

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

Isa was the last prophet appointed by Allah for Bani Israil. They defied his teachings and denied his legitimacy. Curious and agitated, they wanted to know who was the father of the baby. She did as instructed by Allah, and pointed towards the infant. They all laughed at this and said how could a new born answer their questions.

However, Isa spoke up with the permission of Allah and said, "I am a servant of Allah.



He has appointed me as prophet amongst you and am the bearer of the Book (Injeel).

Allah has granted me bounties of benevolence and made me obedient to my mother. I will worship Allah and obey all His laws for as long as I live. " He became quiet after that. The people were dumb founded at this miracle and they dispersed. The stories of this supernatural event remained in circulation for a long time.

The controversies over the Virgin Birth of Isa

The Jews consider Isa to be an illegitimate child of Maryam. The Christians consider him the son of God. Allah says He is neither a husband nor a father. He is the Creator and Sustainer of all things. He settled the controversy over the birth of Isa in al Qur'an: "Verily, for Allah the circumstances over the birth of Isa are no different from those surrounding the origin of Adam. He created Adam from no parents at all, while Isa had a mother. He just has to will some thing to happen; and it materializes at once. He would raise the dead from their graves on the Day of Judgment by His Divine Will, for He is All Powerful and Magnificent."

The Prophet hood of Isa and his Miracles

Isa was thirty years of age when he began to receive Divine Revelations and started to teach Banu Israil the commandments of Allah. He showed them great miracles that indicated the grandeur of Allah. He made birds from the mud and made them fly. He healed the lepers, he gave vision to the blind, he brought back life to the dead and fed thousands from a mere loaf of bread, all with the permission of Allah. He confirmed the truth of Torah and affirmed the ordinances of halal (permitted) 6nd haram (prohibited) and revised certain canonical laws to suit the circumstances of that society. He called upon the rabbis of Bait-ul Muqqadas to

clear it from all trading activities and clean it up for the worship of Allah. He met with the stubborn antagonism from his people except for a handful of true believers. He had twelve disciples, or companions (also known as the twelve apostles of Jesus) who followed him wherever he went and assisted him in his teachings. Bani Israil did not approve the teachings of Isa and collaborated with the Roman governor of the land to get rid of him.

The Occultation of Isa

One of the companions of Isa betrayed him and handed him over to the government agents who were seeking to arrest Isa for treason. The Roman governor and Banu Israil believed that they had crucified Isa. Some of his followers thought that he was taken down from the cross before he actually died on the cross. The controversy still continues. Allah clarifies this in al Qur'an that it is a waste of time even to conjecture on the nature of Isa or what happened to him after his arrest by the Romans. He was neither crucified nor did he die on the cross. Allah withdrew him from amongst his blood thirsty enemies and raised him to the heaven.





Sri Lanka ups protectionism in autarkist budget

Nov 09, 2012 - Sri Lanka has upped protectionist taxes in foods and building materials allowing more profits for producers allowing producers as citizens try to eat and build homes for themselves.

Raising import duties allows producers to engage in tax arbitrage, the act of collecting as profits the equivalent of amount of tax by turning out an item within a national border without actually engaging in competitively priced production.

A budget for 2013 said import taxes or cesses would be raised on dairy products, edible products of animal origin, fresh, preserved, dried vegetable and fruits, edible oils, margarine, sausages or preserved meat products, honey and jiggery, confectionary, bakery products, mineral water, vinegar and salt.

On September 18 Sri Lanka raised import cesses on potatoes were raised to 50 rupees a kilogram and to sprats (dried herring) to 75 rupees. Import cess taxes were also raised on steel, a vital material for building new homes by citizens.

Earlier in the year, Sri Lanka had raised taxes for ceramic articles and steel rods.

Sri Lanka has been on a path to autarky for several years with targets for 'self-sufficiency' and placing an emphasis on an ideology of 'saving foreign exchange'.

Raising taxes on steel in particular would increase the costs of home building. A day before the budget, science minister Tissa Vitharana said high taxes on foods seem to be contributing to persistent malnutrition among children. President Mahinda Rajapaksa said in his budget speech that he would give a free pair of shoes to school children in difficult areas as well as milk and cereal. He said he met many children with broken shoes. Shoes are highly protected with import duties.

Sri Lanka Launches First Satellite into Orbit.....

Colombo, Nov 27 (Prensa Latina) Sri Lanka today completed the trio of South Asian nations with their own satellites when with the collaboration of China placed in geostationary orbit over the island its first artifact of that kind. At 36,000 kilometers above the Earth's surface, the device will start from June next year to provide data transmission services and communications, including broadband Internet, to the Middle East, Central and South Asia and Australia. The sophisticated device was propelled from the Satellite Launch Center of Xi Chang, in the Chinese province of Sichuan.

At a cost of approximately \$ 320 million dollars, the mission is financed by the Board of Investment of Sri Lanka and Supreme SAT private company, with state-owned China Great Wall Industry Corporation.

The multinational company in charge of the project is negotiating with the authorities in Afghanistan and Maldives to agree on terms for the eventual construction of satellites for these countries, from design to launch With this step, the Indian Ocean Island became the forty-fifth country with artifacts of that genre. In South Asia only India and Pakistan have satellites.

Martin realizes the mistake and a fresh quarrel arises.


Now Martin understood that what his old father said was true and his heart grew lighter. He had half a mind to make peace with Scherbako.

2. Mexico dining etiquette






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Albert Einstein

Albert Einstein was a German American scientist. He is best known for his theories on relativity and theories of matter and heat. Einstein is considered one of the greatest physicists of all time because he is thought to have changed the way one looks at the universe. Einstein was born in Ulm, southern Germany, to Jewish parents. A year after he was born he moved to Munich, Germany. Einstein showed no signs of being a genius at an early age. He did not like to receive instructions in school, therefore his education had to begin at home. He would still have to attend school in Munich though, and would get exceptional grades especially in Mathematics; however, he hated it, a teacher suggested him to leave and just study at home because of his dislike toward the school. Merely his presence caused the other students to disrespect the teachers. A story that Einstein loved to tell was that he once saw a compass and saw that the needle had a northward swing. He knew there was something behind it and he wanted to know the hidden mysteries.

Einstein first learned algebra and the pythagora's theorem when his uncle taught it to him. His uncle would visit the family frequently and was Einstein's mentor. He would help him and encourage him to go on and never give up. Einstein loved to solve the algebraic and geometrical problems on his own. At the age of twelve he read a couple of books on Euclid Geometry and learned the whole thing on his own. At the age of fourteen he read a few science books and the books had an immense influence on his life.





At the age of fifteen his parents moved to Milan, Italy, Einstein took this opportunity to drop out of the school in Munich. He spent a year just living with his parents and reading. Albert then realized that he needed to do something in life. He decided to finish school in Aarau, Switzerland. In 1895, he tried to enter into the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology (a type of university). He took the entrance exam, failed it, and passed it the second time. In the institute Albert realized that his true love was Physics. Albert hated that school also, so much was his dislike toward the school, that he would not even attend the classes. He would rather stay home and do experiments and have his friend take notes for him, then he would just study the notes on his own and take the tests.

Albert graduated from the university with not so prestigious grades, he tried to get a job at a university as a professor, but failed to find one. He even became a Swiss citizen to find a job in Switzerland, but it did not work out either. In 1902 he found a job at the patent office at Bern. All he had to do was put applications in for patents. This gave him time to devote himself to the Physics questions that he had and do scientific papers. In 1903 he married Meliva Maritsch, he had two sons with her and discussed his ideas with her all the time.

Einstein started to draw attention to himself when he started to publish his papers. In 1905 he was hired as a professor in the University of Zurich for his Annus Mirabilis-the four major papers that he wrote in his life-. The first one was about the theoretical dissertations on the dimensions of molecules. The second was about the Brownian Motion; he made predictions about the motion of particles. The third one was about the Photoelectric Effect, which contained a revolutionary hypothesis on the nature of light. In this paper he wrote about the photon being proportional to frequency. His Fourth and most revolutionary paper was the one about Theory of Special Relativity, which contained the interaction viewed simultaneously by an observer at rest, and by an observer moving at uniform speed.

Albert did not really become world famous until some of the things in his Theory of Special Relativity proved to be true. In his theory he explained the unexplained variations in the orbital motion of the planets. This was proved in 1919 when there was an eclipse. After the eclipse, people realized that what he had stated was true. From that time on he became world known. He was invited to many special meetings; on one of them he met one of his favorite scientist Max Planck and others that he relished. It was in that same year that he married his cousin Elsa. In 1921, he won the Noble Prize for Physics for the research he did on the PhotoElectric effect.

Since Albert was a publicly declared Zionist, he was the target of many anti-semetics. He would be ridiculed in Germany because of his beliefs. Albert had moved to Germany to work at the University in Prague. When Hitler came to power, he immediately moved to Princeton, New Jersey. Albert later learned that some German scientist had discovered how to split the uranium atom. Albert and other scientist sent a letter to President Roosevelt and told him to start an atomic bomb project also. That is why the Manhattan project was started. Einstein helped to make the first two atomic Bombs.

Albert Einstein died in 1955, in Princeton, New Jersey. He was able to see his own people return to their homeland, something he wanted to see all his life. Einstein accomplished many things in life because of his hard work, and all his work has helped our world today.




What Is Dandruff?

The flaking accompanying dandruff is caused by something called seborrheic dermatitis (sometimes just called seborrhea). Dandruff flakes may be white or light yellow and will usually rub off a person's head easily.

Someone who has dandruff may notice his or her scalp feels crusty, red, and raw in the areas where seborrhea is getting worse. If this happens, seborrhea can cause the scalp to itch pretty badly. In very rare cases, seborrhea may cause hair loss if it isn't treated. But any lost hair should start to grow back once seborrhea is treated.

For some people, seborrheic dermatitis just causes a relatively mild case of dandruff — a bit of flaking and itching in the scalp. Other people with seborrheic dermatitis have crusty, red, irritated skin that may spread to different areas of the body. Common locations to find seborrhea include inside the ear, the armpits, and even the belly button. Seborrheic dermatitis and dandruff aren't contagious. So you can't catch dandruff from (or give it to) another person.





What Is Alcohol?

Alcohol is created when grains, fruits, or vegetables are fermented. Fermentation is a process that uses yeast or bacteria to change the sugars in the food into alcohol. Fermentation is used to produce many necessary items — everything from cheese to medications. Alcohol has different forms and can be used as a cleaner, an antiseptic, or a sedative.

So if alcohol is a natural product, why do teens need to be concerned about drinking it? When people drink alcohol, it's absorbed into their bloodstream. From there, it affects the central nervous system (the brain and spinal cord), which controls virtually all body functions. Because experts now know that the human brain is still developing during our teens, scientists are researching the effects drinking alcohol can have on the teen brain.

How Does It Affect the Body?

Alcohol is a depressant, which means it slows the function of the central nervous system. Alcohol actually blocks some of the messages trying to get to the brain. This alters a person's perceptions, emotions, movement, vision, and hearing.

In very small amounts, alcohol can help a person feel more relaxed or less anxious. More alcohol causes greater changes in the brain, resulting in intoxication. People who have overused alcohol may stagger, lose their coordination, and slur their speech. They will probably be confused and disoriented. Depending on the person, intoxication can make someone very friendly and talkative or very aggressive and angry. Reaction times are slowed dramatically — which is why people are told not to drink and drive. People who are intoxicated may think they're moving properly when they're not. They may act totally out of character.

When large amounts of alcohol are consumed in a short period of time, alcohol poisoning can result. Alcohol poisoning is exactly what it sounds like — the body has become poisoned by large amounts of alcohol. Violent vomiting is usually the first symptom of alcohol poisoning. Extreme sleepiness, unconsciousness, difficulty breathing, dangerously low blood sugar, seizures, and even death may result.








Dicky Ponting says walking away from Australia 'easy decision'



Ricky Ponting says he has no regrets about retiring after his final game for Australia ended in a heavy defeat to South Africa in Perth.

Ponting scored eight runs in his final appearance at the crease for his country to end a glittering Test career with 13,378 runs in 168 Tests. "The decision to walk away was a pretty easy one," said Ponting after South Africa's series-clinching 309-run win. Australia captain Michael Clarke said the game had lost a true great. "I'm a realist and I realise now that my best cricket is probably past me," added Ponting, the second highest run-scorer in Test history behind Sachin Tendulkar, after South Africa secured victory on the fourth day. "As hard as I have tried over the last couple of years to find my form again and reestablish myself, I haven't been able to do that." On a highly emotional day at the Waca, Ponting was given a guard of honour by the South Africa team as he walked to the crease, instigated by captain Graeme Smith. The 37-year-old, who announced his retirement before the match, lasted just 23 deliveries and 39 minutes before he was well held by Jacques Kallis as he attempted to force a shot off the back foot from Robin Peterson's bowling. The South Africa players shook Ponting's hand as he left the field. and he turned to wave his bat to the crowd as the big screen showed the words "Thanks Ricky". After the game, he received a standing ovation during a lap of honour as he was hoisted aloft by team-mates Michael Clarke and David Warner. Ponting's wife, Rianna, and daughters Emmy and Matisse, were among the crowd of 7,166. "It would have been nice to have played one more Test but the decision has been made and I'm disappointed not to have contributed more this week," added Ponting, who ended the match with a total of 12 runs. "It's probably been the toughest Test match I have played." Clarke urged Cricket Australia to use three-time World Cup-winner Ponting's vast knowledge and experience to help the country in the future. "He's one of the greatest players I've been lucky enough to play with," he said. "I've said before I hope Cricket Australia do everything in their power to keep him involved in this great game because he's one of a kind and I think the game needs him." Meanwhile, Smith explained the decision behind South Africa's guard of honour for Ponting. "It was just a sign of respect for someone who has given the game so much," said the South Africa captain. "I'm sure we're all going to miss Ricky as an opponent. "I just told him he deserved everything that comes his way and can be proud of everything he's achieved."









