



# **Principal's Report**

Our Chief Guest today, Professor Mendis, our Lord Bishop the Rt.Rev.Dr.Jebanesan, the chairman of the Board of Directors Mr.Gnanathasan. Members of the Board of Directors, Parents, Alumni, friends, members of the faculty and dear students.

We, at Jaffna College welcome you all most cordially to our Prize - giving this morning. This being my first function as principal your presence here is a great encouragement to me and the college community. I do hope very much that you would welcome this time of fellowship with us.

Professor Mendis, we extend a very special word of welcome. You are a most brilliant product of our country and you continue to shed your influence in the highest academic circles here in Sri Lanka and abroad. You are a don of distinction in the field studies and its higher education.

Professor Mendis was elected the Dean, Faculty of Dental Science of the University of Peredeniya in 1999. He graduated with a first class Honours from the Dental School, University of Peredeniya in 1967, obtaining distinctions in both Dental Sugery I and II. He joined the academic staff of the University of Peredeniya in 1968 and has been in continuous service in the University of Peredeniya from that time till March 2001. He did his Postgraduate Studies in the United Kingdom and obtained FDSRCS England & Edinburgh in 1972 and 1973 respectively and FEDRCS(I) in 1974 and was awarded the Ph.D.degree by the University of Bristol in 1977.

Having returned to Sri Lanka in 1977, he developed the discipline of Oral Pathology in Sri Lanka, training technicians and developing an effective island wide biopsy service and an Oral Pathology museum. The General Dental Practitioners from all parts of Sri Lanka were helped by this biopsy service. He supervised the first Ph.D.that the Faculty of dental Science awarded in 1991. Over the years he has supervised and completed five M.Phil. research dissertations. He has published several papers in both international & local journals. He won the Kandy Society of Medicine Prize for research on two different occasions. He has delivered lectures in more than 12 different countries and is the author of the Faculty of Dental Sciences Jubilee Research Directory and also the co-author of a text book 'Modern Medicine in Dentistry". He has jointly edited the University of Peredeniya Annual Research Sessions Monograph continually from 1996 - 1999. He also co-edited the 1998 and 1999 Research Monograph published in 2000.

He won an open Commonwealth Medical Fellowship in 1988/89 awarded by the Association of the Commonwealth Universities of Great Britain. He won the T.C. White fellowship in 1989 by the T.C. White Bequest Trust of the Royal College of Physicians and

Surgeons of Glasgow, Scotland. He was also appointed Visiting Professor for one year in the Division of Oral Pathology, Department of Pathology, Dental School, North western University of Chicago, Illinois, in 1993. During this period he attended by invitation and contributed to the 2nd World Workshop in Oral Medicine held in Chicago, Illinois, USA.

He is a member of the American Academy of Oral Pathology, British Society of Oral Pathology, International Association of Oral Pathology and also an Associate of the Royal College of Pathologists, London, UK. He was President of the College of Dentistry and Stomatology of Sri Lanka from 1995-1997. He has also contributed to the development of postgraduate Dental Education in Sri Lanka and had successfully arranged many undergraduate and postgraduate Dental Seminars over the years. For General Dental Practitioners Prof. Mendis had arranged Lectures, Seminars & Presentations regularly from 1997 to the present time. He has always shared his knowledge & experience with the General Dental Practitioners. He has taken part in very many annual Scientific Sessions of the College of General Dental Practices of Sri Lanka.

Prof.Mendis was appointed chairman of the University Grants Commission in 2001 and is currently involved in further developing Higher education in Sri Lanka. In this context in 2001, he has visited almost all countries around the Globe.

The UGC during the past eighteen months addressed issues relating to implementation of Higher Education reforms. A new IT faculty was opened at the University of Moratuwa. Presently the UGC is working on the theme 'Production of Employable Graduates". More recently he annalysed the progress of Higher Education Reforms and the progress made by all University and presented same before HE the President in August this year.

In June 2001, Professor Mendis was awarded the president's Research Bonus 1999, for publications figuring in the Science Citation Index of 1999, with a cumulative index for 1999 of 0.666.

He is an old boy of St.Joseph's College, Colombo and is married with three children. His wife, Profrssor Shanthi Mendis is presently the Chief of Cardiovascular Disease Research at the World Health Organization (WHO), Geneva, Switzerland.

We are indeed very sorry that Mrs.Mendis is unable to be present with us today. But we understand her commitments as a very busy person in the W.H.O. is taking her away from the country at this time, and Sir, please take with you our greetings to her.

Once again we welcome you Sir, today in a very special way to our most important function with much pleasure.

Mrs.Eva Boniface grew up in the College campus from her early days as the niece of the first national Principal K.A.Selliah and fully participated in everything that was available to girls during her time - sports, specially net - ball, girl guides, choirs, literary associations and was one of those who made - co - education in Jaffna College colourful and successful. She

was a very popular and successful teacher of biological sciences and made a very good contribution to the extra - curricular and social life of the college. She was also a keen member of the Student Christian Movement locally and nationally. On leaving college has always been a very loyal member of the alumni association of the Colombo branch. I am happy that you have consented to second the vote of thanks at this function. We have great pleasure in welcoming you to your alma mater and I am sure you will have a pleasant day with us.

### A New Challenge:

We stand today on the brink of a new era in education. Certain vital aspects of education are yet to be successfully developed. Schools are intended to provide education to suit the different abilities of children. This type of education is now being implemented through the School Based Assessment (SBA) programme. We do hope all these efforts and attempts will pave way to guide us teachers, and the parents to further the children's education most suited to their aptitudes and ability.

We have to orient our present system of education towards a very high and general level of education. Firstly, academic qualification are essential to develop or learn the skills to be a good citizen, but you need job oriented training as well to get yourself prepared to complete the work created by the present challenges. At present widely talked about challenges are globalization, transformation of Industrial economics and transformation of the enterprise. Globalization involves management and control in global market places, competition in world markets, global work group and global delivery systems. We should provide opportunities to our students to get to this standard by exposing them more and more into the field of information Technology.

Secondly, transformation of Industrial Economics demands knowledge and information based economics, productivity of new products and services, leadership and time - based competitions. Universities should, to a certain extent changes its curriculum in such a way to suit the demands spelled out and produce more productive graduates. To do this I propose to reintroduce viva method, select the best suited students without getting students who are spoon fed by the tutories which make education an excellent avenue for living. I also include here English education as one of the avenues in which we could achieve this target. I am not here to tell that suya basha / mother tongue learning is not good. In my opinion mother tongue education is the best for any student, but to meet the challenges of information or knowledge based economy we need to have English medium education to widen our scope. Therefore, English medium classes should be the main emphasis at schools today. It is our duty to see that we foster a desirable attitude towards English, and this coupled with insightful and improved methods of teaching will result in a great improvement in the standard of English among our children.

Thirdly, transformation of the enterprise gears to decentralization, flexibility, location, independence, empowerment and collaborative work and team work. Here the importance of sports plays a major role to develop these skills and also your commitment to God and loyalty to your own college. We should achieve these qualities through the field of sports.

Sports and games are important also to develop both body and mind.

More activities through literary association and clubs will enable the children to have excellent opportunities to practice all the above skills.

A student of Jaffna College should be mighty in spirit
A student of Jaffna College should possess an outstanding character
A student of Jaffna College should be a lover of learning
A student of Jaffna College should be a dynamic in sports

To achieve these goals we at Jaffna College will invest all our energy.

To educate as many as we can To educate as well as we can To educate as broadly as we can To educate as high as we can.

Keeping all these in mind, I assure you that we shall take every step to give all these facilities to our students.

### In Memoriam:

### Rev.A.A.Paul:

Rev.Anthony Ariyaratnam Paul the 15th Principal of Jaffna College was born on 25th January 1947.

Rev.Paul had his primary education at Paunnalaikadduwan and his Secondary Education at Jaffna College. He entered the University of Ceylon from Jaffna College in November 1966. He followed a Chemistry Special Degree course with physics as a subsidiary subject and passed the final examination in August 1970.

For a short period he served at the Faculty of Science as a temporary Assistant Demonstrator and later became a Temporary Assistant Lecturer in Chemistry in the Faculty of Medicine. In 1974 he joined the Mineral Sands Corporation, Pulmoddai and became the Chief Chemist of this Corporation.

On 2nd February 1985 he was appointed to the staff of Jaffna College. Because of his piety integrity and high academic achievement he was given important positions at Jaffna College. He was made chaplain of the College in 1992. He became Junior Vice Principal of the College in 1994.

Rev.A.A.Paul had an abiding interest in Theological Studies and church activities. He followed a Bachelor of Divinity course as an External Student of Serampore College and passed the B.D.Examination. In 1996 he went to Princeton Thelogical Seminary U.S.A. and obtained his Th.M.Degree.

In June 1991 he was made a Deacon by the Rt.Rev.Dr.D.J.Ambalavanar and in May 1992 he was Ordained as Presbyter of the Jaffna Diocese of the Church of South India. He served as worker in charge at Araly, Moolai and Vaddukoddai churches.

In February 2000 he became the Principal of Jaffna College, a position he held till his much lamented death on the 13th June 2003.

Even though Rev.A.A.Paul had been Principal of Jaffna College only for 3 years and four months, he had been serving the Institution as Vice Principal and Principal during the most difficult period of the College.

We shall always be thankful to God for His gift to us in the life of his devoted servant Rev. Anthony Ariyaratnam Paul. We, as the college communty extent once again our hearfelt sympathies to his wife and three sons.

### W.N.Thevakadacham

I regret very much to record the death of a very lovable person Mr.W.N.Thevakadacham. He served at College for 36 years and joined the band of Jubilarians in 1974. He was a primary trained teacher. He hailed from a family of teachers and proved to be an ideal teacher for the primary kids. His outstanding qualities of a magnetic voice, jovial ways, his active participation in all activities and public speaking, pleasing and enduring personality rose him up to the supervisor of the primary school for three years prior to his retirement. He was house master of the Brown House for fifteen years. He was an excellent organizer of sportsmeets and we witnessed many colourful and inspiring celebration. He was a well-known social worker and took an active part in the Y.M.C.A., the CNAPT, the Lions Clubs and the St.John's Ambulance. His contributions to College and community were immeasurable. Even after his retirement and while residing in Negombo with his son his love and passion for College did not decrease, he was in constant touch with us and never forgot to send words of appreciation for special achievements and successes at college. We wish to convey to his wife and sons our deepest sympathies.

### S.Navaratnam

Mr.Navaratnam also retired after 36 years of fruitful service at college. He joined as a trained teacher in Tamil and Arithmetic in the primary school. He belonged to that old band of Trained Teachers and carried out his tasks with a great sense of responsibility and duty. He was an honest and duty conscious teacher and was a person who would always have a wilt remark to say to his fellow teachers whether it be under the banyan tree, the Staffroom or even the tuck - shop. He was a house mater and was very active in the field. I want to place on record my appreciation and convey to his son and family our heartfelt condolences.

### Leslie Bartlet:

I want to place on record the death of Mr.Leslie Bartlett who gave some of his very untiring years to Jaffna College. He was a loyal alumnus of the college and was very much interested in the achievements of his alma - mater. He was one of the earliest men to occupy

the newly built men's hostel, now the Bunker Hall. He took to law and was a District Judge in Jaffna and later reverted to practicing law. He took a keen interest in the Sansoni Commission recording evidence regarding the communal riots in Sri Lanka. He took an active interest in seeing that justice was done to the Tamils who were victims of oppression and injustice. He was also a committed churchman and was a dedicated member of the CSI Church in Colombo. He was elected to the Board of Directors in 1983 and as an experienced and highly practiced Attorney - at - Law, he gave his very valuable services to College. He was a very simple, affectionate and convivial person and I still remember how comfortable he was in wearing a Veshti while paying unofficial visits to College. We wish to convey our sympathies to the bereaved family.

### Professor K.D. Arudpragasam:

We regret very much to record here the death of a very dynamic personality prof.Arudpragasam. Though he came into the Board of Directors just one year prior to his death, he was no stranger to Jaffna College. After his schooling in four outstanding Colleges -St.Thomas', Hartley, St.John's and Ananda College, he entered the University of Ceylon. With his Zoology special degree he came directly to Jaffna College and spent his most energetic years here. He was a well sought - after person for his friendship, knowledge and excellent organization of exhibitions, excursions and extra - curricular activities. His contributions to the outer world were immense. He joined the University of Colombo as professor and Head of the Department of Zoology; Subsequently he obtained his doctoral degree from the University of Wales. He has contributed much to the development of Science in this country. He was actively involved in University education until his sudden and untimely death in August 2003. Professor Arudpragasam as vice chairman of UGC and our Chief Guest today professor Mendis have been working very closely and it is evident the university circle too have lost a pillar of strength of his composure. He had many dreams for Jaffna College and though most of them we understand are in writing we will miss his direct deep influence on us. We very much mourn his death and I know some of the Board members here and I personally have still not come to terms that he is no more. We shall always remember him with much gratitude and affection. May his soul rest in peace.

### C.L.Devasagayam

The late Mr.Devesagayam joined the Jaffna College Institute of Agriculture as its principal after serving several years at Aquainas Institute, Colombo, During his tenure of office as Principal he gave very valuable service not only to our institute but also to the adjoining farming community. After his retirement he went to the Maldives. His passing away is an irreparable loss not only to his family, but also to the many who were benefited by his timely advice and help. We convey to his family our deepest sympathies.

### E.M.Jebarajah

The late Mr.Jebarajah was the former Acting Director of the Jaffna College Institute of Technology. He was a very active member of the Council and contributed a lot for the growth and development of the Institute. Specially during the most troubled times he was a real watch - dog at the Institute. His untimely death at a young age was most shocking to all of us, and much more to his family. His services and dedication to safe guard the Institute will be remembered by the many beneficiaries of the institute. ### Installation of the New Principal:

The Board of Directors of Jaffna College appointed Mr. Noel Arasaratnam Vimalendran as the new Principal of Jaffna College. He is a graduate of the University of Peradeniya having accredited himself with a Bachelor of Science degree. He obtained a merit pass in his post Graduate Diploma in Education. He is also highly qualified in computing with an M. A degree, in computer education from King's College of London, University of London. He has added two postgraduate qualifications in Ecumenical Studies from Bossey, Switzerland and in Counselling from Association of Counselling and Health. He has been Serving Jaffna College for more than twenty seven years as a teacher, supervisor of the Middle School, Vice Principal and now the Principal. He was installed at the Cathedral, Vaddukoddai on 21st of July 2003. The Rt. Rev. Dr. S. Jebanesan conducted the service and preached the sermon.

### Appointment of New Vice Principal

Mrs.Indrance Jeyakumaran was appointed as the Vice Principal of the college from July 2003. She possess a B.Sc degree, Dip.in.Education, MA in Education and a Teacher's Diploma in English. ### On Roll:

There are 1424 on roll. 426 students are in the primary school 472 in the Junior Secondary School and 526 in the Senior School. There are 834 boys and 590 girls.

### Admissions:

231 students were admitted during the course of this year, 114 to the Primary School, 74 to Junior Secondary School and 43 to the Senior Secondary School.

### Staff:

We have 46 on Permanent teacher cadre, of which three are with Masters degrees, 11 with post graduate diploma in Education, 22 graduates and 9 trained teachers. In addition we have 24 on contract or part - time basis, and 11 on our non - academic staff.

Mr.P.Thevamithiran returned to college on June 1st after completing a special course in Theology and music from the Tamil Nadu Theological College, Madurai, South India.

### On Leave:

Messrs.A.C.Francis and S.S.Karunaithas are doing the Diploma in Education course at the University of Jaffna and will return to us at the end of this year.

### Retirement

Mr.N.Thatpananthan was one of our gifted and dedicated teachers of recent times. He joined Jaffna College in 1969. He is an Arts graduate with a merit pass in the post graduate Diploma in Education of the University of Colombo and a Grade I Special Post holder. He was a very successful teacher of Geography and Social Studies. He has a knack to teach Geography and he never entered a classroom without a roll of maps in his hand. He was subwarden of Sanders Hostel, Faculty Adviser of the School Council, Secretary and President of the Round table, Head of Social Science Council, Secretary and President of the Round table, Head of Social Sciences and Arts Department,, patron of the Academy and house maser of Abraham house. His favorite game was tennis. He was a very active Physical Director and carried out his duties efficiently. He has organized many colourful functions for Jaffna College, chiefly the prize - givings, sportsmeets, cricket and soccer matches, Cross Country Festivals and Academy lunches. He was a very dependable and readily accessible person at all times. We are extremely happy that he is continuing to render his valuable services to College even after his retirement, and we wish him many more years of healthy life. His appearance still remains so youthful and we expect more years of useful service from him.

### **Jubilarians**

Mr.K.Thangarajah joinded Jaffna College in1977 after obtaining a Bachelor of Science degree in public Finance & Taxation. He secured his Diploma in Education from the University of Jaffna in 1985. He is well known for his subject Accountancy in the Technical College circles. He is the head of the Advanced Level Arts Department and Co-ordinator for Advanced Level Project work. He is the master - in - charge of the Commerce Union and a house master of Hitchcock House. He has successfully completed twenty - five years of fruitful service at Jaffna College in the year 2002. 





Building repair of many damaged buildings due to the military activities and military occupation were undertaken. The twin quarters adjacent to the Araly road were repaired and new electrical fittings were installed. Electrical fittings for the power lab and some class rooms were undertaken. A second coat of tar was put for our road from top of Karainagar Road to the Abel's Auditorium. The road repairs to the other roads are underway.

Currently there are 7,687 volume of books in the library. During this period 16 new books were purchased and 29 books on Discipline of Engineering were donated to us by our former students Messrs Suthan and Suresh Subramaniam.

The sports and religious activities are conducted regularly. The boys hostel restarted at the end of 2002 is functioning well. There are 20 students in the hostel.

My sincere thanks are due to to the Director Mr.N.R.G.Hoole, the tutorial staff, non-academic and minor for their untiring efforts in maintaining the Institute on a good standard of tertiary education and the great service they are rendering.

# Jaffna College Institute of Agriculture

The Agricultural Institute is now on an excellent footing under the principalship of Mr.T.Kugathasan. The institute is providing courses in Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, poultry, machine maintenance and in other allied fields. Several seminars and workshops in collaboration with various other organizations are conducted regularly on topics related to the courses provided. Students were taken on Agricultural study tours to many of the Agricultural stations here in Jaffna and in the Vanni areas. Many schools in the Jaffna district visit the Institute. Hostel facilities are available for boys. The religious and social activities are conducted regularly.

I am extremely thankful to Mr. Kugathasan and his staff for the good work and wish him well in their plans for the future.

I want to place on record my sincere thanks to all the members of the Council of the institutes for their timely guidance, advice and interest.

#### The Alumni Associations

The Parent association and the Colombo Alumni Association have been very active and several good functions have been held both in Jaffna and in Colombo. We are happy to record an increase in the membership in both these associations. I am very proud to record here that some members of the Colombo Alumni Association have helped many of our students who were in Colombo for various competitions. The students were encouraged and peped up for higher achievements by their personal presence in the sports field and elsewhere. The Colombo OBA president Mr.S.Thavayogarajah, the Secretary Mr.Chandran Ariaratnam, Mr.A.Gnanathasan, Mr.C.D.Chinnakone and Mr.A.Kandasamy are in constant touch with the school and its progress. A special word of thanks to Mr.Thavayogarajah and Mr.Kandasamy for heir contributions towards sports articles and other cash prizes given to the college.

# Principal Report - 2004

Our Lord Bishop the Rt.Rev.Dr.Jebanesan, Mrs.Seeta Vimalalakshmi Jebanesan, The chairman Mr.Gnanathasan and Dr.(Mrs.) Ariaranee Gnanathasan, other members of the Board of Directors, Parents, Alumni, friends, my fellow administrators, our teachers and my dear Students:

We welcome you all in a very special way to Jaffna College today. Your kind presence encourages us very much to labour in this great institution. May you always continue to sustain with your presence and visits.

Our Bishop Jebanesan and Mrs. Jebanesan, it is with much pride that we welcome you to our College today. Bishop Jebanesan, is one of our most brilliant and outstanding scholars Jaffna College has produced in the 21st century with a string of earned degrees in Theology, Tamil and History. He is continuing to shed his influence in the highest academic circles here and abroad. It is certainly a very pleasant privilege to have a Christian gentleman of your calibre as our chief guest today. You are so much a part of us and we have very special reasons to have you with us. You spent a good part of your life here at Jaffna College as an outstanding Student, excellent teacher of History and Civics, as Vice -Principal and as Principal. You hail from a family of teachers and your brothers along with you form a band of excellent academics.

Bishop Jebanesan's splendid accomplishments stand out significantly. He started his early education at Drieberg College where his parents were teachers. Here I would like a add a special note, that along with our Bishop, myself and the chairman of the Board Mr.Gnanathasan, we all had our early education at Drieberg College and then moved to Jaffna College for our final years. After attending the University entrance classes at Jaffna College from 1959 Bishop Jebanesan obtained his B.A.Degree from the University of Peradeniya in 1962. His teaching career started at St.Anthony's College, Kandy in 1963. After a short spell of teaching there, Bishop Jebanesan thought of furthering his studies in India. He thought he would take not one M.A.Degree but two. He obtained one in Philosophy at the University of Madurai and one in Tamil at the University of Peradeniya.

After obtaining these degrees there was an idea gnawing in his mind to do something in Theology. I understand theology is also considered as the 'Queen of Science", and Bishop Jebanesan's Theological career began with the B.D.Examination part by part. As all these qualifications were adorning his name, he worked hard and obtained a Ph.D.degree from the University of Jaffna. Geniuses like him are hard to find these days and in Bishop Jebanesan, we find a person who thirsts for knowledge.

He joined Jaffna College as a teacher of History and Civics in 1969. His main contribution was towards the literary and religious activities of the College. He was the editor of the Jaffna College Miscellany from 1974-1993. He served as the Faculty Advisor of the 'Young Idea" from 1979-1993. His academic achievements along with his commitment, and devotion towards the school promoted him to become one of the Co-Vice Principals, and then the Principal in 1988. It was during his principalship that most of the teachers of Jaffna College were influenced to pursue higher studies in their own fields of education. Thus we are proud to say that we now have a full fledged staff who have benefited much by Bishop Jebanesan's timely advice, guidance and support. Our Bishop is a good dramatist and an excellent actor. We marveled at the ability with which he acted in many dramas and specially in the film produced by the college - 'Kalluri Vasanthathil". He has a great liking for the 'Kural' and for songs of Bharathi. It was during his career at Jaffna College he made a successful effort to celebrate the Bharathi Day, and ever since, I am proud to say we are the only school in Jaffna that celebrates the birth, work and contribution of Bharathy in a very meaningful manner every year in September.

The Rt.Rev.Dr.S.Jebanesan was consecrated the third Bishop of the Jaffna diocese of the Church of South India on 30th May 1993. Ever since his loyalty, dedication, commitment and faithfulness had been towards the upliftment of the Diocese. He took over the Bishopric when the country, especially the North Eastern parts were in turmoil. He had worked hard to uplift the victims of war and reconstruct the ruins of destruction.

Bishop Jebanesan has an impressive array of publications to his credit. He has published books both in English and Tamil, mainly on American Ceylon Mission. I shall mention the most important one here for you - 'Religious Controversies of the 19th Century' in collaboration with Dr.S.F.Young published by the Institute of Ideology, University of Viena in 1995. His special skill and flare for writing and research were evident in all his publications.

Besides the excellent writing skills, he has a gift of speech and is very fluent in English and Tamil. We find he is well - informed on all matters, it can be theology, education, politics, history, culture, you name it and he speaks very eloquently. He possesses a fine sense of homour and this quality combined with his knack of story telling makes his speeches fascinating and lively. It is a treat to listen to his speeches mingled with wit and humour.

As for the ability to get on with people, he has served in numerous Councils and Committees and presiding as chairman. He is a member in cluster IV of the comittees of CCA - the Justice International affairs. Development and Service from the year 2000. In 2001 he was invited by the Cambridge International Biographical Centre as one of the outstandin intellectuals of the 21st Century.

In 2002 he was invited by the Princeton Theological Seminary to be a Research Assistant. In 2003 he was elected Chairman of the Solidarity fund for Theological Education in South Asia. Bishop Jebanesan had also served as Chairman of the Committees of the Church of South India Statistics, Communication and Ecumenical Relations.

We are very proud to note Bishop Jebanesan is one of the Senior most members of the Jaffna University council nominated by University Grands Commission in 1992 and is continuing to serve on the Council. He is a member of the selection committee for Arts Faculty from 1992, and was a visiting lecturer in Christian Civilization from 1979-1988.

I quote here a few lines from Bishop Ambalavanar's sermon on Bishop Jebanesan's installation as principal of Jaffna College, 'You had entered into the race as an educator to win prize of a high vocation of building a new future". I am sure Bishop, though you are nearing your retirement from the Diocese, your race is not yet over, there is a greater future and let us go hand in hand as we face it. Your encouragement, richness of experience in all aspects of education and your leadership is relevant, significant and most needed for our time.

One again we admire your achievements and appreciate your continuing friendship with us at Jaffna College. You have a very remarkable knowledge and understanding of our special history and purpose as an educational institution borne out of the American Ceylon Mission. Your constructive and incisive criticisms have been accepted in the best of spirits and they have been most invaluble and relavant to us to re-evaluate our own existence and purpose. We therefore, look forward very much to your special messsage to us today with great expectation.

Mrs.Vimala Jebanesan, you will find yourself in the most familiar surroundings today, and we have nothing really new to show you. Our students are very fortunate to receive one's prizes from the hands of a devoting mother, an excellent teacher and expert musician. We are very happy this task has fallen on you today. You had been teaching western Music in Jaffna for almost forty-five years. You started your career, at Vembadi Girls High School where the College band won the All Island Band Competition and then you came to Jaffna College in 1982. From that time onwards we at Jaffna College have benefited much by your expertise and experience in training choirs, bands and orchestras. You obtained the highest qualification in music, the L.T.C.. at a very young age of 18 years. You taught our children numerous musical instruments from piano, recorders, trumpets and western violin. The College Orchestra trained by you had performed at many functions and this will ever be remembered with much appreciation. You had been the chief pianist at combined schools Carol festivals for over 35 years. The rich experience you received while you were at Bishop Cotton Boys School in Bangalore from 1995 - 97 was exhibited to the maximum when you returned back to us. You gave off your best to Jaffna College and we remain ever grateful to you.

Your involvement in Diocesan work, especially as President of the Women's Fellowship has brought about many opportunities for the women who had been deprived of a normal modest living. Being a trained counsellor your knowledge and influence to the entire diocese I remarkable, and a blessing to the Bishop in all his heavy task of running the Diocese. As being the first lady of the Diocese I say well done madam, and we appreciate the dedication, love and services you offer to the College community at large and to the diocese.

We thank you for your charming presence here with us today. Our Children are

anxiously waiting to receive their prizes from your worthy hands.

We welcome once again our dear Bishop and Bishop amma with open arms for gracing this occasion.

Dr.(Mrs)Ariaranee Gnanathasan is again no stranger to us. Her family has had a very long association with Jaffna College, and more now, as the wife of the Chairman of the Board Directors. Dr.Ariarance, I am sure, as you entered the portals of Jaffna College today, several impressions and nostalgic memories both visible now and invisible would stand out reminding you of the solid foundation you got here as a student of this College. You may even hope very much that you could be a student at Jaffna College all over again. You had a brilliant career here at College and we remember how enthusiastically you carried away a heavy load of prizes at several prize - givings here, from this stage.

Dr.Ariarnee entered the Peradeniya Medical College with high distinction, from the Chemistry stream of the University, excelled in studies and obtained her MBBS and later the M.D.Degree. She went to London and secured her M.R.C.P.(Oxford), she specialized in Toxicology and snake bite.

Since then she has held many prestigious positions in the medical profession, Secretary of the College of Physicians, Secretary of the Post Graduate Institute and Senior Lecturer in Medicine. In addition to her many qualifications she has written articles and won the President Award for researc.

IF not for the timely rescue of our Chairman Mr.Gnanadasan, I am sure Dr.Ariaranee would have become another 'Mother Theresa" and followed in her footsteps. Her service to the people with her utmost dedication and commitment are immeasurable. She always combines Western Medicine with a word of prayer which makes the patient feel more secure in her loving and caring hands. I have no doubt there are hundreds of patients anxiously waiting to have her back, and we are ever so greteful for the time you had taken to be with us today to second the vote of thanks. Our sincere thanks to you doctor, and we welcome you here with us.

We were happy to have one of our own, Ms Diane Faires, our American missionary opening today's function with a meaningful prayer. She is an excellent addition to our staff and we are happy she is fast in getting socialized into our culture. She is a very willing and able worker and we expect much contribution from her.

#### **Our Vision**

Our objective is to see the world as a source of human enrichment, whether we pray, study, play, take part in a social function, or help the needy. We should make every student of our College to have their life to the fullest. Every student be taught to discover their identity and talents by exposing through various activities in sports as well as in extra curricular activities. This means engaging ourselves and others in the process. Our job is basically chasing after visions and recognizing the fact that boys and girls need guidance to meet the demands of the society. We are delighted that the sort of work we are doing now is worthy and intimately related to be participants in the formulation of moulding our products. The secret of developing successful products out of war affected students is creative thinking. As an institution we have to go with the time and develop the idea quickly.

A general assessment of the year's work could be termed good. We may appear to live a little out side reality, in a community of our own. But we have an adequate, qualified and permanent staff for all branches of our work, with a comparatively disciplined, affectionate and responsive student body. Let me say here, that Jaffna College has decided to maintain a garden where trees will bear good fruits and they will be allowed to mature on the tree itself until they are plucked and distributed to the world.

# The Prize Day Address 2004

# delivered by The Rt.Rev.Dr.S.Jebanesan

Principal Sir, Teachers, Alumni, parents and students. At first I wish to express my sincere thanks to the Principal for giving me and my wife the greatest honour this College can give. i.e., The honour of being the Chief Guests at the most important function of the year. In 2003 I returned from Princeton, USA. There, I was told the person who is invited to give the address at the annual convocation normally gives US \$ 25 million as donation for the University. I wish I had so much money to give you after this function.

The Principal has kindly mentioned all about my contribution to this College. I had been a student, Teacher, Principal and now Bishop. I was the 13th Principal of Jaffna College. Some years ago I met Nan Fredrics in Washington. She was the head of USAID at the time. When I told her that I was the 13th Principal of Jaffna College she quibbed then you must be very careful. Mr.N.Sabaratnam a former Principal of Jaffna Hindu College and a very loyal old boy of Jaffna College used to say that this Institution's heads were Hs or Bs after Dr. Daniel Poor, viz; Hoshington, Hastings (Senior), Hastings (Junior), Howland, Hitchchock then it was Bicknell, Brown, Bunker, Boss and Balasingam.

The history of Jaffna College had been well documented from the time of its inception. Missionary Herald, the morning star, the Miscellany and the Young Idea had been recording its history most faithfully.

The following are some of the important statements recorded in the past issuess of the miscellany:

"I have yet to meet a Student who is not proud of having received part of his education in Jaffna College and I think Jaffna College has reasons to be proud of her graduates"

#### G.G.Brown

For well nigh over 100 years the noble band of instructors have been preaching by precept and example that the highest ideal was selfless service.

#### Hon.K.Balasingam

Jaffna College is a veritable queen among educational institutions of the Country – Prof.G.P.Malasekara.

Ladies and gentlemen I taught in this noble institution for many years but I am not a jubilarian. But I have taught in various schools for more than thirty years. Once Mr.B.K.Somasundaram, a Chemistry teacher at Jaffna College said if any body completes 25

years of teaching he must be felicitated. It is not necessary that he/she should teach for 25 years at Jaffna College.

Then Mr.C.O.Elias who came to teach Social Science from Kerala and himself a jubilarian quibbed "But Mr.Somasundaram you would have and so many farewells no?"

It was a great previlage to be teacher at Jaffna College. Mr.T.Vinayamoorthy who was teaching Tamil Language and Literature at Jaffna College at his farewell speech said, when Rev.John Bicknell called him and offered him a teaching job at Jaffna College his mood was comparable to that of Hanuman when he was called by Rama and was given the assignment of find him Seeta. Hanuman was overwhelmed by emotion. He was jumping, dancing, running and climbing. That was the joy he had when he was given a teaching position.

During the past 60 years I spoke on many things and had done various things. But the work that gave me real satisfaction was the teaching at Jaffna College. Even now people over the world remember as "Jebanesan master"

I joined Jaffna College as a student 50 years ago. There were 8 students in the University Entrance Class. It was called the H.S.C. There were more than 30 students in the class in January that year. The results of the University Entrance Examination released that year frightened many of them. Because nobody gained admission. So most of them left the University Entrance Class and joined the Undergraduate Department. I did not go to the undergraduate department. But out of the 8 students who stayed back to do the University Entrance Examination, six passed.

Jaffna College has its own philosophy. Justice Jeya Pathirana who came as Chief Guest to Jaffna College for the Prize giving in 1976 said that his years at Jaffna College were extremely useful. It has taught himself confidence, to be informal, to be liberal, to be concerned about fellow beings at Jaffna College. Once a professor at University said Jaffna College boys have the confidence of Colombo boys minus their snob.

Jaffna College Philosophy can be compared with the wood apple. The exterior is rough and strong and inside it is soft and sweet.

We are taught to be rigid on big things and to be flexible in small things. This is the essence of the philosophy of Jaffna College. People who moved with Jaffna College students think that they are very cordial and humane but very soon they realize that they are also men of sterner stuff.

When I was a student at Jaffna College, this Institution was at its peak. I enjoyed intellectual bliss that pervaded her. In the staff there were Keralites, Germans, Americans, Sinhalese.

English was the medium of instruction and spoken widely in the campus. But the standard of Tamil was also very high. Many of the Tamil poets and short story writers who loomed large in the 20<sup>th</sup> century were old students of Jaffna College.

I wish to congratulate the students who have won prizes, excelled in sports and studies and had done commendable service to the community. It has been wisely said you do not know the talent in a particular field till you plunge into it.

The Mahavakiya of Socrates was know thyself. He felt everybody must have a thorough knowledge of their personalities. If we know ourselves we can achieve so much in this life. In advanced countries guidance and counselling are important departments in the schools. The students are tested again and again to find out their aptitude, talents and intelligence. They are guided to take the correct vocation. The parents in our part of the world want all their children to become doctors or engineers. No doubt medicine is still most prestigious profession in the world. How many of us can become doctors? If we do not have the necessary intelligence and memory power we will be chasing the wild goose. We end up as failures and spend the rest of our life in utter frustration. Some of us are academically inclined. Some of us artistically inclined. Some of us are night birds while some others are early birds. Some are very intelligent who can grasp things quickly while others have the capacity to sit down and study for 16 or 17 hours a day.

When I was a student at Peradeniya we used to tease a student for studying, reading and writing notes all the time. He was given colours by the students for cramming. But he used to say, I am not intelligent as you are, I do not have a very rententive memory. So I keep on studying. Then only I will be able to pass the examination. So I am not ashamed to get the colours of cramming.

God did not create all men equally. People differ in intelligence, in physique, memory power, energy, wisdom and courage. An intelligent man or woman will know early in life his or her personality. Everybody has to make an attempt to find out what sort of person he is. Even Lord Jesus Christ wanted to know who he is. He went on asking disciples whom do they say I am? The disciples said to him you are Elijah, you are John the Baptist, and you are one of the peophets. Jesus was not satisfied with those answers. Then he asked his disciples whom do you think I am? Peter replied, you are Christ the son of the living God.

People who find out their talents early in life have many years to plan their course of life. It is unfortunate some people find vocation in their 40s or 50s. They do not achieve much in their fields.

Once an educationist asked these questions: Give me the name of the poet who was not a poet in his school days? Give the name of the scientist who did not show interest in applied science in his school days? Give me the name of the actor who was not an actor in his school days? Give me the name of the painter who was not a painter in his school days? I remember the two students at Jaffna College who found out their vocation very early in life.

Mr.M.Shanmugan who was one year senior to me at Jaffna College. His ambition was to become a police officer. His nick name in the class was 'costap' Mr.Shanmugam entered the University, did his degree and joined the police force as an Assistant Superintendent of Police. He rose to the rank of the position of Senior Superintendent of Police. The other person whom I often meet in India is Mr.Balu Mahendra. He was one year junior to me at Jaffna College. He went to the Survey department and from there went to Poona Film institute. He knew his talent and took the risk. Now he is one of the most important film directors of South India. The secret of his success depended on how early he found his vocation. There is a world of difference between a teacher of English who had studied English for three years and person who had studied Eglish for more than 30 years. It can be said of all professions. If you are in a field from your infancy you will become an expert in the field. This is what I wish to tell the students of Jaffna College both boys and girls. Keep on asking the question who I am? What is my work in this world? You must have a mind of your own. Your parents can make mistakes. Your relations can give wrong advice. But the final decision ha to made by you.

Once again I wish to thank the Principal, and staff for giving me the honour. When I retired from Jaffna College in 1993, the then Principal Mr.G.Rajanayagam invited me for the prize giving. I told him the hour has not come. After a few years Rev.A.A.Paul asked me to be the Chief Guest at the prize giving. I said the hour has not come. Now when Mr.Noel Vimalendran asked me to come as the Chief Guest. I told him that the time has come to glorify me. Because in a few months time I will be retiring from the Bishopric.

I wanted to be Chief Guest while in office and I am happy that I am second Prize Day Chief Guest in Vimalendran Era.

Only when a person is at the helm of affairs for atleast 10 or 15 years we call it an era. There had been Bicknell era, Boss Selliah era and Kadirgamar era. God willing Noel Vimalendran era will be a period of achievements and Jaffna College will rise to grater heights during his period.

May the good Lord bless the Principal, his family and all those who are working for this noble institution.



#### Missionaries

We have had an array of missionaries from time to time, and we have appreciated their zeal and commitment. Lately we have had Miss Grace Bunker and Miss Diane Faires. Unfortunately Miss Bunker's period of service came to an end at the end of June this year and we had to bid a heartfelt farewell to her. Miss Bunker came to us in 2001 happily volunteering for service here when Jaffna was just recovering from the ethnic conflict in the North. This land was not a strange one to her as she had spent many of her childhood years here on this soil. Her unassuming ways, passion for teaching and the zeal and energy she possessed were all I am sure were inherited from her duty conscious father the late Rev Dr Sydney Bunker. It was most appropriate that Miss Bunker was here with us when we celebrated the 100th birth Anniversary of Rev. Dr Bunker. The teaching of English came under special attention with Miss. Bunker conducting classes under the follow up programme of the British Council. Our primary School kids benefited much by her teaching skills and singing classes. She played a key-role in raising funds for the Tsunami victims. She was the first person to let people abroad know that there was an urgent need to help the needy and the financial assistance received was very timely. She herself was present at many of the places where this help was rendered. We are extremely grateful to her for all the efforts, the dedication and commitment with which she wholeheartedly worked. We are confident that she will hold Jaffna College dearer to heart even when she is back home in USA. May the God Almighty guide and protect her as she begins her retired life.

#### An Expectation of Education in a school

The major issue, that we as educationists, parents and well wishers are concerned about are the discipline and well being of our students, who in turn going to be the leaders of this nation. There is a general concept that education has two major objectives. They are education for the purpose of change of behavour, which is acceptable by the society and to its well being, and education for training students for the job market. The major objectives set out above identifies two main areas in the curriculum. Education for change of behavour, which is called liberal or non-vocational which is based on traditional and philosophical subjects, and job oriented education which deals with vocational and technological subjects which are called professional education.

#### So what is a school's function?

A school's aim should be to discover what ration of intelligence nature has given to each individual child at birth, then to provide him the appropriate education, and finally to guide him into the career for which he seems to have been marked out. Also it has a responsibility to maintain or challenge the social order. School being a social institution, and to keep to the set objectives, it must fulfill four major functions: Integration, Goal attainment, Adaptation, and Pattern maintenance. Integration by transmitting knowledge; Goal attainment as

Personal career development, Adaptation by way of education for the future, and pattern maintenance to understand Social differentiation. Society which is mirrored in schools have the need for a clear and acceptable social order; the need for improved performance; and a commitment to rights and responsibilities that reflect young people's social, intellectual and physical maturity. In order to achieve these the School has to establish norms and values that are likely to be:

- 1) teachers' expectations about the children's work and behaviour,
- ii) the models provided by the teachers' own conduct in school, and by the behaviour of the other pupils,
- iii) and the feedback that the children receive on hat is acceptable performance at the school

Then the second major problem starts with regard to construction of one's identity in the society. This could be explained by the symbolic interactions. The symbolic interactions uses the concept of self - esteem to explain human action. Human beings develop an idea of who they are (self - image) and who they would like to be (ideal - self). There is a gap between the two. When the gap is large, self-esteem is low: we are not the people we would like to be.

When there is congruence between self-image and ideal-self, self-esteem is high.

A successful identity comes from matching a sound sense of oneself, what one is like and what one is good at, with a sound sense of the world, what opportunities exist. It is necessary to have some goals but these need to be realistic. Often adolescents are adrift, switching from a sense of aimlessness to enthusiasms, and back again. This process of identity achievement can only be directly undertaken by the individual concerned, it is something occurring within their mind. We can help, partly by informing students about the world, the range of careers and lifestyles available, and partly be helping them recognise their own qualities and limitations. Possibilities should be debated. We should not force teenagers to rush into making decisions as adolescence should provide space and time for this process of identity acquisition to occur.

Thirdly, In today's world more and more people want to learn English. They want to because English is key to their personal future at school and University or at work. They need to because there are studies to complete, information to acquire, employers to please, etc. Every one has different abilities. But most learners of English want above all to listen with understanding and to speak with confidence. Every student should need to prove that they can do it, at their own level and for their own purposes. The ability to communicate effectively is an essential skill we all need to succeed in today's global business environment.

Sri Lanka has been credited for its very high literacy rate as compared to any country in the south East Asia. Learning and Education has been given very high place since ancient times in the social life of the people of Jaffna. SriLanka as a national policy committed to

provide 'Education for all and free' from the kindergarten to the University since independence. Jaffna College even being a non-fee levying, unaided government approved Private school, students contribute only 13.5% of their entire expense to educate them for a year. The rest is on service basis which was started by the American missionaries and some of the early natives of Vaddukoddai.

#### Steps taken at Jaffna College to conform to the above said concept

- 1. We have a system of inviting the expatriate student volunteers to come to college for short term duration and try out a new English curriculum specially designed for Jaffna College. The first one in this program was Ms.Linda Winslow from Germany for 8 weeks at college and now Ms.Tharani Balachandran from Canada for five weeks. The program is actually a pilot project to improve English speaking and writing skills. Beginners level syllabus is tried out with the English medium students of grade six and the other two levels are tried out with the hostel students in two batches, one for advanced level students and the other for the students in grade 9 to 11. Once we finalise the feasibility of the syllabus and the actual duration, we will get expatriate student teachers accordingly. I wish to thank Mr.C.D.Chinnakone and Mr.Victor Karunairajan of Canada for organizing the volunteers from overseas to help in this program.
- 2. We have introduced Association of Accounting Technician (AAT) course to the advanced level first year students. Our expectation is that a student when he/she completes his/her advanced level exam will hold a professional course certificate in hand so that he could be marketable or can continue his professional field with out wasting his/her time idling. If one has the full qualification in AAT he will be exampted from CIMA foundation level.
- 3. To construct Student's identity, hey are open to the following to identify their potentials.
  - In the Student Council every student is respected as individuals and as a body occupying a significant position in the student council of the school organizing retirement functions for retiring staff, teachers day, Prize Giving other important functions.
  - Fairness to all pupils irrespective of their class, gender, ethnicity or academic status are maintained in and out of the classroom.
  - Autonomy not as an absolute state, but as both, a right and a responsibility in relation to physical and social maturity is given to students to organize various functions through their literary associations. Each class has one for them
  - We create lot of opportunities to motivate intellectual challenge that helps pupils to experience learning as a dynamic, engaging and empowering activity;
  - We have appointed a councillor to look into the social support in relation to both academic and emotional concerns;
  - We have a sound security system in relation to both the physical setting of the school and in interpersonal encounters.

# Jaffna College Institute of Agriculture

The Agriculture Institute functions effectively to attain the objectives of establishing it. The object of the Institute is to train the educated, unemployed youth in modern scientific agriculture so that they could be self employed in agriculture, getting a reasonable steady income for their lively hood. The Institute has shown good progress by expanding into new fields.

#### School Section

#### Junior certificate course

38 students were enrolled at the beginning and 26 of them sat the final examination in January 2004. 40 students were taken in April 2004 and 30 students sat the final examination

in August 2004. Another batch of 40 students were taken in September 2004 and 34 students are attending classes regularly.

# One year Agriculture Diploma Course

42 students were taken in January 2004 for the one year agriculture Diploma course and 31 students are attending classes regularly.

## Seminars and workshops

Seminars and workshops in collaboration with various other organizations were conducted mainly on topics related to agriculture, animal husbandry and other allied fields with the idea of educating farmers and cattle owners. Agriculture teachers, officers of the department of agriculture and agrarian services participated in these seminars. Some of the schools in Jaffna peninsula have shown great interest in visiting our farm and study the various activities that are being carried out here.

#### Farm Section

The objective of the farm section is to be and effective teaching aid to acquire new skills and scientific know in farming. Field practical work for the students lasts three hours and students are given ample opportunity to learn various skills in the different enterprise. In Poultry there will be birds from day old to point of lay and from point of lay to culling stage. Techniques like fowlpox vaccination, inoculation or oral worming, feeding, culling etc. Are all taught during their training period.

In addition to the cultivation of crops, we are carrying out some research activities in consultation with the department of agriculture and with the Eastern University. Invetigations are being continued to see the feasibility of using the products of Margosa leaves, bark, seed galic etc. as an alternative to some of insecticides. Mr.T.Wadson from Australia has been sent to our Institution as a volunteer to help us and work with us for some time. He is carrying out some projects like application of liquid fertilizer, testing of new varieties of pumpkin, control of weeds by different methods.

A new office and classroom complex was erected and declared opened by our bishop Rt.Rev.Dr.S.Jebanesan.

Mrs.Attracta Vernothini Emil (B.Sc Agriculture (second upper) Eastern University) has been appointed as the Vice Principal of the Institute.

My grateful thanks to the Principal Mr.T.Kugathasan and his able staff for the good work and wish them well in their future plans. I also want to thank Mr.Trevor Wadson, a Voluntary worker from Australia for helping us in the farm section.

My sincere thanks are due to all the members of the management council of JCIT & JCIA for their time and guidance in all matters concerned with these two institutions.

The refugee camp near Manalkaadu was our student YMCA's port of call.

There were 80 families living in the part we visited and 75 of them had lost at least one family member. All of them (chiefly the fishing community and local craftsmen) had lost all their possessions. Here and at another camp housing hundreds of refugees, the people lived in communal emergency accommodation, in tents, and in corrugated-iron shelters, with virtually no sanitation.

The Students Y.M.C.A under the auspices of jaffna College had started up a Tsumani relief project. The Project team consisted of 30 students of the Advanced level 2006 batch and six of the teachers as team leaders, i.e. Mr.Bernard Bate, an Amerian Professor and three of our teachers Mr.S.S.Karunaithas, Mr.K.Sathasivam and Rev.D.S.Solomon.

The first part of the project consisted of two phases: in the first phase the camp was visited, family details were gathered and attention was focused on the basic needs of the people (hygiene, clothes nourishment), and in particular the needs of the pregnant women, toddlers and school children.

In the second phase the team visited the camp in Manalkaadu to determine how the families affected would envisage their life in the future and to ascertain which commodities would be required to get them back on their feet. The information was collected and the donated money was utilised in such a way that each family received what was necessary for that particular family to earn a livelihood again. This is a project which will be continuing over a longer period of time by the students.

Therefore the goal of education for most of us is utilitarian. It is a means to an end. It is a passport to more comfortabe life, materially.

The etymology of the word 'education' offers significant clue to the nature of the activity itself. The English word 'education' comes from the latin word 'ducare' meaning 'to lead' and the prefix 'e' meaning 'out'. The root meaning of education is an activity of 'leading out'.

Three points can be discerned in 'leading out', a point from which present process and future toward which the leading out is done. In this sense education have an 'already' a being 'realized' and a 'not yet' dimension to it.

The 'already' 'dimension is expressive of either what the learner already knows of what the educator knows and the learner has an inner capacity to consciously appropriate.

The image of a sculptor who 'educes' a statue from a piece of marble may help to clarify this dimension. The figure was already in the marble potentially. The sculptor knows what the shape of it ought to be and educes the possibility which the marble already possess within itself.

The second dimension 'a present process being realized' emphasizes not what is already there but what is being discovered by the learner as it comes to meet him from beyond present limitation. In this dimension knowledge is more to be that and discovered in the experience of the journey than formed by someone who knows the design of it.

The third dimension refers to the point towards which the leading out is done. To lead out is an activity directed towards the future. It is a transcendence aspect of educational activity. It enables people become what they are not yet, but 'potentially can be'.

To Paulo Freire concern for the future is the utopian dimension of education. By this he means that education must not allow people to settle for what is already known but lead them instead to build a better world. Educators should teach what society needs its citizens to know if they are to function effectively.

- Globalization Aimed at International standards in Primary, Secondary and tertiary Education.





Little ones affected by the Tsunami at Kudathanai had a one full day camp on 21/05/2005. The topic for discussion was "stand on your own".





# Bunker Memorial Lecture On "The Works of R.K.Narayanan"

It gives me great joy and immense pride to be present here to deliver the Bunker Memorial Lecturers today to be invited by a college that is nearly 200 years old and stands in such international repute; to deliver lectures in memory of an eminent and great human being as Dr.Sydney K. Bunker, is an honor that has certainly overwhelmed and edified me.

I bring fraternal greetings from my college Bishop Heber which occupies an important place in the education map of South India.

On behalf of my husband and myself, I whole heartedly thank Bp Jabenesan the revered Bishop of the C.S.I. Jaffna Diocese, the principal and the vice-principal for the Jaffna College and all the organizers of this program, for having graciously invited us and made every moment of our stay memorable. Back home in Tiruchirapalli I have friends who have close association and connections with this great college and I carry their greetings to each one of you.

Rasipuram Krishnasamy Narayanasamy Iyer or R.K. Narayan is a household name not only in India but in any corner of the world where tradition and customs are respected and literature is appreciated. It becomes almost a status symbol to mention casually R.K.Narayan's name or the names of a couple of his novels or at least the names of a few of his fictional characters, while making conversation. No syllabus in the Indian Universities is complete without a book or two of Narayan being prescribed for study. Every year scores of literary scholars choose R.K. Narayan as the subject of their research. His stories have such universal appeal that transcends the barriers of time, language, age, creed, color or culture.

Born in 1906 in a Brahmin family, Rasipuram Krishnasamy Narayanaswamy shortened his name as RK Narayan, in 1935 when his first novel "Swami and his Friends" was published on the advice of his friend Graham Greene. He instantly shot into fame and tirade broke out non-stop, till by 1995 almost 60 years later, he had almost 35 published works to his credit and name. Today, some 70 years after that first novel, RK Narayan is most appropriately celebrated as the Pioneer of the Indian Novel in English. He has also earned the title of the "Father of Indian English"

Indian writing in English has a solid tradition behind it, stemming from the decision to use English as a medium of higher education in India, which was taken in 1835 at the prompting of Macaulay and others. This tradition begins with the great Bengali reformer and philospher, Raja Ram Mohan Roy, founder of the Brahmi movement and the inspiration of the liberal atmosphere that produced writers like, Rabindranath Tagore.

Every Indian English writer has perforce come to terms with the fact that his is an endeavour to express an Indian sensibility through a western medium. To be thoroughly Indian in thought feeling and experience and yet to bring out the Indian charm through a foreign language is an experiment in the field of creativity.

Fiction being the most characteristics and powerful firm of literary expression, has acquired a prestigious position in Indo English literature. It has evolved from a respectable history of national awakening, political apprising and a cultural consciousness of the epics and folk stories typical to the country. The year 1935 may be regarded as the year of the Indian anglian novel's nativity. Because it was in that year that RKN published his first novel Swamy and friends and Mulk Raj Anand published his Untouchable and three years later Rajarao joined them with his Kanthapura. However among all such Indian writers in English RKN remains the most reputed and the mostly appreciated.

The hallmark of Narayan's art in all its aspects is a natural simplicity and unpretentiousness. His prime or only concern is constructing a plot is to tell a story which is both interesting as well as readable. This sponteneous and traditional concept of good story telling saves his plot construction from unnecessary gimmickry.

Though not impervious to change and growth, the structuring of his plots, as other aspects of his craft is governed by the particular milieu and background of a South Indian community rooted in a cultural tradition. The material available to a story writer is limitless and with the broad climate of inherited culture, there are endless variations. The very Indian society that is not standardized or mechanized is vastly stimulating and is free from monotony.

RKN was the first modern Indian writer to make a fulltime career out of literature. He was first infact, modern Indian's first successful professional writer. The writer was an exceptional child. He spent his first 15 years under the supervision of a distinguished grandmother, Ammani, in Madras. while the rest of the family lived in princely Mysore. His childhood was an enlightened middle class home environment. The family's economic circumstances somewhat straightened, but they lived in a part of the great city of Madras that was ancient, socially mixed, but changing, from Ammani, his maternal grand mother Narayan as child absorbed folk tales, a fluent narrative tradition and an appreciation of

Carnatic Music. His talented uncle, T.N.Sechalam, instilled in Narayan values that endured and influenced his outlook, as a writer, Sechalam, was committed to classical Tamil Literature as well as to Shakespeare. Sechalam's younger brother, proved as a fount of character material for Narayan, as Kailash, the drunkard in A Bachelor of Arts.

In the year 1921, Narayan as a young man of 15 went to Mysore to join the rest of the family. Thus transition and transformation were of great significance to Narayan's evolution as a full time writer. He was enrolled in the Maharaja's Collegiate High School where his father Krishnasamy Iyer was the Headmaster. In Mysore the rules of the game changed for our writer. He became a part of a large lively family. His parents were highly principled, had a strong belief in education, and shared a liberal perspective on life that worked against orthodoxy, both religious and social.

Naryan's mother Gnanambal had a lot of common sense, sociality and a broad, democratic and compassionate outlook which she brought with her as her dowry on her marriage she was a rare soul, plain dealing, transparent and absolutely committed to truth telling. Theirs was a triangular house hold, Tamil being within the house, Kannada socially, while correct English usage became almost family obsession. The children's interest in English literature was strengthened by their unlimited access to the library in the school of which their father was the head master. Along with this, the captivating green open spaces and eloquent landscapes dominated by the rise of the Chamundi hill of the Mysore city, enthralled the young Narayan and motivated him to become a story writer for an exceptionally long period, encompassing 7 decades. Narayan's educational career was exceptionally unpretentious he failed in the university entrance examination, and ironically the first time, actually in English. But this was actually a blessing in disguise, because, these two years, gave him time to read, muse, take long walks, savour nature and try his hand at writing. And at the end of these years, Narayan had a sizable collection of stories and memories but also an impressive bundle of rejection in various colors and stages from the different publishers whom he had approached.

Narayan managed to claim his B.A. degree from the Maharaja's College, Mysore in 1930 after actually failing in the first attempt. Pressured by the family to take up school teaching, he obliged and took up assignment at a Government school in Chennapatna, lasting in all 4 days.

#### Malgudi (It is impossible to speak about Narayan without speaking about Malgudi)

Thus started Naryan's literary career on the Auspicious day of Vijayadasami in 1930, a day selected by his grandmother, it was on this auspicious day that the universally renowed fictional town Malgudi was born Narayan visualized a small railway station and called it the Malgudi Railway station of Naryans 15 novels all except the last "The Grandmothers Tales"

(written in 1993) are set in Malgudi. Malgudi is quite obviously South Indian, but is cannot be reduced to any one place. Malgudi is not Mysore, nor Madras nor Coimbatore. It is an imaging little town into which many real places and experience have made inputs. Here change happens slowly but surprises abound at every step in the midst of ordinaries, which when looked beneath is not ordinary.

RKN touches a vast range of Indian life and thought, but slowly avoids political issues and social conflicts. He has a keen eye for detail and his awareness of the contemporary Indian situation is penetrating. He views India as of her children who loves her. Almost all novels of Narayan are slender and straightforward. He has avoided complicated and intricate maneuverings. His characters are exquisitely simple in their interests and motives. So that there is hardly any need for thematic or structural complications.

Naravan is a writer of the average humanity: Malgudi, though a fragment of his imagination, yet is a real town of the Southern part of India. Though an average town, Malgudi claims as remarkable a place in literature as "the Wessex of Thomas Hardy" or "The five towns of Arnold Bennet". Malgudi is the microcosm of India, and Swami, Chandran, Ramani, Krishnan, Sampath, Margayya, Sriram, Raju Vasu and Mali - the inhabitants of Malgudi, but can be recognized as the average humanity of India. They share the essence and the chief characteristics of India and thus represent the country which Narayan belongs to even though the medium is a foreign language. The range of RKN's subject matter is very limited like that of Jane Austen. He is rooted in Malgudi and it is the life of the middle class people which he describes and analyses in his novels. Naryan's creating of Malgudi, an imaginary South Indian locale; is a dream country in which physical features of various places, intimately known to the novelist, fuse and mingle and are rearranged, modified and magnified. Narayan has chosen Malgudi to form the background to his novel and short stories. Malgudi is Narayan's Casterbridge. And some scholars have observed that Malgudi is the real hero of Narayan's novels, because this imaginary town forms the background of his stories and affects and influences the characters and actions of his novels. However Malgudi does not remain only a small town, it becomes a symbol of the whole country and world at large. Narayan's treatment of Malgudi is so vivid and convincing that the reader begins to feel that whatever happens in Malgudi, happens everywhere. This assigns a universal character to this fictional town.

Nevertheless, the streets or lanes of Malgudi, appear to be as familiar as one's home town. The principal landmarks of Malgudi are the railway station, the kabir street, the river Sarayu, the Lawley extension and the Memphi hills. The first impression that a reader gets of Malgudi is that it is old-fashioned, shabby looking and extremely unassuming. Its streets are dark and dingy and its buildings unimpressive.

#### Characters

Into this Malgudi, Narayan leads his readers to laugh, to sympathize and to share the vicissitudes of its residents. And the real theme of his stories is human Relationships. William Walsh remarks: the family is the immediate context in which his sensibility operates and his novels are remarkable for the subtlety and conviction with which family relationships are treated.

All Narayan's characters are typically Malgudian's rooted in the age old local traditions and they belong to Malgudi. He writes for the most pants about the smaller professional middle class with a gentle irony and a haunting sadness that has gained him the reputation of "Indian Chekov". His characters, mostly printers, journalists, teachers, shop-keepers, money-lenders, guides, astrologers, saints, students etc are people oppressed with much the same sense of helplessness and futility generated by an age old social conventional structure. But Narayan's writing is free from any politics either pre or post independence.

The real secret of Narayan's success lies in his unique gift of creating and handling characters. Everyone of his novels centers around a single character who is dominant throughout the novel. In other words the center if interest, the focus of attention is in the principal character or the protagonist of each novel. None of them can be called a hero in the real sense of the term, for they are neither great nor heroic. They are ordinary men, invariably average and mediocre, but called upon either by destiny or chance to play roles, which are too great for them. As a result these characters pass though a process of rise and fall. The rise is impressive, but the fall is partly amusing and partly pathetic, but never tragic. A significant feature of N's world is that it is densely populated by boderline people. Sanyasis, sorcerens, recluses, criminals, astrologers and the like. Infact, N's creativity expresses itself, to a great content, through a fascination with people who are at the borders of social life.

These are the marginal people, who lack the normal social identities and who exist in

the finge of the social order. Narayan though a middle class, well educated, widely traveled Brahmin, yet lived in a country where perhaps a majority of the population is not Brahmin, poor, semiliterate and unfamiliar with the world beyond their own prescribed perimeter of existence. Not withstanding this obvious disadvantage, he is regarded by a vast number of readers beyond India, as the principal interpreter of the Indian life and culture, for them. As a result Narayan's novels have been translated into several languages including Russian, Polish and Hebrew.

#### Purpose

In this background of Malgudi and with these Indian middle class, modest un self confident heroes. Narayan spins his stories with complete objectivity and a strange mixture of humor and irony and an underlying sense of beauty and sadness. He has succeeded in portraying sensitively the varied and colorful life of 20th century India. He has no educative or political purpose in his writings, but has provided a general background about India for the fortune of his readers. If all the Indian writers in English, RKN is surely the finest and most authentic in his representation of the national ethos, the sentry, the sights and sounds the ambience of the nation - or at least South India which he has made his sights domain under the name of Malgudi.

Narayan exhibits a profound sense of India ness through his stories. For him this India ness is a spontaneous flow of the heritage of Indian culture and the projection of the image of his country. He has explored the metaphysical, spritual, romantic, social land mundane aspects of the Indian Society. Each one of his stories whether he treats novel or novelette, as an institution of the Indian philosophy and its distinctiveness, of the Indian way of life and its consciousness, is so easily and so spontaneously touched upon. Because Narayan himself has said that the mission of an Indian writer should be to express the way of life of the group of people with whose psychology and background he is most familiar. Judged by this standard N's achievement is marvelous. He has succeeded in communicating to the English reader the subtleness of the Indian sensibility. And it might not be an oxageration to say that RKN, preferred the responsibility of an Abassador or an envoy of his country in a nature and meticulous manner through his stories.

Prostrating at the temple adorning one in a special way for 'Puja' consulting horoscopes for marriage alliances,

One some of the examples of the deep involvement of the writer and his commitment to Indianess. Even in the description of his characters, Jagan for example in  $\underline{A}$  vendor of Sweets, Narayan draws heavily on typical Hindu notions. He writes, "his chin was covered with whitening bristles as he shared only at certain intervals, feeling that it was an intolerable European habit to view oneself daily in a minor".

Jagan is said to be in the habit of getting up at 5 in the morning and brushing his teeth with a twig from a margosa tree. Jagan also wore loose jibba, made of material spun with his own hand. He drapped his shoulders with kaddar shawl.

Indian sweets such as Halwa, Mysore Pak, chandrakala, sohanpapdi, jilabi are introduced and described in the fabric of his stories which enriches their texture.

Narayan also gives us a hitarious picture of an Indian marriage is his story "A vendor of sweets" sitting before the fire, performing complicated rites, reciting sacred mantras, knotting the sacred "thali" around the brides' neck, the noise, the music of drumstpupes the jokes and the feasting for 3 or 4 days and finally the group photograph are all described in such details and with such passion!! (Reminding us of spencers pro & Epithaliamion).

Narayan even quotes a tamil provable aptly translated into English. In A Vendor of Sweets' Jagan feels his lawyer must be "One of the frogs in the well" - a person with limited knowledge.

He also touches his characters with the sure and uneming instinct of an acute observer of human foibles. In the story "An Astrologens Day" and "The Gateman's Gift" Narayan, humorously makes fun of the Indian Society hich is so caught up in superstitions, and a blind faith in fate and destiny.

In the story "Iswaran". Narayan underlines the folly of the society that holds certain false values and tries to restrict everybody within it. For the family of Iswaran, the protoganist passing an examination is a value and to them failure is a curse. And RKN reminds us that the society is often responsible for the perils in human life.

#### Humour

Narayan is fundamentally a good storyteller with an eye for the ludicrous aspect of life. His stories are simple, and traditionally narrated. Even the use of the suliplot is rare. Narayan use the most simple form of the prose fiction, but maintains his objectively. Even when he writes a novel dealing with tragic aspects of life it yields humour or irony.

Narayan's forte is genial ironic comedy, which has no parallel in Indo Anglian fiction.

His is the gift of healthy refreshing invigorating humour. He often mingles pathos with humour that we smile through our teams. He can be comic even at the moments of Reject tragedy.

The English Teacher published in 1945, the first story that came after the untimely death of Rajam his wife, is both autobiographical as well as cathartic. But it is the best example of the Narayan's exceptional gift to bring out human accent rictities and idiosyncrasies, humorlessly. It is rather surprising that Narayan over the years, managed to keep his comic vision intact in story after story and in incident after incident. The secret of this unageing comic fecunditily lies in Narayana's outlook as a writer. This is the affirmation of life with all its imperfections eccentricities, follies and foibles. As a result, the incongruous and the absured in life does not annoy him, it only amuses him.

Narayan never professed any high sounding moral precepts nor has the claimed to fathom the depths of human experience. "A snake in the Grass" is one such story. Writing simple stories out of the trivial matters in life is the best-known skill of RKN. What people set aside as an unimportant incident will be taken by him as a source of enjoyment and humour. Catching a snake is not an easy thing. But when RKN attempts to explain it, it not only amuses but also terrifies the reader.

RKN is a charming story teller, by virtue of his humour, sometimes compassionate and sometimes bitterly satirical. The stories are of South Indian origin, but the appeal is refreshingly to the whole of mankind. The humour comes not out of a painful effort, but is rather spontaneous. The stories are short but charged with close observations' N is the greatest of the humourists among the Indo Anglian writers. His humour is all pervasive and most varied. We get in him facial humour, which arises out of the odd and the grotesque in character. We also get in him verbal humour arising from jokes, jests repantees, retorts and by the clever use of the language in various ways. His stories are peopled by all types of South Indian Society - peasants, aristocrats, thieves, clerks artists, shopkeepers, teachers and persons both rich and poor.

"An Astrologies Day" is a perfect example for RKN's humour. Here his humour is not cheap, but has come as a result of an indepth study of Indian culture and his concern for the Indian people. Apart from his deep understanding of human nature. His very description of the astrologer for as the reader to laugh even in the very begining of the story. Intertwined into this description in the mild satine which makes fun of the Indian society which is so blind to accept, the verdict of an illiterate, to shape their destiny. And through his humour RKN brings the whole profession of astrology into question but readens do not develop an aversion towards the astrologer or astrology on the other hand his humour has only made the reader to pity the astrologer.

Gateman's Gift: a character called gingh. He is a believer is destiny and that everything on earth is preordained and that no amount of human effort can ease the situation. This is a story built around Indian beliefs and superstitions. Singh is the protoganist. The way he receives the General Manager and his attitude towards the others, his new profession of making models out of clay. His receipt of a registered post in return for his gift of clay model to the General Manager are all so humourously described - For Singh the letter is a big problem. He believes that the letter will bring him ruin. By this RKN makes us to laugh at our own follies and believes in superstitions. singhs experience in the X Ray institute is another incident to laught out. However RKN is careful not to just satoje the follies of the Indian people but he also carefully brings out the open nature and the sincerity of the Indian people.

"The Roman Image" is a story that entertains the readers in a different manner. It reads more like a thriller with suspense building up at the beginning of the story. It is the story of an Archeologist and his friend. They come with a preconceived them that Roman civilization had existed in their part of South India. So when a stone image is found in the riverbed, they preconclude that it is a Roman image. The celebration over this discovery mounts until a local rustic tells then that the image in question is only a statue from the local temple. NOT only the Archaeologist is shocked, but also the readers. This is a special skill of Narayan, by which he brings out the follies of the society, at the same time he will never allow the reader to take a serine's look about it.

Iswaran is another story which aboundsien humour. It is the story of a boy defected over his repeated failures in his examinations. Here Narayan is not digging at the boy but at a society, which criticizes the boy for not passing the exams. The humour from pathos becomes jubilant when, Iswaram is disappointed not to find his number in the III Class, but when he finds it in the II, he is unable to believe it. The manner in which the young Iswaran reacts to this unexpected turn of events is both amusing as well as enlightening. We laught with relief that he has passed and at the same time we ponder over the past events and wonder whether it was necessary for Iswaran to suffer such agony over a trivial passing of an exam. In this story, the humour is intertwined with a note of irony and pity. And we are made to realize that society can ruin a man's life altogether by its false expectations and empty values.

#### Humanism

Humanism is more a tendency rather than a system. Humanism is religion secularized. The positivists identify religion with the service of humanity. In a world dominated by the tyranny of scientific ideas and threatened by a mechanization of spirit, humanism is felt to be the only hope of salvation by those who believe that the only values that matter one human values. One of the ardent functions of literature is to humanize man. It is the prime duty of a writer to stir the compassion and love in hearts of his readers. How

diligently Narayan does this in his stories. While talking about Narayan and his works, it is but inevitable to speak about the strong streak of humanism that is present as an undercurrent in his stores. "Half a Rupee Worth" is a poignant and haunting tale, where Narayan employs "Poetic Justice" and unusually "commits" himself. The stay revolves around a rice merchant Subbiah.

Sweets for Angels. In this story Kali is a favourable rowdy, with a tall sturdy body and a beard. Born to unknown parents and grown up as an urchin, he scarcely knows the meaning of love. Ironically however Kali is happy and peaceful as long he is loveless in his heart, and his happiness suffers a setback ever since he learns to love. Kali cannot read or write and so he has a great admiration for school children. With a "seer" of sweets he gathers the children and distributes it a token of his love. He does not know that love is a luxury, an anachronism to the people of his sort. Thus, Kali is mistaken for a kidnapper and beaten heavily. Though writing is a profession with Narayan, he has spread an aura of spiritual humanism and throughout his work, and the credit goes to his being a perfect man, who exhibits a faith with which he has been tirelessly interested in people and has made people tirelessly interesting.

#### Autobiographaical element


The dullest of characters or events and the most repelling of experiences in life can become quite exciting in ant and become stories. So the art of story telling is actually the storying of life and its varied facets. RKN;s writing may appear a matter of self expression to the extent that he channels his life into it. Narayan who takes his craft seriously has often moulded the raw material of his life to the requirements and tenets of ant from. Narayan's life has been a main theme among the many other themes he deals with. His own experiences, his encounters with people, the major events of his life, the family and friends he grew up with, have all gone into his work. William Walsh says: that Narayan is predominately autobiographical and utilizes the experiences of his life to organize them in his work of art.

But more than any other book. The English Teacher is autobiographical in content, very little part of it being fiction. The English Teacher - Krishna undergoes the same experiences as Narayan and Krishna's wife is called Susila, instead of Rajan N's wife and the child is Leela instead of Hema, N's daughter. The Typhoid episode, the death of Susila, Krishna's depression, etc are all taken from the author's own life.

In Swami and Friends the young boy swami is an autobiographical rememberance of his own childhood experiences. Even Iswaran, in the story by the same name, is only a pere picture of his own experiences and struggles to pass the BA class.

In the novel the English Teacher, Krishna's mother comes to Malgudi to set up house for the young couple. The meticulous description of Krishna's mother is just a perfect picture of his own mother Gnanambal who demanded the same perfection from Rajan's in the household chorus. However the greatest and the most attractive aspect of his writing is that Narayan present his stories with complete objectively. Even while telling his own life story, he has managed to keep the story as casual and as detatched as possible from his own experiences.

### DR. W. L. JEYASINGHAM - By The Rt. Rev. Dr. S. Jebanesan -

Dr. William Luther Jeyasingham was born in Erlalai on 7th of January 1916. He had his Primary Education at Erlalai American Mission School and Secondary Education at St. Patricks College, Jaffna. By dint of honest perseverance he passed the Bachelor of Science Degree Examination of the London University in 1939 and Special Degree in Science Examination (Geography) in 1950.

In 1951 he passed the M. A. Degree (Geography) of Clark University U. S. A. and seven years later he obtained the Ph.D Degree of the same University. Dr. Jeyasingham joined the staff of Jafna College High School in 1940 and taught Geography, Mathematics, Gen, Science, Bible and Ethics.

He held many positions in the High School and was coach to the 2nd XI Soccer team. In 1960 he became a full time lecturer of the Undergraduate Department and became its Dean of Studies in 1964. From 1966 to 1974 he served as the President of Jaffna College.

When Jaffna College Undergraduate Department was taken over by the Government of Sri Lanka to be part of the Jaffna Campus, he became the Associate Professor of Geography and Head of Dept. of Geography in the new University Campus. He was also the Dean of the Faculty of Arts for one year and six months.

Dr. Luther Jeyasingham was a man of great vision. He felt the need for midgreat technicians in Sri Lanka and the necessity to provide such education for the youth of the North.

The idea of a Technical Institute and an Agriculture Institute under the aegis of Jaffna College slowly emerged in his mind. The foundation Stone for the Jaffna College Institute of Technology was laid by Carl Holdridge, the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees in 1972. On the 10th of February 1973 the Technical Institute was declared open.

Dr. W.L. Jeyasingham was man of remarkable intellectual powers. The following are some of his important works.

Dr.Luther Jeyasingham took a keen interest in Church activities. He served as Treasurer of the Jaffna Diocese of the Church of South India. He was a member of the Synod of the C. S. I. and was a member of Advisory Committee on Race and Ethnic Relations of the World Council of Churches. He was on invitee of the World Council of Churches to study and report on Casteism in the Kerala Churches (South India). He served as Programme Cordinator to the study visit of Dr. Diasuke Kitagawa to Ceylon to study and report on the Sinhala - Tamil ethnic Problems for the World Council of Churches.

Dr. W. L. Jeyasingham died in 1989 in U.S.A. after a brief illness.

# REV. ANTHONY ARIYARATNAM PAUL - By A. Gnanathasan - Chairman Board of Directors

Rev. Antony Ariyaratnam the 15th Principal of Jaffna College was born on 25th January 1947 to Mr. W.N. Paul of Araly and Mabel Ariyamalar of Punnalaikadduwan.

Rev. Paul had his Primary Education at Punnalaikadduwan and his Secondary Education at Jaffna College. He entered the University of Ceylon from Jaffna College in November 1966. He followed Chemistry Special Degree course with Physics as a subsidiary subject and passed the final examination in August 1970.

For a short period he served at the Faculty of Science as a temporary Assistant Demonstrator and later became a Temporary Assistant Lecturer in Chemistry in the Faculty of Medicine. In 1974 he joined the Mineral Sands Corporation, Pulmoddai. He became the Chief Chemist of this Corporation and was in charge of laboratory, where quality control was maintained.

While he was at Pulmoddai he was sent on three months I. A. E. A Fellowship to the University of Nairobi, Kenya. On 2nd February 1985 he was appointed to the staff of Jaffna College, Because of his piety integrity and high academic achievement he was given important positions at Jaffna College. He was made chaplain of the College on the 1st of March 1992. He became Junior Vice Principal of the College on 15th March 1994.

On 22nd of February 2000 he became the Principal of the College a position he held till his much lamented death on the 13th June 2003.

Rev. A. A. Paul had an abiding interest in Theological Studies and church activities. He followed a Bachelor of Divinity course as an External student of Serampore college and passed the B. D. Examination. In 1996 he went to Princeton Theological Seminary U.S. A. and obtained his Th. M Degree.

On the 8th of 1991 he was made a Deacon by the Rt. Rev. Dr. D. J. Ambalavanar and on 16th of May 1992 he was Ordained as Presbyter of the Jaffna Diocese of the Church of South India. He served as worker in charge at Araly, Moolai and Vaddukoddai churches.

It has been wisely said "keep young by continuing to grow." Rev. Paul was a life long student When he was serving Mineral Sands Corporation, Pulmoddai, he continued to experiment in organic Chemistry and became a Chartered Chemist and

a member of the Institute of Chemist in Sri Lanka. He passed the M. Phil Examination at the University of Colombo in 1986 by research in the field Organic Chemistry. He obtained his Dip - In Education from the University of Jaffna in 1991. He was writing his Ph. D thesis for the Department of Christian Civilization of University of Jaffna at the time of his death.

Eventhough Rev. A.A. Paul had been Principal of Jaffna College only for 3 years and four months, he had been serving the Institution as Vice Principal and Principal during the most difficult period of the College.

We shall always be thankful to God for His gift to us in the life of his devoted servant Rev. Anthony Ariyaratnam Paul.
