


















Rev. William Ault, The first and the founding principal of Batticaloa Methodist Central College.

Rev. William Ault was born in West Bromwich, Warwickshire in 1778. From his young age, he had read the Bible and he was jointly conducting a Sunday School in his home town. He was called to do God's work and he entered Ministry in 1808.

Ault expressed his interest to assist the Rev. Dr. Thomas Coke in the overseas Ministry work. When Rev. Coke was selecting Ministers as missionaries to Ceylon, he included Rev. Ault and his wife, Sarah. They all made their way to Portsmouth and went on board ship on 30th December, 1813 and set sail for Ceylon, the next day.

Dr. Coke sailed on "Cabalva" with Benjamin Clough and Mr & Mrs William Harvard. Lynch, Erskine, Squance and Mr & Mrs Ault sailed on "Lady Melville". It was a difficult journey on the stormy seas. Ault's wife who was already showing signs of pulmonary disease died on 10th February 1814 and was buried at sea. It was unfortunate, Dr. Coke suddenly appeared weak on May 2nd. Though he took medicine, he was found dead on the floor of his cabin at 5.30, next morning. The death of their revered leader shattered the hopes of their Mission. Though the outlook for the Mission was gloomy to the young and inexperienced missionaries, yet they with all "FAITH" proceeded on the journey.

When their ship was sighted three miles off-shore from Galle harbour, the master attendant sent two boats to meet it. It was on Wednesday June 29th 1814, Lynch, Squance and Clough reached ashore in one of those boats. Ault and Erskine who were in the other boat were carried away by strong winds and tides to the open sea in darkness, but they landed unhurt at Weligama at 2.30 a.m.

On Monday, July 11th, the missionaries drew lots to choose their stations. Ault was to proceed alone to Batticaloa and the journey proved to be perilous. He was to travel almost over 200 miles by sea in a dhoney (a small sailing vessel). The expected three days' journey took almost eight days. The crew in the dhoney were lazy and they sailed in a haphazard manner. An anchor was lost in a strong wind. Food and water nearly used up, almost all Ault's books, and some of his other belongings were spoilt by drenching seas. Once he fell over the side of the boat, and when at last he arrived at his destination, the boat capsized.

Batticaloa at that time, had suffered a drought for two years and was painfully affected with sickness. Soldiers were dying daily in the crowded hospitals; the temperature was 94 degrees in the shade. The people were in a state of fear due to an earthquake which happened a fortnight before.

When the Rev. William Ault, the first Methodist Missionary to Batticaloa arrived on the 12th of August 1814, Mr. Simon Sawyers, the Collector of Revenue at that time welcomed him and encouraged him to open an English school. Ault opened his first school (eventually grew into Batticaloa Methodist Central College) in a large store room granted by Mr. Sawyers which was probably one of the Customs Warehouses in the town. There were just five students at the inception, three of them were orphan sons of two British soldiers who had died of an epidemic of fever, while two others were boys of the locality — one of them was Rajakarier Daniel Somanadar who is the great grandfather of Dr. S.V.O Somanader (The first Sri Lankan principal of Batticaloa Methodist Central College).

Rev. Ault taught the English language and the first principles of the true religion. He learnt Tamil and preached freely. Altogether he established eight Schools and he visited them with great enthusiasm; preaching to both Hindus and Muslims and was joyously ministering to a congregation of 150.

Ault's health was already deteriorating. Though he was suffering from high fever, he was in perfect possession of his reason till the last moment. At his request, his only attendant read the Scripture-Jeremiah 3: 4-22. At the start, he listened with attention and then saying "It is enough", turned aside on his bed and breathed his last.

When Ault died on April 1st 1815, there were 40 Students in the first School he founded. Just before Ault died, he wrote a hymn which was sung on June 29th to mark the early years of the Methodist Mission. The 12th of August 1814 is a significant day for Batticaloa Methodist Central College, for it was on this date that the founder of the School, the Rev. William Ault arrived in Batticaloa. Though the Methodist Church in Sri Lanka will be celebrating its Bicentenary on 29th June 2014, Batticaloa Methodist Central College will be completing its 200 years of existence only on 12th August , 2014 and this day can never be forgotten by the past and present students of the college.

Rev. Ault was the first to join the Dr. Coke's band of Missionaries and he was the first to die on the Asian soil. Today, the Church and the School he founded continue the noble work of a long line of selfless missionaries and they remain as his fitting memorials.



I do not know if all of us are aware of the significance of our College Crest. wich was my pleasurable privilege to design at the special request of the R.W.Holtom. B.Sc.. durina his principalship. I thought a note on it, in this our first issue of the College Magazine, would not be out of place. so that we might all understand and appreciate its meaning.

First of all, you have in the bottom half of the crest the wide concerned before you, and in the background, on the Eastern horizon, you see the sun rising in its splendor and diffusing its rays of light to brighten up the surface. In the same way, Batticaloa Central College – through its students – should 'shed light' to illumine the 'darkness of the land' – especially Batticaloa which can be regarded as 'the land of the Rising Sun', so far as our Ceylon is concerned.

Then you have, on the top left, an open book, signifying that the student of Central should love books (study), and especially the book of life, valuing knowledge for its own sake, and ordering his life according to the Book of Books. All our learning and our thinking should not lead us to sin and wrong but-as the dove flying over the book signifies – to purity, innocence, simplicity of character, and reverence for all that is noble. This is all very important especially at this time when the knowledge that we gain is being directed towards evil ends – crime, selfishness, bribery, corruption and other similar vices.

"Let knowledge grow from more to more, But more of reverence in us dwell; That mind and soul, according well, May make one music as before, But vaster"

The Coconut palm on the top right has alwo a great meaning. While it is typical of our pretty East Coast, it indicates that our growth should be "tall" and "straight" and just as every part of the palm is of use to man, the student of Central should not only be "straight-forward" but useful-every part of him being used for unselfish service in the cause of humanity around.

If we live and set like the palm, the dove, and the book, and the rising sun over the sea of ignorance, then, and then only, can we grow-up to be good citizens and shed lustre. But no light that we radiate upon the world around us is worth anything if it is not reflected from the light of God who is the Source of all light.

All these, then in a broad sense, sum up the meaning of our school Motto "In Lumine tuo Lumen" (In Thy Light is light) found at the bottom of our Crest.

Let us all remember, therefore, what our school-crest stands for, and strive – with God's grace-to shed light and lustre, and thus live up to its great and noble significance.

A Brief History of the College

The 12th of August 1814, is a significant day of Methodist Central College, Batticaloa, for it was on this date that the founder of the School, the Rev. William Ault arrived in Batticaloa. He was the first Methodist Missionary to East Ceylon, and was given every encouragement by Mr. Simon Sawyers, the Collector of Revenue at that time. Rev. Ault opened his first school in a large store room granted by Mr. Sawyers which was probably one of the Customs ware-houses. There were just five pupils at the inception, three of them were the orphan sons of two British soldiers who had died during an epidemic of fever, while the two others were boys of the locality. Rev. Ault taught the pupils English Language and the principles of true religion and the greatest tribute to his work is shown by the fact that within eight months, when he died in April, 1815, there were forty pupils in the school. There was a delay in the arrival of Rev. Ault's successor and it seemed that the torch lit by this great missionary would be put out, but a good Samaritan in the person of Captain Thomas Aldersley Jones, the Commandant of the English Garrison, filled the breach till Rev. Elijah Jackson arrived in July 1816.

The school had humble beginnings where the pupils, due to the scaracity of paper in those days, had to use the ashy under surface of plantain leaves for writing. There was only one English Dictionary in the town which belonged to an old Dutchman Kahle. he kept the book well protected in camphor in a safe, but the boys realizing Kahle's weakness for tobacco, were able to consult the dictionary as long as they brought a plug of Kahle's favourite brand of tobacco. The school moved to a new location when in 1839, the then Governor of Ceylon, the Hon'ble James Stewart Mackenzie, who was greatly interested in education, visiting Batticaloa, gave the Rev. George Hole the materials of the old Dutch Church and an old store room in the Fort for school buildings with a total of £25. This helped to put up verandahs on each side of the Methodist Church and school sessions were then held on the verandah immediately overlooking College House, the Principal's bungalow.



As the boys' school began to outgrow the church verandah, a large cadjan shed was put up where the present classes adjoining the office block now stand. A comment worthy of note made in the Methodist Mission minutes of 1860 stated "Our Mission at Batticaloa must take its place as an educator or be superseded".

The first prize giving on record was held on January 10th 1876, and even as early as that date among the items at this prize giving was the staging by the boys of Act 4 of Shakespeare's Richard II, while for the essay competition, the subject was "Cranmer" A long line of Methodist Missionaries continued to serve as principals of the school till 1942, the first Ceylonese Principal was appointed.

With the change over from colonial rule to the era of independence, Missionary schools such as Central College are facing hard times., where they suffer, at the cost of the Governmane going all out to develop Government schools. Mission schools today are in the role of the 'Cinderellas' of Education and unless assistance from various quarters is enlisted, the future of schools such as Central College, which did the initial spadework in lighting the torch of learning and rendering service to the people of this country irrespective of caste, creed or race, will indeed be bleak. After a period of 145 years of service, these schools may even have to close down unless the school receives assistance and encouragement from friend and well-wishers all over the globe to continue the noble work of a long line of selfless missionaries.

Reverend James Cartman, OBE (1910 - 1998)

Reverend James Cartman was the last European Principal of Methodist Central College in Batticaloa. He was born near Manchester, England in 1910 into an Anglican family, but became a Methodist when his father, a talented organist, was asked to play at the services in the local Methodist church. After leaving school he joined a manufacturing firm as a trainee manager but, at the age of 20, he decided that he wished to train for the Ministry. Entering Manchester University he studied theology and and gained a first class BA degree. While there, he heard an appeal for ordained men to work overseas as missionaries. He undertook a post-graduate course in education having specifically asked to be sent to Ceylon as an Educational Missionary. He married Winifred in August 1937, and a year later in August 1938 he arrived in Batticaloa as Principal of MCC. He threw himself whole heartedly into this role, seeking to guide his pupils in both academic and sporting fields, particularly cricket. He was appointed General Manager of Methodist schools in Batticaloa and was a consultant to the Education Office there.

In 1942 a daughter, Christine, was born and she spent her first two years very happily in Batticaloa. However, in 1942, Mrs Cartman and Christine were evacuated to England following the threat of a Japanese invasion of the island. James stayed on as Deputy Civil Defence Commissioner and worked tirelessly helping the many survivors of vessels sunk by the Japanese off the East coast. For this work he was awarded the defence medal.

In 1944 he also returned to England and his work in Batticaloa came to an end. However, this was not the end of his service to Ceylon. While on furlough he studied for a Bachelor of Divinity degree, again obtaining a first class honours, and returned to Ceylon in March 1945 to take up the post of Principal of Wesley College, Colombo. He continued his wonderful work there before returning to England in late 1949. The then Prime Minister of Ceylon, asked him if he would accept a post working at the Ceylon High Commission in London as education and Welfare officer. This he was delighted to do as he could continue his association with Ceylon and also give guidance and support to the many students from Ceylon who wished to study, join the forces or simply work in United Kingdom.

In 1983 James and Winifred returned to Sri Lanka for a long holiday during which they visited MCC, Batticaloa. They were given a wonderful welcome - feted, garlanded and paraded both at the College and through the town. They were delighted to see that the College was flourishing and took home very many happy memories. In the years to follow, Rev. James Cartman and Mrs Cartman were always delighted to be involved with Ceylon expatriates, and his association with Sri Lanka, which began in 1938, continued until his death in 1998.

The teachers taught me lessons and values., To solve problems, they gave me clues. Today I am shining well in my career, Determined to face in life, any barrier.


Everyday at the College was another world., Varied ways of thinking were unfurled. In Drama and Debates, I always excelled., To name and fame, I was soon propelled.







Some of the contributions are:

- Cricket materials bought for Rs.100,000 that to be used by talented young cricketers. This will be used in their day to day practice and tournaments.
- Paid Rs.35,000 for cricket nets. Together with Sri Lankan OBA's initiative a practice net was built in the old Principal's quarters. This will encourage boys to practice regularly and will be an invaluable aid for tournament training.
- A photocopy machine for Rs.127,200 was donated to the school administration office. This replaces the malfunctioning old copier.
- Hired an external IT teacher to enhance IT skills for the students who opted in to study Information Technology. Classes are conducted during and after school hours.

We aim to deliver major projects to enhance the quality of our school's education, sports and teaching.

The old boys are an inspiration and can help the school that is contributing a good service to the betterment of the young in the field of education. This will only be achieved if all Centralites all over the world unite together.
