The responsibility in this respect has become unduly great in modern times as the life of a nation in the current context is almost a labyrinth, a complicated structure requiring proper guidance for survival. The intricacy of life has been made worse confounded by the illogical development of political thinking. The ordinary man is being constantly told that the 'leaders' are thinking all the twenty-four hours to find a way out for him of the maze in which he has found himself.

What then are the chances of the people to find their way through to redress? What is it that has caused this colossal confusion, this complex network of cross roads of political ideals? And what is amazing is that the bewilderment is not confined only to a few countries. It has become a universal ulcer, an open sore with the dangerous secretion of the pus of violence. Ulcerated as the political world is, how can the common man hope for correct guidance unless some laudable leader of the calibre of noble Gandhiji diagnostically deal with the disease?

Let the leaders of political movements take lessons from the Gandhian campaigns and learn to be fully religious in their activities.

Urgent action is required from the public.

Let us earnestly and unremittingly pray that religious dignitaries, and institutions, the Clergy of all denominations, the National State Assembly, His Excellency the President, the Government, including the Armed Forces and the Police, the Parliamentary Opposition, all Political parties, the Press, the Courts of Justice, the Legal Profession, the Educational Authorities, Social, Cultural, and other Organizations without any exception and the student population and all individuals, jointly and severally, in all parts of the country be plesssd to take immediate steps to arrest the growing evil and retrieve the position. Huge buildings, big Development Schemes, progress in Industry, Commerce, Agriculture, and in every sphere of human activity, mere preaching of religious dogmas, and high metaphysics, mechanical performances of elaborate religious ceremonies, international recognition and friendships, and Foreign Aid, will be of no avail ultimately if this Great Evil is not checked.
