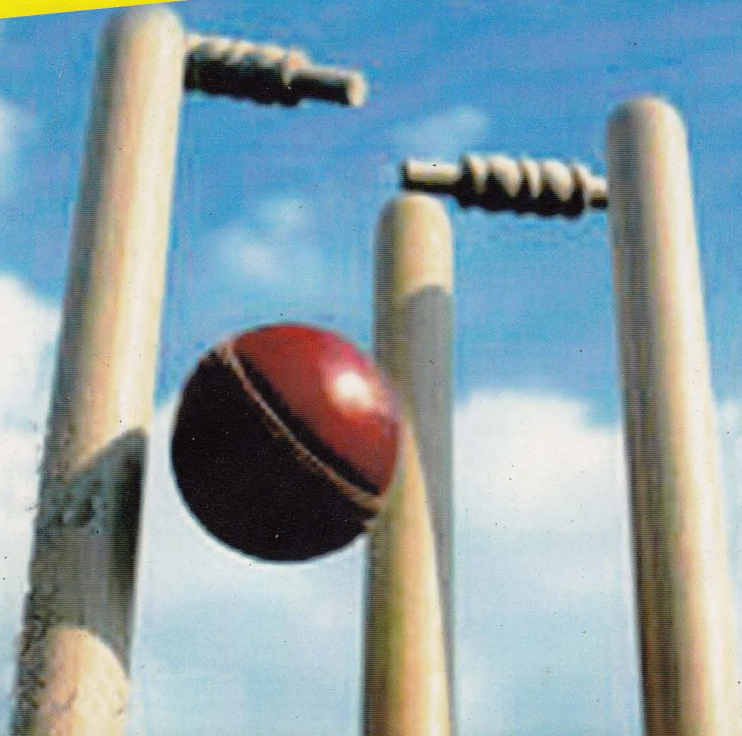

In bowling his tantalizing "off cutters" his excellent "fielding" in any position remain "a fresh" in my mind even after nearly forty-five long years.

The huge crowd at matches always enjoyed every moment of Nada's sterling performances. His were "thrillers". He crowned his alma-mater-J/Hartley College, the University and the Bank with many glorious victories at different times.

I hasten to mention a few outstanding performances of Nada in his full career and permit you to go through the rest about this "Wonder Boy" of North in these extracts.

# HARTLEY TROUNCE KOKUVIL HINDU COLLEGE

*Sunday Times* 23-02-1964

*POINT PEDRO, SATURDAY*

**NADARAJASUNDARAM**, the Hartley vice - **Captain** scored a dazzling 159 runs and helped his side to beat Kokuvil Hindu College by an innings and 167 runs. Sivagurunathan the Hartley leg spinner had a match bag of 12 wickets for 19 runs.

This match played at Pt. Pedro over the week-end was witnessed by a large crowd, Hartley who had first lease of the wicket, lost their first three wickets for 54 runs but then a partnership of 174 runs between Nadarajasundarama and Sathananthan helped them total 298.

**Nadarajasundaram** scored his century in 87 minutes and reached the 150 in 114 minutes. His score included 30 fours and a mighty six. **Sathananthan** scored a patient 57.

Kokuvil Hindu scored 62 in the 1<sup>st</sup> innings 64 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> inngs. Sivagurunathan the Hartley leg spinner was the cause of this debacle. Thangarajah alone offered some resistance and scored a Patient 38 runs. The following were the scores:

M. Nadarajasundaram, the Hartley all-rounder, by scoring 159 runs became the top schoolboy scorer this season. Sivagurunathan, his teammate, a leg spin bowler, claimed a match bag of 12 wickets for 19 runs in tops the schools' bowling averages.

Hartley met Kokuvil Hindu on their home grounds and trounced them by an innings and 167 runs. Kokuvil Hindu were able to collect 62 and 64 runs in both their innings. Thangarajah, however, batted well to score 38 runs.

## HARTLEY STAR IN SPANKING FORM

*Daily Mirror, Thursday, March 5<sup>th</sup> 1964.*

Hartley College ground was the venue of the biggest draw where St. Johns Jaffna and Hartley College, Two of the Schools strongest teams met at cricket. A Future of the drawn game was tall scoring by **both sides a total of 764 runs** were for the lost 30 wickets.

**Nadarajasundaram, Hartley's Prolific scorer**, playing a gem of an innings, **scored 120 runs in the 1<sup>st</sup> innings and cracked 71 in 35 minutes in the 2<sup>nd</sup> innings. Nadarajasundaram becomes the first schoolboy cricketer to score 500 runs this session. His aggregate in the innings he played is 515.** He has 2 centuries of his credit a score of 95, 71 and 46. He also becomes the **first schoolboy cricketer to take 4 wickets in for consecutive balls also 5 wickets without conceding a single.**
