance.

"Police officer" includes inspectors, sergeants, and constables of police, and all village headmen and peace officers.

All stray dogs to be seized.

4 Every local authority shall cause all stray dogs found within the district to be seized, and such dogs shall be dealt with as follows:—

How to be dealt with.

(1) If the dog is not diseased or suspected, it shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period as the local authority may think expedient, provided that where the owner or other person who had charge of the dog is known, the local authority shall cause notice to be

forthwith given to either of them of the seizure and detention of the dog, and upon receiving payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such seizure and detention, shall deliver the dog to the person noticed or his agent, without prejudice however to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of any of the provisions of this Ordinance.

Unclaimed dogs. (2) If the dog so seized and detained be not claimed within two days after the notice aforesaid has been served, or, in case no owner or other person is known to be in charge of the dog, within three days of such seizure, it shall be competent to the local authority to cause the dog to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the local authority shall deem expedient.

Owner, who. 5 Every person who shall knowingly suffer a dog to make such person's house or premises its ordinary place of resort shall be deemed and held to be the owner of such dog for the purposes of this Ordinance, and shall be liable civilly and criminally for all mischief done and all acts of nuisance committed by such dog.

Ferocious dogs may be killed. 6 It shall be lawful for any person to kill upon the spot any dog which shall ferociously fly at or attack him, and to pursue and kill any dog not being securely tied up or otherwise confined which he shall have reasonable ground to believe to be diseased.

Notice by owner or possessor of diseased dog or other animal to police officer. 7 (1) Every owner or other person having under his charge a dog or other animal which is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a dog or other animal reasonably suspected, shall cause such dog or animal to be securely tied or otherwise confined, and shall forthwith give notice of the fact of such dog or animal being so diseased, suspected, or bitten, to a police officer of the district wherein the dog or animal so diseased, suspected, or bitten, is or was.

(2) The police officer receiving such notice shall forthwith transmit the information to the local authority, who shall likewise inform the principal civil medical officer and the government veterinary surgeon.

Police officer to inform local authority. Local authority to inform principal civil medical officer and government veterinary surgeon.

Police officer to proceed to place where rabies exist.

8 A police officer receiving credible information of the existence of rabies, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of rabies, shall forthwith proceed to the place where such rabies is reported to exist, and put in force the powers conferred on him by this Ordinance or by the regulations made thereunder.

Regulations. 9 It shall be lawful for the local authority specified in (a), (b), and (c) of section 3 of this Ordinance to give public warning by notification in the *Government Gazette* and by beat of tom-tom, and by such other means as he may deem expedient, of the existence of rabies within his district, and it shall be lawful for any such local authority to make such regulations (subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council) from time to time as he may think fit for the following purposes, or any of them :—

- (a) For providing for the muzzling of dogs while in or on any public road or place, with such exemptions (if any) as the local authority may think fit.
- (b) For providing for the keeping of dogs under control by the owner or person in charge thereof in such manner as may be prescribed by such regulations.
- (c) For providing for the seizure, detention, and disposal, including destruction, of dogs not being kept under control in the manner prescribed by such regulations.
- (d) For providing for the recovery by the local authority of the expenses incurred in respect of the detention of any dog seized and detained and disposed of under any such regulations from the owners thereof.

- (e) For prohibiting or regulating the holding of shows or exhibitions of dogs, and the exposing of dogs for exhibition or sale thereat.
- Publication of regulations. 10 All regulations made by the local authority and approved of by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under this Ordinance, shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall thereupon have the force of law.
- Destruction of diseased dogs. Destruction of suspected dogs and diseased animals other than dogs. Notice by owner to local authority and reference to Governor. 11 Every local authority shall cause to be destroyed every diseased dog within his district, and if he thinks fit any suspected dog or any diseased animal other than a dog within his district, provided that if the owner of such dog or animal gives notice in writing to the local authority that he objects to such dog or animal being destroyed, the local authority shall cause it to be examined by a medical officer of the civil medical department, and if such officer is of opinion that such dog or animal ought to be destroyed, the local authority shall cause the same to be destroyed.
- Penalties for offences. 12 The following penalties are imposed for the following acts and omissions which are hereby declared to be offences under this Ordinance :—
- Contravention of regulations. (1) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Ordinance or of any regulations made by a local authority under section 9 of this Ordinance, the owner of the dog and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be liable on conviction to a fine of rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment for a period not exceeding months, or both.
- Failure to give notice of disease to police officer. (2) Any owner or person having in his possession a diseased or suspected dog or other animal, or a dog or other animal which has been bitten by a dog or other animal reasonably suspected to be diseased, shall, if he fail to give notice of the same to a police officer as required by section 7 of this Ordinance, be liable on conviction to a fine of rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment for a period not exceeding months, or both.
- Failure of police officer to give notice to local authority. (3) Every police officer receiving notice as regards a diseased dog shall, if he fail to transmit the information to the local authority as required by section 7 of this Ordinance, be liable on conviction to a fine of rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment for a period not exceeding months, or both.
- Allowing diseased dogs to go at large. (4) Every owner of a dog or other animal which is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a dog or other animal reasonably suspected to be diseased, who shall permit the same to go at large after being informed or knowing it to be diseased, suspected, or to have been bitten by any dog or animal suspected to be diseased, shall be liable on conviction to a fine of rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment for a period not exceeding months, or both.
- Police court to have jurisdiction. 13 Every prosecution under this Ordinance may be instituted in the police court of the division in which the offence was committed or where the offender is found, anything in the Criminal Procedure Code or in any other Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.
- Informer's share. 14 It shall be lawful for the court imposing a fine under this Ordinance to award to the informer any share not exceeding a moiety of so much of the fine as is actually recovered and realised.

M I N U T E.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance relating to Pawnbrokers.

Preamble.	W HEREAS it is expedient to provide for the regulation of the business of Pawnbrokers: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—
Short title.	1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Pawnbrokers Ordinance, 189 ."
Interpretation.	2 In this Ordinance— "Pawnbroker" includes every person who carries on the business of taking goods in pawn. "Pledge" means an article pawned with a pawnbroker. "Shop" includes dwelling-house and warehouse, or other place of business, or place where business is transacted.
Application of Ordinance.	3 This Ordinance shall apply only where the sum lent by a pawnbroker at any one time does not exceed one hundred rupees.
Pawnbrokers to keep books as in schedule.	4 A pawnbroker shall keep and use in his business such books and documents as are described in the schedule to this Ordinance, in the forms therein indicated, and shall from time to time, as occasion demands, enter therein the particulars required. If a pawnbroker fails in any respect to comply with the requisitions of this section, he shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance, and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.
Pawn tickets to be given for pledges.	5 A pawnbroker shall, on taking any article in pawn, give to the pawner a pawn ticket, and shall not take any article in pawn unless the pawner takes the pawn ticket.
Pledges redeemable within one year, and seven days of grace.	6 Every pledge shall be redeemable within twelve months from the day of pawning, exclusive of that day; and then shall be added to that year of redemption seven days of grace within which every pledge, if not already redeemed, shall continue to be redeemable.
Pledges for five rupees and under, not redeemed in time, forfeited.	7 A pledge pawned for five rupees or under, if not redeemed within the year of redemption and days of grace, shall, at the end of the days of grace, become and be the pawnbroker's absolute property.
Pledges above five rupees redeemable until sale.	8 A pledge pawned for above five rupees shall further continue redeemable until it is disposed of, although the year of redemption and days of grace are expired.
Sale by auction of pledges above five rupees.	9 A pledge pawned for above five rupees shall not be disposed of by the pawnbroker except by sale by public auction held by a duly licensed auctioneer; and at such a sale a pawnbroker may bid for and purchase a pledge pawned with him. A pawnbroker who is also a licensed auctioneer shall not himself sell any pledge taken by him in pawn. It shall be the duty of the pawnbroker to give at least three clear days' notice to the pawner of the day, hour, and place at which he proposes to hold the sale by public auction.
Power to inspect sale books.	10 At any time within two years after the auction at which a pledge pawned for above five rupees is sold, the holder of the pawn ticket may inspect the entry of the sale in the pawnbroker's book and in the books of the auctioneer. Where such pledge appears to have been sold for more than the amount of the loan and interest due at the time of the sale, the pawnbroker shall on demand, within two years after the sale, pay the surplus to the holder of the pawn ticket within two years after the sale, deducting the necessary costs and charges of the sale.

Offences as to pledges above five rupees.

11 If, in regard to pledges for loans of above five rupees, a pawnbroker—

- (1) does not *bonâ fide* sell a pledge pawned with him in strict conformity with the provisions of section 9;
- (2) enters in his book a pledge as sold for less than the sum for which it was sold, or fails duly to enter the same;
- (3) refuses to permit any holder of a pawn ticket or other person interested on his behalf to inspect entries of sale in his books; or
- (4) refuses to pay on demand the surplus to the person entitled to receive the same—

he shall in every case be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction before a police court to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Holder of pawn ticket entitled to redeem.

12 The holder for the time being of a pawn ticket shall be presumed to be the person entitled to redeem the pledge, and subject to the provisions of this Ordinance the pawnbroker shall deliver the pledge to such holder. Provided, however, if the pawnbroker has reason to suspect that such holder has stolen or otherwise illegally obtained possession of the pawn ticket, the pawnbroker may seize and detain the person and the ticket and deliver them, as soon as may be, into the custody of an officer of police or village headman, who shall convey the person and the ticket before a court of competent jurisdiction to be dealt with according to law.

Liability of pawnbrokers in case of fire.

13 Where a pledge is destroyed or damaged by or in consequence of fire, the pawnbroker shall nevertheless be liable, on demand, within the period of redemption, to pay the value of the pledge, after deducting the amount of the loan and interest.

A pawnbroker shall be entitled to insure to the extent of the value of the article pawned.

Compensation for depreciation of pledge.

14 If a person entitled and offering to redeem a pledge shows to the satisfaction of a court of competent jurisdiction that the pledge has become lost, or has been rendered of less value than it was at the time of the pawning thereof, by or through the default, neglect, or wilful misbehaviour of the pawnbroker, the court may, if it thinks fit, award a reasonable satisfaction to the owner of the pledge, and the amount awarded shall be deducted from the amount payable to the pawnbroker, or shall be paid by the pawnbroker in such manner as the court directs.

Unlawful pawning of goods, not property of pawner.

15 If any person without lawful excuse pawns with a pawnbroker anything, being the property of another person, he shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Proceedings where a person offering articles in pawn do not give a good account of themselves.

16 If any person—

- (a) offers to a pawnbroker an article by way of pawn, but refuses or is unable to give a satisfactory account of the means by which he became possessed of it; or
- (b) wilfully gives false information to a pawnbroker regarding the ownership of the articles offered by him in pawn, or his true name and address; or
- (c) redeems or attempts to redeem a pledge, not being entitled to redeem—

shall be guilty of an offence, and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

In every such case, and also in any case where, on an article being offered in pawn, a pawnbroker has reason to suspect that it has been stolen or otherwise illegally obtained, he may seize and detain the person and the article and deliver them, as soon as may be, into the custody of an officer of police or village headman, who shall convey the person and the article before a court of competent jurisdiction to be dealt with according to law.

Prohibition of taking in pawn linen, clothing, unfinished goods, &c., in certain cases.

17 If a pawnbroker knowingly takes in pawn any linen or apparel, or unfinished goods or materials entrusted to any person to wash, scour, iron, mend, manufacture, work up, finish, or make up, he shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine of double the value of the article pawned; and the pawnbroker shall also restore the pledge to the owner thereof in the presence of the court or as the court directs.

Whenever, in any proceeding under this Ordinance, it shall be made to appear to a court that any article is in the unlawful possession of any pawnbroker, it shall be competent to such court to order the production of the article and its delivery to any person named by such court, under such terms, if any, as it may think proper.

Offences by pawnbrokers.

18 If a pawnbroker does any of the following things :—

- (1) takes an article in pawn from any person appearing to be under the age of sixteen years or to be intoxicated; or takes an article in pawn without giving the pawner a pawn ticket;
- (2) purchases, or takes in pawn or exchange a pawn ticket issued by another pawnbroker;
- (3) employs any servant apparently under the age of twenty-one years to take articles in pawn;
- (4) purchases, except at public auction, any pledge while in pawn with him;
- (5) suffers any pledge while in pawn with him to be redeemed with a view to his purchasing it;
- (6) agrees with any person, pawning or offering to pawn any article, for the purchase, sale, or disposition thereof within the time of redemption;
- (7) sells or otherwise disposes of any pledge pawned with him, except at such time and in such manner as is authorised by this Ordinance;

he shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Yearly licenses.

19 Every pawnbroker shall yearly take out from the government agent of the province or the assistant government agent of the district where the pawnbroker resides, a license for carrying on his business, and such license shall be in the form contained in the schedule, and shall bear a stamp of twenty rupees. And such government agent shall forward to the inspector-general of police for his information a copy of each license issued.

Every license shall be dated on the day on which it is issued, and shall determine on the 31st day of July next ensuing.

If a person acts as a pawnbroker without a license as herein provided, he shall be liable for every such act to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, or to imprisonment, either rigorous or simple, for a term not exceeding three months.

Refusal of licenses.

20 A license shall not be refused except on any of the following grounds :—

- (1) That the applicant has failed to produce satisfactory evidence of good character; or has been at any time within five years from the date of such application found guilty of any acts rendered punishable under the 11th, 13th, 17th, or 18th chapters of the Penal Code, or under the provisions of this Ordinance;
- (2) That the shop in which he intends to carry on the business of a pawnbroker or any adjacent house or place possessed by him is frequented by thieves or persons of bad character, or is used for the sale of intoxicating liquor, opium, or bhang.

Pawnbroker's book subject to examination.

21 It shall be lawful for a police magistrate to order a pawnbroker to attend before him on a day or hour to be named in writing, and to produce for examination all books and papers relating to his business.

If upon the receipt of such an order he fails without lawful cause to appear with his books and papers, he shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Inspector of police may enter and search pawnbroker's shop or residence.

22 It shall be lawful for any officer of police not below the rank of inspector to enter any pawnbroker's shop or residence at any hour of the day and examine and take note of any article pledged with the pawnbroker, or any books and papers kept by him.

Whoever resists such officer of police in the execution of this duty shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Imprisonment in default of payment of fine

23 It shall be competent for the court before which any person has been convicted of any offence under this Ordinance and sentenced to pay a fine, to award, in default of payment of such fine, imprisonment either rigorous or simple for a term not exceeding three months.

Ordinance only to have effect within limits appointed by Governor.

24 This Ordinance shall have effect only within such limits as the Governor shall by proclamation from time to time ordain.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend "The Petroleum Ordinance, 1887."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Ordinance No. 6 of 1887, intituled "The Petroleum Ordinance, 1887": Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Petroleum Amendment Ordinance, 189 ," and shall come into force on the _____ day of _____ 189 .

Date of operation.

Ordinance to be construed as one with Ordinance No. 6 of 1887.

2 "The Petroleum Ordinance, 1887," is hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and the principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Petroleum Ordinances, 1887 and 189 ," and this Ordinance shall be construed as one with the principal Ordinance; and the expression "this Ordinance" in the principal Ordinance, and any expression referring to the principal Ordinance which occurs in any Ordinance or other document, shall be construed to mean the principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance.

Amendment of section 19 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1887 as to the quantity to be conveyed.

As to the conveyance in a closed vessel or cart.

3 (1) To sub-section (a) of section 19 of the principal Ordinance the following words shall be added, namely, "except when conveyed in a cart specially constructed for the purpose, which has been licensed by writing under the hand of the local authority for the conveyance of petroleum."

(2) In sub-section (b) of the same section after the word "vessel" and before the words "so constructed" the words "or cart" shall be inserted.

A reef about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile in extent with a depth of 3 fathoms on it. Bay hill, in line with Bathurst head, bearing ... E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.
And D reef bearing ... N.E.

A reef of small extent, with two pinnacles, on which there is $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms at low water, lying about W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the beacon on D reef.

The first-named danger lies on the recommended night course off Princess Charlotte bay, and the latter one on or near to the usual day course. Mariners are therefore cautioned to exercise great care in that vicinity.

*China Sea—Natuna Island—Reefs and Wrecks near
Pulu Laut.*

The following information concerning certain reefs and wrecks near Pulu Laut or North Natuna island has been received from H.M.S. Archer, dated May 3, 1893 :—

1. Reefs which usually break at half tide, and which dry in places at low water spring tides, fringe the south-east coast of Pulu Laut for a distance of about 4 miles. The soundings for about one mile south-east of the outer edge of the reefs are 8 to 13 fathoms over uneven ground, thence depths of 18 to 20 fathoms, sand and coral bottom, were obtained till nearing Batu Penuh.

2. The wreck of the Swedish barque Doris lies on the above-mentioned reef in about one foot at low water, with the east extreme of Sto Kong islet bearing N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., and the south-east extreme of Pulu Laut W. by N., distant about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Approximate position, lat. $4^{\circ} 41' N.$, long. $108^{\circ} 2' E.$

3. Batu Penuh, shown with $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms water on it, is an extensive shoal, composed of coral and white sand. A depth of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms (at about low water) were obtained with the south-east extreme of Pulu Laut bearing W.N.W., distant $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Approximate position, lat. $4^{\circ} 38\frac{1}{2}' N.$, long. $108^{\circ} 6\frac{1}{2}' E.$ Belknap rock, on which the American ship Robert L. Belknap was wrecked, forms a part of the above-mentioned shoal.

4. The cylinders of a steamer with two piston rods on Gloria shoal uncover at low water, and resemble a rock awash.

Approximate position, lat. $4^{\circ} 36' N.$, long. $107^{\circ} 59' E.$

CAUTION.—The waters surrounding this group are most imperfectly known.

*China, East Coast—Putoy Group—Hongkong Approach—
Double Flashing Light and Fog Guns on Waglan Islet.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 108, dated May 1, 1893, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice that on May 9, 1893, a light was exhibited from the lighthouse recently erected on Waglan islet, Putoy group, western side of approach to Hongkong by the Tathong channel :—

Waglan islet light is a double flashing white light (dioptric of the first order), showing flashes at intervals of half a minute. It is elevated 225 ft. above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather, where not obscured by the land, from a distance of about 21 miles.

For the present the light will only show with about one-third of its maximum intensity towards the land, between the bearings of N. by E. through east and S. E. by S.

The lighthouse situated on the summit of the islet is 52 ft. high, constructed of iron, and cylindrical in shape. The lower half is painted white, the upper half red, the lantern and keepers' dwellings white.

Approximate position : lat. $22^{\circ} 11\frac{1}{2}' N.$, long. $114^{\circ} 18\frac{1}{2}' E.$

Also, that from the establishment of Waglan islet light, the keepers, on hearing a bell, horn, steam whistle, or other sound indicating the proximity of a vessel, will fire two guns with an interval of fifteen seconds between them, and if the vessel's fog signal—showing that she is under way—continues to be heard, the guns are repeated after an interval of twelve minutes.

Sanitary Officer's Report for the Quarter ended March 31, 1893.

The General Health during the quarter was bad. Measles was reported in different wards during the first half of the quarter. Chickenpox was prevailing in the different wards throughout the quarter. An epidemic of smallpox broke out in ward No. 2. It was traced to a Moorman who kept himself in concealment, and on detection stated the disease developed on board on his way from the Coast, and the Port Surgeon pronounced his case as chickenpox. The case was reported to the Government Medical Officer, who kept the patient under observation till the real nature of the case was elicited by the appearance of two more cases of smallpox in the same house at Dangedara near the mosque. A few days after there were two more cases in a boutique opposite the infected house. Then the disease appeared in China Garden, where we had about six cases till the end of March. The epidemic was still raging, making its appearance in different other parts later on. It could have been arrested at once if active measures were taken for the immediate removal of patients to hospital. There had been considerable delay on the part of the Government Medical Officer in ordering the removal of patients on several occasions, and to this may be attributed the spread of the epidemic.

The Wards.—In my last report I dwelt at length on the defects in drainage and sewage disposal, and made some suggestions to meet these defects. To avoid repetition I would invite the attention of the Council to my last report.

The China Garden drain discharging into the Pattiya-ela is invariably kept dirty, being used as a latrine by the neighbours. This discharging into the stagnant Pattiya-ela causes a nuisance, as the latter has no fall to carry away the filth impregnated water. The drain itself is not built with a proper fall. Even after a heavy shower it does not look clean, and there is always some water left stagnating at the bottom. To prevent people from committing the nuisance there ought to be two public latrines on the dry-earth system—one opposite the drains and the other opposite the Pattiya-ela. In premises where there is room the owners ought to be served notice to have latrine accommodation.

Plumbago Sheds, &c.—In those places where a large number of women, &c., are employed from morning till evening there ought to be proper latrine accommodation. In most places I think there is an average of fifty or more employes, and there is no doubt they must be seriously polluting the soil and the wells in the neighbourhood.

Latrines are kept clean. Seashore, Talbot town, and Customs latrines require repairing.

Street Sweeping within the Fort was not satisfactorily done, as the coolies used to start work rather late instead of at 5 A.M.

Scavenging was satisfactory.

Slaughtering of Cattle.—The quality of the cattle was good.

2. I believe that in the use of these sprayers and "London Purple" is to be found a remedy for the fly that is so destructive to paddy in the Kandyan Provinces, and possibly for green bug on coffee as well.

SIR,—IN continuation of my letter No. 1,142 of the 20th instant, I beg to submit for your information the highly successful results obtained by the use of the sprayer to destroy "godavellus," and the general feeling of gratitude among the cultivators, particularly those of the fertile paddy tracts of the Malimmada division, where the sprayer was lately used, that a remedy has at last been discovered to avert what has been the curse of the cultivator from "time immemorial."

The godavella was hitherto believed to be indigenous to the soil. The introduction of the sprayer has now brought the information that instead of its being so, it is a kind of caterpillar that comes from an egg that is laid by a moth that flies about during night from place to place.

These insects generally appear about three days after sowing, in such numbers that the tract literally swarms with them, two or three of them attacking each paddy plant. If left unheeded the tract is converted into such a complete waste within seven or eight days that a second sowing is required. Flooding the tracts where water was available for that purpose was the only remedy known, and where this was not possible the more primitive methods of "polgehíma" (cocoanut throwing) and "ankeliya" (horn pulling) and their connected feasts were resorted to, by which it was expected to propitiate the deities from whom this pest was supposed to be a visitation. The belief in such methods was maintained by the mere coincidence that as the period of these ceremonies drew to a close the godavellus, in the course of nature, disappeared.

The first attempt to devise a more practical way of destroying them was made at your suggestion early in 1892. This was to sprinkle with the hand—like seed being thrown in sowing—a solution of one part of kerosine oil to sixteen parts of water over the attacked tracts, which had been previously flooded for the purpose. After a few hours the water was drained off, and the insects were found dead or were swept away dying with the ebbing water. I tried this in several large tracts in Aparekka in the Wellaboda pattu, but although the results were satisfactory it had its drawbacks in the manner of sprinkling, which was necessarily slow, and in the fact, too, that the solution could be used only in flooded fields, or there was the danger of damage to the crops. The sprayer removed the former, while the insecticide (London Purple) supplied this harvest has removed the latter. We have now an unfailing remedy, obviating, too, the often impossible necessity of flooding, to take the place of the pristine methods of "polgehíma" and "ankeliya" of our forefathers.

Early in July there was great apprehension in Malimmada, Uninduwela, and Kaduwa, some of the finest paddy tracts in the Province, owing to the appearance of godavellus in denser swarms than before, even prior to sowing, wherever a field was seen above water. This occurred just about the time the amunas were to be broken for sowing. I deferred sowing for another week for fear of the insects getting into the fields when the water was drained off, and reported the state of affairs to you. The sprayer with the insecticide was sent. It was freely used in the parts of the tracts referred to, which were not flooded by the amunas, and the effect was even better than was expected. The insects operated on in the morning were found dead at sun-turn. This was so reassuring that the cultivators, who opposed the late Mudaliyár in using the solution of kerosine oil, and who were clamorous for the retention of the amunas even longer than I wished, of their own accord opened them, and allowed my men to spray the insecticide, with the results stated. Within a few days there were no godavellus in this tract. What specially commends this treatment is that, unlike all other methods, godavellus never appear in the same tract again, and that the powder is perfectly

harmless to the plant, obviating, as I said, the necessity for flooding the crops. There was a scramble for the sprayer among the cultivators when the first results were seen, and it was used here and there, so that the exact extent operated upon cannot be stated, but I put it down at thirty-five amunams.

I am so satisfied with this experiment that I would recommend that six sprayers may be supplied to my district with the necessary insecticide, so that they may be used simultaneously all over the district in future occasions.

NOTE by the ASSISTANT GOVERNMENT AGENT.

The sprayer is a copper vessel containing about 4 gallons of liquid. It is slung on a man's back and easily worked by him, the pump handle with one hand and the jet with the other. I obtained my sprayer from Mr. J. H. Starey, of the Eastern Produce Company, at a cost of Rs. 68.27 in Colombo.

The London Purple is used in the proportion of 1 lb. to 100 gallons of water. It costs, I think, about £2 per cwt. in London, and it is sold by the Hemingway's London Purple Company, Limited, London and New York. One pound is sufficient for about ten acres of paddy.
