The sudden awakening of the colonial nations, and their desire to gain. immediate and unrestricted freedom, is rooted in the following reason: the sub-conscious belief of the masses (often illiterate and uninformed) that only a violent overthrow of the present regimes can improve the existing economic and political conditions

On the other hand, the resistence to these tendencies, offered by the colonial powers, seems to come out of a fear that their current political and economic challenger the Union, might achieve its strategical goal of dominating the world too easily, and by a drive assentially non military in its nature.
