





THE JAFFNA HINDU COLLEGE

THEN AND NOW

The history of the Jaffna Hindu College reads like a poem. It is a truism to say that big movements and large institutions, as a rule, start in humble and unlikely circumstances. The history of the establishment and development of the Jaffna Hindu College is no exception to this rule.

The great Hindu savant, Sri la Sri Arumuga Navalar, enjoined on his ecompatriots to establish schools in order to save Hindu children from the denationalising influence of Christian Missionary schools. Ten years after his demise a handful of high-souled patriots met together in 1889 and formed a committee charged with the job of setting up a Hindu school where western education could be imparted in a purely indigenous atmosphere. A small plot of land 65 perches in extent was acquired for the purpose in the little village of Neeraviady in the. Vannarponnai District- a district hallowed by the foot-prints of the great Navalar.

At this juncture, as luck would have it, something strange happened. The Native Town High School run by Mr. Nevins Chithambarapillai and the Pettah High School of one Mr. Koch were in the dumps. Paradoxically enough, the two Christian owners offered to hand over their schools to this committee of Hindu gentlemen. The offer was gratefully accepted.

On Vijaya Dasami day of 1890 the students numbering 80 and the entire staff of the two schools repaired to a pandal erected a month earlier in the plot of land at Neeraviady to felicitate Mr. (Later Sir) Ponnambalam Ramanathan The new school thus assembled, humbly named the Hinau High School, commenced work under the headship of one Mr. Godman Appapiliar. In a year's time the number on roll trebled itself. The committee of management, therefore, looked out for a more suitable man to head the school.

At this time Mr. Pasupathy Chettiar, one of the founder-fathers of the school, while on his way to Benares, met young Mr. Nevins Servadurai in Madras. Young Nevins was the son of the erstwhile owner of the Native Town High School. The Chettiar was so favourably impressed by the young man's learning and personality that he lost no time in persuading him to abandon his plans of entering the legal profession in Madras and accept the head-mastership of the new school in Jaffna. Mr. Nevins agreed.

He came over to Jaffna and took charge of the school on 18th February, 1892.

The management now addressed itself to the difficult task of putting up suitable buildings. The necessary money had to be found. The doughty Chettiar, ever optimistic, started building operations even before enough funds were collected.

The news of the progress of the new national school spread far and wide. Many affluent Hindus, on their own, offered money and material to put

up permanent buildings. Masons and carpenters, artisans and craftsmen, caught up in the spirit of the day, offered to work a day in the week free of wages. For miles around the school every Hindu house-hold daily put by a handful of rice and a coconut for the school. With such voluntary support from the public it was no wonder that the massive main block sprang up in double quick time It was declared open in 1895 by Mudaliar Ponnambalam Cumaraswamy, the eldest of the three illustrious brothers.

In the same year, the tone of the school had risen high enough for the Principal to get it affiliated to the Calcutta University. With this change in status the school took on the name of the Jaffna Hindu College.

The registration of the school for government grant was unduly delayed due to the opposition of Christian missionories. It was, however, eventually secured in 1895.

By now the Jaffna Hindu College had become a fact. The Hindu community of Jaffna was jubitant, Prestigious Hindu families thought it their duty and privilege to send their sons to this their own school. Boys from poorer homes, who could afford the time after helping their fathers in their vocation, took advantage of the large number of free studentships offered by the school and joined it in large numbers

Some of these poor children had to walk as many as 5 or 6 miles to school, be satisfied with a snack lunch of a chop of manioc and a lump hot sambol, and trudge it back home after a day's heavy work. It is gratifying to note that quite a number of them rose to eminence in the learned professions and Government Service in later life.

As the century drew to a close students had started flowing out of the school in large numbers after completing their studies. Many of them secured high politions in the Government departments and European firms. But a larger number left the shores of the country to try their fortunes in the relatively young British colonies of the Federated Malay States and Singapore. This exodus to Malaya continued unabated for the next three decades or so.

When in 1925 Mr. Nevins visited Malaya on a fund-raising mission for the school he was mobbed by his old students wherever he went; and to his pleasant surprise he found that the Malayan railways were virtually run by them.

In 1909 Mr. Nevinsleft for Kandy to become the head-master at Trinity College.

Mr. Nevins was succeeded by Mr. Shiva Rao. This unorthodox brahmin brought with him to the school an outlook of new depth and breadth. Although the concentration on studies continued to be there, a relaxed atmosphere prevailed in the school. In the school campus the students enjoyed breathing the fresh air and philosophy, and ardently discussing Indian National politics.

Mr. Shiva Rau moved out in 1913 to become the principal of the newly-founded sister school of Manipay Hindu College, and his cousin Mr. Sanjiva Rao took his place.

Before Mr. Sanjiva Rao could complete a year in office he was called to take over the principal-ship of Kayastha College, Allahabad, from Ramananda Chatterjee, the famous brother-in-law of Rabindranath Tagore. The brief year he spent at Hindu, however, was a glorious one for the school in that it went through a crowded programme of activities. He made such an impression on the students and teachers that they were inspired to emulate the lofty principles he held and dedication to work he displayed.

In July 1914 Mr. Nevins came back to his old school and office. He continued his good work until his retirement in 1926.

The students and the teachers, the old-boys and the Hindu public, were all very sad at the departure of the veteran teacher whom they had all learnt to love and respect. But there was one consolation. By the time he left he had made Hindu College the leading national institution in the North.

The management brought in Mr. W. A. Troupe to succeed Mr. Nevins. He was a young Scot, wedded to Hindu ideals of life. He started very well and much was expected of him. Unfortunately he could not get acclimatised to the local climate and left after a year in office.

While the management was scouring far and wide in search of a suitable head for the school the long-time vice principal, Mr. V. M. Sabaratnasinghe, held the fort with acceptance. The 'head' was eventually discovered in far off Madura. The lean and lanky brahmin, Mr. V. R. Venketaraman, came over and took charge of the school in 1928.

Mr. Venkat raman was a good administrator and a fine teacher. He continued the good work of his illustrious predecessors with distinction. He is especially remembered for his razor-sharp intellect. One could not pick up an arguement with him and go past him without being severely mauled.

When Mr. Venketaraman's contract of service was over in 1933, there was Mr. A. Cumaraswamy, an old boy of the school, ready to take charge of it. He had recently returned to the Island after having spent 3 years at the London University Institute of Education, imbibing the habits of educational thought from Prof. Spearman and Dr. Percy Nun.

Mr. Cumaraswamy held office for 20 years. During his time the school scaled dizzy heights in sports and studies and a variety of extramural activities. It may well be said that his regime is the golden era in the history of the Jaffna Hindu College.

For most of his period in office Sir Waitilingam Duraisamy was the manager of the school. Political patronage, therefore, was there for the mere asking. He, however, never availed of it.

For 11 long years of his period Dr. C. W. W. Kannangara was the Minister of Education. Dr. Kannangara had lot of sympathy for the ideals for which the Jaffna Hindu College was founded. He, therefore, kept a benign eye on the progress of the school.

Mr. Cumaraswamy's tenure of office will be remembered for three things;

Mr. Cumaraswamy persuaded the management to acquire lands adjoining the school for a play-ground. The new playground was declared open in 1938. Overnight the standard of sports and games in the school rose to such heights as to challenge all-comers. This lead the school continues to maintain even to this day.

In the thirties there was only one school, the Ramanathan College at Chunnakam, for Hindu girls in the entire peninsula. One such school in the Jaffna town area was a sore need. Mr. Cumaraswamy opened the gates of his school in 1935 to girls as well. Eyebrows were raised in certain orthodox quarters. He effectively silenced them. He said he was not advocating a sudden upheaval in Hindu society. "Did not Sakuntala meet Dushyantan in the forest hermitage of their sage guru?" he asked.

This act of the principal compelled the management to think seriously of establishing a girls' school close to the boys' school. The Hindu Ladies College started functioning in hired premises in 1943 and the girls at the Jaffna Hindu College left, some of them broken-hearted, to their new school and environment.

Towards the close of the thirties Mr. Cumaraswamy, with characteristic vision, made the study of Sinhala language compulsory in his school. Many other Hindu schools followed his example. Two generations of students fluent in the 3 Rs of Sinhala had left the portals of the school when this experiment, rich insocial potential was, sad to say, slaughtered on the altar of political expedience.

The revered principal died in office on 20th November 1952. His death was sadly mourned by students, past and present, and all others associated with the school. By the time he left this earthly life the Jaffna Hindu College had become a name to conjure with. The Hindus were proud of their darling school and everybody else, even the one time adversaries, had learnt to treat it with respect, tinged, perhaps, with a sense of envy.

The mantle of the lofty office of the principalship of the school now fell on Mr. Vijayam Asaipillai.

Vijayam, as he is affectionately called, had been Deputy to Mr. Cu maraswamy for over 15 years. He is a good scholar and had spent 3 years in U.K. on a Government scholarshsp. Soft-spoken and quietly efficient he was a highly respected principal. The school made further strides of progress during his stewardship. It was during his time the schools were taken over by the state. The Jaffna Hindu College did not reek or rattle under the stress and strain of the change in management. With Vijayam at the helm it carried on regardless.

In December 1962 Vijayam retired from service.

The head-ship of the school now devolved on four old-boys one after the other. Mr. C. Sabaratnam who had been associated with the school for over 50 years as student, teacher and vice - principal took over from Viajyam. He was followed by Mr. N. Sabaratnam, Mr.E. Sabalingam and Mr.P.S. Kumaraswamy, the present incumbent in office. For a few months after Mr. N. Sabaratnam retired Mr. M. Karthigesan, a veteran teacher on the school's staff, acted as principal.

The Jaffna Hindu College has now become a well-oiled system and is running smoothly and famously.

The present principal grew up in the shadow of the school. His boy-hood home is only a stone's throw from it. Under his devoted service the school is keeping up its pre-eminence and making efforts towards further excellence.

When one thinks of the Jaffna Hindu College a number of facts about it clamour for recognition, Way back in the twenties and thirties there used to be a large number of Sinhala students from the South, Tamils from the Hill Country and Muslims largely drawn from the local Muslim population, resident in the school hostels. They all lived in amity and profited by their stay in the school. There are no Sinhala students in the school. campus today as the school is essentially a Tamil medium school. But Tamil and Muslim students from various parts of the country are still found in the halls of residence of the school.

Judging by examination results the Jaffna Hindu College is streets ahead of the other Tamil medium schools in studies. In sports, games and athletics it is invariably at the top in the local competitions. Even at the all-island level its presence is always felt and respected. It has a wide range of extra-mural activities in all of which its boys are excelling.

Last year the school sent in a large contingent of 67 boys to the University, the largest for any school in the North, its soccer team emerged champions, its athletes secured the first place in the annual inter-school competition for the 5th year in succession, and its scouts annexed the Rotary Challenge Shield which has remained in the school since 1971. At the all-island level the school grabbed the much-coveted V. M. B. de Silva Challenge Cup for field events. Only the other day a boy from the school defeated in chess the international master - player Mr. Nikola Karaklaic.

In 1977 the school's science quiz team came first in the all-island competition and the basket ball under 19 'B' team became all-island champions.

Running one's mind back cursorily over the years one notes that twice in the fifties a boy from the school had topped the G. C, E. (O/L) pass list and won the Dr. Hewavitarane Memorialal Prize, in 1958 the school had the largest number of admissions to the Faculty of Engineering for any school in the Island, in 1961 and 1962 it topped the all-island list for admission to the Physical Science Course, twice in the sixties the first prize in the essay competition organised by the Chemical Society of Ceylon was awarded to a boy from it and in 1964 its scout troop was awarded the Island Merit Flag by the Governor-General.

The facts enumerated above do not in any way exhaust the list of achievements of the school. They only indicate the calibre of the teaching and training that is going on there.

It continues to inspire in the minds of its students the spirit of tolerance and understanding, and encourage freedom of thought, self-decipline and selfless devotion to public service.

May the Jaffna Hindu College go on for ever.

THE DANCE FORMS

The dances presented to you today are representative of three of the many dance traditions prevalent in India. The three dance traditions are the Bharata Natyam tradition, the Kuchipidi tradition, the Kathakali tradition.

The Bharata Natyam Tradition

Bharata Natyam is believed to be the oldest of all Indian and allied classical dance forms. The origins of the Bharata Natyam is shrouded in mystery and mythology According to Hindu mythology this dance form originated from Lord Shiva. The cosmic dance of Lord Shiva is supposed to represent the Bharata Natya tradition and a statue of Lord Shiva in this pose adorns all Bharata Natya dance stages. The concept of the cosmic dance and the philosophy behind it, however, have nothing to do with Bharata Natyam. One is hard put to explain the meaning and significance of the word Bharata in the name of this tradition. All sorts of untenable and ridiculously absurd explanations are replete in souveniers marking Bharata Natyam debuts. All that one could be certain of is that Bharata was the ancient name of India, India being called the Bharata continent. Perhaps this dance form was considered the national dance form of India, others being regional dance forms, or off shoots of the Bharata Natyam tradition.

Bharata Natyam falls into two principal divisions Nrtha are Nrtya. Nrtha is dancing pure and simple consisting of movements and poses devoid of dramatic contents. Nrtya is interpretative dance with every movement and gesture invested with meaning.

A third division called Natya is also sometimes included. Natya is a complete drama type representation in which music, dance, facial and other expressions and speech all blend as the artist's means of communication with the audience. Music is an indispensable accompaniment of Bharata Natyam. The musician sets the pattern and pace of the dance and the dancer interprets what the musician sings.

The Bharata Natyam was, at an early stage, in the custody of devadasis temple dancing girls who had delicated themselves to god through this medium. This noble tradition, was in the custody of these noble delicated and devoted women and was also called dasiattam. However after the 16th century when the Muslims completely overpowered the South India a serious degrading and debilitating set back to Hindu dance followed in the wake of this domination. Slowly the institution of devadasi fell into disrepute, and temple dancing girls became synonymous with prostitutes. In the latter half of the 19th century in Tanjore Chinniyah, Ponniah, Vadivelu and Shivanandam, four talented dancers who were brothers — popularly known as the Tanjore Quartet — revived the original purity of dasiattam by studying and following the ancient texts and temple friezes, with the missing links supplied by the socially spurned devadasis. Their popularised form of dasi attam came to be called Bharata Natyam

Bharata Natyam has now become perfectly respectable. In fact learning, and acquiring competence in, Bharata Natyam has become a coveted qualification among the elite.

r

During the last quarter of a century Bharata Natyam has attained world recognition as the most exquisite form of classical dance. Its aspirants go to Tamil Nadu to learn from gurus who still live in the villages. Because of its lasya character, performing artists have almost always been women. But their teachers have invariably been old men who chant the lines to tiny cymbals, controlling the complex rythm without dancing themselves.

The major 20th century performers associated with the Bharata Natyam School of dance are T. Balasaraswathi, especially known for her abhinaya (expressive interpretation) of padams; Rukmani Devi, who popularised Bharata Natyam among the upper classes in the 1930s; Yamini Krishnamurti; and Shanta Rao. Two of the most important gurus are Meenaksalsundaram Pillai, who injected vigour into Bharata Natyam by his choreography, and his son in law, Chockalingampillai.

The Kuchipudi tradition

This form of classical dance is widely prevalent in Andhra. It is essentially, a dance drama tradition and owes its name to the small village of Kuchchipudi (Kuchelapuram) in Andhra Pradesh. The form of the Kuchipudi dance dramas was originated in the 17th century by Sidhyendra Yogi, creator of the superb dance drama Bhama Kalapam, which is the story of charming Satyabhama, jeatous wife of Lord Krishna. Sidhyendra Yogi taught the art to Brahmin boys of Kuchchipudi and gave a performance with them in 1675 for the Nawab of Golconda, who was so taken up that he made an endowment of Kuchchipudi to the Brahmin Bhavathas for the preservation of this art.

The Kuchchipudi dance begins with worship rituals. That is why the first item in our programme today is Poorvarangam (Poojah dance) of the Kuchchipudi tradition. All roles were traditionally played by men, but now women have made a significant dent into it as you would see in the Kuchchipudi dance items this evening. All the four elements of abhinaya - dance song costume and psychological resourcesare used in this dance tradition.

Among the major Kuchipudi dancers of the 20th century are Guru Chinta Krishnamurthi, Vedantam Satyanarayana, and Yamini Krishnamurthi.

The Kathakali tradition

The Kathakali must have had its origin in the Kali Kuttu of the Tamils of yore, the Sangam period. Kathakali means Kali Kuthu depicting a story - Kathai. Its present form, however, originated in the 17th century in Kerala which was Tamil country upto well into medieval times. It was devised in its modern form by the Raja of Kottarakkara, who, angry over the refusal of a neighbouring prince to allow his dancers to perform a Sanskrit dance drama in his court, decided to create his own dance troupe using Malayalam which is an offshoot of Tamil and also the spoken language of the Kerala people. This school of dance has its own hastas, based on

regional texts influenced by the Natyasastra of Bharata and later treatises. It also has marked elements of energetic ritualistic dances. The make up has its roots in the grotesque Dravidian masks of the pre - Hindu period. Themes are taken mainly from the Ramayana, the Mahabharata, the Siva Purana, the Bhagavata Purana and other Hindu religious texts. The superhuman characters represent primal forces of good and evil at war. Traditionally, because of the terrifying vigour of the dance, men played all roles, but now Kathakali to is another male citadel which has been forced to open its doors wide for women.

The principal characters fall into seven typical classes: (1) the Pacca ("green") (2) Katti ("Knife") (3) Chokannatadi ("red beard") (4) Veluputadi ("white beard") (5) Karupputadi ("black beard") (6) Kari ("black") and (7) Minukku ("softly shaded")

Well known performers of Kathakali include Guru Chandu Panikkar, Guru Kunju Kurup, Ramunni Nair and Kalamandalam Krishna Nair. The dancers Guru Gopi Nath and Krishnan Kutty have both emphasized simplification of the use of towering headgear and thick-crusted, elaborate make up, so that the art may be more commonly understood.





The Late Professor

Somasundram Selvanayagam

University was till a teddler hecourse Jailina

It is barely six weeks since the demise of the late Professor Se'vanavagam. It is extremely difficult and even more painful for those who have had the good fortune to come into contact with him - and there are a legion -to get reconciled to the fact that Professor Selvanayagam, or Selva as he was affectionately called, is no more. He had a personality that was so charming, so throbbing with dynamic life and liveliness, a disposition that was warm. friendly and endearing, an appearance that was slim, prim and proper and youthful, a heart that was ever so generous and a genius that was amazing. Having had the blessing of being closely associated with such a man as a friend and college-mate for so many years one feels an unbearably painful wrench of heart when one has to prefix his name with the phrase "The late." The cruel, untimely, wanton demise of Selva is only another instance of the lifeless, dead, but omnipotent, nature that rolls on blind and indifferent to the likes and dislikes, weal and woe, benefits and detriments, of the impotent men and women who crawl helplessly on this insignificant planet in the insignificant solar system.

Born in 1932 in Pungudutivu, in Jaffna, Selva had his education at Jaffna Hindu College, our Alma Mater. Jaffna Hindu College, as always, had the intellectual and cultural atm sphere in which Selva's innate genius and talent could flower and get nourished; and humane and lively intellectuals to whom teaching and education far from being a profession and a means of earning their livelihood was a vocation and a mission. Selva always knew and had said on a quite a many occasion that he received his real education at Jaffna Hindu. He left Jaffna Hindu fully equipped to build up on his own the intellectual and cultural edifice that he turned out to be, to the eternal pride of his Alma Mater, his teachers, and college mates. After spending a couple of years at Zahira College, Colombo, Se'yanayagam entered the University of Ceylon. Peradeniya. He did the Geography Special Course and on obtaining the degree did a short stint at Official Language Department which gave some scope for his intellectual and linguistic talents of rare calibre. He soon returned to the University of Ceylon Peradeniya to teach.

While there he obtained his Master's and Doctoral degrees at the London School of Econamics. Sometime later, in 1974, Selvanayagam went to Nigeria to teach in a University there. It was when he was there that the Geography Chair at the Jaffna University was offered to him, He

grabbed the offer though the post had no pecuniary attraction and though the Jaffna University was still a toddler because Jaffna was always close to his heart. He did a yeoman service at the Jaffna University organising the Geography Department starting from scratch, so to say, contributing to the other Departments, and guiding the Hindu Students Union there. Like a brilliantly glowing meteor he flashed across the mid heavens of the Jaffna University, but unlike a meteor which sets without a glow, Selva had the brilliant glow right to the moment he went out of existence and his physical remains were cremated. Nay, the glow, the dazzling, brilliant glow, has outlived his existence; it is still there.

Professor Selvanayagam was very successful as a scholar and teacher. The legion of his students will bear testimony to this. The Peradeniya University was very sorry to lose him. The authorities of the Nigerian University, where he taught, his collegues and students would not let him out even to serve the University in the place closest to his heart, his own, native, Jaffna. Selva had a time of it extricating himself from the admiring, adoring and appreciative love and affection of the Nigerian University authorities, teachers and students. That one of the Nigerian students wanted to follow Professor Selvanayagam to Jaffna to do research under his guidance is a glowing tribute to the talents and achievements of Selva as a teacher of Geography.

Professor Selvanayagam was a specialist in the Geography of Agriculture and Land use. Selvanayagam's Master's dissertation was on the pittern of land use in the Jaffna District and the Doctoral dissertation was on Dry Zone Agriculture. His devotion to and delight in the research into Agriculture stems from his love of rural studies. His interest in peasant life, peasant agriculture, and in fact, all peasant activities, was such that he carved out a division for Rural Studies in his young Department of Geography at the Jaffna University, It is a tragedy that this county with a preponderating peasant sector should lose a scholar just as he had bloomed in full.

Selvanayagam was a Jaffna man to the core. He was devoted to Jaffna and Jaffna culture with an almost fanatic fervour. He was steeped to the neck, and even above, in Jaffna culture. His versatality in Tamil Language and Literature, his devotion to the Saiva religion philosophy and culture took roots in and got nutured by the Jaffna cultural environment, particularly the bedrock and monument of Jaffna Tamil Saiva Culture, our Alma Mater, the Jaffna Hindu College. His love of Jaffna is evident in the fact that the subject of his first research was land use in Jaffna District. His accepting the Jaffna Geography Chair, foresaking a more lucrative post in Nigeria too was motivated by his longing to serve Jaffna. His devotion to Jaffna and Jaffna Tamil Culture in no way detracted from the broad outlook and vision essential to an intellectual scholar. For, is it not true that a broad world outlook and catholicity and flexibility are the guiding and motivating force of Tamil culture as is evidenced in the Purananuru of the Sangam period thus:

"Our home is everhywhere, and our friend every one"...

It would not be out of place to mention in the Souvenier brought out by the Jaffna Hindu College Old Boys about Selva's very strong and abiding connections with the Jaffna Hindu College. These have already been alluded to. Jaffna Hindu not only had teachers who were versatile and competent in Tamil, English, Hinduism, Mathematics and Humanities, among other fields, but also had a full compliment of those who had a cross disciplinary or inter disciplinary intellectual versatiily and scholarship. Selvanayagam carried and continued this tradition; he was an authority alike in Geography as in Tamil Language, Literature and Culture and Saiva and Hindu Culture, Civilisation and Philosophy. This might sound and look queer and difficult to those who are used to intellectual enclaves, never to those who have been nurtured in and used to an intellectual and cultural atmosphere as has prevailed in and permeated the Jaffna Hindu .Jus: a month or so before his untimely and unwarranted demise he with his charming personality and beaming smile adorned the Jaffna Hindu College Old Boys Association Annual General Meeting, got elected as one of our eminent and distinguished Vice Presidents, and had lunch with us in the college hostel dinning hall. When the task of guiding and fostering the Jaffna University Hindu Students Union fell on his willing and robust shoulders he sought guidance, advice and assistance from his teachers at the Jaffna Hindu. To us fellow old boys of Jaffna Hindu the wanton killing of Selva by the cruel and lifeless nature of things is a tormenting agonising thrust into the heart of being as it is infinitely more so to his dearly beloved wife Dayanithy.

Yes, Selva and Dayanithy were an ideal couple. Bonded together by a unity. nay, identity, of purport and feeling, they went through the thick and thin of life, through fair weather and foul, up the rocks and down the depths, always a shinning example of what a family, what a couple, should be, always jointly beaming with a charming smile. It will always and forever be the lasting torment of Dayanithy that Selva did not live to see the bloom and feel the fragrance of the achievements of their children whose fragrance, potential fuitfulness and charm as buds he was gloating in. To these tender children the loss of their father is an irreparable one. To Dayanithy however, the demise of her everything, into which she fused two decades back, means the annihilation of all sense and meaning of life. Nobody can console her. Nobody can share her bereavement with her. Just as Selva, the gentle, but stead fast and sincere lover, the adoring and protective husband, the hero of achivements was hers exclusively so is this cruel and unspeakably tragic bereavement. May the strength of her love for Selva and children give her the capacity to find solace in the fact that all this Selva was hers, that his children are hers, and that they are with her to look after and be looked after.


