## Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba and Yoga Nidra

(By Dr. T. NALLAINATHAN)

Sri Rama Krishna is the first great teacher who explains to us the mystery of the common Hindu tradition that a man who dies in Kasi attains Mukti, when this Paramahansa visited Kasi and saw the funeral pyres he described the vision he had thus "I saw a tall white person with tawny matted hair walking with solemn steps to each pyre in the burning ghat raising carefully every Jiva and imparting into his ear the mantra of supreme Brahman, while sitting on the pyre on the other side of the jiva the all powerful universal Mother Mahakali, the great Kali, untying all knots of bondage, gross, subtle and causal of the jiva produced by past impressions and sending him to the indivisible sphere by opening with Her own Hands the door to liberation..... Thus did he fulfil the perfection of the jiva's life. Sri Ramakrishna's vision of Kasi as a spiritual Haven built in gold and not in brick or stone was so overpowering that in the early part of his stay in Kasi he refused to answer nature's call in that kshetra. He would cross the Ganges by boat to the other side for that purpose. This is an important item in the avatar's life, by day and by night, viz to give liberation to the departing souls. Sri Ramakrishna has described for us all that is invisibly done when an avatar gives holy ash or Ganges water to a dying devotee. When this sacrament is given at night does the Avatar sleep? Is it yoga-nidra or an avatar's nidra? Swamy Yogar told the writer that he normally refreshed himself with six or seven hours of sleep. He was one who could get into Nirvikalpa Samadhi at will but not bring down God-consciousness to the physical

plane at will. His sleep was Yoga-nidra; he was presumably enjoying the consciousness of the Anandamaya kosha all the hours of his sleep. Sri Ramakrishna slept for some three hours only; we learn that Buddha had the same 3 hours of sleep. Bhagavan Sri Sathya never sleeps. The body has perfect rest whenever he goes out on his extra-corporeal missions which is common both by day and night. He is the Lord and Master not only of the Anandamayakosha but of all the five koshas and the corresponding five planes.

Sri Ramakrishna tells us that only one who has given up 'woman and gold' has the capability to recognise an avatar. If we remember the volume of work these avatars do after their Mahasamadhi we are obliged to take our folded hands in adoration over our heads. The following is an actual incident that took place in the life of a Tamil in Delhi. He was a musician by vocation. He was one day going on his bicycle from New Delhi to Delhi, wondering if Sathya Sai is an incarnation of Sai Baba of Shirdi. Suddenly an old gentleman, who was following on a bicycle, accosted him in Tamil and wanted to have a word with him. They both went to an adjoining dilapidated building, left their bicycles leaning against a wall and sat down for the talk. The old man without discussing advised him not to doubt and shewed both his palms in one of which was painted a beautiful picture of Shirdi Sai Baba and on the other Sathya Sai Baba. He added they are both the same, and that he should stick fast to the lucky piece of Karma which

## Sir Kandiah Vaithianathan A Great Sivathondan

The death of Sir Kandiah Vaithianathan has been a shock to many of his friends and relations as he appeared to be fit and healthy though slim of body like his father the late Kandiah Udayar of Kopay. It is only a few weeks back that the writer met him in the train when he was travelling to Vavuniya from Jaffna. He was on his way to Thiruketheswaram where his services to the Hindu Community cannot be praised too much. Apart from spending his time, money and energy in the restoration of this ancient temple he was engaged in organising a Gurukula, where children from priestly houses were being educated in Vedic and Agamic literature with the necessary practical training for their priestly calling. In these days when religion and priesthood are not honoured by even educated Hindus it was a genuine attempt of Sir Kandiah to supply a want created by political considerations that prevent priests and pundits coming to Ceylon and Ceylonese being prevented from going to India for religious education. From the difficulties that this noble Knight had to contend with, it was clear that the Hindus of Ceylon were going down in every way. His enthusiasm for work roused the anger of the ill wishers of Hinduism who adopted every means possible to thwart his noble work done at great sacrifice. People in authority abused their power in obstructing his work but undaunted he carried on his work. His ambition to restore the sacred shrine of Thiruketheswaram was only partly fulfilled as a good bit of work still remains unfinished. Even now sthapathis are at work in the new temple building for which a vast sum of money is required. He

In spite of these attitudes it is my considered opinion that no society worth the name can do without lawyers whose principle role is Service—Service to his fellow man. He stands for the redress of wrongs and the conservation and preservation of public interests from the ravishing inroad of the enemies of orderly and good government. Whatever the race, creed or colour lawyers have, one major point in common which transcends any of their differences is a belief in law and its institutions as the most effective and just means of achieving political order. Lawyers recognise conflict as being part of human behaviour. We realise that our task is not to remove conflict but to limit and control it. It therefore behoves all those who have chosen

to be practising lawyers to maintain a high ethical standard and discipline because the legal profession is a noble and high calling which demands the best in many diversity of talents and such tireless energy in fitting the mind and body for so great a task. And here I must pay tribute to the Bar Council of Ceylon for its impressive record of achievements in maintaining standards which are of the most and almost seeming to cover the world over. This is something that all members of the Ceylon Bar Council should be proud of for it is so deserving.

A great writer warned that words are like leaves and where they most abound much sense of fruit beneath is rarely found. I shall therefore say no more but to thank the Bar Council for this great honour done to us tonight an experience which will never be effaced from my mind. Our thanks go to you the Bar Council for the able way you have proposed our toast and to you gentlemen for the kindly way you have received us. I want publicly to express our thanks to the Honourable the Acting Chief Justice and the Minister of Justice for all their courtesies.

### HIDDEN HAND

In the long history of war, there has never been any instance of a more treacherous aggression than the present invasion of Kashmir by Pakistan. Hitler and Mussolini certainly enjoyed a notoriety for unwarranted attacks on neighbouring nations but even their dastardliness had faded into insignificance before the atrociousness of Ayub-Khan. Several major events of international obligations have happened since the conclusion of World War II. And no sane statesman would have become so furiously foolish as to precipitate a third world war on issues that are well within the capacity of United Nations to be adjusted. It cannot be denied that the tension between India and Pakistan on the border-dispute in Kashmir has been taking a serious turn not because the nations concerned has lost control of the situation but because the consuming fire of Communist interference has spread across the borders of the mighty sub-continent of India. The Colossus of Communist China under the rulership of morally corrupt politicians wants to stride across the wide world wantonly hoping to have the entire human race in its claws. And the inevitable result is the turmoil in Malaysia, Viet Nam and several other countries. Communist China's challenge to humanity has been exposed. The hidden hand beyond the Himalayas has been seen by the whole world.

The present outrage on justice and peace by Pakistan is really a contention between Communist China with its camp followers and the rest of the world including

Russia whatever the political ideology of the latter may be. This wicked war must be fought out by the forces of freedom and fairplay. Thuggery at the international level must be eliminated for all time and humanity saved from evil.

That the mother-land of Mahatma Gandhi, the foremost martyr for the cause of communal harmony, the apostle of non-violence and the true example of purity in politics should be unwillingly converted into a battle-field where the evil forces of communalism, violence and untruthfulness have to be fought is certainly a cruel irony of fate. But Indian culture has been built on the happenings and results of the wars of Ramayana and MahaBharatha in different Yugas. The Indian people with supreme confidence in the spiritual heritage of the past will go all out to vanquish the vicious forces of evil that form the corrupt combination that is communism cum communalism and once again show to the wide world that the influence of the valiant victors of Ramayana and Maha Bharatha and latterly of Satyagraha is still guiding the destinies of Bharata.

# MR. S. ADCHALINGAM PASSES AWAY

## OUR FORMER MANAGER AND TREASURER J. H. C.

It is with deep regret that we record the death of Mr. S. Adchalingam on Tuesday the 7th inst. at his residence in the North Car Street of Nallur Temple at the ripe old age of 88.

Mr. Adchalingam had his school career at Jaffna College Vaddukkoddai and after a short spell as a Teacher in Alaveddy, he followed the trail of all enterprising youths of the age and went to Malaya where he joined the railway Clerical Service and rose to the post of Chief Clerk of the General Manager's Office there. He was one of the founder members of the Vivekananda Ashrama and took a prominent part in all social and religious activities. He had a flair for journalism and contributed many learned articles under the non-de-plume Nachiketa to various papers in Malaya and Ceylon.

He returned from service in his late forties and returned to Jaffna to engage himself in an active life as a farmer. Sir Waitialingam Duraisamy and his friends who knew him in Malaya induced him to participate in social work in Jaffna and he held the post of Treasurer, Hindu College Board of Directors when he worked hard and secured the present spacious playground for the College. He functioned with great acceptance as the Manager of the Saiva Prakasa Press and Hindu Organ for over a period of ten years. When the Hindu Board of Education wanted a Manager his services were secured by them and he helped Mr. S. Rajaretnam to build up the Schools of the Board on firm foundations. Age and illnesses that follow, made him retire from social activities and he spent the last few years of his life under the shadow of the Nallur Temple meeting his friends and resting on the conviction of a life nobly spent.

He leaves behind three sons and four daughters all of whom are well settled in life. The eldest son Mr. Janakan, Immigration Officer in Jaffna and his two brothers performed the last rites at the Chemmani Crematorium attended by a host of relatives and friends. The Saiva Paripalana Sabha

and the Hindu Organ extend to his children their deep sympathy on their bereavement. Mr. Adchalingam would long be remembered for his infectious spirit of service and keen sense of humour. May his soul rest in the Abode of Iswara.
