Gandhiji Centenary Memorial Articles

The following inspiring passage occurs in the course of an eloquent speech made by Sir D. B. Jayatilake (then Mr. D. B. Jayatilleke) at the welcome to a distinguished band of Indian patriots headed by Maulana Shaikat Ali, the famous Indian Muslim leader and Mahatma Gandhi's colleague:—

"We have on this occasion the privilege of welcoming Maulana Shaikat Ali, Dr. Kithlew, Sayad Mohamed and Maulana Akhtar Ali.....In them we salute the great Indian nation, which is being reborn today...It is impossible for us not to think of Mahatma Gandhi, the incarnation of the tribulation of India, I say, the triumph of India tomorrow, whose career exemplifies for us that spirit of self-sacrifice which reached its culmination twenty five centuries ago in India in one of India's greatest sons Lord Buddha..... We welcome them today not as representatives of the Islamic section of India but of all India. India is a sacred name sacred to all of us, irrespective of race and creed. It is our second mother-land. Our religion, our languages, and arts and sciences and all these things and many others beside we owe to India. She has been our teacher for centuries and even in regard to political matters we are following in the wake of India. It is the example of India that inspired us in our activities, whatever they may be in that direction....."

This speech was delivered at a reception held on 9th January 1924 at the Public Hall, Colombo and organised by the Ceylon National Con-

gress, and held in honour of the Venerable Biamman Shaiba, the noble mother of the noble Ali Brothers, Maulana Shaikat Ali and others. It will be included as one of the items in the appendix to these series of articles. It is reported in the Handbook of the Ceylon Na-

and feeble a manner try to emphasise certain salient features in the immortal contribution made by Gandhiji towards the welfare of the entire human race—nay all living beings.

In endeavouring to achieve or implement these objective, reference will naturally be made because they have to be made, to the background upon which Gandhiji worked, the foundations laid by past leaders (his predecessors), the labours of his colleagues, and the services of those who followed after his leaving us and joining the angels in Heaven. "TWO DEATHS"

Sir,—The world has lost in a matter of few days two remarkable Americans viz. Dr. Helen Keller and Senator Robert Kennedy (brother of late President Kennedy). The former was a woman handicapped by many physical handicaps like blindness and loss of speech and deafness but overcame them to inspire and give hope of seeing life and enjoying it as normal humans do to millions the world over. She passed away in natural fashion at the ripe old age of 88 while Robert Kennedy while progressing happily on the route to a Presidential nomination fell a victim to an assassin's bullet and thus joined the select band of American greats like his brother J. K. and earlier presidents like Lincoln who went all out to serve the nation only to end up as corpses in Arlington cemetery. Robert Kennedy may not be considered by many to be great enough to be considered to be in the same category as his brother J. K. or Lincoln but it has to be conceded that had he lived longer he would have done plenty for effective practical operation through White House) of world peace and Social Democracy in America, two tasks to which his brother was also dedicated, adding his personal touch to these tasks, (assuming that he would have adorned the Presidential Chair had he lived). What John Kennedy and Robert Kennedy left incomplete must be undertaken and taken further after making due allowances for changed circumstances by their numerous admirers (both American and non-American, under the guidance direct or indirect of influential Americans like President Johnson (soon to retire) and also men like Bertrand Russell, Rajaji and Dr. S. Radhakrishnan (of India), and their efforts must be backed by prayers. What Helen Keller did should

be continued for ever as long as Humans and the rest of creation need aid in the manner sought by her and from her and we in Ceylon must take steps to perpetuate her memory and refresh our capacity to help the blind and others like them (and birds and animals as well) and make effort to encourage our children to do likewise and also make efforts to join and co-operate decently in all activities connected with collective human problems like cure and rehabilitation of the physically handicapped and etc. and learn to evaluate the true worth of those engaged in such tasks and the talents potential of the progressing sick. We must not waste time regretting the fact that she is no longer alive in our midst but must not forget to think and pay tribute to her memory whenever and wherever opportunities for doing so present themselves and fix in the minds of children (as good teachers do in the classroom) the idea that her career and achievements entitle her to great respect and emulation by them (overlooking the fact that she was physically handicapped; as for Robert Kennedy he had the satisfaction of knowing and feeling proud of the fact that the Kennedy family had become an American institution (unique in several respects) in the course of his lifetime itself and we Ceylonese need not grudge to admit that through magazine illustrations film news reels, personal contact etc. that thousands of families in this lovely Island have also been influenced in regard to living patterns etc. (indirectly) by the Kennedys and other American families) Helen was aware of the esteem in which she was held by her millions of admirers but she rarely or never made use of the fact to foster her personal vanity but in

MALARIA MENACE

Reports from authoritative sources estimate that one tenth of the population of this Island is subject to sustained attacks of Malarial Fever and describe the situation as very menacing. The common man has become the convenient target of all onslaughts—lawlessness, corrupt practice and other criminal tendencies. The high cost of living has made him emaciated. And in this condition he has to meet the resurgence of an old enemy, the Malaria Mosquito. And yet the administrative authorities do not seem to have been moved to prompt action to save the country from a threatening epidemic.

Kataragama has been mentioned as a highly infected area. This ancient Temple where thousands of devotees congregate daily must be made safe for worshippers even if it be that the entire resources of the Medical Department have to be marshalled for direct action. The High Festivals of this sylvan shrine will begin a month hence and milling crowds of pilgrims will assemble there undaunted by any threat of disease or drought or deluge. Full faith in the power of prayer is the basis of this annual Assembly. The medical authorities are, therefore, charged with the great responsibility of meeting the attack of malaria and making the sacred area immune to diseases of any kind. The sacred waters of the slow moving Menik Ganga must be kept clean and pure to enable the mass of humanity assembling there use the stream to their hearts' content. The annual Health week is about to be celebrated. These yearly demonstrations usually pass for a pastime in which officials, officers and others parti-

pate as a matter of recreation. The country has become unhealthy and Health Weeks if they should be celebrated must be of some significance relevant to the realities of life. The Health Week of this year must necessarily become a Malaria Prevention Week and all forces must be galvanized together to eradicate this vicious disease.

SEKKLAR FESTIVAL AND PERIA-PURANAM

The third Sekklar Festival has come and gone. Sekklar festivals have brought about a little awakening in the minds of some. The portrait of Sekklar was taken in procession to the venue of the festival on June 1st. It was a very impressive sight which will live green in the memory of all who had the opportunity to witness it. The sacred hymns and devotional songs chanted by devotees gave a holy atmosphere. It reminded us of the past story of Sekklar who was mounted on an elephant and taken in procession round the sacred streets of celestial Chidambaram. The colourful scene must live green in the minds of all Saivaites and must permeate the minds of us all. The experience we had during the Sekklar festivals must permeate our minds and find expression in our lives in thought, word and deed and purify our lives and broaden our outlook of life. We must become votaries of Saiva lore and persons of devotion, piety, enlightenment, honesty, integrity, generosity and humility. The first and foremost effect of the Sekklar festival must be a genuine, awakening in the minds of all to study Peria-Puranam in verse or prose and enjoy the elegance of its divine literature. I wonder how many persons have in their library Peria-Puranam or have brought copies of the book after the first Sekklar festival. It is very difficult for one to understand the verse part of the book without the help of a person who has studied it well. Study circles may be started in all villages or Peria-Purana-Padanam (பெரியபுராணபடனம்) may be organised in temples in all villages. I know of villages where Peria-Purana Padanam has been going on for more than three decades long before the Sekklar Mantram was started. In this connection we must praise the Siva-Thondan circle for having organised lectures on Peria-Puranam, now and then, in different villages.

Purana Padanam will not be possible in all places, because sufficient number of persons well-versed in the Puranam are necessary for carrying on this soul-stirring pro-

gramme. But every Saivite can own the prose book (பெரியபுராணவசனம்) which is the master-piece of Aramuga Navalar. The stories may be read conveniently in the nights when all inmates of the house can gather round and listen to the divine stories read by a member of the family. Ten or fifteen minutes may be devoted for the reading. By doing this there will be a holy atmosphere made to prevail in the home. This will be profitable not only to the elders but also to the young who will grow up to be persons of mental stability and solace. Every school should take up this solemn work of propagating this Puranic lore among the children. One or two teachers in a school may narrate the stories in weekly assemblies or prayer meetings. Peria-Puranam is a treasure-house of Saiva learning and culture. It depicts the lives of Saints who lived a life of devotion, dedicated to a cause and inspiration and inner illumination. Reading of this illustrious book of integration will enlighten a person on various topics which will equip a person to live a life of duty, piety, dedication, resignation, in the midst of this modern mundane world which is torn by jealousies, unrest, turmoil, discontentment and cut throat competition. Besides reading Peria-Puranam every Saivite should possess the Thevarams sung by the three saints (Appar, Sambanthar and Suntharar) and Thiru-Vasagam by Manivasagar. The inmates should chant these devotional songs which are full of meaning, rhythm and music. Every stanza is a mantra. These mantras will elevate a person to heavenly regions of perennial happiness. Chanting of these devotional songs will do a world of good as mental solace, good health, the strengthening of the nerves, purification of the senses, concentration and determination of mind. A glaring feature in this year's Sekklar festival was the distribution of prizes to those children who got places in a written contest on a portion of Peria-Puranam and Sekklar Puranam. This is a praiseworthy way of
